Nicolet Resource Advisory Committee seeking 3rd round of project ideas

LAONA, Wis. (April 25, 2011) -- The public is encouraged to propose projects designed to improve Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) lands and resources to the Nicolet Resource Advisory Committee (RAC).

The Committee, which represents a wide range of stakeholder interests, reviews proposals and makes recommendations to the CNNF Forest Supervisor, Paul Strong.

Funds for the projects come from the reauthorized Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act. The funds are made available by Florence, Forest and Oconto counties, which receive federal funds based on the percentage of land within the county under federal ownership, federal timber sale receipts and county per capita income.

Title II project funds can be used for restoring watersheds, decommissioning roads, removing noxious and invasive weeds, enhancing recreation sites and maintaining roads and trails. Projects must be located on Forest Service lands -- or directly benefit National Forest lands -- in Florence, Forest and Oconto counties.

Work can be completed by Forest Service personnel, through partnership agreements or by open-bid contracting with individuals and corporations. The funds for approved projects are available for 2011 project implementation. Project proposals of any dollar amount are encouraged.

Members of the public, non-profit organizations and local governments can submit project proposals.

Applicants are encouraged to submit their forms electronically. Application forms, instructions, information about the RAC process and committee member contact information are available via the CNNF Web site: <http://www.fs.fed.us/r9/cnnf>, or from any CNNF office.

All project proposals are due by June 7, 2011.

Get The Lead Out!

With the fishing opener coming up I'd like to remind fellow anglers that lead in fishing tackle poses a danger to our waterfowl. As we know from news articles on the recalls of children's toys containing lead that ingestion of lead can be fatal. The same applies to our feathered friends.

Loons, our endangered Trumpeter Swans and the Bald Eagles are among the species that are impacted. Just one lead sinker can kill a bird. Last year a Pelican Lake eagle succumbed to lead poisoning despite the heroic efforts of Marge Gibson and staff at the Raptor Center in Antigo.

Bans on lead tackle are proposed across the nation. Large lobbying groups such as KeepAmericaFishing are fighting these challenges to lead based on the cost factor to the fisherman. What they are not telling you is scientific data exists that supports that our birds do die from lead tackle. Just ask Marge.

What they are not telling you is that we all have an ethical choice to stop using lead. Lead alternatives include tin, bismuth, steel, tungsten or ceramic. Fleet Farm carries alternative non-lead tackle and will continue as long as we purchase it. My husband and I have a special needs grandchild living with us. I was surprised to hear that his special needs aide, Jennifer Blank, is going to be laid off at the end of the school year. She has been with our grandson since he started school. He has multiple problems and needs the extra help for learning. He is in first grade for the second time and has a wonderful teacher, Mrs. Cindy Bahr, who has worked with special needs children before. Between his teacher and Jennifer they accomplished so much with him.

When I voiced my concerns at the school, I was told that because of budget cuts that the lowest seniority teachers and aides in the Union are being laid off. I don't think we should lay off anyone associated with special needs children.

It seems to me that all other areas and programs should be downsized before laying off teachers and aides. I am from a fairly large school, my graduating class was 300. We had two schools, K-8 was grade school, and 9-12 was high school. For both of these schools there was only one superintendent. Each school had one principal and two secretaries. There were three janitors for each school. The school lunch program went by income as to how much each parent had to pay. These are some areas that should be downsized before laying off teachers and aides.

A school is a place for children to learn. It makes no sense to cut educators and aides when other things should be cut first. I would hope that other parents would voice their concerns to the school.

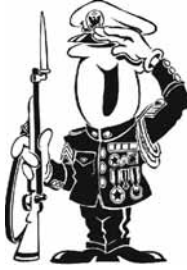

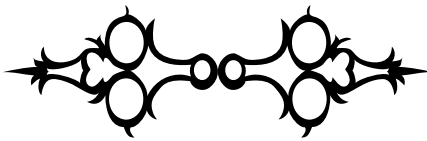

For your next batch of oatmeal, boil oats in low-fat milk for a creamier texture and top off with some sliced banana and walnut pieces.

Oatmeal - \$.14 per serving vs individual instant packets \$.32 per serving

Brown rice - \$.15 per serving

Popcorn - \$.10 per serving

Where have you Bean? One of the most inexpensive proteins around, beans are also high in fiber but low in fat. Canned beans are a terrific staple to have in your pantry and there are dozens to choose.

- Eggs and beans are the least expensive protein sources.
- Cut a serving of meat in half and load up plate with more veggies and rice, pasta or potatoes.
- Toss beans into salads and soups; mix into pasta; add to salsa or puree into dip.

• Canned beans - \$.12 per serving (dried beans are even cheaper at about \$.05 per serving)

Matching grants available for trail maintenance and development

MADISON -- Municipalities and other eligible entities have until June 15 to submit applications for matching grants for development and maintenance of recreational trails and trail-related facilities for both motorized and non-motorized recreational trail uses in Wisconsin.

Towns, villages, cities, counties, tribal governing bodies, school districts, state agencies, federal agencies and incorporated organizations are eligible for matching grants up to \$45,000 under the Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Program. The funds are provided through federal gas excise taxes paid on fuel used by off-highway vehicles. Eligible sponsors may be reimbursed for up to 50 percent of the total project costs.

Eligible projects include:

- **maintenance and restoration of existing trails;
- **development and rehabilitation of trailside and trailhead facilities and trail linkages;
- **construction of new trails (with certain restrictions on Federal lands); and
- **acquisition of easement or property for trails.

Projects are ranked in order of funding priority under the following criteria:

- **Rehabilitation of existing trails.
- **Trail maintenance.
- **Trail development.
- **Trail acquisition.

Eligible sponsors may use these funds in conjunction with the state snowmobile and all-terrain vehicle programs and Nelson Knowles Stewardship Program development projects. For more information, contact a DNR Community Services Specialist.

the Travel Green and its new launch. The goal is to encourage as many businesses as possible across the state to become certified."

Mole Lake lies near one of the Nation's most undeveloped; pristine; clean and still rugged rivers, and is committed to ensure that all people who come to this area understand the vital importance of protecting and preserving its beautiful environment. Future generations should be able to also enjoy the beauty of the outdoor recreation opportunities which exist in this four season destination. Ackley stated "We also have applied for State Scenic By-Way status to enable a section of State Hwy 55 which runs alongside the Wolf River to be designated. This designation will open up great opportunities for us to market GREEN tourism activities worldwide."

Note: A 24-mile stretch of the Wolf River, from the Langlade-Menominee County line downstream to Keshena Falls, was designated as a National Scenic River in 1968. "Noted as one of the most scenic and rugged rivers in the Midwest, the Wolf flows through the Menominee Reservation. The river is not developed for public use." "The National Wild and Scenic Rivers System was created by Congress in 1968 (Public Law 90-542; 16 U.S.C. 1271 et seq.) to preserve certain rivers with outstanding natural, cultural, and recreational values in a free-flowing condition for the enjoyment of present and future generations. The Act is notable for safeguarding the special character of these rivers, while also recognizing the potential for their appropriate use and development. It encourages river management that crosses political boundaries and promotes public participation in developing goals for river protection."

Other goals include the ability to invite international visitors here to north eastern Wisconsin to experience and enjoy its true beauty. As well as to be able to share the rich history of the Woodland Indian of the Great Lakes; early American pioneers; the Civil War Era and more recently the controversial issues which have spanned more than 30 years and efforts to thwart EXXON Mining and Minerals from opening a deep shaft metallic mining operation. A mine would have ultimately introduced toxins and pollutants into the Wolf River system at the headwaters of the Wolf River. Never in history, has a small and nearly impoverished community of Indigenous people defeated a multi-national \$billion dollar conglomerate from reaching its goals. Since winning the fight against mining the community continues to demonstrate a commitment to the ongoing preservation of the Wolf River watershed and to remind travelers, vacationers and tourists that what was accomplished remains for the good of all people.

Ackley also said "We want our great grand children to be able to fish, river raft, canoe, swim, boat, hike, cross country ski and etc., in a clean and pristine environment. The only way we can accomplish this task is through education. The 1st Wolf River Tourism Conference is our way to say "thank you" to those who supported us in the past and to now establish a platform inviting as many people as possible to share in protecting that what we have been able to save. A commitment to saving the sacred wild rice beds in the Mole Lake community; remains as the very essence of the Mole Lake people's existence and survival as Indigenous peoples of the Great Lakes region. "Our hope is that the Wolf River Tourism Conference becomes a sustainable economic activity to become a major annual event across our State; as there is only one Wolf River. We have partnered with many organizations who share our philosophy to protect the environment forever and the new Wisconsin Travel Green Program will also become part of our annual event. Lt. Governor, Rebecca Kleefisch, and Regional Tourism Specialist Sarah Pischer will introduce Travel Green and its new launch. The concept of green is new to the Indian tribes; because the Indigenous peoples of this planet always cared for our sacred Mother Earth since time in memorial," Ackley said.

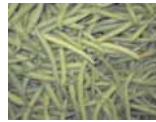

Spring is the time to test private wells for bacteria

MADISON -- Private well owners should test their well water at least once a year for bacteria, periodically for nitrate, and should consider testing for other contaminants to keep their families safe, state health and drinking water officials say.

A recent survey found that well owners are not testing as regularly as they should and are not testing for the range of contaminants that may be in groundwater, says Dr. Lynda Knobeloch, a senior toxicologist with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services.

More than 7,300 Wisconsin residents took part in the 2008-9 Behavioral Risk Factor Survey that included questions about well testing.

The survey found that one-third of Wisconsin families depend on private wells for their drinking water and that less than a quarter of those wells had been tested within the past year, the recommended frequency. Far fewer families tested their water for other kinds of contamination such as solvents, gasoline, fuel oil, toxic metals, or pesticides.

The Department of Natural Resources advises people to test their water for bacteria at least once a year and if they notice changes in taste, odor and appearance of their water. Private wells also should be tested periodically for nitrate, and more often if they are near corn, soybean or vegetable fields, operations where fertilizer is manufactured, or animal feedlots and manure storage facilities, says Mark Putra, who leads the private water section for the DNR drinking water and groundwater program.

And well owners may need to test for other contaminants such as arsenic or agricultural chemicals, depending on the surrounding land use practices. Spring thaw often brings increase in bacterial contamination

Most private wells provide safe drinking water if they are properly located, constructed, installed and maintained, Putra says. "However, we tend to see an increase in well contamination problems after spring thaw when melting snow soaks into the ground."

Some wells may become contaminated with bacteria that is not filtered out as the water soaks into the ground; such problems may be exacerbated during flooding. Surviving microbes can enter the groundwater by moving through fractured bedrock, quarries, sinkholes, inadequately grouted wells or cracks in the well casing. Insects or small rodents can also carry bacteria into wells with inadequate caps or seals, he says.

When flooding occurs, well owners should suspect that their drinking water is contaminated by floodwaters if the well casing becomes inundated; if there's a change in taste, color or sediment; or if the well does not have a deep casing and is near areas that have been flooded. Well owners should not drink from flooded wells until waters recede and the well test shows the water is safe. Wells located in pits and basements are especially susceptible to contamination.

Knobeloch urges well owners to find out more about common contaminants in their area and have their water tested regularly. "While contaminated water often looks and tastes fine, it can increase your risk of illnesses ranging from diarrhea to cancer and heart disease."

She noted that the main reason well owners provided when asked why they didn't test their water was that the water seemed to be safe based on its taste, odor and appearance. Nearly half of the homeowners who had never tested their water stated that they didn't know what to test for or weren't sure where to send their water for testing.

Bears emerging from dens; take steps to avoid problems

As winter melts into spring and black bears start emerging from their dens, homeowners statewide are encouraged to take precautions to reduce the potential for problems with these hungry bruins.

Because natural food sources are limited at this time of year, bears are often attracted to bird feeders, garbage cans, grills, or other common things found in yards, says Mike Zeckmeister, Department of Natural Resources northern wildlife supervisor.

"Black bears are normally very timid and avoid contact with people; however, bears can quickly learn to associate humans with food and can become a nuisance," he says. "Taking steps to remove any food attractants will greatly reduce the likelihood of having problems with bears."

Highly habituated bears can be dangerous and may need to be euthanized. Preventing the problem in the first place is the best solution for bears and people alike, Zeckmeister says.

"When bears become less fearful of humans and humans do not respect bears as wild animals, there becomes a problem," he says. "When we have to resolve this problem it is usually too late and the bear loses."

It is illegal to intentionally feed bears in Wisconsin. But people also should not feed bears unintentionally by allowing a food source to be accessible to bears near their home. Bird feeders are a common bear attractant, especially in the spring, and unsecured garbage cans or dumpsters are also potential problems.

Wildlife biologists encourage residents to follow these steps to avoid attracting bears:

Don't knowingly feed a bear; Completely remove bird feeders, even during daytime hours. Bears are active during the day and may cause problems even if the feeders are out only during that time. Reduce garbage odors by rinsing food cans before putting them in recycling containers or garbage cans; Compost vegetable scraps; Keep meat scraps in the freezer until garbage day and if possible, keep garbage cans in a closed building until the morning of pick-up. Commercial dumpsters should be locked; Keep pet food inside or inaccessible to bears even during daytime hours; Keep barbeque grills and picnic tables clean.

If a bear is near your home, wave your arms and make noise to scare it away. Then back away slowly or go inside and wait for the bear to leave. When scaring the bear away, make sure it has a clear escape route. Never corner a bear.

If the bear found food such as bird feed or garbage one or more times, it will return to the spot. When food is no longer available, the visits will eventually stop. Bears will periodically check sites where food was once available so it may take several days to weeks before the bear will quit visiting a site once the food source has been removed.

Memory Loss

Can't find your car keys? Forget what's on your grocery list? Can't remember the name of the personal trainer you liked at the gym? You're not alone. Everyone forgets things occasionally. You can do simple things every day to improve your memory — starting today!

Stay mentally active
Just as physical activity helps keep your body in shape, mentally stimulating activities help keep your brain in shape — and memory loss at bay. Do crossword puzzles. Read a section of the newspaper that you normally skip. Take alternate routes when driving. Learn to play a musical instrument. Volunteer at a local school or community organization.

Socialize regularly
Social interaction helps ward off depression and stress, both of which can contribute to memory loss. Look for opportunities to get together with loved ones, friends and others — especially if you live alone. When you're invited to share a meal or attend an event, go!

Get organized
You're more likely to forget things if your home is cluttered and your notes are in disarray. Jot down tasks, appointments and other events in a special notebook or calendar. You might even repeat each entry out loud as you write it down to help cement it in your memory. Keep to-do lists current, and check off items you've completed. Set aside a certain place for your wallet, keys and other essentials.

Focus
Limit distractions, and don't try to do too many things at once. If you focus on the information that you're trying to remember, you'll be more likely to recall it later. It might also help to connect what you're trying to remember to a favorite song or another familiar concept.

Manage chronic conditions

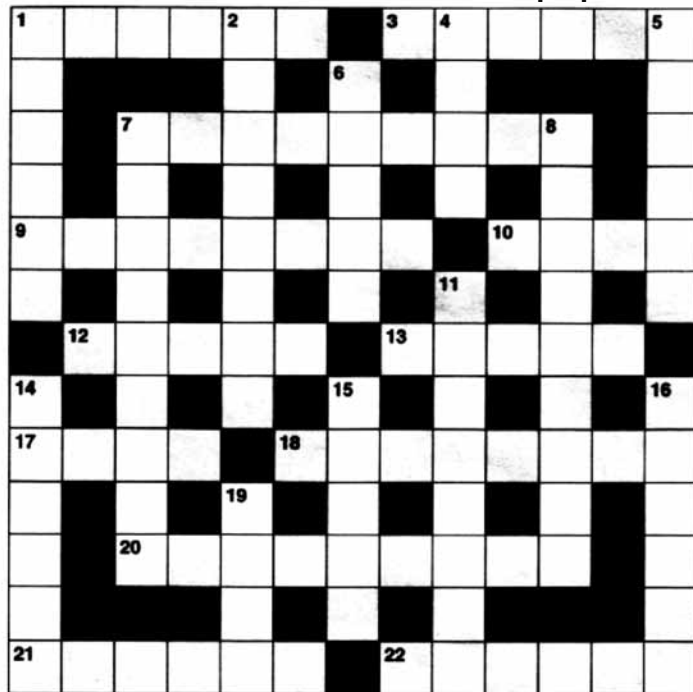

Hillcrest Lodge has live weather doppler on website

The Hillcrest Lodge & Resort website is now offering live doppler radar. As we move into severe weather season, those that have an internet connection can now click on the radar site 24 hours per day for an up to the minute image of precipitation. The system includes a weather-tracking system, which shows the history of weather radar images in five minute increments. Five and ten day forecasts can also be accessed through the weather radar system.

The radar shows a fifty mile range, however to get a broader range the user can move in or out with a tool located on the left side of the radar page. To access the radar, click on www.hillcrest-lodge.com web site, then click on Weather Radar located on the left side of the home page.

Many snowbirds have reported checking out the two camera images (one looking north, the other south) from the two webcams that can be accessed on the same web site. These web cams show current pictures of what appears to be a permanent glacier covering the Townsend Flowage.
