FCP Foundation Grant To Support Local Economic Development

Forest County, Wis. A Forest County Potawatomi Foundation capacity-building grant was recently awarded to the Forest County Economic Development Partnership. The \$28,000 grant will allow the Partnership to contract an Executive Director on a full-time basis.

The Forest County Economic Development Partnership (FCEDP) represents the joint efforts of multiple entities to improve the standard of living and quality of life for all tribal and non-tribal residents of Forest County. The FCEDP Board of Directors consists of ten board- or council-appointed positions, representing Forest County, Forest County Potawatomi Community, Sokaogon Chippewa Community, City of Crandon, Forest County and Wabeno Chambers of Commerce, and the Forest County Tourism Commission.

Four additional board members represent the county's financial, utilities, manufacturing, and service sectors. The UW Extension-Forest County Office, Nicolet Area Technical College, and other entities also provide critical support and serve as resources from the fields of education, business, and natural resources.

At the core of the Forest County Economic Development Partnership is its mission to improve the standard of living and quality of life for individuals and families residing in Forest County. It aims to increase economic development by supporting small businesses, facilitating community projects, and attracting new industries to the areaall while maintaining Forest County's natural resources, heritage, and cultural traditions.

The voting board members contribute to the sustainability of the organization through multi-year commitments to pay membership dues. "This provides a nice base funding mechanism to move forward" says Steve Nelson head of the UW Extension-Forest County Office. However, even with this base of support, the Partnership had only enough funds to hire a part-time Executive Director.

After collaboration and discussion among board members, it became apparent that a full-time Executive Director was critical to the success of the future endeavors of FCEDP. The board recognized that the selected candidate will play a key role in the history of the organization. Establishing integral relationships and defining FCEDP's role within the communities it serves, the first employee will have the critical responsibility of setting the organization on its course for the future.

Now, with the support of the FC Potawatomi Foundation grant, FCEDP has the ability to attract a qualified candidate to fill the contracted, full-time position. The Partnership is in search of a candidate who possesses a background in economic development as vell as a strong commitment to the communities in Forest County. The selected candidate will serve as a liaison to local businesses, associations, and governmental units on economic development matters and will provide administrative oversight, create a long-term sustainability plan, and carry out the organizational vision outlined in the strategic plan.

On Monday morning, about 11:00 a.m., the lights flickered, my computer shut off, as did all in the building. Then the electricity returned for a short time, only to leave us in the dark, computerless and almost helpless. Every business and home in Crandon and Laona were in the dark, and business came to a sudden stop.

Soon, a siren sounded as Chief Dan Packard went by. Taking a camera, I headed east on Hwy 8 and saw the reason for the outage.

A vehicle driven by Shandon Tallier, Laona, and another by Scott Cayce, of Neenah, had sideswiped, leaving Tallier crashed into the bottom of a light pole, snapping it off. His pickup, as seen in the photo above, sat on the broken stub of the pole. The Rescue Squad moved Tallier to medical care. We don't know what, if any citations were issued.

The arrival of Crandon's Police Department, the Forest County Sheriff's Department, the Rescue Squad and the Crandon Fire Department had to set a record for an emergency response. It was impressive. Public Service was also on the spot in record time, and electricity was soon flowing to the area due to the improvised repair shown below.

The frailty of our high-tech world was certainly demonstrated by this accident, and it is impossible to calculate the loss in time and money one small mishap

I can safely say that everyone knows what can happen when a person is distracted when driving. The Forest County Rescue Squad, Fire Department, Sheriff's Department and the Crandon School District wanted to remind the youth about the importance of being a good driver. They held a mock car accident on the school grounds and the rescue and safety units showed the children how long it takes to get to a scene of an accident and how they treat the injured parties of the accident.

In one vehicle was a mother and her baby. The other vehicle had two high school aged kids. The mother and baby were taken to the hospital by ambulance. The high school kids were not so lucky. One was taken to the hospital with life threatening injuries by helicopter, while the other was killed.

After the practice, all the children were gathered in the auditorium. They were asked what they thought about what had happened. The EMS then talked about how everybody needs to be an attentive driver. Playing with your phone, eating, or being distracted by other passengers in the car, these are all things that happen that may seem harmless, but have caused accidents.

Mary Sue Engebretson then talked about drinking and driving and how it affects families that have lost loved ones due to it. She gave advice to everybody about safe driving and to call for help when you find yourself in a bad situation.

This exercise hopefully showed the children that we all need to do our part to cut down on accidents. We may never see a day when there will be no accidents, but hopefully we can get the number down.



2. Place ashes in a covered metal containe to keep wind from blowing coals and sparks around.

5. Every year, make sure your smoke pipe is firmly in place where i enters the chimney and crew sections together.

Energy and Weatherization Assistance 2011 2012

Home Energy Plus included the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) and Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP). WHEAP provides assistance for heating costs, electrical costs, and energy crisis situations. WAP helps renters and homeowners reduce their energy consumption. Operating with federal and state funding, the programs provide energy assistance payments to over 230,000 households and weatherization services to over 10,000 households in Wisconsin each year

Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) is a one - time payment during the heating season, which runs from October 1st until May 15th. The funding pays a portion of the costs, but the payment is not intended to cover the entire energy cost of a residence. The amount of the energy assistance payment varies depending on a variety of factors, including the household size, income and energy costs. In most cases the energy assistance benefit is paid directly to the household's

Your household may be eligible for the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program and Weatherization Assistance Program. 
