Motorized recreation success story In Northern Oconto County



Four years ago the Red Arrow Snowmobile/ATV club from Townsend, the White Lake ATV Club and a business owner (Mike Richling, Animal's Bear Trail Inn) from the Town of Doty developed a plan to create a 40 mile ATV Trail/Route loop from the Nicolet State Trail. Riders would travel to the west thru the townships of Townsend and Wolf River, go south to Doty and then back northeast thru the towns of Mountain & Riverview finally reconnecting with the Nicolet Trail between Mountain and Lakewood.

In August of 2009 the Hidden Bear Trail ATV Club (HBT ATV Club) was formed and joined the other 2 clubs in working on this project. All 3 clubs were involved with getting the 5 townships to open mostly gravel town roads needed to complete the project. The next challenge was a half mile of private property. The clubs worked with property owners Patrick & Jennifer O'Brien to get permission to travel on their land along Highway T in the Town of Doty. The Red Arrow Club and HBT ATV Club agreed to construct a fence and on May 8th & 9th, nine members from both clubs constructed the 1/2 mile of fence. On May 15th, 2011 the first 21 miles of the mostly gravel trail/route was opened from Townsend to Highway T & 64 in the Town of Doty. In 2009 the HBT ATV Club applied for a \$23,000.00 RAC Grant from the Nicolet/Chequamegon National Forest Service to improve 3.7 miles of Forest Service roads. This completed the last 19 miles of the project and is also mostly gravel roads and dirt Forest Service trails. The work was completed in September 2011 and on Thursday September 15th the remainder of the 40 mile ATV Route/Trail was opened.

On Saturday September 17th members from the Woodland Trails ATV Club, HBT Trail ATV Club and the Red Arrow Snowmobile/ATV Club started at the Lakewood ATV Trailhead on the Nicolet State Trail, went North to Townsend and then on the new Trail/Route. The group had lunch at Animal's Bear Trail Inn and ended up back on the Nicolet State Trail 40 miles later. This very scenic loop is suitable for all experience levels of ATV enthusiasts.

Plants found in popular Mississippi River waterfowl area

BUFFALO CITY, Wis. -- The recent discovery of two aggressive invasive plant species in a popular Upper Mississippi River waterfowl area underscores the need for waterfowl hunters to clean their boats and take other steps to avoid accidentally spreading invasive plants and nonnative species that can threaten waterways and future hunting opportunities, state and federal wildlife officials say.

"This is the first time we've found these two species of invasive water plants in Pool 5," said Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge Winona District Manager Mary Stefanski. "We are hopeful that none of these plants will survive if we get a cold winter, but we still need boaters to be vigilant."

Pool 5 is by Buffalo City and encompasses river miles 750 to 739.

Bob Wakeman, who coordinates aquatic invasive species prevention and control efforts for the Department of Natural Resources, urges hunters to check their boats, trailers and other equipment before they launch and after they're done for the day.

Progress of the Forest County Rat River Bike Trail

"How is the trail coming?" is a question many people are asking. I'll try to provide periodic updates for them, and for people reading this and asking, "What trail?", I'd like you to know about this exciting opportunity for Forest County. It began with

a vision by a group of bike enthusiasts, Bear Lake residents, and the town of Blackwell for a trail along the scenic Rat River for non-motorized use. The trail connects to the Nicolet Trail and follows an old railroad bed that historically brought logs to the Flanner Mill in Blackwell during the logging days. It then follows the snowmobile trail to Bear Lake campground, and has the potential to someday in the future extend to Armstrong Creek and Wabeno.

Funding to begin the trail was found when the Chequamegon Nicolet Recreational Advisory Committee (RAC) approved the project, and Blackwell included the project into their town planning. Many volunteers have also agreed to donate their time to work on the trail, and are now waiting for the Forest Service to complete its Environmental Study. The study was supposed to have been completed in August, but has not been started yet. The town of Blackwell has begun brushing out Grant Lane, and will soon start building permanent privy. For walkers and bikers, tourists and residents, this trail will provide more access to enjoy our beautiful forest. I hope I will be able to report further progress soon.

John Schnorr, far left, CEO Wisconsin Off Highway Vehicle Association (WOHVA) presents a check to the Sokaogon Chippewa Community in the amount of \$630.00. The money was raised this past July 21-22 at the Annual Northwoods Jeep Jamboree which takes place each year on Mole Lake tribal lands. \$10 from each registration is earmarked for the Sokaogon Chippewa Veteran's organization. The WOHVA has an Memorandum of Understanding with the tribe, so as to maintain year-round access of tribal lands for use by Jeeps on the reservation. Two hundred and thirteen people and 76 jeeps registered and nearly 500 people came over to visit the event. Anyone interested in joining may visit the web site; www.jeeppamusa.com.

From the web site: The Wisconsin Off-Highway Vehicle Association (WOHVA) focuses on assuring the individual rights of citizens (who enjoy motorized trail recreation) to the continued use of public lands. WOHVA believes that motorized recreation can coexist with an environmentally responsible use of public lands. These two goals need not be mutually exclusive. WOHVA believes with firm conviction in that previous statement!

By working to inform & educate Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) recreationalists; in conjunction with informing and educating legislators, land managers, land owners and public administrators; WOHVA continues to increase OHV trail availability here in the Badger State.

Our members are regularly receiving educational and training opportunities from experts from across the country. The premier education and information offering is WOHVA's Annual Wisconsin OHV Enthusiasts Workshops (held each spring).

Working closely with land managers from the Chequamegon/Nicolet National Forest WOHVA is expecting receipt of a Recreational Trails Program Grant. This Grant encompasses the first stage of a multi-state project which will rehabilitate the Pipeline 4x4 Corridor on the eastern boundary of the Nicolet Forest side of the Forest. WOHVA has sponsored numerous volunteer projects on The Pipeline (including our Annual WOHVA Spring & Fall Pipeline Trail Maintenance Days).

In 2007, the Sokaogon/Chippewa granted WOHVA exclusive trail event access to the Mole Lake Indian Reservation. Working closely with Tribal Forestry, WOHVA has developed a network of motorized recreation trails catering to the desires of OHV's, UTV's and 4WD's. Each year WOHVA hosts two trail riding events; the Northwoods-Mole Lake Jeep Jamboree USA & the Annual Great Northern Trail Ride. In addition, WOHVA has numerous Mole Lake Trail Days each summer where WOHVA Individual Members are encouraged to explore the trail system while continuing to expand and maintain the current trail network.

WOHVA continues to support numerous local, state, regional and national organizations.

No appointment is necessary, and there is no cost.

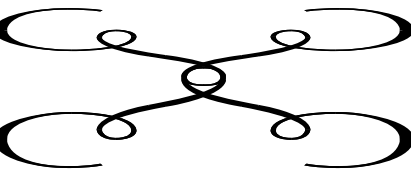

Travel safely with your child

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for children ages one to twelve, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). During Child Passenger Safety Week from Sept. 18 to 24, law enforcement agencies, safety organizations and the medical community will remind parents, grandparents and caregivers that consistent and proper use of child safety restraints in vehicles can be a matter of life or death. To protect children against being ejected from a vehicle or thrown around violently inside it during a crash, Wisconsin law requires the following four-step progression:

1. Rear facing child-safety seat in the back seat (if vehicle is equipped with a back seat) when the child:
 - Is younger than 1-year-old or
 - Weighs less than 20 pounds
2. Forward facing child-safety seat in the back seat (if the vehicle is equipped with a back seat) when the child:
 - Is at least 1-year-old but younger than 4-years-old and
 - Weighs at least 20 pounds but less than 40 pounds.
3. Booster seat when the child:
 - Is at least 4-years-old but younger than 8-years-old or
 - Weighs at least 40 pounds but less than 80 pounds or
 - Is not 57-inches (4-feet, 9-inches) tall or taller
4. Safety belt when the child:
 - Is 8-years-old or older or
 - Weighs 80 or more pounds or
 - Is 57-inches tall or taller

An observational survey earlier this year indicates that nearly all children in Wisconsin age four and younger are restrained while riding in a motor vehicle. However, recent national studies also show that approximately three out of four child safety seats are not installed properly and might fail to fully protect children in crashes. To ensure maximum protection for children, safety experts recommend that parents and caregivers remember the following points:

§ Comply with the safety-seat manufacturer's directions and the vehicle instructions for buckling the seat into your car or truck.

§ You cannot be sure about the quality of a used safety seat that you buy at a garage sale or obtain second-hand. The model may even have been recalled for a defect. The best practice is to buy a new safety seat that meets all current federal standards.

§ Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained and all adults are buckled up. This sets a good example for young children and protects them against being hit by an unbuckled occupant who could be tossed around violently in a crash.

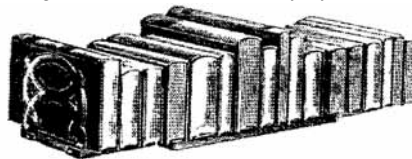

VA's Telephone Service Helps Family Members Encourage Veterans to Seek Medical Care

WASHINGTON The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has launched a telephone service, Coaching into Care, to provide assistance to family members and friends trying to encourage their Veteran to seek health care for possible readjustment and mental health issues.

"Those closest to Veterans are often the first to recognize when Veterans are having difficulties," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "Family members and friends may not know what to say to encourage their Veterans to seek much needed readjustment and health care. The Coaching into Care line will help them find the right words."

To help Veterans address problems and support Veterans in making decisions about getting care, the Coaching into Care program offers unlimited, free coaching with family members or friends over a series of telephone calls. The priority is connecting Veterans with VA care in their community through the family member's help and encouragement. Callers receive professional coaching on solving specific logistical obstacles and encouraging sometimes reluctant Veterans to seek care while still respecting the Veteran's right to make personal decisions.

Coaching into Care, launched in March 2011, has had more than 650 calls with family members or friends of greater than 175 Veterans to encourage them to seek care. This phone line is connected to VA's Veterans Crisis Line, Caregiver Support Line, and the National Call Center for Homeless Veterans. This way, if the caller or Veteran is in an immediate crisis, or has concerns regarding caregiving for a disabled Veteran, or seeking assistance regarding homelessness, there is no wrong number for families to call.

Callers can reach VA's Coaching into Care program at the toll-free number 1-888-823-7458, 8 a.m. - 8 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, and online at <http://www.mirecc.va.gov/coaching/>. As always, Veterans can reach immediate help at the Veterans Crisis Line at 1-800-273-8255, press 1 for Veterans.

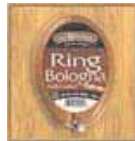

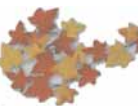

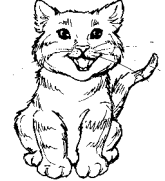

9 Easy Ways to Help Lower Your Cholesterol

1.) **Read beyond "low-fat":** Even foods that claim to be "low-fat" may contribute significantly to fat intake if you eat more than one serving. The label phrase "low-fat" means the product contains 3 grams or less per serving. Be sure to check the serving size on the nutrition facts label and account for the extra fat (and calories) consumed if you eat more than that one serving.

2.) **Get Fiber:** Research suggests that increasing soluble fiber intake by 5 to 10 grams each day may result in a 5 percent drop in LDL cholesterol. Start the day with a cup of oatmeal. put a 1/2 cup of beans on your salad at lunch, eat broccoli with dinner and snack on an orange or a pear and you'll easily meet the target range.

3.) **Eat Eggs, in moderation:** Eggs are no longer on the cholesterol blacklist. The daily recommended cholesterol limit is 300 milligrams of cholesterol and one egg contains about 213. So if you're going to eat an egg in the morning simply limit how much cholesterol you get that day from other sources. Substitute some veggies for meat at dinner, or skip the half-and-half in your coffee.

4.) **Start the Day Right:** Chose hot or cold breakfast cereals, such as oatmeal and oat bran, that have about 2 grams of soluble fiber and 4 to 6 grams of total fiber per 1-cup serving. Add a banana or other fruit to boost fiber even more. This will help keep LDL cholesterol low.

5.) **Double Cholesterol Whammy:** Dietary cholesterol can elevate your blood cholesterol levels, but saturated fat has an even worse effect. However, the two are often found in the same foods, including meat, butter and full-fat dairy. So by limiting your intake of foods rich in saturated fat, you'll also help reduce your intake of cholesterol.

6.) **Know Your Sources of Trans Fat:** Since 2006, the FDA has required food manufacturers to list reportable amounts of trans fat on the nutrition facts label. What's considered reportable? Food manufacturers don't have to report the trans-fat content if it's less than 0.5 grams per serving. So check the ingredient list for hydrogenated or partially hydrogenated vegetable oils even if the nutrition facts label reports 0 grams of trans-fat.

7.) **Go Fish:** Twice a week, substitute a fatty fish, such as salmon or tuna, for a higher-fat meat like beef. These fish are rich in omega-3's, a type of polyunsaturated fat, that may help lower your blood

cholesterol level when substituted for saturated and trans fats in your diet.

8.) **Find the Right Fats:** To identify foods low in cholesterol and saturated and trans fats, follow this rule: choose fats and oils (e.g., canola and olive oils) with 2 grams or less saturated fat per tablespoon.

9.) **Check for Tropical Oils:** Lots of products are now "trans-fat free" but in some cases, these fats are being replaced with saturated fats, such as palm and coconut oils. You may have heard that palm and coconut oils do not negatively affect cholesterol levels, but the research isn't conclusive and palm kernel oil contains 80 percent saturated fat. Instead, look for products that use polyunsaturated and monounsaturated fats, which help lower LDL cholesterol.

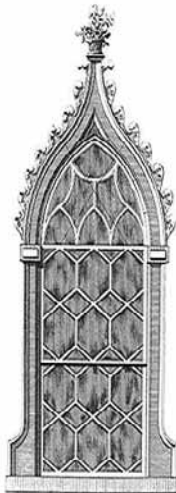

"Please take a few minutes to inspect your boats and equipment, remove any plants and animals, and drain water from your boat and equipment," he says. "These steps will prevent the spread of these new invasive plants, and will also help contain other aquatic invasive species and diseases that may be present."

DNR Water Guards and wardens will be checking boats at popular landings in the area and across the state, educating hunters about the rules and enforcing them. "The waterfowl hunting community is an important partner in the effort to prevent the spread of invasive species in Wisconsin's waterways," says DNR Chief Warden Randy Stark.

And DNR was working with the River Alliance of Wisconsin to post signs at boat landings in the area to alert hunters to the presence of water hyacinth and water lettuce in Pool 5 of the Upper Mississippi River.

Water lettuce and water hyacinth are two innocuous sounding invasive plants with outsized impacts: as few as 25 individual plants can expand to cover 10,000 square meters of water surface in one growing season, nearly enough to cover Lambeau Field twice. This expansion creates a thick, impenetrable mat of vegetation that prevents waterfowl from foraging.

Stefanski also notes that another invasive plant, purple loosestrife, has been spotted in larger than normal amounts along the river this year. She believes this is because many of the beetles that normally feed on the loosestrife and keep them under control may have died over the winter due to cold weather and high water. "We plan to release more of the beetles next summer to hopefully get the population of loosestrife back under control," she says.

Here is how hunters and others enjoying Wisconsin's outdoors can help protect their hunting, fishing and the state's natural resources from invasive species.

If you see these plants or other plants on the watch list, please pull them and put them in a trash bag or other container to be disposed of in a landfill.

If you find a large infestation that you are not capable of pulling contact the toll-free DNR information line at 1-888-WDNRINFO (1-888-936-7463).

Inspect your equipment and remove all plants and animals before transporting.

Follow all other state and federal laws to prevent the spread of invasive species and diseases.
