





Of course there is a huge problem with our young people finding jobs up here that will allow them to raise a family. Creation of the jobs needed will most likely come from the private sector. Counties, cities and townships must work hard to attract new business growth to our part of the state. With the high price of gasoline and diesel fuel, this becomes even more problematic due to shipping costs for raw materials and finished products. In any event the lack of new jobs and a dip in tourism are not directly caused by and should not be linked to the recent ruckus in

Opportunities do exist! On Wednesday I was at the Oconto County Tourism office in Oconto. The conversation centered on "chatter" at recent shows around the state attended by staff. It seems vacationers are looking for shorter trips and those who once considered going to Michigan or Canada are now thinking about our area instead. The sport fishing on Lake Michigan was the specific example cited but it could have been any number of activities we have to offer up here. One area group is promoting "Less than one tank of gas round trip from Green Bay or the Fox Cities." Sure we have to work harder

to get people to come to our area, but it can be done.

Also, folks retiring up here bring a lot of new money to the area. I personally know nearly two dozen couples in the Townsend area who bought or built retirement homes here. They brought their retirement spending with them and most were formerly employed in the private sector. Contrary to the implications in the Madison letter they did not flee south. Instead they decided to stay in Wisconsin and enjoy the wonderful four seasons of activities that our area offers.

The Madison teacher letter, in my opinion, was written as a scare tactic to sway public opinion about the Walker budget issues. I am not going to take a position on that mess here but believe there is a concerted effort by some in the public sector to scare and potentially harm private business. For example, I have a copy of a letter signed by seven public sector unions sent to a major Wisconsin retailer. It threatens a business boycott by their members if corporate records are not turned over indicating who the company supports politically. It has been reported that similar letters have been sent to other Wisconsin businesses. That is just plain wrong!!

So, let's all take a deep breath, roll up our sleeves and work together to continue efforts to bring more jobs, retirees and tourists to our area. The sun will come up tomorrow (if perhaps behind the clouds some days).

#### **Governor's Budget Proposes More Road** Spending...Except for the North

State Senator Jim Holperin (D-Eagle River) today blasted a 2012-'13 state budget that will pour \$410 million more into road projects over the next two years, with virtually none of the new highway spending headed to northern Wisconsin.

"Instead, road aid cuts of 3% to 15% will be the rule across the north where residents count on good roads for logging, tourism, agriculture, education and commuting, "he said.

"In a budget proposal filled with cuts to school aid and dozens of other programs, less health care for the poor, and the complete elimination of programs like recycling, transportation spending is slated to grow by almost 15%," Holperin explained. "Yet nearly all the new money will go toward major projects in the southern part of

Specifically, Milwaukee's "Zoo Interchange" will get \$225 million; I-94 from Milwaukee south to the state line will get \$195 million; and I-90 from Madison south to the state line will get \$59 million.

Meanwhile, Rhinelander will have its road aid cut by almost \$80,000 or 15 percent. Merrill will lose \$72,000 and Crivitz is out \$11,000. Antigo will lose \$85,000 while Tomahawk can subtract \$31,000 and Eagle River is down

"Worse yet, northern counties are forecast to lose 9.3% from the amount of road aid they got last year, and most northwoods towns will see their state road support drop from \$2,117 per mile this year to \$2,053 per mile in 2012 and thereafter," said the 12th District Senator.

"I've never seen a transportation budget that favors big urban projects at the expense of local road maintenance like this one does," Holperin said. legislators need to join together to push back on this assault by Governor Walker on rural road aids. There needs to be more balance and I simply will not vote for a road budget that's so inequitable."





the proper equipment and stay out in the field during daytime and nighttime operations. Sometimes the weather is unpleasant. The FUNSAR course content includes topics in three major areas: survival-and-support, search, and rescue. This course is based around wilderness and rural environments but the material is recommended as a basis for all SAR environments.

The FUNSAR class is suitable for persons who are physically capable and interested in becoming involved with SAR operations as a field responder; SAR personnel who would like to refresh their training; emergency response personnel whose organizations provide resource and assistance during SAR operations; managers of emergency response organizations that are involved in SAR operations; community members and groups (university outdoor recreation, scouts, hunters, hikers, outdoor trip leaders, etc.) that have an interest in outdoor safety and preventative SAR operations; those interested in outdoor work with the government (US Park Service, US Forest Service, state departments of natural

#### First Census numbers released

Oneida County UW-Extension-Erica Brewster

The first of the 2010 Census numbers for local towns and counties have been released. This week the US Census Bureau released the first of the data: basic population by race and housing counts down to the census block level. This data makes up the National Summary File of Redistricting Data and will be used to determine districts for the House of Representatives and other population-based representation in advance of the 2012 elections.

The numbers for the north central counties of Wisconsin, other than Vilas and Taylor counties, shows a decline in population. Oneida County's population decreased by 2%, from 36,776 in 2000 to 35,998 in 2010. Iron County saw the largest decrease in the region, at -14% growth, followed by Florence (-13%), Price (-11%), Forest (-5%), Langlade (-4%), and Lincoln (-3%) counties Vilas County saw a modest increase in population with 2% growth, and Taylor County had 5% growth in the ten years since the last census.

Population statistics for towns within each county are also available. The population of the city of Rhinelander remained stable during the decade, marking 1% growth. Eagle River lost 3% in population and the city of Antigo lost 4%. Lincoln County cities were hit harder, with Merrill dropping 5% in population Tomahawk losing 10%.

The number of vacant housing units also increased, however until further numbers are released later this year, it isn't clear whether those vacancies are due to an increase of empty homes on the market, or an increase in seasonal-use homes, which are included in "vacant housing units" in the initial census data.


