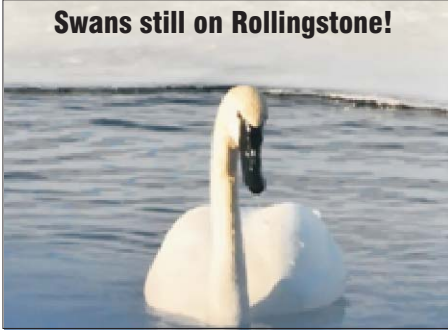

Snowmobile Clubs praise Joint Finance Committee

Action taken Wednesday by the Legislature's Joint Finance Committee to stabilize Wisconsin's ailing snowmobile program was praised by club leaders throughout the state and by officers of the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC).

Regarded as the major driver of Wisconsin's winter tourism economy, snowmobiling relies almost exclusively on clubs and their members to provide and maintain nearly 25,000 miles of trails located throughout the state.

"Without snowmobile clubs, there would be no trails," stated Doug Johnson, AWSC President. "We love our sport, and we foster a family-oriented recreation that many businesses rely and thrive on." Johnson said the Joint Finance Committee's actions, which emulate programs successfully implemented in two eastern states, would bring much-needed revenue and additional manpower through incentives designed to boost club participation.

The measure was introduced by Representatives Mary Czaja and Chris Danou, and by Senators Richard Gudex and Bob Jauch. It garnered the support of the Wisconsin Association of Convention & Visitors Bureaus, Wisconsin Hotel and Lodging Association, Wisconsin Petroleum Marketers & Convenience Store Association, Wisconsin Restaurant Association, and the Tavern League of Wisconsin.

Local Chapter banquet to benefit habitat for ruffed grouse and woodcock

On Saturday evening, March 29th, the Nicolet/Wild Rivers Chapter of the Ruffed Grouse Society will be holding its 23rd annual conservation banquet at the Crandon Community Center. Doors open at 5:15 p.m. Tickets for the banquet are \$50 for individuals and include a membership and dinner. Tickets for a member and a spouse are \$70 and tickets for children are \$20 each. Funds generated at this banquet will be used to improve habitat for ruffed grouse and woodcock in Northeastern Wisconsin.

Banquet Chairman Craig Williams says, "We invite folks to join us at this year's banquet and support our continuing efforts to enhance ruffed grouse and woodcock populations in the area. Funds from this year's banquet are targeted for continuing the development of the 2,045 acre David V. Uihlein Sr. Ruffed Grouse Management Area south of Crandon on the Forest County Forest that we dedicated last October."

Since its inception, the Ruffed Grouse Society has provided over 3.5 million dollars for 600 projects in 28 states, encompassing more than a half a million acres. In

scientists report that the protein in these gems nourishes and heals the pancreas, cutting the risk of blood-sugar fluxes by 30 percent.

MANGOS switch on happiness genes. The genes that produce mood-elevating brain chemicals (like dopamine and oxytocin) often become sluggish when sunlight is in short supply. To counteract this, Dr. Nadeau advises treating yourself to 1 cup of mango daily. The reason: Rich stores of vitamin A in this tropical delight stimulate genes to work at peak efficiency - an effect that can boost happiness within 72 hours.

BROCCOLI calms the brain. As cold season sets in, immune cells work hard to fend off illness - and in the process, they deplete stores of folate, a B vitamin that helps regulate the brain's anxiety center. But enjoying 1 cup of broccoli a day has been shown to correct folate shortfalls in 7 days and curb irritability by 45 percent.

SALMON corrects vitamin D shortfalls. Nearly 90 percent of women endure a mood-sapping vitamin D deficiency each fall, since the body needs UV rays to synthesize this happiness hormone, says Michael Holick, M.D., Ph.D., a professor of medicine at Boston University. But eating salmon daily cuts the risk of low moods by 67 percent. This fish is a top source of D, plus its omega-3s boost the vitamin's absorption by 50 percent.



MACADAMIAS rev feel-good serotonin. When the days grow shorter, diminished exposure to sunlight can hinder the production of the antidepressant hormone serotonin and leave you feeling blah. The easy Rx: Munch on 2 oz. of macadamia nuts a day. Stanford University researchers say the tryptophan in these crunchers stimulates serotonin production to cut the risk of shortfalls in half - and lift your mood within 10 days.

EGGS prevent blood-sugar swings. The physiological strain for adapting to cooler temperatures can disrupt the ability of the pancreas to keep blood-sugar levels and insulin steady. we have been bearing much of the cost and providing nearly all of the trail miles - to the benefit of all snowmobilers." Adjustments to snowmobile registration rates have not occurred since 2001 while the cost of fuel and other expenses have risen and the number of snowmobile trail miles has grown. "As volunteers we've been stretched thin, in many areas to the breaking point, and we need people out on the trails and money to keep operations going," Newman added. "Legislators took a major step toward bringing relief to those of us who have been paying out-of-pocket to keep the program vibrant."

Mike Giese of the Wolfs Pack Snowmobile Club of Neenah also added praise regarding legislators' actions. "That was a bold vote from Joint Finance, but all snowmobilers, restaurants, gas stations and many retail businesses will benefit."

"Anything that gives people reason to participate in clubs and brings money to our sport, we're supportive," said Donna White of The Moonlighters Snowmobile Club located in Columbia County. "We're an unusual group of enthusiasts because we've been pleading with legislators to bring snowmobiling fees up to date. We appreciate the efforts of Rep. John Nygren and his colleagues to help us out."

Website Scam Targets Military

BBB Military Line is sharing information from the U.S. Army's Criminal Investigation Command (CIC) warning about a new website scam in which criminals are attempting to take advantage of soldiers and their families.

The "My Army Benefits" website at usmilitarybenefit.org is a fraudulent site designed to "collect soldiers' Army Knowledge Online, email accounts and passwords." The site also falsely claims that "the U.S. military has granted access to unclaimed and accumulated benefits for active duty soldiers, and that benefits not claimed within the stipulated period will be available for claims after 60 months," according to investigators.

Airmen

Some Airmen who met a medical or physical disability evaluation board between Sept. 11, 2001 and April 30, 2012 prior to separating from the Air Force may be eligible for re-evaluation, Air Force Personnel Center officials said.

When defense officials learned some diagnoses had been changed during board processing between 2001 and 2012, the secretary of defense called for a department-wide review of mental health diagnoses for members who met evaluation boards between the affected dates.

The Air Force review identified 250 eligible Airmen whose mental health diagnoses changed during the disability evaluation process. A mass mail-out effort to ensure those Airmen were aware of the opportunity to be re-evaluated elicited 31 responses.

To ensure all eligible Airmen receive and respond to the notification letter, the under secretary of defense has requested a second mailing be initiated by Dec. 31, with a required media engagement to precede the mail out.

Service members who have received a notification letter are encouraged to respond as stated in the letter. For information concerning the Department of Defense Physical Disability Board of Review, go to the PDBR website at <http://www.health.mil/PDBR>. or email PDBR at PDBRPA@afncr.af.mil.

National survey: Wisconsin ranks second in bird watching

MADISON - Wisconsin ranks second nationally in the proportion of citizens considered birders, with fully one-third of residents 16 and older reporting they travel to watch birds, or actively watch and identify birds around home, according to a recently released U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service report.

Wisconsin trailed only Vermont, where 39 percent of residents are birders, and tied with West Virginia, where 33 percent of their population also watches birds. Numbers-wise, however, the Badger State vastly outnumbered those two states, with Wisconsin boasting 1,678,000 birders, compared to 292,000 for the Green Mountain State and 574,000 for the Mountain State. "Wisconsin is well known for its rich tradition of birding and other forms of wildlife watching," says Ryan Brady, Wisconsin Bird Conservation Initiative monitoring coordinator and Department of Natural Resources research scientist. "Here we have a strong connection to our natural resources, and their vibrant colors, soothing songs, and high degree of visibility make birds a crowd favorite."

Wisconsin features both northern and southern breeding species and sits astride a major migration pathway, allowing birders easy access to one of the most diverse collections of bird life in the United States. More than 400 species have been recorded in the state, with the vast majority of species and numbers being migratory birds. Others, like chickadees, cardinals, grouse, and turkeys, are permanent residents

Brady says spectacles such as staging sandhill cranes, waterfowl migration on the Mississippi River, goose migration at Horicon Marsh, booming prairie chickens, overwintering bald eagles, and more than 30 species of warblers are some of the state's biggest birding draws.

Nationally, there were about 47 million birders, about 20 percent of the population 16 and older, according to the report. They spent an estimated \$41 billion on trip related expenditures and equipment, generated a total economic impact of \$106 billion, supported 666,000 jobs and generated \$13 billion in state and federal tax revenues.

The report, *Birding in the United States: A Demographic and Economic Analysis*, is an addendum to the 2011 U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service National Survey of Fishing, Hunting and Wildlife Associated Recreation. That same survey found that 1.2 million Wisconsin residents fished, and 895,000 residents hunted in that same survey year. www.census.gov/prod/2013pubs/fhw11-wi.pdf

Kim Grveles, who coordinates Wisconsin's Bird Stopover Initiative, says the keen interest in birding in Wisconsin can be seen in the growing number of communities seeking "Bird City Wisconsin" www.birdcitywisconsin.org status indicating their commitment to bird conservation efforts. Since the program started in 2010, 76 communities have been designated Bird Cities.

That interest also was seen in 2013 in the Great Wisconsin Birdathon wibirdathon.org, in which 155 birders spent part of a 24-hour period in May observing birds and soliciting pledges for the total number of species they saw. The birders observed a total of 252 species and raised more than \$55,000 for bird conservation projects in Wisconsin, according to the Natural Resources Foundation of Wisconsin, which sponsored the event along with the Wisconsin Bird Conservation Initiative.

"There's a growing recognition of what's needed to maintain healthy populations of birds and to understand birds' importance to their economies and quality of life," Grveles says. "The national survey's participation rates and economic rates reflect the important role birds play for our local communities and our state."

More statistics from the report:

In 2011 there were 47 million birdwatchers (birders) 16 years of age and older in the United States - about 20 percent of the population.

88 percent of birders are backyard birders, while 38 percent take trips away from home to "go birding."

The "average" birder is 53 years old while only 17 percent fall under the age of 35.

Unlike hunting and fishing where men were overwhelmingly in the majority, a larger percent of birders were women - 56 percent in 2011.

Birders are not a racially or ethnically diverse group. Ninety-three percent of birders identified themselves as white.

75 percent of birders reported observing waterfowl, making them the most watched type of bird. Birds of prey followed at 72 percent and songbirds at 68 percent.

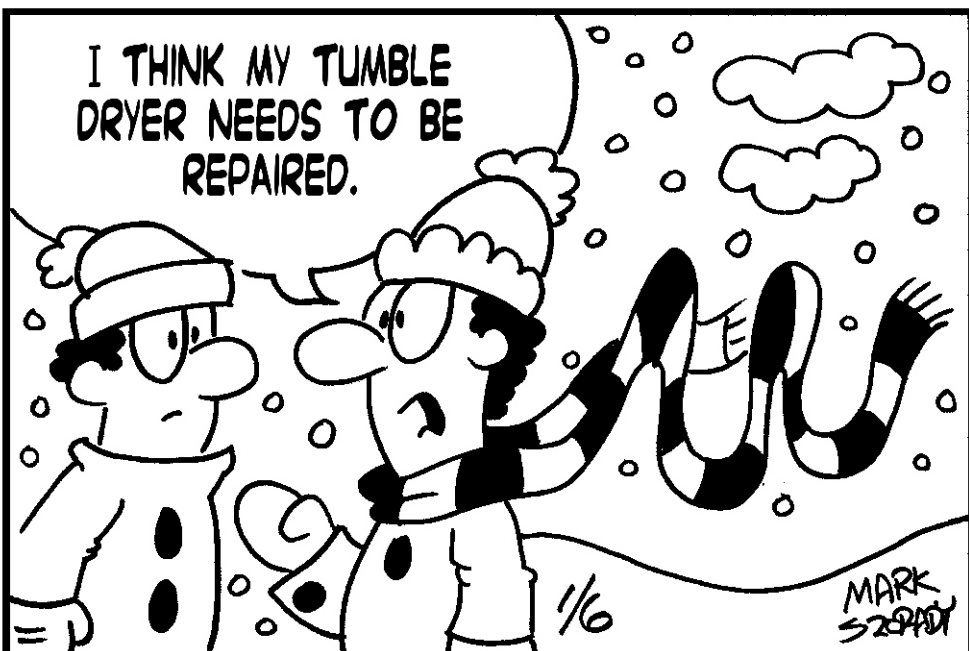


