Forest County recreation trails get noticed

No one can deny the importance of tourism to Forest County's overall economic health. This past weekend the Sokaogon Mole Lake Chippewa hosted the Wisconsin Off-Highway Vehicle Association's spring training at the Mole Lake Lodge Conference Center. John Schnorr the Executive Director for the WOHVA, says the possibilities of an off-road park in the Northwoods would be a perfect fit, "With the huge demand, if Forest County is indeed lucky enough to become the host site of such a park, it would be a huge economic boost to the local community." The Wisconsin Off-Highway Vehicle Association hopes they do get those trails here in Forest County because they want to get off the pavement and into the dirt. Current statistics reveal there are some 300,000 motorized off-road enthusiasts throughout our state.

Owners of an off road vehicle, looking for a place to put the vehicle into four wheel drive and experience all the thrills associated with this type of recreation may soon find an answer around the Crandon area.

Off-road racing is a very popular sport with a very long history here in the Northwoods, especially at the Brush Run in Crandon. According to Schnorr Off road vehicle enthusiasts are looking for some room to play because currently the 30-mile section of legal off-road trail is getting crowded. And Schnorr says a lot of people would play and stay, "It's not uncommon to have 1,200-1,800 visitors to a park of this type, daily." State Representative Jeff Mursau, a member of Wisconsin 36th Assembly District (Republican) was very upbeat about future plans in Forest County, as he addressed the WOHVA luncheon gathering this past Saturday. Tiffany Landru, a member of the Forest County Chamber of Commerce says, "Forest County is already known statewide and often nationally as the king of off-road. So to bringing more motor sports activities and to further our trail development will just grow our reputation in the off-road industry." Landru says it will grow more than the county's reputation, "If we can expand our trail system and

Storm damages property and woodlands last Sunday

Somewhere in the woods a couple of miles southeast of Argonne, last Sunday evening, a tornado touched down and moved from southwest to northeast. Trees and buildings in the path of the storm paid the price. The same thing happened near Newald on Lake Van Zile when a twister picked up a mobile home on the lake shore and dumped it into a big pine tree and destroyed the garage and most of the trees on the property. There was also damage in Armstrong Creek.

These photos show the strength of the winds, and they are also a reminder to take heed of tornado warnings on radio and television. Anyone not taking cover can certainly lose their life if they are in the path of this type of wind.

It is likely that our rural setting makes for less loss of property and possible loss of life when one of these storms hit. Of course, woodland owners can certainly make an argument that they have lost property. We can only hope that future storms miss our communities.

Governor approves project at Crandon Airport

Governor Scott Walker has approved a \$126,422 project to design pavement reconstruction and expansion at the Crandon Municipal Airport. The Governor's action releases \$3,161 in state funds for the project and the city of Crandon is contributing another \$3,161. The Federal Aviation Administration is providing \$120,100.

The project will help replace aging pavement, as well as expand some pavements. The airport is having a consultant draft plans and specifications for the reconstruction of the airport's primary runway and two taxiways, the reconstruction and expansion of the terminal ramp, and development of a new hangar area and taxiway. The design project is scheduled to begin in March 2011 and should be completed by June 2011.

The Crandon Municipal Airport consists of one asphalt runway, 3,100 feet in length, an apron, connecting taxiway and a hangar area. Four single-engine and one multi-engine aircraft are based at the airport, and approximately 4,400 take-offs and landings occur each year.

Burning Permits Required

After what seemed like a winter that would never end, we may have turned the corner to spring. As the snow disappears and the temperatures increase, the risk of wildfires will also increase rapidly.

Each year the debris burning done by landowners in an attempt to dispose of trash, tree branches and leaves, clear fields, ditch bank or to accomplish other tasks cause more than 1,600 wildfires in Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources urges home and landowners to take a few simple and sensible precautions to prevent small debris fires from turning into wildfires this spring.

- Consider environmentally sound alternatives to burning such as recycling, composting, or brush piles in the woods for wildlife habitat.
- Permits are required for all open burning, except cooking or campfires, anytime the ground is not

completely snow covered outside of incorporated cities or villages. This includes burning on the ground as well as incinerators or in burning barrels. Burning permits are not required in the City of Crandon. However, burning is restricted to 6:00 p.m. to midnight. No burning is allowed on Sundays or holidays. City of Crandon residents may call City Hall at 478-2400 for additional information.

- Keep fire-fighting tools close at hand. You should have a water hose, shovel, or other fire-fighting implements on hand to put the fire out if it starts to get out of control.

- Monitor the burn closely until it is dead out and cold. If you see signs of the burning expanding beyond the planned area, such as increasing smoke and flames, call 911 immediately!

- Don't rush! It is much easier to monitor and maintain a small burn than a large one, so don't light too much at one time. If you can't commit the time and effort to safely and effectively complete your burn consider some of the alternatives discussed above.

Burning permits are issued free of charge for the Crandon Ranger Station, US Forest Service Ranger Station in Laona and Emergency Fire Wardens throughout Forest County. New this year if you are unable to pick up a permit in person, you can either call 1-888-WIS-BURN hotline or visit dnr.wi.gov/forestry/fire for directions on obtaining a permit online.

Burning permits are valid for the entire year. After obtaining a burning permit, you must check for burning restrictions on the day you intend to burn. Directions for finding current directions are listed on the front of your permit; burning restrictions are updated daily at 11:00 a.m. No matter how you obtain your permit, remember you are required to have it in your possession while burning.

Inner Talk Becomes You

The wind plowed down and twisted off trees along the banks of the Peshtigo and took off the roof of the house on the old Waggoner farm (current owners not known) and destroyed the garage.



One wall of the garage at the Waggoner farm is intact, but on the ground. The rest of the building and the contents are over the edge of a bank and lay along the Peshtigo.

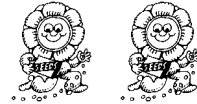

Pickrel Volunteer Fire And Rescue Why We Do What We Do

Welcome to our second informational article in an ongoing series. Instead of questions to answer from you, we have a couple of informational tidbits to share with everyone this month.

There is a program in place through Langlade County Public Health Department in Antigo called Community Partners for Medication Safety. This program supports distribution of "red bags" as a central in-home location for all medications that you are currently taking. For more info and to receive your free "red bag" call 715-627-6250 for details. Why is this a good thing? First, it gets all your medications (prescription and over the counter) written down and keeps all the bottles in one place. Then when that emergency happens and an ambulance service has to come to your aid, we can just grab the "red bag" and go and have all the information we need about your medications.

A frequently asked medical question is "What are signs of a stroke"? First, if you notice signs of a stroke, this is a true emergency where every minute counts.

So "act F.A.S.T."
F ace == Does one side droop? Ask the person to smile to test for a facial droop.

A rms == Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

S peech == Is speech slurred? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is the sentence repeated correctly?

T ime == If the person has any of these symptoms, CALL 911 or get to the hospital immediately.

April is Organ Donor Awareness Month

You've probably heard about heart or lung transplants that use donated organs. But a variety of other organs and tissues can be donated and used for transplantation.

Q-What organs can be donated?

A- Beside heart and lungs other organs and tissues can be donated such as Kidneys, Liver, Pancreas, Intestines, Corneas, Skin, Heart valves, Bone, Veins, Cartilage, Tendons and Ligaments.

Q-What else do organ and tissue donations do?

A- In addition to saving lives, these organs and tissues can help restore sight, cover burns, replace veins, and mend damaged connective tissue and cartilage.

Q-Is there a shortage of donors?

A- Unfortunately, there's a shortage of organ donors in this country. As many as 19 people in the U.S. die every day waiting for a transplant that never comes, the department of Health and Human Services reports.

Q-How many people can be affected by donating?

A- According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), a single donor can save or improve the lives of as many as 50 people.

Q-What can someone do if they want to be a donor?

A- If you want to become an organ donor, sign up with the state donor registry (yesiwillwisconsin.com) and indicate your decision on your driver's license. In some cases, a donor's family may need to give their consent, so it's also critical to discuss your wishes with your family.

Q-In the old days you just put an orange dot on your driver's license, does this work today?

A- The orange dot on your driver's license will always make people aware of your intentions, but the family may still have to agree to that donation depending on when the driver's license was issued. Signing up on the Yes I Will Wisconsin donor registry not only makes your intentions known, but serves as a legal authorization for donation and removes the burden of making that decision from your family or legal next-of-kin.

Q-Should you tell your family if you want to be an organ donor?

A- Definitely. Making this decision by signing up at YesiWillWisconsin.com is the first stage. Sharing that decision with your family and next-of-kin is the final step.

Families who have discussed this subject ahead of time say that when tragedy strikes, knowing their loved one's decision to be a donor was a blessing. It made supporting that decision a no-brainer, especially when the family is likely in a state of shock and grief over losing that person.

Q-Can I have a funeral if I am going to be an organ donor?

A- A donor's body is treated with the utmost respect, and an open-casket funeral is still possible after donation.

Q-Is there a cost to donate?

A- There is no cost to the donor's family for choosing to save others through the gifts of organ, tissue, and eye donation.

Snowmobile deaths down

Department of Natural Resources Snowmobile Administrator Gary Eddy credits the trend to a new permanent speed limit law for night drivers, law enforcement efforts, outstanding snowmobile safety instructors and unpredictable temperatures.

Wisconsin recorded 17 snowmobile fatalities this season – down from 21 during the 2009-10 season.

"This was the first year for the permanent night time speed limit of 55 miles per hour," Eddy said. "That has been proven to be effective in the past, which is why it was made permanent."

Enacted in May 2010, the permanent speed limit for snowmobile operators is in effect from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise. The speed limit had been a temporary regulation. The nighttime speed limit had been in place on a temporary basis since 2006.

"During past snowmobile seasons, many of the fatal accidents happened at night and were related to speed," Eddy said.

Since the 55 mph nighttime speed limit has been in place, Eddy said the state's snowmobile season fatality rate has steadily dropped in spite of good snow conditions. "It is a proven fact that speeds greater than 55 at night significantly reduce your ability to react in time to avoid collisions with fixed objects or make curves."

Law enforcement and educational efforts by wardens and local law enforcement agencies also aided in the reduction, Eddy said.

"The unsung hero during a safe snowmobile season are the hundreds of volunteer snowmobile safety instructors who host courses, and work hard to make sure operators and riders make safety part of their winter outings," Eddy said. State law requires all snowmobile operators born on or after Jan 1, 1985 to complete a snowmobile safety course."

The weather also played a role. "The season was up and down for a while with two mid-season warm-ups that took the trails down to nothing in most areas of the state," Eddy said. "Still, there were good riding opportunities for all to enjoy."

More than 220,000 snowmobiles are registered in Wisconsin where operators use 25,000 miles of groomed trails.

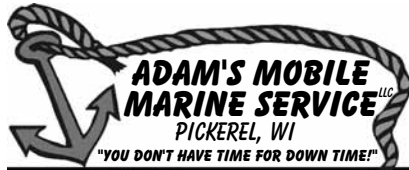

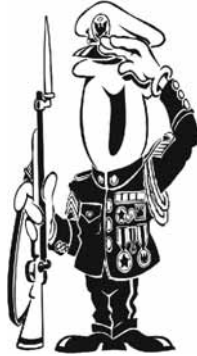
