West Nile virus found in Forest County



The Forest County Health Department reports a dead crow found in Forest County on July 24th has tested positive for West Nile virus. This is the first bird that tested positive for West Nile virus in Forest County since surveillance for the mosquito-transmitted virus began on May 1 for 2013.

"The positive bird means that residents of Forest County need to be more vigilant in their personal protective measures to prevent mosquito bites," Kathy Marvin, Public Health Nurse said.

West Nile virus is spread to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito. Mosquitoes acquire the virus by feeding on infected birds.

"Forest County residents should be aware of West Nile virus and take some simple steps to protect themselves against mosquito bites," Marvin said. "The West Nile Virus seems to be here to stay, so the best way to avoid the disease is to reduce exposure to and eliminate breeding grounds for mosquitoes."

Miniature logging equipment on display at museum in Crandon

Mr. Brewer has been making the miniature equipment for over 40 years. Pat purchases the vehicles and then customizes them according to his designs. The logs presented in the display are dead balsam twigs which are individually cut and glued onto the trailers or railroad cars. The jammers on the trucks are made entirely by Mr. Brewer. The various tie-downs are made by either cutting electrical tape into thin strips or wire.

The display can be viewed at the museum at 105 W. Jackson St. in Crandon. The museum is open Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Bear Lake Creating Lake Quality Management Plan

While the water at Bear Lake looks much better than it has in years, local residents and government agencies are not sitting back thinking their work is done. A draft management plan for Bear Lake's water quality was released earlier this summer, according to Dave Muench, the study's local coordinator. The study was conducted by the Center for Watershed Science and Education at the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point 2011 and 2012. The Town of Blackwell, with support from the U.S. Forest Service, the Association for Bear Lake and Environs (ABLE), the Aquatic Invasive Species Program of Forest County, and Bear Lake Shores Association, applied for a Department of Natural Resources Lake Management Grant to look into reasons for algae issues the lake had been facing for several years and how the problem could

Hwy 32 under improvement between Townsend & Lakewood

As part of his efforts to create jobs and make sure Wisconsin is open for business, Governor Scott Walker has approved \$795,000 to improve three miles of WIS 32 from Lakewood to Townsend (Big Hill Road to Bobcat Lane) on WIS 32 in Oconto County. Work began Monday, August 5 and will be completed by the end of August.

The contractor is Northeast Asphalt, Greenville, Wisconsin. Work includes resurfacing the highway, new highway signing and culvert maintenance.

The road will remain open to traffic with lane closures and flagging operations. Motorists should be prepared for potential backups during construction.



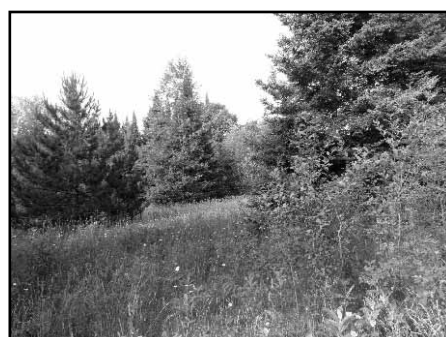

be managed. Some observations and results include:

*** Bear Lake is a drainage lake, meaning most of its water comes from the watershed which drains into the lake. In Bear Lake's case, the watershed is very large, over 4,000 acres, and Bear Lake is only 68 acres in size. The large watershed includes numerous wetlands, which store water throughout the year and maintain adequate Bear Lake water levels. On the other hand, the watershed collects a lot of phosphorous, which contributes to algae growth.

*** Over 121,000 pounds of phosphorous enter Bear Lake annually, and most of that goes out Bear Creek. Surface water runoff contributes a little over half (53%) of the phosphorous delivered into Bear Lake. Overall, much of the phosphorous delivered to Bear Lake is naturally occurring and little is man-made.

*** Bear Lake's phosphorous levels border on high naturally, according to DNR standards, so any additional phosphorous input results in an overload, causing algae. A lake's native vegetation, if healthy, is usually adequate enough to store and use algae in its growth cycle, and therefore allow little to be used for algae growth. Bear Lake has relatively little vegetation due to its rocky, sandy nature and therefore is at a disadvantage. Added to that is the fact that phosphorous is naturally occurring in the soils and the task to stay algae free becomes more difficult.

*** One of the biggest problems cited in the study as a possible cause of algae production is the presence of rusty crayfish, an aquatic invasive species (AIS) introduced to the lake several decades ago. Rusty crayfish are very aggressive against native crayfish and various fish species, and their eating habits create water quality problems, in addition to aesthetic ones. Rusty crayfish cut off the plant to eat the algae, creating the dual problem of reducing the number of plants which can take up excess phosphorous and leaving the plants to decay,

creating even more nutrient problems.

According to the management plan, controlling rusty crayfish populations was identified as a main focus in the battle to improved water quality on Bear Lake. This and other suggested methods are addressed in a multi-year plan being prepared by the project team to pro-actively promote activities to manage and reduce phosphorus in Bear Lake. In the meantime, half dozen teams of landowners will continue efforts to trap and reduce the rusty crayfish population. The Plan also suggests actions such as:

1. Make efforts to control additional phosphorus inputs to Bear Lake by minimizing soil disturbance, setting back septic systems from lake, controlling runoff from roofs and other impervious surfaces, and minimizing the disturbance of natural shoreland vegetation. When possible, locate septic system drain fields a greater distance from the lake, particularly in areas of groundwater inflow.
2. Put measures into place to prevent the introduction of other exotic aquatic plants and animals. These measures should include prevention and early detection.
3. Continue monitoring the water quality and routine or annual aquatic plant surveys in Bear Lake to ensure data are available to determine if efforts are resulting in improvements or if re-direction of efforts is warranted. Following the WDNR's Citizen Lake Monitoring Network protocol helps to ensure continuity of the data from year to year. Water quality parameters should include phosphorus and chlorophyll a and temperature and dissolved oxygen profiles.

The above mentioned groups and agencies will be meeting over the next several months to review the document and discuss what actions can be taken to maintain the good water quality Bear Lake has this summer. Input from the public is always welcome.

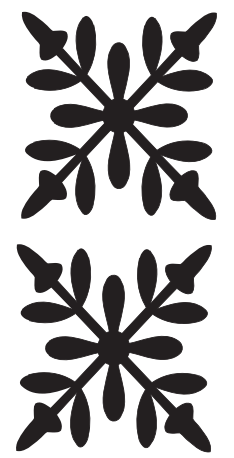

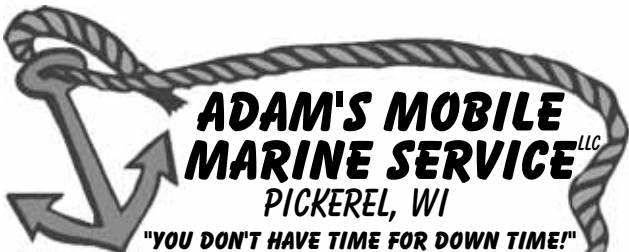

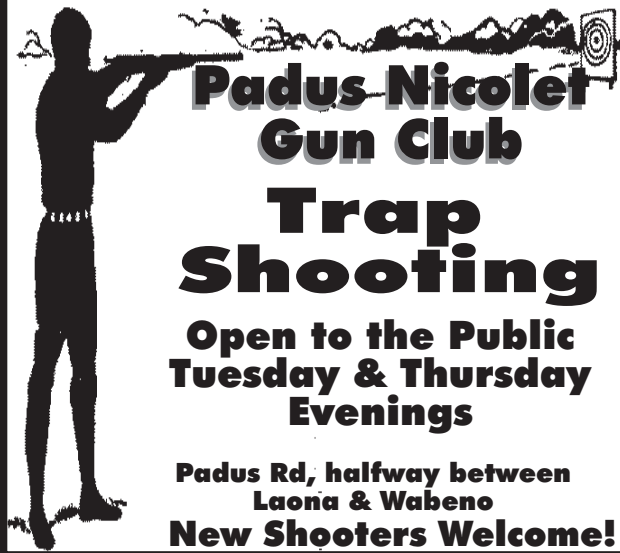

The Forest County Health Department recommends the following:

- *** Limit time spent outside at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes are most active.
- *** Apply insect repellent to clothing as well as exposed skin since mosquitoes may bite through clothing.
- *** Make sure window and door screens are in good repair to prevent mosquito entry.
- *** Properly dispose of items that hold water, such as tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots, or discarded tires.
- *** Clean roof gutters and downspouts for proper drainage.
- *** Turn over wheelbarrows, wading pools, boats, and canoes when not in use.
- *** Change the water in birdbaths and pet dishes at least every three days.
- *** Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs; drain water from pool covers.
- *** Trim tall grass, weeds, and vines since mosquitoes use these areas to rest during hot daylight hours.
- *** Landscape to prevent water from pooling in low-lying areas.



The majority of people (80%) who are infected with West Nile virus do not get sick. Those who do become ill usually experience mild symptoms such as fever, headache, muscle ache, rash, and fatigue. Less than 1% of people infected with the virus get seriously ill with symptoms that include high fever, muscle weakness, stiff neck, disorientation, mental confusion, tremors, confusion, paralysis, and coma. Older adults (age 50+) and those with compromised immune systems are at greater risk of developing central nervous system illness that can be fatal.

The Department of Health Services has monitored the spread of West Nile virus since 2001 among wild birds, horses, mosquitoes, and people. During 2002, the state documented its first human infections with 52 cases reported that year. During 2012, 57 cases of West Nile virus infection were reported among Wisconsin residents, the highest annual number of cases reported since surveillance began in Wisconsin. in humans have been reported from June through October; however, most reported becoming ill with West Nile virus in August and September.

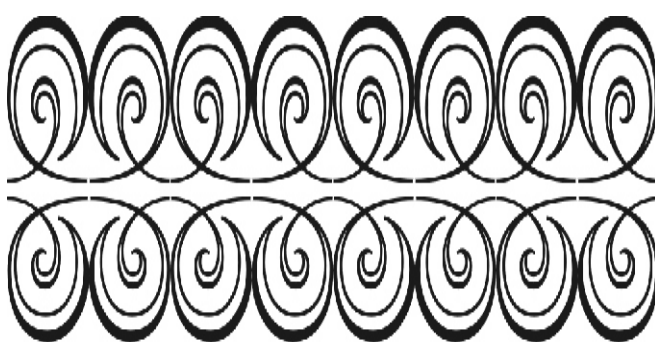

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS

The Board of the School District of Wabeno Area shall allow persons to have access to school district records in accordance with this policy and implementing procedures and in accordance with the law.

The district administrator is designated as the legal custodian of records. The legal custodian shall safely keep and preserve records of the authority and shall have full legal power to render decisions and carry out duties related to those records maintained by any school district authority. The legal custodian may deny access to records only in accordance with the law.

Public records may be inspected, copied and/or abstracted at any time during the established district office hours, which are from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. The legal custodian may establish fees for services in accordance with the law. A list of fees is available at the district office.

STUDENT RECORDS

Student records are maintained to assist students, parents, guardians, and the school in achieving the student's educational goals. Such records are accumulated, maintained, released, transferred, and eventually destroyed by the building principal or his/her designee in accordance with state and federal law. Only those individuals or agencies specifically authorized by state and federal law shall be granted access to a student's records.

The school district does forward records to other schools that have requested the records and in which the student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled, as long as the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer.

An adult student or the parent/guardian of a minor student may inspect the student's records in accordance with administrative policy and established procedures and may challenge the content if he/she believes the records are inaccurate or misleading. Such a complaint would be filed with the building principal. If not satisfied with the decision, an appeal avenue is available through the Family Policy and Regulations Office of the U.S. Department of Education.

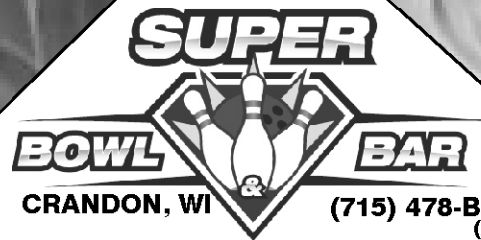

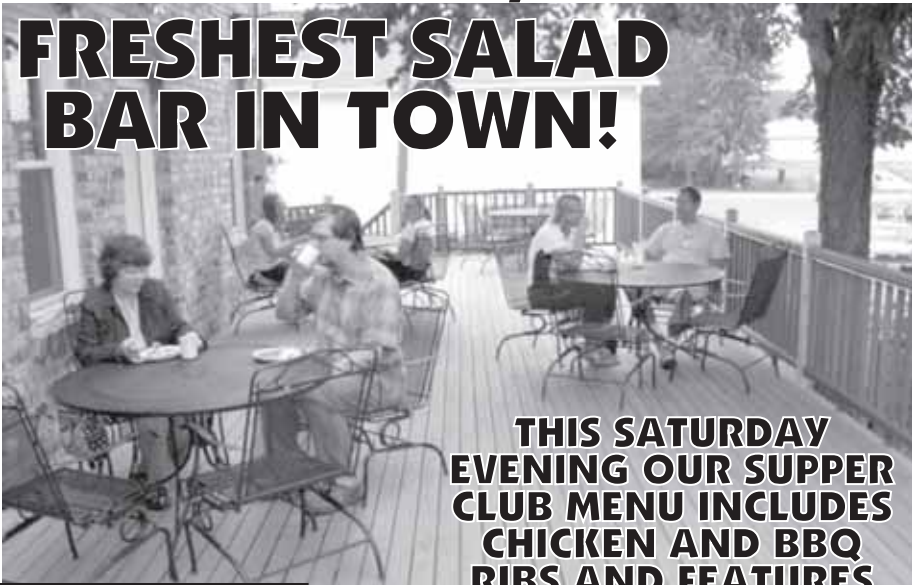
