Dedication held for Dave Uihlein Ruffed Grouse Management Area

Last Monday, October 21st, a group of people gathered on Keith Siding Road to dedicate a part of the Forest County Forest to grouse hunting and Dave Uihlein, Sr., a big supporter of the sport of grouse hunting and the Ruffed Grouse Society.

This piece of county forest has been and will be managed as a young, emerging, aspen forest to support game species like ruffed grouse, woodcock and whitetail deer will appreciate the habitat as well. The site consists of 2045 acres with entry points on Keith Siding Road, where the sign was placed as shown above. In addition to the mowed hunting trails, the site is also traversed by a snowmobile trail and an ATV trail.

The namesake of this piece of habitat was an ardent grouse and woodcock hunter, who spent a great deal of time on his hunting lands in the northern end of Forest County. Uihlein passed away at age 89, and the grouse and woodcock lost a good friend. He was the founder and president of the Milwaukee Chapter of the Ruffed Grouse Society, and was a very active person in the Society, which is why John Eichinger, President and CEO of the Ruffed Grouse Society made the trip from Pennsylvania to attend the opening.

Numerous speakers made speeches that were kept brief because of the wind and cold, including: County Board Chair Paul Millan, State Senator Tom Tiffany, 36th District Assemblyman Jeff Mursau, RGS Director James Hayett, Jane Severt-Executive Director of the Wisconsin County Forest Association, Chuck McCullough-DNR wildlife supervisor, and Dave Ziolkowski-Forest Administrator of the Forest County Forest and Parks Department.

Dave Ziolkowski talked of the work that RGS has done in Forest County, and gave praise to the volunteers that have worked to make the RGS Wild Rivers Chapter Banquet a resounding success and competitive with Wausau and even Milwaukee for raising money to support the Society.

RGS President John Eichinger said that the RGS has used volunteer workers for much of the work and fundraising that has established 600 projects like the recent one in this county, in 28 states that amount to 500,000 acres of wildlife habitat.

Eichinger said that Uihlein believed in healthy forests, abundant wildlife, and the sporting tradition, and with dedication of the new management area we were celebrating Dave Uihlein's beliefs in these three ideas.

It is also interesting to note, that the Uihlein name was associated with Forest County in the early days of the county. The Uihlein's, ancestors of Dave Uihlein, owned a very large tract of land in this county going back to the 1880's. The land around Lake Lucerne, then Stone Lake, was owned by the family, and a lodge was built on the north end of the lake where the Walerko family owns today. They were friends of the Wilcox family who owned, it is thought, the first resort in Forest County, also on the north end of the lake. It is also possible that the Uihleins bought the property after hunting with Wilcox.

They sold all of the land except for the site of their lodge, to the Page & Landeck Lumber Company around 1891. Page & Landeck had plans for a big sawmill in Crandon, but they had to wait for the Chicago & Northwestern to run a spur line in from Pelican Lake. That took ten years. It is likely that when the Uihleins visited their lodge and ran their steamboat around the lake, they had to come into the depot at Pelican Lake and complete the trip to Stone Lake by wagon.

In 1901, when the C&NW finally got around to running in the spur, a big sawmill on Clear Lake was

New loan funds available for economic development projects in Forest County

Forest County—In a move that is already producing additional capital development in Forest County, a new partnership has been formed with Central Wisconsin Economic Development (CWED) loan fund. Locally, Forest County's access to the fund will be administered through Forest County Economic Development Partnership.

"Our alignment with CWED provides us with access to millions of dollars for economic development projects in Forest County," stated FCEDP Board President RT Krueger.

CWED is one of only three 105(a)(15) organizations in Wisconsin as recognized by the Federal government. This means funds can become "defederalized" for broader economic development impact. Loan funds such as CWED are available for a variety of economic development projects including a Revolving Loan Fund, Micro Loan Fund, Façade Loan Fund, and a Capital Investment Fund. Loan funds for up to \$200,000 will be decided by a local committee and administered by FCEDP. Larger loans will also require approval by a regional committee.

These funds are loans, not grants, and do require a match. "CWED funds can help address the need for gap financing in projects which can be the difference of whether a project can move forward," stated Forest County Board Chairman Paul Millan. "These new projects can be good for our county through job creation of added county assets that can be good for the taxpayer."

Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) Secretary and CEO congratulated Forest County for the step and added "Inclusion in the [CWED] Fund will allow Forest County to leverage additional funds to support business development, and we here at WEDC support this in all ways possible."

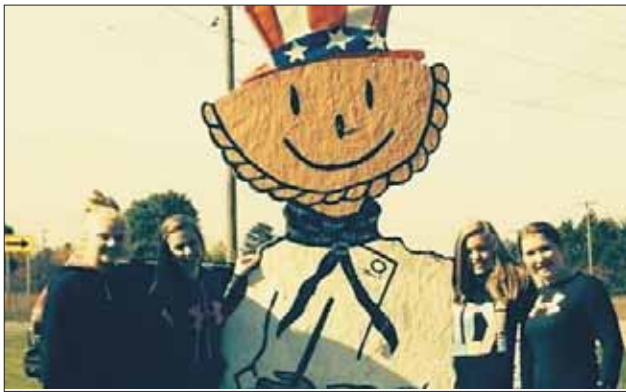

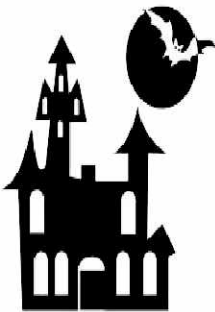

WE'RE LOSING LOCAL CONTROL, AGAIN

Big Government is at it again. Led by Senator Tom Tiffany, the State of Wisconsin is moving forward to limit our freedom to regulate ourselves on the local level. Senator Tiffany's newest attempt to thwart local governance is his proposed draft legislation that will prevent local governments from regulating nonmetallic mining.

Town government has been a hallmark of Wisconsin even before statehood in 1848. Presently, Wisconsin has 1,259 towns in which 30.1% of us live. The Wisconsin Town's Association (WTA) website motto is "Lose Local Government, And You Will Lose America." The WTA points out that "towns are the last refuge of direct democracy."

Today this essential component of democracy in Wisconsin is under threat again by our State legislators.

Senator Tiffany has drafted a bill to severely limit local governments' use of police powers. Police powers allow a local government, such as a town, to regulate conduct and property of some folks for the safety and property of all. Zweifelhofer v. Town of Cooks Valley (2012).

Bothered by the Wisconsin Supreme Court's decision in Zweifelhofer to support a local town government's right to regulate nonmetallic mining, Senator Tiffany has spent his time drafting legislation to prevent local governments from having an effective voice in deciding how nonmetallic mining works in their own jurisdictions.

Senator Tiffany's draft legislation is titled LRB 2146/1. According to the Legislative Reference Bureau analysis of the bill, the bill limits the authority of local governments to regulate nonmetallic mining. For example, the bill:

- Prohibits a local government from enacting or enforcing a nonmetallic mining reclamation ordinance that requires more restrictive standards than those of the DNR.
- Prohibits a local government from establishing or enforcing its own standard of water or air quality.
- Eliminates a county's current right to administer an air pollution control program.
- Prohibits a local government from, other than regulating blasting schedules, regulating the use of explosives in connection with mining and quarrying.
- Limits the liability for damage to a highway that a local government is presently entitled to collect from a highway user.

In an email dated October 16, 2013, Senator Tiffany and co-sponsor Representative Joan Ballweg, urged legislative colleagues to contact them in regard to the proposed legislation by Noon on October 21, 2013. The bill did not even have a number. As of Sunday, October 20, 2013, no committee hearings were scheduled to address the legislation.

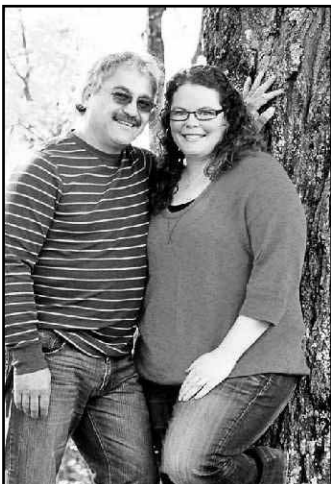
Yet Senator Tiffany is attributed as saying that he hopes his committee, the Senate Committee on Workforce Development, Forestry, Mining and Revenue, can hold a hearing on the bill next Thursday (10/24/13). Article, 10/17/13, WisconsinWatch.org.

Do not doubt that this piece of legislation is the end of a concerted effort by legislators to limit our right to govern ourselves on the local level. Today the assault is on local control of nonmetallic mining. Tomorrow there will be legislation to prevent local control of metallic mining, both ferrous and nonferrous. Folks in the Town of Lynne, in Iron and Ashland counties - beware.

If you live in a town, village, or city, if you care about the county in which you live, become informed about this newest attempt to limit our freedom to govern ourselves. Then act.

Dear Mike,

I just read your article regarding the proposed off-road vehicle park and I must say "Thank you!" With what may seem to be (and could very well have been your intention) in opposition to one of our local economic initiatives, you are providing poignant support of another. When discussing the potential loss of hunting land, you write, "take into account the National Forest lands that are barely logged and don't provide the emerging forests needed for game production." And later, "these private lands that are sought by the off-road promoters (U)nlike national forest lands, ... have been cut and provide the young forest growth essential to game management, as well as a multitude of non-game species."

I couldn't agree more, however I don't view this situation as a reason to prevent the development of an off-road park, but rather a challenge to better manage our National Forest lands. As I write this letter, the three-part expose on timber management that will run in several major Wisconsin newspapers has yet to come out, but, by the time my letter is published, it will. This series of articles is an in-depth look at the local situation and I expect they will lead to extensive discussion (even more than usual) on the topic.

Forest County is poised to make significant progress toward restoring appropriate management of public forest lands. We have major collaborative strategies coming together locally and we have garnered significant notice of the issue at the Federal level. The persistence of a few voices over the past couple decades and a recent organization of voices into a unified message, has created real promise.

As for the ORV park, I don't expect there to be unanimous support of the proposed project, but I would ask you and your readers this question - Is it more appropriate to manage public forest lands for better hunting habitat and pursue private land for the off-road vehicle park?

The promoters of this project realize that there will be opposition - significant effort has already gone into developing a scenario that addresses and minimizes concerns as much as possible. The project is at a point where confidentiality is justifiably at its highest level making it difficult to dispel or even address many of the concerns, but that period will be over in a few months and folks will have ample opportunities for input. The time, effort and dollars required for this project make it imperative that the proposal create the least local opposition possible - any other strategy would be a total waste of resources.

The State of Wisconsin has stated that there WILL BE an ORV park somewhere. Somebody, some county, will realize the economic benefits of the park - estimated to be as much as \$28 million annually. Forest County has the land, the plan and the tradition - it is up to us, through discussion and debate, to determine if it is something we want.

Once again, Mike, I appreciate your providing a forum and fodder for this and other important local debates. Sincerely,

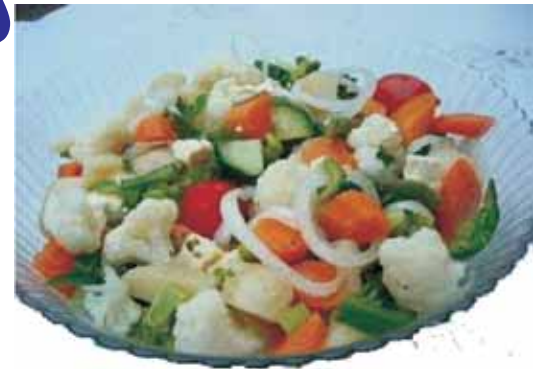

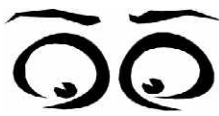

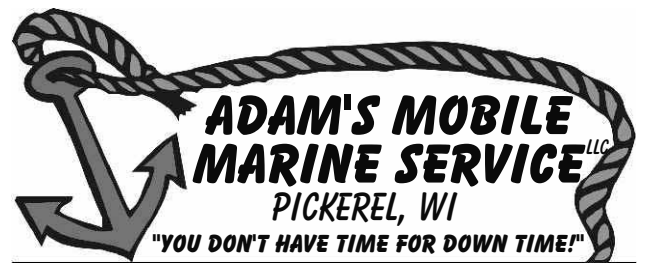

2014 Tax Levy Summary Impact on Homeowners

The Forest County Tax Levy is \$5,338,105, which is levied at a rate of \$4.86 (up from \$4.55) per \$1,000 of equalized value on all eligible property in the County.

However, you may see a decrease of tax on the County portion of the 2013 tax bill even though the overall mill rate increased.

Due to the varied assessment ratios of equalized values determined by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue and property value changes (inflation/deflation), the tax bill impact on a specific property will vary. Forest County's equalized value for 2013 is 1,097,316,700 a decrease of 44,801,500 from 2012.

It is also possible that the site of the new ruffed grouse management area was owned by ancestors of Dave Uihlein, which makes the name even more fitting.



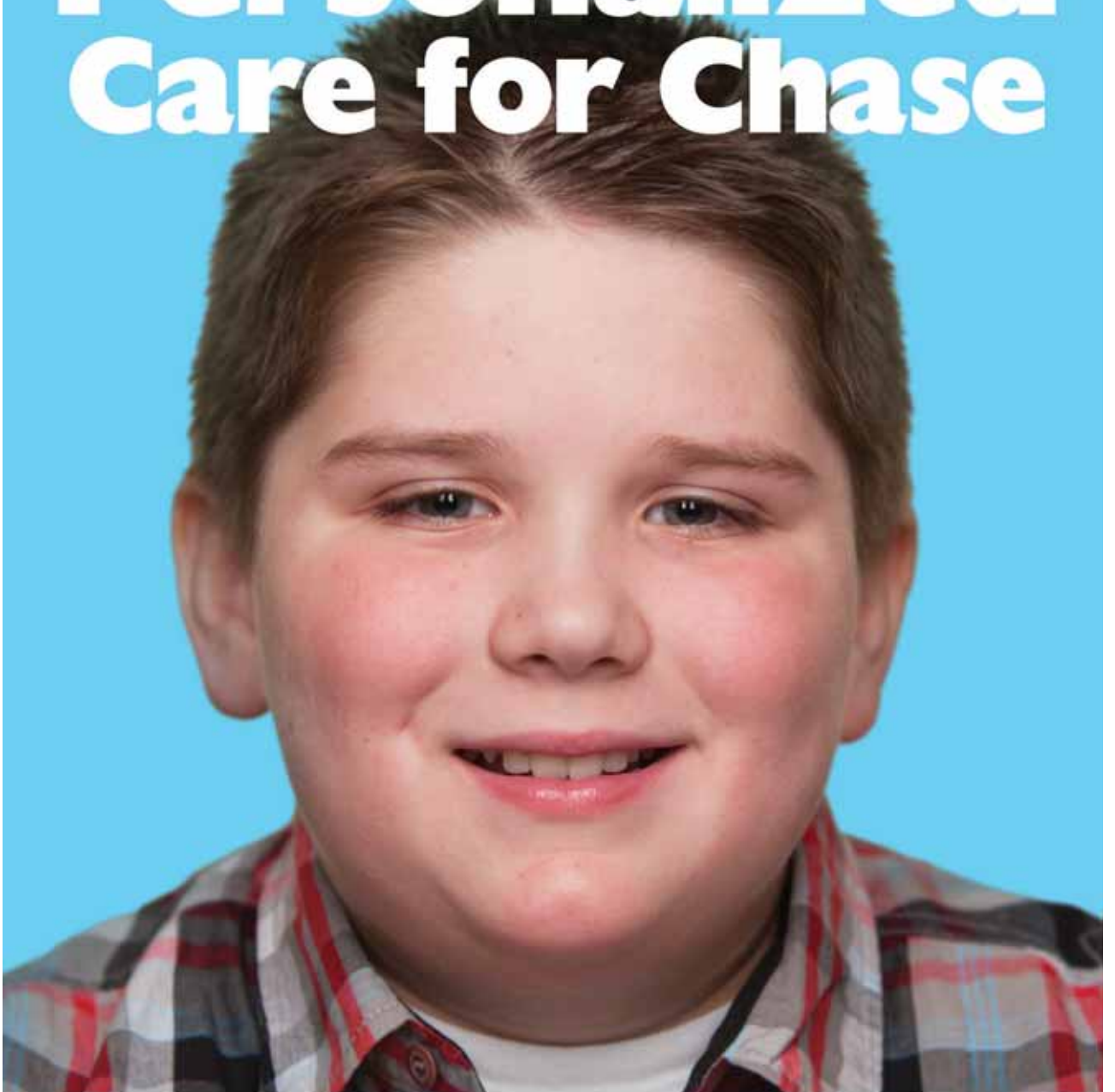
The Uihlein lodge from a distance above and a close-up shot is shown below, as is the steam launch they used on the lake.

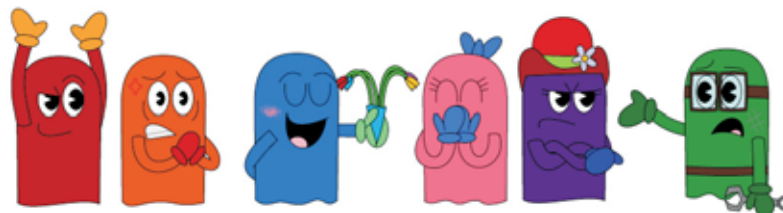
