

## FCP Donates to Forest County Law Enforcement

The FCP tribe donated approximately \$237,000 to the Forest County Law Enforcement to provide the number of equipped officers needed to patrol the reservation land in Forest County. This includes Stone Lake, Carter and surrounding reservation lands. The officers will be working 24 hours a day seven days a week in order to have law enforcement present on tribal land.

These officers will be part of the FCP community. You will most likely see them at community events getting to know the people and eventually you will be able to know them on personal basis. FCP Chairman Gus Frank quoted, "This is a step in the right direction for dedicated officers to serve our lands and this has been a long time coming."

Sheriff John Dennee replied with, "This is continued collaboration between Forest County Law Enforcement and the FCP tribe to keep our communities safe. The same officers will be working the same shifts and will be at community events showing their service."

Paul Millan, Forest County Board Chairman, also commented, "It's a great step in the right direction. It shows unity and continued support with government and tribes. We are all working towards a common goal."


#### The Lake Metonga Association and the Forest County Association of Lakes Sponsor a Lake Outing

#### Antigo Elks donate to Wabeno & Laona schools




