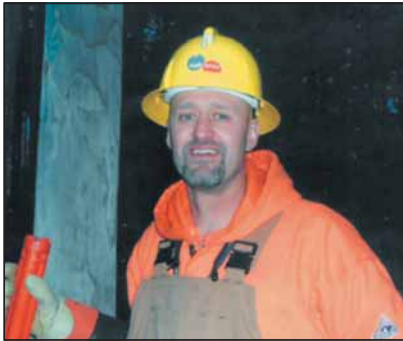

South Korea, US to Probe Agent Orange Claims

May 23, 2011 | Associated Press | SEOUL, South Korea

South Korea says the United States has agreed on a joint investigation after American veterans claimed they buried large amounts of Agent Orange in a U.S. military base in South Korea. South Korea and U.S. media recently cited former U.S. military service members saying the toxic herbicide was buried at Camp Carroll in southern South Korea in the 1970s. That raises concerns about lasting environmental damage and health risks. KPHO CBS 5 News in Phoenix, Arizona, first reported the claims. The prime minister's office said in a statement Sunday the investigation of the reported burial would start at an early date. Camp Carroll is still a military base for the U.S., which has 28,500 troops in South Korea.



Do SMARTBoards Make Smarter Students? A Jump into Technology in the Classroom

The Wabeno School District recently had all rooms equipped with SMARTBoards. What are they? A SMARTBoard is a large screen onto which you can project your computer screen. The SMARTBoards are very interactive; they have similar characteristics to iPods and Smartphones. The SMARTBoards have endless possibilities. For operation a finger is used as the mouse; the entire screen is a touch screen, and only basic computer skills are needed to utilize this technology. Teachers in the Wabeno area are using these to enhance their teaching techniques.

Mr. Mike McCann, Wabeno history teacher, uses his SMARTBoard for every subject he teaches in his classroom. Skills the students learn from these smart boards are communication, teamwork, and thought processing skills. Mr. McCann describes the SMARTBoards as a "big computer" and "a very positive investment." In the touch of a finger, Mr. McCann is able to save documents and create a new document; it is a time saver compared to rewriting notes everyday on the old-fashioned overhead projector. Teachers using their SMARTBoard believe it helps with the students' learning abilities.

Mrs. Nelson, English teacher at Wabeno School District, also uses her SMARTBoard for many classes, such as communication, grammar, and English. Teachers are able to create their own lessons plans suitable for the SMARTBoards. Whether it's vocabulary acquisition or grammar help or writing models, students utilize various thinking and problem solving skills while experiencing learning in a new way. The students have the opportunity to maneuver within the classroom through active learning.

The teachers and students from Wabeno do not have a negative thing to say about the SMARTBoards. Overall this technology offers outstanding educational opportunities and produces an atmosphere where students are more attentive in the classroom. This generation of students is more technology-focused which makes them able to understand and interact effectively in this new learning environment.

Smarter students? At the very least, more effective learners! Mrs. Nelson concluded, "I can not imagine what they will invent next."

THE POLL TAX IS BACK

Years ago in the south, not in Wisconsin, a 'poll tax' was charged to those who wanted to vote. This was a way of limiting the voting of the poor and the minorities. Well, we now have it in Wisconsin. It is called the Voter Identification Law. It means, if you want to vote, you need either a driver's license or an Official State issued picture identification card. These will be issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

It is estimated that about 175,000 elderly residents do not have a driver's license. Many people who live in cities with public transportation do not have a driver's license. For those people, they must get to a DMV office and obtain, and pay for a voter ID. This will be very inconvenient if not impossible for many people, especially low income people, those who because of circumstances beyond their control, move frequently and students. We do not yet know what it will cost, but it still amounts to a poll tax.

Having a driver's license is a privilege, and we pay for that privilege. However voting is supposed to be one of our Rights, and now many must pay for that right.

It is not as if multiple stations will be set up to accommodate people, or that the cost may be waived, it is planned to cause hardship for many to vote.

For a governor who wants to save money, and claims not to want to raise taxes, he could be doing both by this new law. Voting will now be a tax for many, and if we are to accommodate the influx of people to the DMV, we will need to hire more employees, increasing costs to that department.

Wisconsin has always been a state with very little voter fraud. So it seems that the only reason for passing this law, is to limit the number of voters, particularly at the lower income level.

Holperin Co-Sponsors Concealed Carry Legislation

State Senator Jim Holperin (D-Eagle River) said today he will support the least restrictive or "constitutional carry" version of legislation which would allow Wisconsin citizens to carry a concealed handgun without training or a permit.

"I favor the 'constitutional carry' or 'shall issue' version of concealed carry, but I've co-sponsored all three of the handgun bills that have been offered this session because this issue needs to advance and finally get signed into law," he said.

Holperin said the 'constitutional carry' legislation, Senate Bill 93, was making good progress after receiving strong support in public hearings. "SB 93 will be modified to include an optional permit for use in other states, but will still allow handgun owners to carry concealed without a permit or other regulation if they choose," he said.

Another bill, Senate Bill 90, creates a licensing system for those who want to carry concealed and is similar to measures introduced in past sessions. "SB 90 has become a fallback position this session, and will likely not be advanced," Holperin said.

A third measure, still in drafting, would allow concealed carry after gun owners complete a short two hour training session.

"I've always believed that responsible and qualified citizens deserve the right to carry and use firearms as guaranteed by both our state and federal constitutions with the fewest possible restrictions, and my voting record reflects that," Holperin added.

My Pyramid: Meat and beans group

Submitted by U.W. Extension

All foods made from meat, poultry, fish, dry beans or peas, eggs, nuts, and seeds are considered part of this group. Dry beans and peas are part of this group as well as the vegetable group. Most meat and poultry choices should be lean or low-fat. Fish, nuts, and seeds contain healthy oils, so choose these foods frequently instead of meat or poultry.

- Selection Tips:**
- Choose lean or low-fat meat and poultry.
 - Select fish rich in omega-3 fatty acids, such as salmon, trout, and herring, more often.
 - Processed meats such as ham, sausage, frankfurters, and luncheon or deli meats have added sodium. Check the ingredient and Nutrition Facts label to help limit sodium intake.
 - Sunflower seeds, almonds, and hazel nuts (filberts) are the richest sources of vitamin E in this food group. To help meet vitamin E recommendations, make these your nut and seed choices more often.

How much food from the **meat and bean** group is needed daily for ages 51+ years? Women = 5 oz. equivalent; Men + 5 1/2 oz. equivalent.

What counts as an ounce equivalent in the **meat and beans** group? In general, one ounce of meat, poultry or fish, 1/4 cup cooked dry beans, one egg, one tablespoon of peanut butter, or 1/2 ounce of nuts or seeds can be considered as one ounce equivalent from the meat and beans group.

Why is it important to include fish, nuts, and seeds? Many people do not make varied choices from this food group, selecting meat or poultry everyday as their main dishes. Varying choices and including fish, nuts, and seeds in meals can boost intake of monounsaturated fatty acids and polyunsaturated fatty acids. Most fat in the diet should come from these fats.

Some fish (such as salmon, trout, and herring) are high in "omega-3 fatty acids." There is some limited evidence that suggests eating fish rich in omega-3 may reduce the risk for mortality from cardiovascular disease.

Some nuts and seeds (flax, walnuts) are excellent sources of essential fatty acids, and some (sunflower seeds, almonds, hazelnuts) are good sources of vitamin E.

Department, decreasing Special Education Staff, condensing bus routes, reducing the activity buses from five to four days per week, eliminating two kitchen positions (one full-time and one part-time), eliminating two full-time study hall positions, eliminating a full-time math position, eliminating a full-time secretary, eliminating two summer custodial positions, implementing energy saving practices, applying for and receiving SAGE funds, applying for and receiving Microsoft settlement money, and applying for and receiving grants for teacher mentoring, teen institute, and technology.

In spite of all of these efforts, it is likely that we will have to go to a referendum for operating expenses in the next couple of years. Before we reach that point, it is very important for our communities to be satisfied that the school district has pursued all options for cutting costs. At the Two Cents Event, we will be seeking input on this topic. Some of the areas that could be considered for reducing or eliminating would be: activity buses, summer school, extracurricular activities, Project Brainworks, teaching staff (creating split grades or larger class sizes), administrative staff, and non-required programming (Tech Ed, Family and Consumer Ed, Band, Art, Music, Phy Ed). We can also pursue further condensing bus routes and having students pay for lunch.

What programming is important to you? What expenses will you be willing to support if or when we go to a referendum? Come to the Two Cents Event on Tuesday, June 7 at 6:30pm to share your thoughts and ideas.

Feds announce proposal to remove wolves from endangered species list

MADISON - Citizens will have an opportunity to testify on the federal government's most recent proposal to remove the gray wolf from the endangered species list in the western Great Lakes including Wisconsin.

The U.S. Department of Interior's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced on May 4, 2011 the publication of a new proposed rule for delisting wolves. The Fish and Wildlife Service will hold a 60-day public comment period on the new rule from May 5 through July 5, 2011.

A public hearing will also be held on the proposed delisting rule on May 18, 2011 at the Great Lakes Visitor Center in Ashland, Wisconsin. An informational meeting will be held from 6 to 7:15 p.m. and a public hearing will be held from 7:30 to 9 p.m.

Wolves continue to be protected as a federally endangered species until the rule process is played out and that is expected to be sometime in fall or early winter 2011. Once removed from the federal endangered species list, also referred to as delisting, wolves will be managed as a state protected wild animal in Wisconsin, which means they may not be killed unless specially authorized by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

"We thank Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar for responding to our petition for delisting and for recognizing that the state of Wisconsin is ready to assume management of gray wolf populations in the state," said DNR Secretary Cathy Stepp. "We strongly believe it is time to return management authority to the Great Lakes states and Tribes. Gray wolves have made a terrific recovery within our region, and now need to join the list of species successfully managed by the state. The Wisconsin DNR and our tribal partners are committed to use sound science for managing the state's wolf population."

Silver Lake meeting Cont. from pg. 1

A fair-sized patch of EWM was discovered in Silver Lake late last summer. Concerned association members have learned how rapidly and easily this invasive weed spreads and how destructive it can be for a lake. As a result, they have been working through the winter to learn what can be done to begin control action as soon as possible. This information will be presented at the special Silver Lake Association meeting this Saturday, May 28th.

Christopher Hamerla, Aquatic Invasives Coordinator for Lincoln, Langlade and Forest Counties will make a power point presentation giving us a history of the EWM infestation in Silver Lake and what has been done in an attempt to deal with it to this point. It will include underwater pictures taken following the ice-out this spring.

Important steps toward initiating the EWM control process will be explained, as outlined in suggestions and requirements from the Dept. of Natural Resources. This will include signing a contract with professional contractor-consulting firm specializing in invasive species control. This service includes help in writing much-needed funding grants.

Information will be given on what wording is required in a lake association constitution and by-laws before it can qualify to apply for a Wisconsin Lake Management grant.

A motion will be presented to the members of the association to begin the process of applying for an Early Response Aquatic Invasive Species Control Grant at the required 75%-25% cost share. This application needs to be submitted by early June. A summary of short-term and long-term management strategy will be presented by Kevin Guthrie, Sr. from the Rhinelander DNR office.

All area residents interested in the future health of Silver Lake and its related property values are asked to attend. The meeting is open to any area lake residents who might be interested in the early process of dealing with EWM once it is discovered.

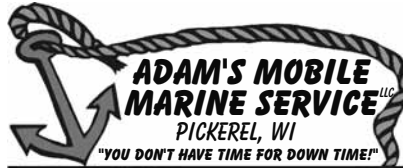

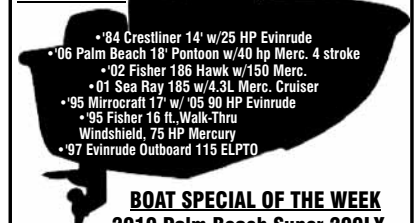

Lyme Disease Remains a Health Threat in Wisconsin

Cases increased 35% in 2010; May is Lyme Disease Awareness Month

MADISON -- Lyme disease cases increased 35 percent in 2010, and state health officials are urging people to take precautions against tick bites as warm spring weather triggers more "blacklegged" or "deer" tick activity. Infected blacklegged ticks can carry Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases including anaplasmosis, ehrlichiosis, and babesiosis.

Lyme disease cases totaled 3,495 in 2010 compared with 2,587 cases in 2009, according to Dr. Henry Anderson, State Health Officer.

Early symptoms of Lyme disease may occur 3 days to 30 days after the bite of an infected tick, which can include a rash called erythema migrans (EM), fever and chills, fatigue, headache, muscle and joint pain, and swollen lymph nodes. In some people the EM rash may not occur. The disease can be easily treated with antibiotics when detected early. However, if left untreated, Lyme disease can result in debilitating arthritis, and serious heart and nervous system complications.

"Everyone should take precautions against bites from blacklegged ticks, especially between May and August when people are more likely to be exposed," said Anderson. "It's important for people to check themselves for ticks as soon as possible when they come indoors." People can take steps to avoid tick bites and reduce the chance of getting Lyme disease:

Avoid wooded and bushy areas with high grass and leaf litter since ticks prefer these areas. Stay to the center of a trail to avoid contact with grass and brush.

Use effective tick repellants and apply according to the label instructions. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that adults use repellants with 20-30% DEET on exposed skin and clothing to prevent tick bites. Repellants that contain permethrin can also be applied to clothing.

Wear clothes that will help shield you from ticks. Long-sleeved shirts and long pants are best. Tuck your pants into the top of your socks or boots, to create a "tick barrier." Light-colored clothing makes ticks easier to spot. Landscape homes and recreational areas to reduce the number of ticks by creating tick-safe zones using woodchips or gravel along the border between lawn and wooded area. Continue to remove leaf litter and clear tall grass and brush around the house throughout the summer

Check frequently for ticks, and remove them promptly. Blacklegged ticks are small and may be difficult to find, so tick checks must be done on all parts of the body carefully and thoroughly. Pay special attention to areas where ticks tend to hide such as: the head, scalp, and body folds (armpit, behind the knee, groin).

Remove attached ticks slowly and gently, using a pair of thin-bladed tweezers applied as close to the skin as possible. Folk remedies like petroleum jelly, nail polish remover, or burning matches are not safe or effective ways to remove ticks.

Protect pets from tick bites by checking dogs or cats for ticks before allowing them inside. While a vaccine can prevent Lyme disease in pets, it will not stop the animal from carrying infected ticks into the home. Speak to a veterinarian about topical tick repellant available for pets.

West Nile Virus Dead Bird Reporting Hotline

To help track the West Nile virus (WNV), state health officials have reactivated the statewide, toll-free Dead Bird Reporting Hotline at 1-800-433-1610. "Dead birds act as an early warning system for West Nile virus," said Dr. Henry Anderson, State Health Officer. "Finding the virus in birds indicates that West Nile virus may be present in the local mosquito population bites, triggering special prevention and insect-control measures." Anderson said that anyone who observes a dead bird can call the hotline and arrange to have the bird tested for West Nile virus. Hotline staff can answer questions about dead birds and provide information on safe handling and disposal. People should not handle dead birds with their bare hands. West Nile virus is spread to people by the bite of a mosquito infected with the virus. Mosquitoes get infected with WNV by feeding on infected birds and can then transmit the virus to other animals, birds, and humans. Only one in five people infected with West Nile virus will have symptoms, including fever, headache, body aches, swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back. In rare cases, West Nile virus can cause severe disease with additional symptoms including muscle weakness, stiff neck, disorientation, tremors, convulsions, paralysis, coma, and potentially death. Transplant recipients and older people are at greater risk of developing severe illness. Symptoms begin between 3 to 14 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito and typically last a few days. People who become ill and think they have West Nile virus infection should contact their healthcare provider for treatment of symptoms. "The best way to prevent West Nile Virus and other mosquito-borne infections is to prevent mosquito bites," Anderson said. Mosquitoes breed in water, so eliminating standing water around homes and workplaces reduces mosquito breeding sites and the risk of bites. Even small pools formed in ashtrays or old tires can be breeding grounds.



Other measures to help decrease the risk of mosquito bites include: Limit time spent outside at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes are most active. Apply insect repellant to skin and spray clothing with insect repellant since mosquitoes may bite through clothing. The CDC recommends using products that contain active ingredients approved and registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). These products display an EPA registration number on the label. Wear long pants and long-sleeved shirts to reduce bites. Repair window and door screens to prevent mosquito entry. Properly dispose of items that hold water such as tin cans, plastic containers, pots or discarded tires. Clean roof gutters and downspouts for proper drainage. Turn over wheelbarrows, wading pools, boats and canoes when not in use. Change the water in birdbaths and pet dishes at least every three days. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas and hot tubs; drain water from pool covers. Trim tall grass, weeds and vines since mosquitoes use these areas to rest during hot daylight hours. Landscape to prevent water from pooling in low-lying areas. The Department of Health Services has monitored the spread of WNV since 2001. The surveillance program monitors wild birds, horses, and humans for West Nile virus. In 2002, the state documented its first human infections with 52 human cases. This was followed by 17 human cases in 2003, and 12 in 2004, 17 in 2005, 21 in 2006, 12 in 2007, 8 in 2008, 1 in 2009, and 2 in 2010. Protect the Forest from the Emerald Ash Borer: leave your firewood at home

Rhinelander, Wis. (May 26, 2011) Campers enjoying the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) during this year's summer camping season are asked to leave firewood at home -- unless you live within 25 miles of your favorite national forest campground. The firewood restriction is one way the forest is combating Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), an exotic beetle from Asia that kills ash trees. This invasive insect's larvae kill ash trees by destroying the soft layer of wood just under the bark that moves water and nutrients throughout the tree.

Firewood restrictions were established in 2009 under a Forest Closure Order Number to help prevent the ash-killing beetle from reaching the Forest. Movement of this pest is greatly accelerated by the inadvertent transportation of larvae in logs, firewood and nursery stock. Acceptable firewood to bring into the CNNF includes:

- ** Wood gathered from within the Forest with a valid permit or camping receipt
- ** Firewood purchased from a vendor within 25 miles of the national forest destination or brought from a residence within that same distance
- ** Wood that has been certified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (certified wood can be brought into the Forest from a distance of more than 25 miles)
- ** Kiln-dried, untreated, unpainted, unstained constructional/dimensional lumber free of any metal or foreign substance is also permitted.

If you have already brought firewood from home, within a quarantined area, do not take it back home and do not leave it -- BURN IT!

Originally discovered in southeastern Michigan in 2002, EAB has now been detected in numerous states including Wisconsin. In August 2008, an Emerald Ash Borer was first positively identified in southeast Wisconsin. A year later, an adult beetle was discovered on public land in Green Bay. Forest entomologists and silviculturists continue to monitor for the insect.

To date, there have been no confirmed findings on the CNNF.

The Forest-wide firewood restriction prohibits the possession, storage, or transportation of firewood originating from a distance of more than 25 miles from the Forest destination. Firewood from a federal or state quarantined county or area is also banned.

The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest has 41,000 acres of lowland ash-dominated forest. Additionally, there are about 243,000 acres of upland forest containing ash as a component in a mixed hardwood setting.
