My name is William Dutton, a candidate for reelection to the office of Townsend Supervisor. I would like to present my experience and some of my accomplishments in my terms in office for your consideration in the April 5 election.

** A member of the Town Board that has held real estate taxes steady (+1.7% last year) for the last 4 years though the state aids have been reduced. Unfortunately the other taxing districts shown on your property tax bill went up significantly: +3.8% Oconto Co., +4.9% Wabeno school district 7.6% and the Technical College 8.9%. Note that the Tech's levy to the town is now more than the Town budget.

** Negotiated better interest rates for an improved return on town bank deposits.

** Initiated the town web site, www.townoftownsend.com, for more transparency to better inform town residents of town business. It contains information on coming events, contact information for town and county services, Town Board and Plan Commission agendas and minutes, answers to frequently asked questions and a link to E-mail town officers. Town residents have accessed the web site over 30000 times since its inception for information.

** Chairman of the Townsend Plan Commission and a town representative on the County Advisory Plan Committee. The Plan Commission, with public input has developed a plan for the future growth of Townsend and currently reviews zoning requests the first Monday of the month for recommendations to the town board.

** Initiator and contributor to the 6 northern county towns coalition. The towns of Breed, Mountain, Riverview, Lakewood, Doty and Townsend meet regularly to discuss topics of mutual aid and as a united group to influence county legislation and to get more county services available in northern Oconto County.

** Drafted and guided passage by the County Board, a more restrictive billboard ordinance to better preserve our scenic beauty in the northern county highway 32/64 corridor.

** Town representative to the DNR and the Army Corps of Engineers for environmental and wetland issues.

** Working with the Forest Service I had Cathedral drive widened with safety turnouts provided.

** With financial help from the McCaslin Lions Club, initiated and oversaw construction of the Oughton Park shelter for increased public enjoyment of this beautiful park.

** Improved signage in the town cemetery
** Initiated town hall improvements to make it more energy efficient and Americans with Disabilities compliant.



Other than water the only drinks humans regularly consumed about a hundred years ago were tea, coffee, milk, beer and wine. Fizzy drinks and juices were considered an occasional treat until they started gaining popularity after World War II. Today, our beverage choices take up more supermarket aisles than any other product. And maybe you've noticed that beverage sleeves in cars are now standard equipment.

Americans love to drink. On average, we consume 21 percent of our calories from all beverages, up from 13 percent - 15 percent in the 1970s. About half of the increase comes from soft drinks and fruit juices; alcohol, tea, and coffee drinks are also big contributors, according to findings of the Healthy Beverage Guidelines published last year.

No doubt the added calories from beverages have added to America's weight problems. How? Experts say people tend to drink beverages without compensating for the calories by eating less.



First Census numbers released

Oneida County UW-Extension-Erica Brewster
 The first of the 2010 Census numbers for local towns and counties have been released. This week the US Census Bureau released the first of the data: basic population by race and housing counts down to the census block level. This data makes up the National Summary File of Redistricting Data and will be used to determine districts for the House of Representatives and other population-based representation in advance of the 2012 elections.

The numbers for the north central counties of Wisconsin, other than Vilas and Taylor counties, shows a decline in population. Oneida County's population decreased by 2%, from 36,776 in 2000 to 35,998 in 2010. Iron County saw the largest decrease in the region, at -14% growth, followed by Florence (-13%), Price (-11%), Forest (-5%), Langlade (-4%), and Lincoln (-3%) counties. Vilas County saw a modest increase in population with 2% growth, and Taylor County had 5% growth in the ten years since the last census.

Population statistics for towns within each county are also available. The population of the city of Rhinelander remained stable during the decade, marking 1% growth. Eagle River lost 3% in population and the city of Antigo lost 4%. Lincoln County cities were hit harder, with Merrill dropping 5% in population Tomahawk losing 10%.

The number of vacant housing units also increased, however until further numbers are released later this year, it isn't clear whether those vacancies are due to an increase of empty homes on the market, or an increase in seasonal-use homes, which are included in "vacant housing units" in the initial census data.

the proper equipment and stay out in the field during daytime and nighttime operations. Sometimes the weather is unpleasant. The FUNSAR course content includes topics in three major areas: survival-and-support, search, and rescue. This course is based around wilderness and rural environments but the material is recommended as a basis for all SAR environments.

The FUNSAR class is suitable for persons who are physically capable and interested in becoming involved with SAR operations as a field responder; SAR personnel who would like to refresh their training; emergency response personnel whose organizations provide resource and assistance during SAR operations; managers of emergency response organizations that are involved in SAR operations; community members and groups (university outdoor recreation, scouts, hunters, hikers, outdoor trip leaders, etc.) that have an interest in outdoor safety and preventative SAR operations; those interested in outdoor work with the government (US Park Service, US Forest Service, state departments of natural resources, etc.).
