Massive influx of west coast-based drivers are prepared to run Crandon

... the Famous Land Rush start awaits!

CRANDON, Wis., (August, 2013) - Great news emanating from Crandon International Off-Road Raceway's front office today as a slew of west coast-based drivers have confirmed that they'll be racing the upcoming World Championship®, Aug. 30 - Sept. 1, rounds 14 & 15 of the Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL - the first in synthetics.

The list reads like a 'who's who' of top divers, including Brian Deegan, RJ Anderson and Sheldon Creed, along with former TORC PRO Light class champ Andrew Caddell. Additional PRO Light racers registered for the Crandon World Championship® include: Jerett Brooks, Bradley Morris, Jimmy Stephenson and Jessie Johnson (Robby Gordon's SST driver and member of the Johnson Racing family of Charlotte, NC).

"I'll tell you what ... there's no better place to be than along the Potawatomi Turn One at Crandon when we turn those PRO Lights loose on the Land Rush start," said Crandon's Cliff Flannery. "There's gonna be a year's worth of bragging rights on the line as to who's truly the best driver in the country crowned the PRO Light World Champion® on Saturday!"

The west coast aces will certainly have their hands full with the stars from the Traxxas TORC Series, including top overall racer CJ Greaves (Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis), 2nd place Keegan Kincaid (Traxxas/AMSOIL/Maxxis), 3rd place Brad Lovell (AMSOIL/Torchmate/BFG) and a host of others in this epic East vs. West shootout!

In addition to the stacked TORC PRO Light field, top PRO 2WD racers Robbie Woods, Mike Porter and Austin Kimbrell will be joined by desert racing greats Dan McMillan (grandson of Baja legend Corky McMillan) Robbie Pierce (owner of Mastercraft Safety) and Jesse Jones to enhance the already stacked TORC PRO 2WD field featuring Bryce Menzies (Red Bull/KMC Wheels/Peak), the two-time defending TORC PRO 2WD champion, and Rob MacCachren, who dominated Sunday's action at the past RedBud/TORC round.

In the PRO 4x4s it'll be Curt & Todd LeDuc making the trek from California to see if they can get between the red hot Rick Johnson/Johnny Greaves rivalry at Crandon - a spot TORC regulars Scott Douglas, Adrian Cenni and Mike and Mark Jenkins already have their eye on as well!

With racers and trucks/buggies, crews and off-road fans converging from all points on the U.S. map, the small logging town of Crandon, Wisc., (population: 1,961) is awash in activity. And since 1970 the off-road phenomenon has played out in Crandon, making it the nation's longest-running short course off-road competition. For more information please visit www.crandonoffroad.com

Crandon Raceway parade instructions

The Annual Off-Road Parade in downtown Crandon begins with a police escort for race teams in their race vehicles from the Track's back gate at 8:30 a.m. on Friday morning. Racers are escorted down Highway 8 into Crandon and, assisted by Raceway officials, are parked in the parking spaces on both sides of Lake Ave.

Everyone is welcome to enter a float into the parade. Floats are required to be "race related" and all floats are included in the competition with a purse for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. No pre-entry or fee is required. Floats are encouraged to (carefully & safely) pass candy or goodies to the kids. Floats are positioned by the Fire Dept. in the order they are received at the South end of Lake Avenue between 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.

From 9:00 a.m. until Noon the Raceway hosts Race Team competitions at the corner of Lake and Madison Avenues. Race teams are encouraged to enter the competitions: Tire Changing | Truck Push | Sharpest Looking Crew followed by the Amsoil Challenge Cup drivers meeting.

The City fire whistle blows at high noon, signaling the beginning of the parade, led by a high school marching band, the Veterans Color Guard, and reigning AMSOIL Cup Champion parade marshal. As the tail end of the parade passes each race vehicle, they fall in behind and return to the Raceway on Highway 8.

Can Pier Pressure control milfoil in Metonga?

Wherever we go in the North we see and hear about invasive species invading our lakes and countryside. For many, it's a new thing, for property owners on Lake Metonga it's 'OLD HAT'. We have lived with Rusty Crayfish for over thirty years, Zebra Mussels for about ten and have held our own against the most destructive invasive of all - Eurasian Water Milfoil. EWM for short. This "Beast" has been one tough customer to reckon with. Eradication is impossible, control has proven to be the next best option. Over the last six years we have spent an average of about \$43,000 per year to monitor the EWM problem. The Wisconsin DNR, through the Grant Process, has provided funding to assist in a portion of the cost of treatment, control and consultant fees. Forest County, the City of Crandon, Town of Lincoln, and the County Park Leaders recognize that Lake Metonga is a valuable resource that attracts the local public and tourists whose spending benefit the economy in Crandon and surrounding area. Since 2011 a total of \$11,500 per year was funded by municipalities. The Lake Metonga Association provided the Grant writing, program administration and remaining costs. Securing these funds through "Membership Fees and Donations" and "Raffles" has been a real test for a few dedicated Association Members.

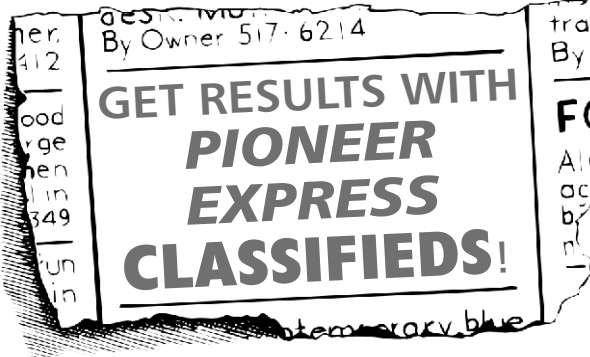





While I wish my hose hadn't exploded, I can't say enough good about the people who helped us.

PUBLIC RELEASE - National School Lunch And Breakfast Programs, Special Milk Program

As children need healthy meals to learn, it is the policy of the School District of Laona to serve all students breakfast and lunch free of charge each school day. The School District of Laona is eligible to receive reimbursement for part of the cost of these meals through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). For those students who qualify for free or reduced price meals, based on their household size and income level or due to receipt of FoodShare, FDPIR, or W-2 cash benefits, DPI will reimburse the school at a higher rate.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals if a student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals, households must fill out the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals for children for whom households receive FoodShare FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, an adult member needs only to list the names of the school children, give FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number for each child, sign his/her name and return the application to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or write "none" if they do not have a Social Security Number. Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal, the high school secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to:

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time.

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 does authorize the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WABENO AREA ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Wabeno Area is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Deb Wall, Director of Special Education, School District of Wabeno Area, at 715-473-2592, or by writing her at P.O. Box 460, Wabeno, WI 54566.

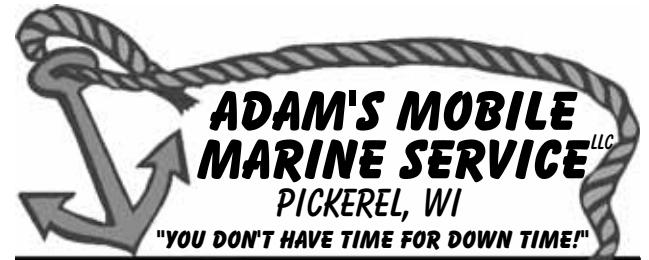

In addition to restocking, Trump Lake Protective Association has been working with Greg Matzke, Fisheries Biologist for Florence & Forest Counties, to improve the fish population and fishing experience on Trump Lake. Two surveys conducted in 2011 indicated that largemouth

bass have become overabundant and because of this, the bass are not reaching the legal size limits. They are competing for available food, namely, panfish, and thus depleting the panfish numbers. Biologist Matzke has recommended changes to the size and limit of largemouth bass which would go into effect in the Spring of 2014.

DMV five-day customer service centers extend hours

Starting September 3, all five-day centers will be open to the public 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. After Labor Day if you're planning to visit one of DMV's five-day customer service centers, you'll have a little bit more time in the week to do it – almost two hours more, in fact. "Rather than having different hours on various days of the week, all 29 of DMV's five-day centers will now have uniform hours and will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. Monday through Friday," notes Bureau of Field Services Director Donna Brown-Martin. "Currently, our five-day centers open early on one week day and stay open late on another. Sometimes customers will show up early thinking it is an early-open day, or arrive late thinking it is a late-close day, and discover that they had the day wrong. Consistent hours will make it much easier for our customers to remember, and that is important to us." This schedule includes 41.25 open service hours per week, per location – an increase of 1 hour and 45 minutes per week. DMV would like to remind customers that driver license and ID products are good for eight years, minimizing the need to travel to a customer service location. Additionally, many services including vehicle registration renewal and some title services can be found online at the official Wisconsin DMV web site: www.wisconsin.gov. You can do them at any time, and save yourself a trip. Lastly, notes Brown-Martin, "remember to always look for .gov in the web address. Private, for-profit sites will not contain .gov. These sites carry our information and forms but will charge for them. Forms are always free from DMV, so go to www.wisconsin.gov."

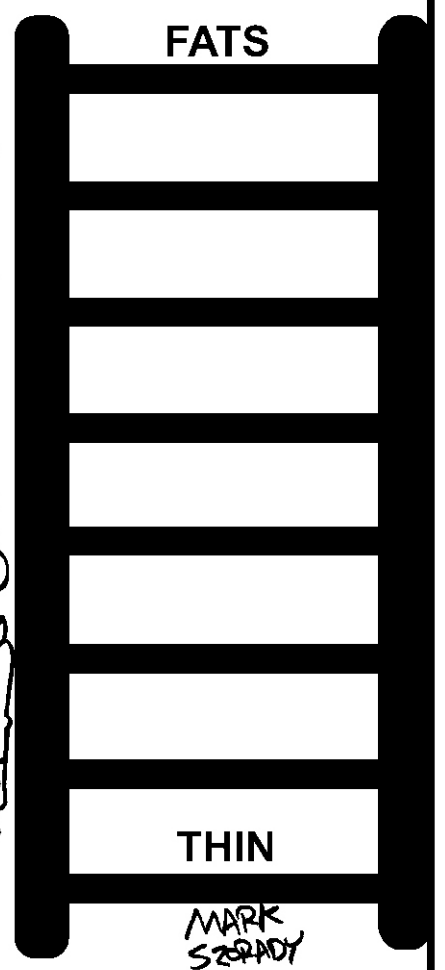

Early Canada goose and mourning dove seasons open Sept. 1

MADISON – With cooler nights and Labor Day approaching, hunters may be thinking about the first fall hunting seasons, including early Canada goose and mourning dove seasons.

The early Canada goose season in Wisconsin runs Sept. 1 to Sept. 15, statewide. The dove season runs Sept. 1 to Nov. 9, statewide.

The early Canada goose season, with a more liberal bag limit than the regular season, is allowed by federal rules due to the growth of local giant Canada goose populations.

During the spring waterfowl survey, Wisconsin's resident breeding goose population estimate was 138,925.

The early season harvest last fall was estimated at 21,302 and makes up roughly one-third of the total annual Canada goose harvest in Wisconsin.

"The early season provides additional recreational opportunities for our goose hunters and directs harvest pressure toward these locally nesting geese," said Kent Van Horn, migratory game bird ecologist for the Department of Natural Resources.

The early season daily bag limit is five birds. In addition to the standard small game hunting license and state and federal waterfowl stamps, participation requires a \$3 early Canada goose permit and the federal Harvest Information Program (HIP) certification. Registering for HIP is free and can be done at any DNR Service Center or licensing sales agent.

There are no "zones" or "subzones" during the early season. The hunt is statewide regardless of what area hunters may hold a permit for during the regular goose season.

In addition to slitting the date of harvest on their permit, hunters must register their harvest within 48 hours by calling 1-800-99-GOOSE (1-800-994-6673).

"Canada goose feeding and loafing areas can be very different in September than later in the fall and resident geese often change feeding and movement this time of year," Van Horn said. "Continued scouting is important during these early hunts, when crop harvest and bird patterns can often change abruptly."

Mourning dove season details and tips

Mourning doves are the most abundant game bird in North America, with populations slowly growing.

"Dove hunting is a great way to introduce new hunters to bird hunting," said Van Horn.

"It's one of the earliest game bird seasons to open so weather is generally mild, access to hunting spots is generally easier and you don't have to head out too early to have good opportunities."

On average, about 10,000 to 15,000 Wisconsin hunters harvest 100,000 to 200,000 mourning doves each year.

"As with Canada geese, mourning dove hunters should benefit from scouting to see where birds are flying as they move between roosts, water and feeding areas," said Van Horn.

Like with goose hunters, dove hunters must also be HIP certified to be in compliance with state and federal law.

"The national HIP registry allows biologists to select hunters to receive mail surveys in order to collect information about important harvest information and participation," said Van Horn.

To help provide increased bird hunting opportunities, DNR staff, often in partnership with local farmers, planted sunflower fields on state and leased lands.

"In 2013 there were successful fields in 11 counties which should provide excellent dove hunting opportunity," said Van Horn. "Dove field management has continued and provides excellent opportunity for sportsmen and women, particularly those just beginning the tradition of hunting."

"The late, wet spring made planting challenging and often later than intended, so hunters are encouraged to check that fields are mature and attracting birds before heading out opening morning," said Van Horn.

Ducks Unlimited again worked with Dow AgroSciences to provide a donation of 85 bags of sunflower seed to the DNR, at a value of over \$18,000. "This generous donation really highlights the importance of a variety of partners to Wisconsin sportsmen and women," said Van Horn. "This generous donation helped to provide increased bird hunting opportunities in Wisconsin."

Weed fields and shallow water areas can also be good locations for dove hunting, Van Horn said.

Additionally, Van Horn offers the following dove hunting regulation and safety reminders:

- Doves are migratory birds so hunters must use a plugged shotgun with a capacity not to exceed three shells in the magazine and chamber combined.
- Nontoxic shot is required to hunt doves on all DNR managed lands.
- Look for dove bands. Doves are banded to help with population monitoring and harvest management. Pay attention for a small silver band on one leg of harvested doves and follow reporting instructions on the band.
- Be safe! Hunters need to be absolutely aware of their target and beyond, especially when hunting on smaller fields that see high use. Avoid shooting at low-flying birds or at birds on the ground.

Preliminary results foster quick action, reflect good news and some surprises

LAKE GORDON, FOREST COUNTY – County staff over the weekend pulled by hand patches of an aggressive invasive species they found earlier that week in the Nicolet National Forest, illustrating a key side benefit emerging from a five-year effort led by the Department of Natural Resources to survey lakes statewide for aquatic invasive species.

The surveys are allowing DNR staff, local partners and volunteers to identify early infestations of invasive species and, as they did Saturday with the yellow floating heart, take immediate steps to get rid of them before the invaders' populations have a chance to expand.

"The surveys are having an immediate benefit, as we saw with Lake Gordon," says Maureen Ferry, who is coordinating the survey for DNR. "We've had many instances where they've turned up new populations of invasive species that DNR and partners have been able to address immediately."

Yellow floating heart is a concern because it can grow in dense patches, excluding native species, creating areas with low oxygen levels underneath the floating mats, and interfering with fishing, swimming and boating. The discovery last week of yellow floating heart in Lake Gordon is believed to be the first time the plant has been found in an inland Wisconsin lake; it had previously only been found in a few private ponds. Possession, sale, transfer and introduction of the species is illegal in Wisconsin without a permit.

John Preuss, Lumberjack Resource Conservation and Development aquatic invasives coordinator for Lincoln, Langlade and Forest counties, found the yellow floating heart mid-week when he was conducting surveys on Lake Gordon with DNR aquatic invasive species specialists Jennifer Steltenpohl and Ryan Mottiff.

Preuss returned to the lake Saturday with Chris Hamerla, AIS coordinator for the Golden Sands Resource Conservation and Development Council, and the two spent hours carefully pulling the plant from near a boat landing and campsite.

"We hand-pulled the two populations on Saturday and pulled a total of six-and-a half bags," Preuss says. "We took our time and believe we did a good job. We made sure to get the rhizome and did our best to make sure no pieces escaped. We made sure to get under the roots and get them out of the sediment."

Preuss will work with the U.S. Forest Service to monitor Lake Gordon and nearby lakes and increase awareness among campers of yellow floating heart.

Surveys to detect aquatic invasive species are taking place this summer on 200 randomly selected lakes with public access. The effort, funded through the federal Great Lakes Restoration Initiative, is the first of this scale in the United States and will result in more than half of Wisconsin's 1,600 lakes with public access being monitored for invasive species, says Ferry.

Monitoring includes people in boats doing a visual survey along the entire lakeshore, snorkeling at all boat launches and at "high risk" locations, raking up plants to see if Eurasian water-milfoil and other plant invaders are present, and dipping nets into the water to look for invasive waterfleas and juvenile zebra mussels.

Ferry says the surveys are ultimately aimed at helping DNR and partners know how widespread the different invasive species are and if the rate they are spreading is increasing, decreasing, or staying the same. Such information can better help direct prevention and control efforts in the future, she says.

Right now, though, the surveys are paying off by fostering a rapid response to new discoveries when they are often more easily and less expensively addressed.

Last summer, for instance, DNR staffer Matt Hager spotted just six strands of Eurasian water milfoil, a harmful non-native plant that chokes lakes and clogs propellers, as he boated and snorkeled slowly across the surface of North Lake in Florence County. He carefully hand pulled the plants for disposal before alerting the Spread Eagle Chain of Lakes Association. No new milfoil plants have been found so far in the 2013 surveys on North Lake. In addition, the Spread Eagle Chain of Lakes Association successfully applied for a Rapid Response Grant from the DNR that will allow them to monitor, map and hand pull any milfoil populations that may remain – as well as work with UWSP zebra mussel researchers on a long term adaptive management plan.

"The best part is when we've helped a community get the information and funds they need to keep a lake in good shape for their kids," Ferry says. "Boating, swimming, fishing and all."

Preliminary results from two years of monitoring

Preliminary results from two years of surveys for aquatic invasive species have found some good news and some surprises, Ferry says. "The good news is many of the potentially most harmful invasive species, like zebra mussels, occupy a tiny fraction of those lakes that provide suitable habitat for them."

University of Wisconsin research shows that of the 15,000 lakes in Wisconsin, about 4,000 are suitable for zebra mussel. The surveys have shown that only 164 lakes are invaded by zebra mussels.

Likewise, spiny water fleas have only been found in six waters. And 70 percent of the lakes with public access surveyed were free of Eurasian water-milfoil, despite its being in Wisconsin for more than 50 years and being documented to damage waters with high levels of the plant, Ferry says.

"It's too early in our surveys to tell whether the spread of certain species is slowing, speeding up or staying the same, but findings like these are encouraging. We're also encouraged that 93 percent of boaters say they're taking the prevention steps, and encouraged by the fantastic interest and commitment among lake association members and other volunteers to help increase awareness of invasive species and the steps we can all take to avoid spreading them."

One surprise from the surveys thus far is that one particular aquatic invasive species, mystery snails, is more widespread than thought. Studies to date, however, have documented little ecological harm from mystery snails, so DNR and partners are trying to figure out how much of a concern this species is, Ferry says.

"What we do know, however, is that mystery snails do not belong in Wisconsin waters. Their discovery reminds us that there are lots of new invasive species with the potential to establish and spread in Wisconsin," she says. "So we need to be vigilant and make sure to prevent these species from becoming the next big problem species."

That pesky "Funding Balance" is why I'm asking, the Lake Metonga Property Owners to set up and establish a continuous funding stream to keep EWM under control. It doesn't matter if you are an Association Member or not, you have a Stake in the game to maintain this resource and your subsequent property values.

We all know the, "How do we eat an elephant thing," well, that's how we get the funding stream in line. Now that more water bodies are becoming infected with invasives, the competition for WDNR Grant Funds is greater. So it is questionable as to whether or not Lake Metonga Association would be awarded a grant in the future.

Calculating the financial need is simple. Metonga has about 280 riparian properties. It is estimated that additional funds in the amount of \$20,000+ would likely be required each year. This equates to approximately \$70 per riparian property. Pretty basic so far! Now where do we go from here? I'm looking for 40 like-minded folks who are willing to contact six of their neighbors and convey the urgency of their participation in this noble effort. 100% participation is in the best interest of everyone who values the Lake, the waterfront property and recreational use. Less than that and EWM control could become EWM despair.

The formation of the Lake District to deal with this problem is an option that might need to be visited if we can't raise the \$20,000 annually. If you think you would be able to be one of the 40, call Gary Mueller at 715-478-2049 before Labor Day.

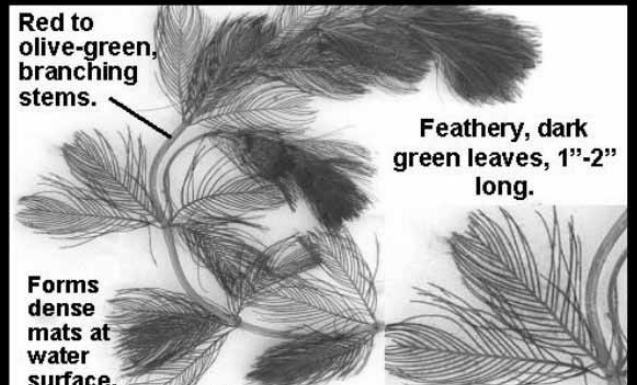

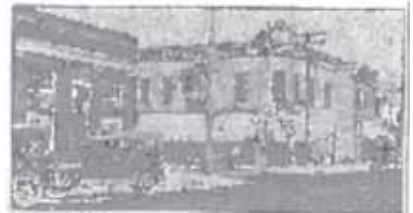

The visit was a chance to show Senator Baldwin what good forestry is and isn't. It also made a visible connection for the senator to the uses by our society of the products from our forests, from the stump to the sawmills and paper mills. Murray also told Senator Baldwin what raw forest products sold for and how a timber sale is advertised, sold and harvested.

From the woods in the Laona and Blackwell area, the tour traveled to the Forest County Potawatomi executive building near Crandon for a presentation by Dr. Gary Morishima about Forest Collaboratives and the Anchor Forest. While this excellent lecture pointed out the benefits of sound forest management and use, it was also a talk about working with the Forest Service through collaborative efforts with tribes and other units of government to put management, logging and jobs back into our national forests, and put money back into local school systems. Dr. Morishima pointed out that he works with tribal lands, and often tribal forests in Washington State are degraded when bordering unmanaged national forest lands. There is a concerted effort in the Pacific Northwest to work out cooperative efforts to put management back into these national forest lands.

After the lecture, the entourage visited the Infinity Flooring plant and Hometown Trolley in the Crandon Industrial Park. She was greeted by the Crandon Chamber, with Melinda Otto greeting Senator Baldwin and R.T. Krueger welcoming her on behalf of the Forest County Economic Development Partnership.

Senator Baldwin expressed the opinion that there would be opportunities for cooperation in Washington on correcting problems with national forest management changes. She said; "I have certainly been meeting with people who are getting it right."

She was referring to the local people who gave her a look at the situation that exists locally with our forests, and the lecture on silviculture delivered by Al Murray was clear, concise and easy to understand by a novice in the field of forest management, that used stark examples of what a healthy, managed forest looked like and a neglected and unmanaged forest looked like.

It is always uplifting to see an elected representative take the time to learn about the problems facing constituents, and Senator Baldwin did just that.
