#### Special session of Forest County Board has a surprising conclusion

The Forest County Board met in special session on Tuesday, April 22nd. The special session was set at the regular board meeting held on the previous Tuesday to give the Wisconsin Off-road Vehicle Park, Inc. (WORVPI) a chance to present the completion of their "scoping" to the board and to discuss the purchase of three parcels of land that would be the site of the proposed ORV park.

At the regular board meeting, the board voted to give County Forester Dave Ziolkowski the authority to purchase a tract of land called the Roder Block, but they tabled the resolution giving him the authority to negotiate for another tract called the BPLC block. The purpose of the tabling was to combine the request for DNR and Stewardship funding with an upcoming resolution to purchase 2000.13 acres for the proposed park.

At the special meeting, the group from WORVPI was prepared to present their scoping efforts to the board, but wanted to do it in closed session. A vote of the board was required to go to closed session, and when the roll call vote was taken, the board voted against the motion for a closed session with a total of 13 votes against 7 votes for the closed session, with Supervisor Stormer absent due to illness.

Those voting against the closed session were: Campbell, Shaffer, Chaney, Lemaster, Connors, Dehart, Gifford, Tauer, Cleereman, Collins, Savard, Landru and Stamper. Those in favor of the closed session were: Otto, Lukas, Albrecht, Millan, Berg, Dailey, and Sommer.

The vote surprised all in attendance, especially the WORVPI people, who held a conference in the hallway and came back into the room and announced that they didn't want to present their information to the public, whereby they picked up their computer and projector and left the meeting.

The next item on the agenda was to authorize the Forestry office to negotiate on the possible land purchase that was tabled at the last meeting, and it was unanimous to do so, giving Ziolkowski the green light to continue his job of increasing the amount of viable county timber land.

The resolution to purchase the 2000.13 acres for an ORV park was tabled by the board until further meetings on the subject.

Where does the proposed park project go from here? That's up to the WORVPI organization.

Why did the board refuse to go into closed session? That would take an answer from each board member that voted no to the closed session. Possibly, it could be from constituent pressure. The park is not popular with everybody, and many don't want the county board to put the citizens in debt for a project that they view as having dubious value. It may be that many of these constituents view the project as having too much secrecy wrapped around it.

Whatever the reason for the surprise vote at the special session, it appears that the WORVPI promoters have to try a different approach to attain their goal.

### Controlling invasive terrestrial species

We are all familiar with the huge amount of information put in front of the public on aquatic invasive species, but are you aware of the problems we have with terrestrial invasive species?

A meeting held at Crandon's Community Building provided a wealth of information on the problems we have with invasive species in our landscape.

The meeting was presided over by Emily Anderson, WRISC Project Manager. WRISC is an acronym for Wild Rivers Invasive Species coalition. She is based in Kingsford, Michigan and does work on invasive species over a large area.

Tom Moris is a Forest Service employee, who lives in Crandon, and is having a one-man contest with invasives, and says he is winning some battles but losing the war. He admits that invasives are here to stay, and says Crandon is a place where he has noticed a spread of invasives. That doesn't mean that you give up on the control of these terrestrial menaces. He said that vacant lots, abandoned pastures and roadsides are great breeding grounds for plants that aren't native and can take over the landscape.


There are 60 plants on the list of invasive species at this time, but another 85 species are being considered for the list. He encourages people to take an interest and do some eradication around their homes and in adjoining lands where they have permission.

Roadsides are a great gathering place for terrestrial invasives, as cars and ATVs running the ditch lines can spread seeds.

Allison Shaw is the invasive species coordinator for the Forest County Potawatomi. For the past year, she has been conducting an inventory of invasives on tribal lands. According to Allison, thistles, of course, are very common. Buckthorn is making its entry into our ecosystem as are bush honeysuckles. Japanese Barberry is another villain in the invasive list.

John Preuss, the invasives specialist with the Lumberjack RC&D, spoke about the Japanese Knotweed, and said that the root structure is so strong that it can break foundations. This plant is bad for streams and will promote erosion. Preuss told us about wild parsnip, a





Please be advised of the following requirements to appear before the Board of Review and procedural requirements if appearing before the Board.

No person shall be allowed to appear before the Board of Review, to testify to the Board by telephone or to contest the amount of any assessment of real or personal property if the person has refused a reasonable written request by certified mail of the assessor to view such property.

After the first meeting of the Board of Review and before the Board's final adjournment, no person who is scheduled to appear before the Board of Review may contact, or provide information to a member of the Board about the person's objection except at a session of the Board.

No person may appear before the Board of Review, testify to the Board by telephone or contest the amount of assessment unless, at least 48 hours before the first meeting of the Board or at least 48 hours before the objection is heard if the objection is allowed because the person has been granted a waiver of the 48 hour notice of an intent to file a written objection by appearing before the Board during the first two hours of the meeting and showing good cause for failure to meet the 48 hour notice requirement and files a written objection, that the person provided to the clerk of the Board of Review notice as to whether the person will ask for removal of any Board members and, if so, which member will be removed and the person's reasonable estimate of the length of time that the hearing will take.

When appearing before the Board of Review, the person shall specify, in writing, the person's estimate of the value of the land and of the improvements that are the subject of the person's objection and specify the information that the person used to arrive at the estimate.

No person may appear before the Board of Review, testify to the Board or by telephone or object to a valuation; if that valuation was made by the assessor or the objector using the income method of a valuation; unless the person supplies the Assessor all information about income and expenses, as specified in the Assessor manual under Sec. 73.03(2a) of WI Statutes, that the Assessor requests. 



Dear Editor:

Yesterday, April 22, 2014, the Forest County Board was convened by direction of its chairman, Paul Millan. The purpose of the meeting was to listen to a presentation by WORPVI and to then pass a resolution authorizing Mr. Millan to apply for grants and loans for at least \$2,500,000.00 to begin County land acquisition for the proposed 10,000-acre off-road vehicle park.

In keeping with the veil of secrecy that has attended this dubious proposal for years, the meeting was proposed by Mr. Millan to be held in "closed session". That is, he and WORPVI wanted the Forest County Public to be excluded from the meeting and kept in ignorance as to the expenditure of their public funds and the use of their public lands.

The Chairman and key members of the Board have become accustomed to controlling public issues with their influence from the core of the Board, a core made up of about six of the 21 member Board. It was natural for them to expect, therefore, that when one of their group made a motion to close the meeting to the Public, all remaining members of the Board would fall in behind and vote in favor of the motion. Equally expectant of a summary approval of closure were representatives of WORPVI who were standing by to have the confidential attention of the Board.

But, then began what was expected to have been a routine vote to close. Only it was not routine at all. The motion ran into the conscience of this community and was soundly rejected by a vote of 13 to 7. Yes! Without discussion of any kind, a roll call vote was taken and there were thirteen clear and resolute votes against secrecy... and for the rights of the Citizens.

Now, this development amounts to something of an insurgency on the Board, a rebellion against those half dozen members who have asserted control and, most importantly, an outright rejection of the notion that WORPVI has somehow been granted authority to govern in this County. It also gives pause to us, as citizens, to ponder the workings of our Government, to reassess and discuss whether our interests are being properly represented and to formulate a plan to improve our representation as needed.

A small group of us intend to study the functioning of this County Government with a critical eye. We intend to foster gatherings of citizens who feel it necessary or appropriate to participate in overseeing the workings of their government. We intend to foster a public discussion, through this paper and other members of the media, so that elected representatives might become sensitive to the wishes of the People.

It may well be that the vote that occurred last night signals a sea change in the way the Board operates. That would be a very healthy change for Forest County. We are proud of those 13 members of the Board for not going along with more secret government. They deserve our respect, our thanks and our support as this process plays out.

Mursau in particular praised the assistance he has received from Townsend resident and past WWF president Ralph Fritsch and the many other citizens of the 36th Assembly District for helping him oversee the Department of Natural Resources and craft better legislation:

"My accomplishments are a direct result of the great input I get from all the people of the 36th District," Mursau said. "This is absolutely an award I share with them."

#### Long-Term Caregiving at Home

Odds are we will most likely need some sort of long-term care and/or the assistance of a caregiver at some point in our lives. Although we may need care at any time, the likelihood increases as we grow older. Not all U.S. adults have a long-term care insurance policy or have sufficient resources to pay private rates for care - and not all qualify for government assistance under the strict long-term care Medicaid criteria. It's a myth the Medicare will cover extended long-term care needs and Medicare does not cover custodial care. These restrictions leave a significant gap for those who need care. Often, families fill in as uncompensated caregivers for those who need care the most.

A Pervasive Issue: According to the Caregiver Action Network, "there's no question that family caregiving is really the backbone of the long-term care support services in this country." The data supports this statement. Thirty-nine percent of all adults aged 18 or older are caregivers for someone who has a significant health issue.

Recent data released by the Pew Research Center indicates that uncompensated caregiving by family members spans racial, educational, and other demographic lines. Thirty-nine percent of white adults were caregivers for someone, compared with 40% of black adults and 32% of Latino adults. The rates also remain similar over varying levels of educational attainment: 31% of adults without a high school diploma are caregivers, compared with 36% of high school graduates, 44% of those with some college education, and 40% of those who have received a college degree or higher.

In addition, household income does not seem to significantly change the incidence of caregiving: 36% of those with incomes less than \$36,000 a year were caregivers, whereas 43% of households with incomes of \$75,000 were caregivers.

These numbers show a trend that bridges demographic differences: families are absorbing the caregiving needs of members who need care and are doing so at much higher tares than in years past. While other options are available for financing long-term care needs (such as insurance policies and savings), the cost of care continues to rise. Currently, the average daily rate in the nursing home for someone paying privately is \$243.

Many people try to plan ahead for long-term care needs, but planning for the unknown is difficult. It's hard to predict what type of care we may need and how much this care will cost when we need it. With so many unknown factors, families have truly become the pillar of the long-term care system with a high incidence of caregiving occurring in the home.

#### Food Additives 101

People have been enhancing their food for centuries - think salt and spices - and today there are thousands of food additives. Whether we should eat these altered foods is hotly debated.

The Pros: Only additives "generally recognized as safe" by the U.S. government (FDA) are permitted, and many improve food in some way. Vitamins increase the nutritional quality of foods, and preservatives increase food safety and shelf life - reducing food cost and making a wider variety of food available. Some added ingredients make food look and taste better.

The Cons: The FDA can never be absolutely certain about safety and has recalled some additives. The American Academy of Pediatrics and other groups are concerned about risks to children. Some people react to substances such as dyes, and people with phenylketonuria (PKU) can have life-threatening responses to foods with phenylalanine (example: aspartame). Manufacturers color food purely for marketing purposes, and "natural flavorings" can be as processed as artificial ones. Additives can mask low-quality food and are even in "fresh" products such as meats. Many food additives used in combination have not been tested for safety. A good approach might be to learn more about additives, then decide which you think are acceptable them.



There was a scavenger hunt throughout both schools. Prizes were awarded to students who found small images of book covers of award winning books.



#### Wisconsin's sustainably managed forests create economic opportunity

MADISON -- Wisconsin's strengths in sustainably managed forests, premium hardwood production and engineered wood products offer state residents something to celebrate during April, which the Legislature has designated as Forestry and Paper Products Month.

Steve Hubbard, forest products services team leader for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, says the nation's recovering housing market is providing an important boost for state mills that specialize in high quality flooring, trim and veneer wood. While Wisconsin also produces the pine 2-by-4s used to frame single family homes, Hubbard says it is the quality of the state's hardwoods such as oak, hickory and maple that truly stand out.

Just how good is Wisconsin wood? NCAA basketball fans saw it in action as teams competing in recent regional tournament games jumped, dribbled and ran on meticulously crafted maple originating from Menomonee Tribal Enterprises.

"This is not to say we don't produce significant quantities of fiberboard and other commodities, but where we win is with the quality of our hardwoods," Hubbard says.

Wisconsin also remains the nation's No. 1 paper producer, a title the state has claimed for more than 50 years. While the paper industry continues to face challenges worldwide, Hubbard says Wisconsin's sustainable forestry practices have given producers here a competitive business advantage.

Wisconsin now ranks among the nation's leaders in terms of the number of pulpwood forests certified by the Sustainable Forestry Initiative and Forest Stewardship Council. These certifications have played a critical role in recent contracts between state producers and industry leaders such as Time Warner that have goals for using sustainably sourced paper in magazines and catalogs, Hubbard says.

"We now manage more than 7 million acres of third-party environmentally certified forest land in the state," he says. "Our management practices have allowed us to benefit from consumer trends."

The future of forestry and paper products in Wisconsin promises to be no less dynamic. For example, nanocrystalline cellulose - made from the tiny crystals that give wood its strength - can be engineered with the stiffness of steel at just a fraction of the weight.

Research now underway at the U.S. Forest Products Laboratory (exit DNR) in Madison and at a handful of state companies promises to usher in completely new categories of products ranging from high-strength, lightweight fabrics that could be used in bullet proof vests to new automotive components.

"The sky is the limit for our trees," Hubbard says. "Going forward, we anticipate new forestry and paper products industries to grow alongside our existing manufacturers in the sector."

With total production valued at nearly \$19 billion each year and employment of more than 46,800 based on numbers from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corp., the economic importance of Wisconsin's forestry and paper products industries is clear. Despite this level of productivity, Hubbard says, residents may be reassured to know that the number of forested acres in the state continues to grow.

"While other states incur losses, Wisconsin's forest lands have increased since 1983 and now total more than 17 million acres," Hubbard says. "Each year, we grow more wood than industry removes; our forests produce about 490 million cubic feet of growth each year, while about 332 million cubic feet is removed."



plant that can cause serious rashes if you pull the plant without gloves and long sleeve and pants. If the sap gets on your skin and is exposed to sunlight, you can get a horrible rash. Crown vetch is a weed that will grow to cover anything if given a chance. And there is garlic mustard that will produce 8,000 seeds and those seeds can remain viable for up to seven years.

If the problem can't be stopped, it can at least be contained. There is a program available called the Private Forest Land Invasive Control Project. This program is funded through DNR and is designed to help private landowners manage invasive species populations. They will work with the landowner to identify problem species and develop a targeted management plan for no fee, but space is limited. This can be important with infestations of a plant like garlic mustard that can completely take over the bottom story of a woodland, preventing new trees from growing.
