
Cub bear released from trap with no loss of hide by any involved

Historic Emergency Alert System Test First ever nationwide alert set for Novem

(MADISON) - Wisconsin will participate in the first nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) next month. The test will be heard on radio stations, and will be viewed on televisions across the country as part of national preparedness efforts.

The test will occur on Wednesday, November 9, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. and will last approximately 3 minutes. Television viewers and radio station listeners will hear a message indicating that "this is a test."

The national-level EAS is a public alert and warning system that enables the President of the United States to address the American public during extreme emergencies. Similar to local EAS tests that are conducted frequently, the nationwide test will involve broadcast radio and television stations, cable television, satellite radio and television services and wireline providers across all states Continued on pg. 5

VETERANS DAY HISTORY

World War I officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919. However, the fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars." The following year, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day, saying "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations." The original conception of Armistice Day called for parades and public meetings and a brief suspension of business at 11:00 am. Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of the day of the week on which it falls, preserving the significance of the date. It also focuses attention on the true purpose of Veterans Day: a celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.








Big Fish!

"Although EAS is frequently used by our state and local governments to send weather alerts and other emergency information, there has never been a national activation of the system," says Wisconsin Emergency Management Administrator Brian Satula. "EAS mes were sent out 23 times in the last two years by local and state government agencies in Wisconsin to communicate vital emergency information. Last February, EAS messages were used to warn people about treacherous road conditions during the Groundhog Day Blizzard.'

The purpose of the November 9, 2011 test is to assess the readiness and effectiveness of the current system and identify improvements to better serve and protect our citizens and communities.

The test has been in the development stages for the last two years. The Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Federal Communications Commission and the National Weather Service, along with state, local and tribal agencies, have been coordinating this test.

The EAS test is a great reminder that everyone in Wisconsin should have an emergency preparedness kit and create an emergency plan for themselves, their families, communities and businesses. Anyone can visit http://readywisconsin.wi.gov for more information about how to "Get a Kit, Make a Plan and Stay Informed" and what to do in the event of an actual emergency

Frequently Asked Questions about the EAS Test

What is the Emergency Alert System (EAS)?

The national-level EAS is a national public alert and warning system that enables the President of the United States to address the American public during extreme emergencies. Alerting authorities can leverage the state and local EAS to send alerts and warnings to radio and television stations, cable television, satellite radio and television services and wireline providers.

What is the Nationwide Emergency Alert System (EAS)

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) National Weather Service (NWS) will send an EAS test message to all participating radio, television, cable and satellite

Focus on Fruits

- 3.) Think about variety: Buy fruits that are dried, frozen, and canned (in water or 100% juice) as well as fresh, so that you always have a supply on hand.
- 4.) Don't forget the fiber: Make most of your choices whole or cut-up fruit, rather than juice, for the benefits that dietary fiber provides.
- 5.) Be a good role model: Set a good example for children by eating fruit every day with meals or as
- 6.) Include a fruit at breakfast: At breakfast, top your cereal with bananas, peaches, or strawberries. Add blueberries to pancakes, drink 100% orange juice or grapefruit juice. Or, try a fruit mixed with fat-free or low-fat
- 7.) Try a fruit at lunch: At lunch, pack a tangerine, banana, or grapes to eat, or choose fruits from a salad bar. Individual containers of fruits like peaches or applesauce are easy and convenient.
- 8.) Experiment with fruit at dinner too: At dinner, add crushed pineapple to coleslaw, or include orange sections, dried cranberries, or grapes in a tossed



Additional Jr/Sr High late starting/Elementary no school dates during this school year will be December 7, February 1, March 7, and May 2.


Operation Christmas Child







When first approached about the Honor Flight, Jim was hesitant. Being a humble man, he wasn't sure he was worthy of being selected. However, as the big day approached, Jim became more and more excited.

On the day of the trip, four airplanes with 90 passengers each took off from the Central Wisconsin Airport in Wausau at 5:00 a.m. Refreshments were served and two hours later they arrived in Washington. The Veterans and their escorts were met by volunteers who came with wheelchairs, golf carts, and buses to help the men get from place to place.

What followed was an amazing day. Jim and his fellow Veterans visited the World War I Memorial, the World War II Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, and the Vietnam Memorial; as well as witnessed the changing of the guard at Arlington National Cemetery. When asked which Memorial had the most impact on him, Jim didn't have an answer. He said they were each intense in their own way.

The group was back on the planes by 7:00 that evening and on their way back to Wausau. When they landed, they were treated to an unexpected surprise. The entire airport was filled with supporters. People filled all of the hallways and concourses while waving flags and signs, cheering, singing, and offering pats on the back. Jim says the celebration left him shaking and feeling very proud.

All in all, Jim says the entire trip was wonderful, and more than met the expectations he had for it. He is very thankful to everybody who made it possible and those who contributed in any way. When asked what his favorite part of the journey was, Jim replied, "The flights, of course. I still love to fly." And as for his emotions while viewing the various monuments and being with other Veterans, Jim said it "made him feel small, but as if he had been a part of something very big."
