The Stovewood building is now heated year round

The Mecikalski Stovewood building in Jennings suffered less damage from winter weather this year. The reason was the heat from a new furnace, which kept the building warm and decreased the chances of condensation and heaving that can happen in an unheated structure.

The furnace, due to the efforts of Mike Gravitter at Gravitter Plumbing and Heating in Crandon, was donated by Lennox. It is a 130 BTU forced air unit that distributes heat to the various rooms. The foundation paid Gravitter to do the duct work and he, in turn, found some vintage-style heating grates and donated part of that cost back to the building.

The old landmark building isn't kept at 72 degrees, of course, but even with the thermostat set low, the building was available for foundation volunteers to work in during the winter months. At present, a "post office" is being built in one corner of the store, and the building once housed the post office.

Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest Safety Alert

Rhineland, WI: May 4, 2011 Last fall the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (GNF), in cooperation with an interagency enforcement action, eradicated approximately 70,000 marijuana plants that were cultivated by a large Drug Trafficking Organization (DTO). These grow sites were located on National Forest lands and were first reported by a hunter.

The illegal activity of growing and harvesting marijuana on public lands is expected to continue. The safety of the public and employees is the top priority for

According to Dick Dvorak, the building was insulated with the financial help from the Town of Schoepke, the Kohler Foundation and Stovewood Foundation funds. Because of the insulation, heating costs were near the \$2,000 mark instead of the \$6,000 price quoted by the Lennox engineer who checked out the building before the furnace installation.

The Stovewood Building is a real treasure, and gives the visitor a taste of what life was like a hundred or more years ago in the Northwoods. The Stovewood Daze celebration is scheduled for August 6th this year, and is well worth the visit. It is a very relaxing and interesting afternoon, and the food is excellent.



The furnace is busy pumping heat to the Stovewood Building, and heat is being retained by the new insulation, including the insulation sprayed on the stone walls of the basement, which is noticeable to the left of the furnace.

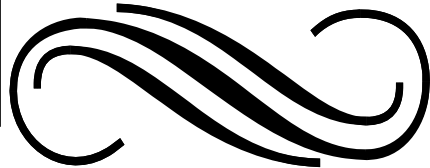

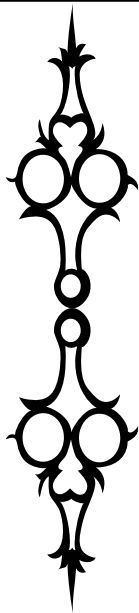

Forest Service requests motorized trail users to delay riding until May 10

Rhinelander, Wis. (April 27, 2008) -- The U.S. Forest Service is asking the public to voluntarily delay using motorized trails on the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest until May 10, 2011.

Although the trails officially open May 1, late spring weather conditions make trails prone to erosion and other damage, explained Catherine Pinegar, Forest Recreation Planner.

"As everyone in Wisconsin knows, it has been a long winter and late spring in the state. Because of this we are asking motorized trail users to refrain from riding on the Forest's motorized trails until May 10," she said. Forest officials expect all trail surfaces to be frost free and sufficiently dry by May 10, she said.

"This is a completely voluntary action and we hope the public will use good judgment and help us protect their trails from potential damage during spring thaw and reduce costly trail repairs and maintenance," added Forest Supervisor Paul Strong. "We welcome motorized trail users back and we ask that they honor their sport and the National Forest by riding responsibly."

Riders need to be aware that towns continue to allow ATVs on certain town jurisdiction gas tax roads. In addition, riders should check with county and state managed trail offices and websites for any trail closures.

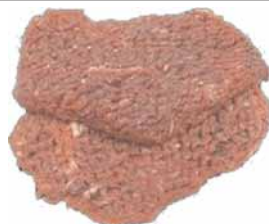

Latest treatments for heart attacks

Cardiology - the study and treatment of your heart and vascular system - has uncovered some important advances recently.

Superior tools: Many hospitals now possess sophisticated equipment for the detection and treatment of heart disease, such as 24-hour cardiac catheterization labs for performing angioplasty (a procedure for opening blocked blood vessels).

Better understanding: Ongoing research is yielding state-of-the-art knowledge, from recognizing that angioplasty is most effective if done within a few hours of the heart attack to knowing how best to treat patients with atypical symptoms.

Advances in care: Hospitals that participated in quality improvement initiatives, such as the American Heart Association's "Get With the Guidelines" program, have substantially boosted their care of heart attack victims.


Patient knowledge: Through corporate-sponsored wellness and public education programs, more people are learning about cardiovascular health. Many recognize the symptoms of a heart attack. They also understand what to do if one occurs, including when to get urgent medical care - within one to two hours of the onset of symptoms - to maximize their odds of survival.

Progress continues: New technologies are constantly being developed to provide better patient care. Future advances may include cooling a person's body temperature to increase survival rates or growing new cells to replace tissue damaged by a heart attack.

the Forest Service. National Forest and other public lands
are being used for these illegal operations as they are
often vast, uninhabited acres the growers find have the
right conditions for their illegal operations. Typically
planting occurs in the spring and the plants are harvested
in late summer.

These DTO marijuana growers are dangerous
and are known to carry firearms! The CNNF asks that
visitors be aware of their surroundings and know what to
do to remain safe. Knowing how to recognize grow sites is
vital.

Indicators of illegal marijuana grow sites include:
** Isolated tents in the forest where no other recreational
activity is present
** Garden tools, bags of fertilizer, and large amounts of
garbage
** Signs of cultivation/soil disturbances in unlikely areas
** 1 to 2 acre cleared areas with stumps up to
approximately 3 feet tall

If you encounter a site, or unusual circumstances
you should take these actions immediately:

** Leave the area as quickly and quietly as possible
** Do your best to know your location by use of landmarks
or waypoints
** Notify local law enforcement authorities, if on National
Forest you can also notify the local Ranger District Office.

Authorities will continue to work to decrease this
unlawful and damaging activity. Your assistance is
important to help stop marijuana growing in your National

Sweethearts and Sirens and A Chance to Love

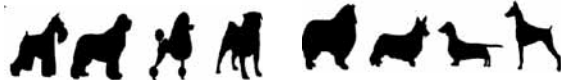

Saturday, May 14th, Mountain Ambulance Service will host a Dog Bite Prevention Clinic. "Don't Get Bitten" will begin at 10:00 a.m. at the Mountain Ambulance Station, 14336 Hwy. 32 in Mountain. Children and adults are encouraged to attend. No pre-registration is necessary. Participants are asked to leave their own dogs at home.

Kathie Bollenbach, of Granite Ridge Kennels in Mountain, will be the special guest. She'll be assisted by Oz, a seven-year-old German Shepherd. Kathie has been training dogs for more than 30 years in obedience, search and rescue, and agility. Oz is a Certified Therapy Dog (Therapy Dogs International TDI) and a member of Puppy Pals (the Oconto Chapter of TDI). Together, they'll demonstrate how to act around your own dog, how to approach a strange dog, and what to do if a dog threatens you, whether it's your own or someone else's. Kids will have a chance to practice with Oz, and a chance to win pet-related door prizes.

Did you know: about 4.7 million people are bitten by dogs every year; the group most likely to be bitten by dogs are children, especially those 5-9 years old the second most frequent bite victims are the elderly; children are frequently bitten on the face, and are more likely than other groups to be severely injured; and most dog bites affecting children occur with dogs they know, during ordinary activities. Among adults, males are bitten more frequently than females, and people with dogs in their homes are more likely to be bitten than those without dogs.

Dog bites are not minor injuries; they can result in trauma, sometimes requiring reconstructive surgery, and rabies is a serious and potentially lethal problem.

Dog bites are, however, often preventable. Prevention starts with taking your time and choosing a new dog carefully. Spend some time with a dog before you bring it into your home, and then train it well. Knowing how to act around other people's dogs is equally important.

Mountain Ambulance Service is presenting the "Don't Get Bitten" program as part of EMS Week and Dog Bite Prevention Week.

WPS Seeks Electricity and Natural Gas Rate Increase for 2012

Green Bay, WI - Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS), a subsidiary of Integrys Energy Group (NYSE:TEG) today filed a limited request for new electric and natural gas rates with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW). The items included in the request are consistent with the final decision the company received as part of its 2011 rate order from the PSCW authorizing WPS to make a filing for 2012 for recovery for changes in costs in a few limited items.

The WPS request is for a 3.5% overall increase to electric rates and a 0.3% increase in natural gas rates. If approved, the request would result in monthly increases of \$2.33 for typical residential electric customers using 630 kilowatt-hours and \$0.42 for typical residential natural gas customers using 756 therms annually.

"Most of the electric rate request reflects increased fuel and purchased power costs," said John Guntlisbergen, WPS manager - electric fuel cost recovery. "Included along with that is the rate impact of the ending of our refund to customers in December 2011 for lower fuel costs in 2010." Guntlisbergen noted that if actual fuel and purchased power costs differ significantly in 2012 from the request, the company would ask the PSCW for permission to adjust rates to either refund over-collections to customers, or to collect a shortfall.

"In essence," he said, "that is what is currently occurring with the refund of 2010 fuel cost over-collections this year."

Also among the electric issues are increased costs for transmission, as well as increased payments for energy conservation.

The small change to natural gas rates is the result of WPSC's Gas Revenue Stabilization Mechanism which annually adjusts rates based upon differences between actual and forecasted customer gas use.
