

Construction begins on Crandon Police Dept. garage

The Blackwell Job Corp is busy constructing the new garage, which is attached to the Crandon Police Department headquarters. The wiring will also be handled by the Job Corp. In addition, the Job Corp will roof the new structure and re-roof the existing structure.

The garage will give heated storage to the two squad cars as well as house an evidence room. The estimated cost is \$45,000.

According to Mayor Jaeger, the heated garage will save wear and tear on squads that are now kept in service for three years instead of the usual two years per squad. In addition, there won't be valuable time spent in scraping windows in an emergency situation.

Annual ethical hunter award nominations

"We must always remind ourselves about the importance of safety and ethical hunting each time we head into the field," said Bob Lamb, retired La Crosse Tribune outdoors editor and co-founder of the Tribune/Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Hunter Ethics Award. "In turn, by acknowledging safe and ethical hunting when we see it, we are encouraging more

Safe hunting reigns supreme and goes without saying. Ethical hunting also goes without saying, but is rarely talked about. That's why Steve Dewald, Jerry Davis and Lamb developed the state award in 1997.

Dewald, who retired as DNR conservation warden supervisor in the La Crosse area earlier this year, said the 15th annual award signifies the qualities of hunters helping others. It's also about hunters engaged in behavior that positively reflects on Wisconsin's hunting

tradition.
"All hunters want to have an enjoyable hunt. In many cases, how their hunt goes, depends on the kind of interaction they have with other hunters," Dewald said The Hunter Ethics Award provides positive examples for all hunters to follow. These actions reflect positively on the







If I Lived On A Lake In Forest County, What Should My Healthy Shoreline Look Like?

My healthy lake shoreline should have natural aquatic vegetation to stabilize the plants that grow there that way fish have a place to spawn. It would also have shore line shrubs and fallen trees that way birds can use the shrubs for nesting, turtles can use the logs for sun bathing and the natural grasses that grow along the shoreline would be a place for ducks to lay their eggs. A healthy shoreline needs to have native sedges and grasses, broadleaf ground cover plants, wild flowers, and shrubs, the mid canopy would have smaller trees like ironwood, hazels, and willows. The canopy layer would have trees like sugar maple, white pine, and red oak to help maintain aquatic life. It would also have beneficial aquatic plants like bulrushes, wild rice, arrowhead, cattails, and bur seeds that would also help protect the land from shoreline erosion. If you have a natural shoreline with all of the above, you would be able to see so many different birds coming and better water quality because those plants also protect the water, and the cycle of life with the fish in the water. It should be kept clean and free from garbage and chemicals. A healthy shoreline should be a natural beautiful area on the lake; it should have 35 - 50 feet of natural vegetation, so that many different types of wildlife can use it. A healthy shoreline is considered a wildlife highway for many animals that should be able to use it and to sustain its life without any worry. That's how I would want a healthy shoreline to look

A healthy shoreline is a natural shoreline; it is one that is not touched by man. It should have things like native vegetation because it provides homes, shade, and food for fish and other animals. It is also good to leave things like tree limbs and branches in shallow water if they fall because they provide a place for ducks and turtles to eat and to climb up and rest on.

It is really important to leave the shoreline natural because it protects the lake from erosion and helps with pollution. Natural shorelines make the lake front more beautiful. When you are out on the lake, you can see trees, plants, and wildlife instead of houses and other buildings It is also very important to keep oil or gasoline away from your shore because it will harm the lake, plants, fish, wildlife, and the entire environment.

A healthy shoreline is one that is filled with native trees, shrubs, wild flowers, grasses and aquatic plants Lake owners need to be careful not to introduce invasive plants like purple loosestrife to the shoreline. Even though it looks pretty, it can take over the native plants actually damage the lake environment. Invasive plants are harmful because they take over and prevent native plants from growing. If a shoreline is healthy, it will look natural from out on the lake. You will only see the things you would see if the shore had never been touched or developed.

By keeping our shorelines natural, we are protecting the water quality and so many other things. A shoreline that has a buffer containing a combination of plants, shrubs, trees and grasses is very important to the health of any lake. It is the job of all who own lakefront property in Forest County to protect existing natural shorelines and work to restore those that have been

A healthy shoreline to me is a shoreline that has not been disturbed. The trees, shrubs, plants, and ground have been left alone. A healthy shoreline also includes the shallow margins and shores that are home to 90 percent of all living things that are found in your lakes. These include fish, insects, birds and turtles.

Lakeshore lands extend into and away from the Natural shorelines help to prevent runoff and flooding, it increases ground water levels, and prevents or makes it harder for aquatic invasive species to establish themselves. Shore lands also keep the lake cleaner by filtering sediments and nutrients from run off water. Waters edge is not only home to fish, turtles, and other wildlife. It's a source of food, a place to sleep, a place to hide, and a place to raise their young.

Threats to shore lands, over development, and the clearing of lake lots can have a tremendous impact on the quality of our lakes. What can we as people do? If you build houses, make them small and leave the fallen trees in the water. Leave dead fish in the water so other animals can eat them. Do not move any of the trees and rocks because they could be home to some fish, crabs, turtles, frogs, tadpoles, and water bugs.





tradition of hunting, and leave good memories with the hunters who are fortunate to encounter these individuals in the great outdoors.

Davis retired from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse several years ago and lives near Barneveld.

"We are usually writing, hearing and reading about hunters doing bad things, illegal things. But those cases are the minority, the tiny minority," Davis said. "We need, now Nominations will be more than ever, to write, read and recognize the great things hunting activity in Wisconsin. that the majority of hunters are doing when they're in the fields and forests. It makes us all feel good when we hear of a hunter who took some of his or her own time to help a fellow hunter or landowner."

Dewald said nominations for the 2011 adult and youth hunter ethics awards must be submitted by December 15.

Past award winners have been recognized for restoring wildlife habitat, making private lands available to new hunters, assisting a warden who was dealing with a dangerous person, providing opportunities for disabled hunters, rendering aid to a citizen in a serious car accident, and helping find the rightful owner of a large buck that had fallen off the back end of a pickup truck.

Dewald said the award is about what you can do for the

sport, not what you can do for yourself.

Conservation Warden Todd Schaller, who serves as the DNR Section Chief of Recreation Enforcement and Education, joined Dewald, Davis and Lamb on last year's selection panel. He remains an active member this year

"The vast majority of our hunters are responsible and ethical, and support Wisconsin's hunting and conservation heritage," Schaller said. "However, the incidents that the public reads or hears about often puts hunters in a negative light. The Hunter Ethics Award is a way to highlight what most hunters are about."

The nominee must be a licensed Wisconsin hunter.

The ethical hunting act must occur in Wisconsin during the 2011 calendar year
