Ted Frank's shop burns last Thursday - total loss

Last Thursday afternoon, the repair shop of Ted Frank, a Crandon area logger, burned with the loss of virtually all of the contents. A black column of smoke could be seen for miles around as the stores of oil, solvents and fuels added to the blaze. Five area fire departments responded to the fire that was also fanned by high winds. The fire was discovered by Sandy Frank, who had been in the garage varnishing some paneling for a remodeling job on their nearby house

In spite of the best efforts of the fire departments. the fire was impossible to extinguish but was held down enough to prevent spreading to other structures

Frank says he is insured, but with constant addition of tools through the years, he fears that he will take a substantial financial loss when replacing the tools. Along with the tools, he also lost a Mack truck with only 12,000 miles on the odometer. An older Mack was in the process of a complete rebuild. The frame was in Wausau being refurbished, and as Ted said, "My trucking business now consists of a good truck frame and nothing else.' There was also an antique chainsaw collection in the shop along with other personal items. The new, varnished paneling was also lost to the fire.

woodlands have also become split up into more and more parcels, largely for residential development. The result is fragmentation of wildlife habitat and fewer areas able to be managed for sustainable forest products.

According to Pierce, the land trust is utilizing hard copy plat books, geographic information system (GIS) maps and aerial photos to identify land parcels in Oneida and Forest counties with 40 acres or more of undeveloped woodlands. Each of the property owners will be direct mailed a copy of "For the Love of the Land... A Landowner's Conservation Guide to Protecting Your Northwoods Property." This packet includes current information on the various conservation options, tax benefits, conservation concerns and issues in the northwoods, and several "up close and personal" stories of how people have already protected their working forest lands, and natural lake and river shorelines.

"We will also conduct on-site visits and provide free one-on-one technical assistance for interested landowners to help them consider their conservation options, including perpetual land protection agreements known as conservation easements," he said.

"Under a conservation easement, the land remains private property and is still subject to property taxes, but future development is restricted," Pierce said. "With an IRSstandard appraisal, the landowners can take advantage of federal income tax benefits for the charitable deduction value of their conservation easement donation. Enhanced income tax benefits which expired at the end of 2009 were recently reauthorized by Congress and apply in 2011 too,"

"Our conservation easements are also written to be compatible with the state's Managed Forest Law program, Pierce said. "Many of the properties we work on are already enrolled or will be enrolled in MFL, and any future timber harvests will be guided by a professional forest management plan.

"We would like to extend our special thanks to the Oneida and Forest County UW-Extension staff and Land & Water Conservation Departments for their cooperation and assistance with our landowner education projects," Pierce commented. We hope these efforts will result in commitments by landowners interested in leaving a legacy of woodlands in Oneida and Forest counties for all future generations to come."

The Northwoods Land Trust is a non-profit taxexempt conservation organization with a mission of helping landowners conserve their private shorelands, woodlands and wetlands. The land trust works in areas of Vilas, Oneida, Forest, Florence, Iron, Price and northern Langlade

Bear Lake study report

The Town of Blackwell will host a meeting on Saturday April 30, 2011 to inform the public and to review the findings of the first year of a two-year study on Bear Lake. The town, with support from the U.S. Forest Service, the Association of Bear Lake and Environs (ABLE), the Aquatic Invasive Program of Forest County, and Bear Lake Shores Association, applied for a Department of Natural Resources Lake Management Grant to look into reasons for some algae issues the lake had been facing for several years and how the problem can possible be managed.
