Large Marijuana grow operation on U.S. Forest Land eradicated

One Man Arrested & Four Others Sought; Will Face Federal Drug Charges

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that a large marijuana grow operation located in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest in Ashland County, Wis., was eradicated today.

One individual was arrested at the scene, and four others are at large. The marijuana grow involved thousands of plants over a several-acre area approximately 25 miles northwest of Park Falls, Wis. Law enforcement was alerted to its presence by a tip from a hunter in November 2010.

Fatal accident in Armstrong Creek

On July 27, 2011, at approx. 8:30 a.m., the Forest County Sheriffs Department was notified of a vehicle versus pedestrian accident at the Gudowicz Marathon Store in the Town of Armstrong Creek, Forest County.

Investigators learned that a distributor's truck had parked in the parking lot of the business. The truck parked too close to the building and the driver got back into the truck to move it. As he did so a customer exited the store and walked behind the truck. The truck struck the pedestrian while backing up and the pedestrian was drug for a short distance receiving injuries. A bystander yelled for the truck to stop and it did so. The pedestrian was later pronounced dead at the hospital.

The pedestrian was identified as William C. Roff, age 80, of Goodman.

The matter was referred to the Forest County District Attorney for review of any potential criminal charges.

The program is open to all individuals and families who have unused and unwanted medicine in need of disposal. Free mail back envelopes will be available at the Health Department located in the Forest County Courthouse during regular business hours 8:30 am to Noon and 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm. The envelopes are for individual use only and are not intended for facilities.

The benefits are two-fold: Residents get the prescription drugs out of the house and the drugs stay out of the state's water supply.

This initiative will augment law enforcement's successful one-day collections. On the last Drug Take Back Day on April 30th, local law enforcement collected almost 50 pounds of unused and unwanted medications and a total of 5.6 tons of pharmaceuticals were collected in Wisconsin. Unwanted and unused medications getting into the hands of the wrong person can be a deadly situation.

Approximately 175 federal, state and local law enforcement agents were involved in today's operation, which involved the removal of the marijuana plants and the processing of the site for evidence. An evaluation of the scene indicated that the grow operation has been active for some time. The site included a campsite for individuals who cultivated the grow operation. Loaded firearms were found at the campsite.

Law enforcement officials are asking any members of the public who see suspicious individuals in the area to contact the Ashland County Sheriff's Office at 715-685-7640.

Any individuals who are arrested in connection with this grow operation will be charged by the U.S. Attorney's Office with manufacturing marijuana.

"Unfortunately, there are criminals who take advantage of the remote and heavily wooded nature of our national forests to cultivate marijuana on a large-scale basis. Visitors to U.S. forest land who come upon marijuana grow operations should leave the area immediately and report their observations to law enforcement authorities," United States Attorney Vaudreuil said.

Avoiding Repetitive Stress

What are repetitive stress injuries? RSI's and cumulative trauma disorders (CTD's) can occur over time when you repeatedly use the same motions for activities, such as carrying heavy objects, playing instruments, typing, and exercising. The most common results are (1) *tendonitis*, which involves your tendons - the bands of tissue that attach to bones and muscles; and (2) *bursitis*, which involves the bursae, fluid-filled sacs that cushion tendons and bones.

What are the signs? They include tingling, numbness, pain, tenderness, swelling, redness or heat; sore neck or back; or feeling weakness or fatigue in the hands or arms. If you feel any of these symptoms, see your health care provider for advice about how to control your condition and keep it from progressing. Untreated pain will likely get worse.

Practice prevention daily:

- Proper nutrition helps maintain strong muscles and bones, and supplies the energy to perform physical activities efficiently.
- Exercise builds strength and flexibility - both help prevent injury.
- Warm up, cool down and stretch before and after exercise and other physical exertion.
- Vary your day-to-day activities and take breaks from repetitive motions.

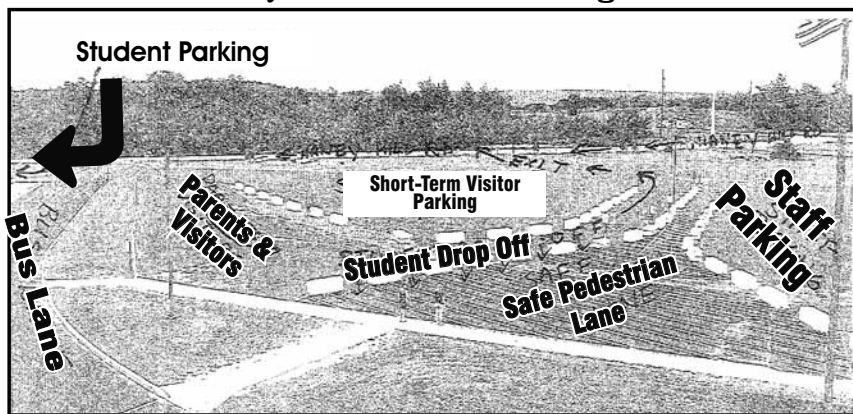

School District of Crandon Creates Pedestrian Safety Zone in South Parking Lot



In response to community members voicing concern about the potential for an accident in the school parking lot, the district worked in conjunction with the Forest County Sheriff's Department to redirect the traffic flow in the lot. The diagram shows the changes in the parking lot traffic flow for the South lot at the School District of Crandon. The purpose of the changes was to establish a PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ZONE that allows students who are dropped off to walk safely through the lot.

Working in cooperation with the Forest County Sheriff's Department the district has created the following areas in the South Lot. The first is a DROP OFF LANE in which students are expected to exit from the right side of the vehicle and move directly to the pedestrian safety zone. Also established is a SHORT TERM and visitor parking area for parents who need to leave their vehicle and come in the building. The other portion of the South Lot is designated for STAFF PARKING. The East Lot is designated for student parking and additional staff parking.

It is critically important for parents and visitors to remember that the BUS LANE needs to be clear of cars at all times because it also serves as a FIRE LANE for emergency response vehicles.

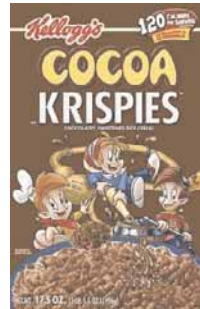

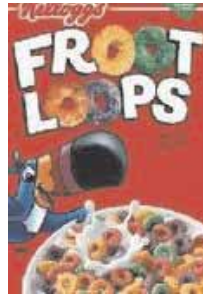

Breastfeeding Awareness Month

The Forest County Health Department is joining the effort to call attention to the health benefits both women and children can enjoy when moms choose to breastfeed. While research has proven many benefits to breastfeeding, too many in our community are still unaware that breastfeeding is the best option for children and mothers.

Studies have shown that breast milk is the only food an infant needs during its first six months of life, and that it offers many benefits that formula does not. Breast milk helps build babies' immune system, protecting them from diarrhea, ear infections and pneumonia. Children who are breast fed are less likely to develop asthma or become obese later in life. Breastfeeding can provide health benefits to mothers as well, lowering rates of breast and ovarian cancer. Of course, it is also free, and can save a family up to \$1,500 in formula costs in the first year alone.

Forest County WIC program helps WIC women in Forest County get the health education they need to ensure healthy pregnancies and healthy babies, including educating new moms about how and why to breast feed. Only a small number of Forest County WIC mom's breast during the first six months of their child's life. We would like to see those number increase so they can enjoy the many benefits of breastfeeding.

There are things that all of us can do to help improve the breastfeeding rate. Social support for breastfeeding—from employers, from husbands and other family, and from the general public—is an important part of encouraging new moms to do the best thing for themselves and their children. Studies have shown that supporting mothers through the sometimes difficult first few weeks of breastfeeding makes a major difference in their likelihood to stick with the practice.

We also encourage all in our community to support breastfeeding moms by providing safe, clean places in offices and public places where they can feed their infant, and by being educated about the natural health benefits of breast milk. After all, healthy infants, healthy moms and healthy families benefit everyone in our community.
