The Forest County Potawatomi Health & Wellness and the Forest County Health Department each received a check for \$3,600.

Any money the Club makes goes toward scholarships and other awards, plus other student enrichment needs and activities.

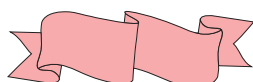
The Fair has become an event to both sell goods and to purchase early holiday gifts, with the added bonus of specially prepared cuisine.

The Off-Road Vehicle Park is discussed at County Board Meeting

I attended a meeting of the Forest County Board last Tuesday, October 15th. Besides the usual county business, there was a presentation by Jim Scheussler and John Schnorr on the proposed Wisconsin Off-Road Vehicle Park (WORVPI). This was the second time I listened to this presentation, and both times I left with more questions than answers, but to those not familiar with the project, I will give a brief description.

The proposed park will give off-road vehicle enthusiasts a place to run ATV's, 4x4 vehicles and other off-road machines in a variety of conditions. The park, we are told, will be on private land, and will consist of 10,000 acres. If the information presented is correct, off-roaders will pour into the area to visit what we were told will be the "Lambeau Field" of off-road vehicle parks. This would be a massive undertaking. That acreage, using 640 acres to the square mile, means that the proposed project will use approximately 15.63 square miles of forest. If I heard correctly, there would be about 1,000 miles of trails winding their way through the park. The people using the facility would be spending heavily for services, food and gasoline in the area, and it would be a huge economic impact to the area, according to the presentation.

Because it will be on private property and not on national forest, county or tribal land, the property will have to be purchased, there will be cost of construction for the trails, campground and administrative and public buildings. The largest economic impact presented at the meeting was to the hotel, restaurant and C-store businesses. The estimate is a \$6 million impact on lodging, restaurants and convenience stores.

Having a positive economic impact in Forest County is always treated as good news, and throughout the years, there often hasn't been enough of this kind of



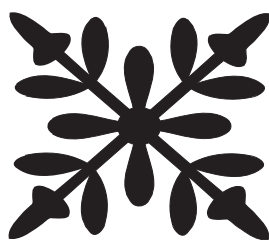

5 Healing Foods

Vanilla pudding triggers feel-good brain chemicals.

With its soothing scent and blend of protein and carbs, vanilla pudding prompts the brain to release serotonin - and the resulting surge of this mood-boosting neurotransmitter can shift the mind and body into a more relaxed state within three minutes, says Alan Hirsch, M.D., medical director of Chicago's Smell & Taste Treatment and Research Foundation. For best results, he suggests enjoying 1/2 cup on an empty stomach. This ensures that the protein and carbs are rapidly absorbed to maximize serotonin output.

White beans relax muscles.

Enjoying 1 cup of white beans can calm jangled nerves in 15 minutes, Stanford University researchers report. The credit goes to the beans' rich stores of potassium and magnesium. These minerals work to soothe the central nervous system and help muscles contract and release optimally.

Sweet potatoes switch off inflammation

These vibrant orange gems are nature's top source of beta-carotene. According to researchers at MedStar Georgetown University Hospital, this antioxidant quickly neutralizes the inflammatory proteins in the brain that damage stress-buffering neurons and inhibit the production of calming neurochemicals. These effects are so powerful, in fact, that women in a Canadian study who consumed 1 cup of sweet potatoes reported feeling calmer and more energized for up to three hours after eating.

Raisins stabilize blood sugar

Fluctuations in blood sugar can put the adrenal glands on edge, increasing their output of the stress-triggering hormone cortisol by as much as 33 percent. The easy Rx: munching on 1/2 cup of raisins. Researchers at Utah State University in Logan found that this fiber-rich treat helps optimize blood-sugar levels to soothe the adrenals and bring on feelings of calm in just 10 minutes.

Peppermint activates soothing brain waves

Savoring this minty candy can slash stress levels by 25 percent in as little as two minutes, asserts Dr. Hirsch. That's because the powerful combination of peppermint's cooling sensation and spicy aroma stimulates the olfactory nerve in the nose, signaling to the brain to amp up the production of calming alpha waves.

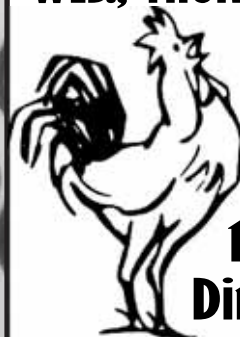

news, but then with the recent economic downturn, Forest County had a lot of company in that regard.

So what are some of the questions that arise from the building of this massive off-road park?

The first question that jumps into my mind and those of others who hunt and fish, is giving up productive hunting grounds to another outdoor pursuit. The answer to this question by the park promoters is that 15.62 square miles is a tiny fraction of the land base of the county, and hunting can still be done in the park.

But, while this amount of land seems tiny compared to the entire land base of the county, it isn't really a fair comparison. The entire land base of the county includes that portion of land occupied by towns, lakes, marshes, rivers, railroads and farm fields. Now, take into account the national forest lands that are barely logged and don't provide the emerging forests needed for game production, and that amount of land grows in importance to grouse hunters, bow hunters, gun-deer hunters and bear and coyote hunters. One also has to bear in mind that these private lands that are sought by the off-road promoters is managed forest land. Unlike national forest lands, these lands have been cut and provide the young forest growth essential to game management, as well as multitudes of non-game species. It would appear that what would benefit one group of land users comes at great expense to traditional uses of these lands, and often these same hunting areas have been hunted by generations of local and non-local hunters.

Certainly, we can always use more economic growth in the county, but we have to ask what we are giving up for what we get. It may be worth the loss or not, and that is a matter of personal opinion.

Our elected representatives on the Forest County Board deserve to hear your opinions on this proposed park, pro or con. Feel free to voice your opinions.

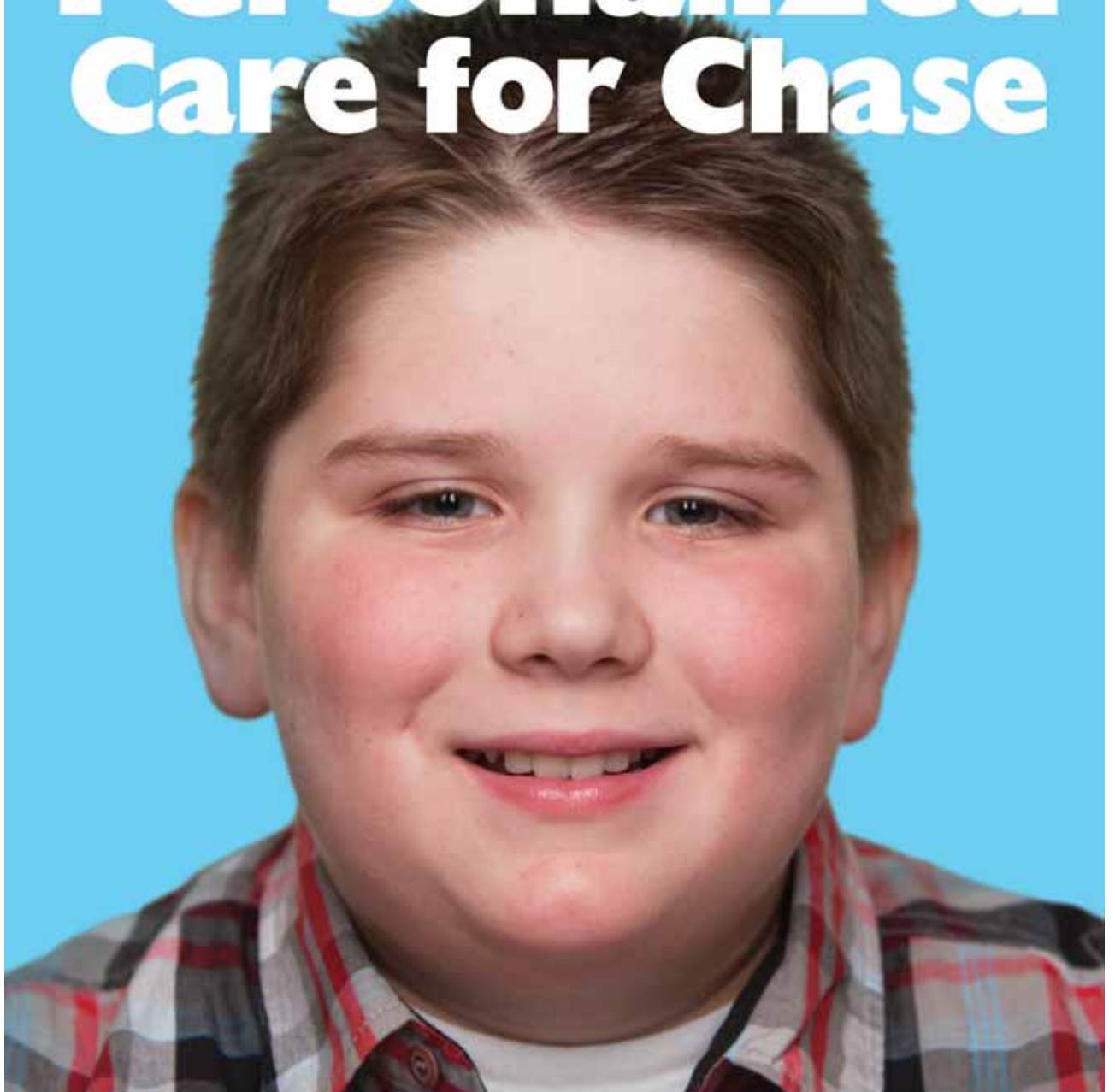
