Kentuck Day Festival Highlights Moonshine Era



CRANDON, WI: Join the Forest County Chamber of Commerce on Saturday, July 30, for the Annual Kentuck Day Festival in downtown Crandon. This popular summer festival celebrates the heritage of many of the area's early settlers from Kentucky. The rich history of the moonshine era will be highlighted at this event, featured in the historical booth on the grounds of the courthouse square. With artist and crafter booths, great sidewalk sales, specialty food booths, kid's venue, live entertainment on the grounds, there will be something for everyone to enjoy! Add the best car show in the Northwoods and you won't want to be anywhere but in downtown Crandon.

The 9th annual Kentuck Classic Car Show will take place on the beautiful grounds of the Weber-Hill Funeral Home from 10:00 a.m. till 3:00 p.m. An entry fee of \$10.00 can be paid upon registration, taking place from 9:00 till 11:00 a.m., at the show grounds. Show Chair Winda Collins encourages everyone to register early as the first 100 participants receive a 'goody bag', including t-shirts and dash plaques. New this year 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophies will be awarded in each class! Food and refreshments will be available on the grounds and DJ Rusty will be playing tunes throughout the day. Whether your vehicle is show ready or a work-in-progress, plan to attend and show pride in your ride at the Kentuck Classic Car Show.

Over 70 spaces have been reserved, so far, for art and craft vendors to set up on the courthouse lawn to show and sell their creations. Handcrafted items include wooden toys, furniture, carvings, wildlife art, oil acrylics, and water paintings, silk floral designs, scented candles, etched mugs, clocks, baskets, ethnic needlepoint, photography, quilting, honey products (from area owned bee hives), hand made jewelry, lawn ornaments, and more. Many of these talented artisans are from this area as well as from throughout Wisconsin and upper Michigan. At the other end of the courthouse square the flea market section along Polk Street has over 20 spaces reserved.

Many local restaurants plan to have a 'Kentuck' special on their menu. Some will be set up in the courthouse square, along with area groups, to serve their scrumptious specialty food items. The 'Kentuck' traditional soup, beans and cornbread provided by the Crandon Nursing Home are always one of the favorites available. The Chamber food booth will be serving up bluegrass burgers, bootleg brats, and hound-dogs for a great summer picnic meal. With home made strawberry short cake, home made cheesecakes and many other foods, you will have to eat all day long to sample everything!

Live bluegrass music on the grounds by "Copper Ridge" will take place from 11:00 till 3:00 p.m. Kids will have a great time with "Jumping Bean Bouncers" on the south end of the square. Brandt's Horse & Wagon Rides will be back for leisurely rides around the Courthouse Square.

The Forest County Historical Society display will be front and center on the courthouse square, which chronicles the migration of area families from Kentucky who settled in the area as well as information on the moonshine era here in northern Wisconsin. Several information booths will also be on hand including two area lake associations.

As this popular festival is a celebration of the heritage of the area's early settlers from Kentucky, dressing the part (Kentucky pioneer, prohibition or moonshine era, or even the humorous version) could win you a prize. \$50.00 in Chamber bucks will be awarded to the best-dressed vendor or attendee to the festival, with judging on stage at noon.

Last but not least, area retailers put their sale items out on the sidewalks from one end of main street to the other! While you are checking out the 'best bargains of the year' at the sidewalk sales, don't forget to stop in all the unique specialty shops.

Mursau Statement On Concealed Carry Enactment

MADISON State Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) made the following statement Friday regarding Governor Walker's signature of Mursau's legislation legalizing concealed carry of firearms, tasers and knives in Wisconsin:

Governor Walker signed the legislation Friday following over 15 years of debate and discussion by government officials, leaving only Illinois and the District of Columbia that prohibit any kind of concealed carrying.

Mursau decided in January that the time to finalize legalized concealed carry was ready for serious consideration and passage. Throughout the spring and summer, Mursau focused on the passage of such legislation.

"The constitution gives us our right to self defense through the right to bear arms," Mursau said. "This law gives us a way to reasonably practice that right."

Mursau's bill legalizes open carrying of firearms while at the same time licensing concealed carry by Wisconsin residents 21 years or older with no criminal record that satisfy proper safety training.

The bill passed with bipartisan votes in both the State Senate (24-9) and the State Assembly in June (69-27).

Wisconsin is getting older

Wisconsin's population is aging, with the state's median age reaching 38.5, according to Census 2010 figures to be released Thursday.

The estimate is up from the median age of 36 reported in 2000.

"Aging communities face unique challenges as well as opportunities," says Katherine Curtis, demographic specialist with the UW-Extension and faculty affiliate of the Applied Population Laboratory at UW-Madison. "Challenges include the delivery of local services such as health care, housing, and transportation. Civic engagement is an especially vital issue in these communities. Older residents can be a source for volunteers and community action. Yet factions can emerge when the needs and values of older residents are not in concert with younger residents."

Such differences might perpetuate the out-migration of younger populations and, in turn, foster the continued aging of communities.

Michigan reported a similar median age of 38.9 while North Dakota, a rural state often featured in discussions of aging in place, reported a lower median age of 37.

Census 2010 counts report 777,314 retirement-age (65 and over) residents in Wisconsin, accounting for 13.7 percent of the total population and marking a 10.6 percent increase in this age group since 2000.

As Wisconsin's older population has increased, its child population has decreased. The number of children, those under age 18, declined by 2.1 percent, falling from 1.37 million in 2000 to 1.34 million in 2010. Declines were reported for all child age groups except children under 5 years old, which grew by 4.7 percent since 2000.

All but two Wisconsin counties have had increases in median age since 2000, with Milwaukee and Grant counties as the exceptions. The biggest increase was reported for the rural counties largely concentrated in northern Wisconsin. This is part of a larger trend of aging in place that is closely tied to labor and retirement migration, says Curtis.

"Aging populations can result from the out-migration of young populations pursuing educational or economic opportunities, the in-migration of older populations seeking amenity-rich places to enjoy their retirement, or some combination of both," she says.

Curtis adds young populations are reproduced through fertility while older populations must rely on migration to sustain or grow.

Iron County reported the highest median age at 51, with 25.4 percent of the population 65 years or older. Vilas County was a close second at 50.7, with 25.9 percent of the population 65 years or older. Menominee County reported the lowest median age at 31.4. Only 11.4 percent of the county population was 65 years or older.

More detailed data—including single-year age breakdowns and age by race—from Census 2010 will be released in the coming months. All data are publicly available and can be accessed through the U.S. Census Bureau's on-line search engine American FactFinder.

Sign Up Sooner, Not Later, for Conservation Programs

Rhineland, Wis..... Many farmers and forestland owners do not realize that they may apply for federal conservation programs at any time; not just for a few weeks each year. Most of the programs offered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) are open year-round for applications, according to Michael Stinebrink, NRCS District Conservationist for Florence, Forest, Oneida, and Vilas counties.

"Private landowners may schedule an appointment to sign-up for cost-sharing for a wide array of conservation practices, including pasture planting, fencing, forest management plans, forest stand improvement, erosion control projects, nutrient management plans, irrigation systems, and invasive species control, through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), at any time throughout the year," says Stinebrink. Those applications are held until an annual ranking date is announced, at which time all applications that NRCS has received will be ranked for funding.

Frequently, the ranking dates are in the winter, and farmers rush to sign up when the ranking date is announced. However, snow cover makes it difficult for the NRCS staff to get a good look at the land and to identify all necessary practices. Funding may not be available in the spring to add anything that was missed, but that can be avoided by signing up sooner.

Fifty conservation program contracts were signed with Florence, Forest, Oneida, and Vilas county farmers and forestland owners, in 2011, for a total value of

more than \$625,000. These contracts were for EQIP, the Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP), and the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP). Like EQIP, WHIP provides incentive payments to private landowners to implement conservation practices. The Conservation Stewardship Program is a rewards program, in which participants may earn annual payments based partly upon their existing level of conservation and partly upon new conservation efforts that they agree to implement. Average, annual CSP payments have been approximately \$19/acre for cropland, \$17/acre for pastureland, and \$4/acre for forestland. Contracts are 5 years in length.

Silk Worms

The caterpillars of the silkworm moth are the remarkable creatures responsible for making the threads from which man manufactures shiny, beautiful silk cloth. Today, almost all silk is cultivated on silk farms in Japan, China, and other countries of the Far East, where mulberry trees grow, since it is the leaves of this tree which are fed to the caterpillars.

The large white female silkworm moth lays her eggs (from 300 to 500) on special paper set out by the silk farmer. These eggs are examined and tested carefully to be certain that the worms inside are not diseased. Then they are put into an incubator for about 20 days, where the warmth causes them to hatch.

When the tiny silkworm hatches, it is fed every two or three hours, night and day, for four to five weeks, with fresh mulberry leaves. At the end of that time, the silkworm is fully grown and stops eating. It is now ready to spin its outer wrapping, a cocoon. The worm first attaches itself onto a twig or piece of straw the farmer has placed near it. It does this by giving off a fluid that is manufactured in its glands. As the fluid hits the air, it hardens into silk threads, which the worm winds around and around the twig or straw. The threads are held together by a gum, which the worm also gives off. The worm continues winding its thread, now enclosing its own body inside a cocoon.

After three days, the cocoon is completed. To prevent the worm's changing into a moth and breaking out of the cocoon, thereby bursting its long silk thread, the farmer puts the cocoon into an oven. The heat kills the worm and permits workers to unwind the long silk threads. Several are unwound together, and the thicker threads are twisted into bundles, ready to be shipped to a mill for manufacturing into silk cloth.

The secret of silk-making was so closely guarded by the Chinese for 3,000 years that anyone revealing the truth about the silkworm was put to death as a traitor!

Bill Kamke made the past come alive on June 25 at the Holt and Balcom Logging Camp Museum's second summer event. The Museum hosted Bill doing My Life as a Lumberjack, an interactive presentation in which Bill interprets the life of lumberjack John Nelligan.

Bill, who is not a logger, but a farmer/game preserve operator, did two shows in the McCauslin Country Club and Golf Course Clubhouse Dining Room. The audience was mightily impressed with Bill's knowledge of the Big Pine Era and life in the logging camps. Lots of interaction brought out an array of comments and questions. Several in attendance claimed family ancestors who had lived the lumberjack life Kamke described.

Bill brought along dozens of artifacts, books, photographs and assorted literature to provide visual examples and invited the audience to examine them after the show.
