We all know that we should eat healthier and exercise more and that if we do, our risk of chronic illnesses like diabetes, heart disease, stroke and cancer will be decreased. But how do we get there? How do we start to make better decisions? How do we, as a community, work together to improve our health?

Health is not something that we get at a doctor's office. Health is something that starts in our families, workplaces, schools, playgrounds and parks. There are many personal behaviors that influence a person's overall health, such as balanced eating, keeping active, smoking, drinking, and how we deal with life's stresses and challenges. We also need to consider that a person's ability to make good choices is limited without community systems that support healthy choices, healthy environments, health-enhancing social networks and resources needed to make healthy decisions. As a community, we need to start making it easier for people to make better choices.

The Forest County Health Department will be hosting a community meeting to identify strategies to help improve our health. The plan will address strategies that all community members, businesses, schools, day cares, local agencies and community leaders can take part in. We will be looking at educational strategies such as toolkits and newsletters, environmental strategies such as increasing access to facilities for exercise, increased availability of healthy foods, and increasing social support for healthier lifestyles. We will also look at worksite and school wellness policies that can be implemented. We would like to put these strategies into a work plan that can be shared with everyone.

We will align our efforts with those of the Forest County Community Health Improvement Plan, Wisconsin's State Health Plan: Healthiest Wisconsin 2020 Everyone Living Better Longer and the National Health Plan: Healthy People 2020. These plans seek to improve health across the lifespan. Everyone should have the opportunity to make the choices that allow them to live a long, healthy life.

A community blood drive will be held at Mole Lake Casino on Wednesday, December 7 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The blood drive will take place in the Bingo Hall at the Casino, at 3084 Highway 55 in Crandon. Staff, visitors, and community members are invited to participate. Donors will have a chance to win a 1-night stay at the Mole Lake Casino Lodge (restrictions apply).

"As the holidays approach, people tend to get very busy and often find it difficult to take an hour out of their schedule to give blood," said Jan Hadsell of the Community Blood Center. "We're encouraging the people of Crandon to get a jump start on their gift giving by donating blood, giving the "gift of life" at Wednesday's blood drive."

Blood donations usually drop dramatically at the end of December, and a successful blood drive on Wednesday will help build up the blood supply for this challenging time.

Donation appointments are highly recommended, and may be made by calling Linda at (715)478-5180 or going to www.save3lives.org. Walk-in donors are welcome, but scheduling an appointment keeps the total time required for a donation to less than an hour.

Blood donors must be at least 17 years old (16 with parental permission), weigh at least 110 pounds, be in general good health, and bring a photo ID. Donors are encouraged to eat a regular meal and drink plenty of fluids prior to donating.

The Breaking of the Wishbone



Although often thought of as an American tradition, breaking the wishbone from a turkey was actually brought to the new world by the Pilgrims from England. The importance of the wishbone can be traced back to the Romans who ate fowl such as guinea fowl and chicken.

Hens and cocks were thought to be oracles or fortune tellers. The Romans adopted this belief from the Etruscans who settled one of the earliest civilizations on the Italian peninsula around 800-900 BC. The Romans would have been responsible for bringing the superstition with them to the western world.

When the Etruscan's killed a bird it's collarbone would be laid out to dry in the sun. They would then pick up the bone and stroke it and make a wish. This is where the name 'wishbone' came from and it seems that wishing on bird's clavicles was a common practice for a few centuries. The wishbone or furcula is also called the 'Merrythought' a term that dates back to at least 1686 when the custom of two people taking hold of either side of the bone and pulling until it breaks was first recorded.

Find the perfect holiday tree on the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest

RHINELANDER, Wis. (Nov. 18, 2011) – A fresh-cut, personally selected tree from your National Forest adds to the holiday season and is a way to stretch holiday dollars.

Last year, more than 600 visitors to the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) found their perfect Christmas tree.

A cutting permit costs \$5 per tree and can be purchased at any US Forest Service District Ranger Station. Up to five permits can be sold to a household.

Permits and maps may be also obtained by mail but you must allow time for a check to travel through the mail and permit to be returned.

Tips for a safe and successful tree search:

** Make sure your chosen tree is on National Forest System lands; visitor maps can be viewed or purchased at Forest Service offices including your local district ranger office.

** Choose a cutting area that is away from private property, plantations, developed recreation or administration sites.

** Select a tree at least 50 feet off the roadside, trail, lake or recreation site.

** Select a tree the correct size for your home. Please don't cut the top off of a taller tree.

** Arrive early at your cutting area. It may take longer than you think to find that special tree.

** Be prepared for a winter outdoor experience. Wear proper clothing, bring plenty of snacks and water and make sure your vehicle is prepared for winter travel. Many national forest roads are not maintained or snowplowed during the winter.

** Let someone know where you are going and when to expect you back. Don't rely on your cell phone as it may not work in many areas of the forest.

** Don't forget a rope to tie down your tree. After you've cut down your tree, wrap it in a tarp and tie it to your car's roof.

** Cut your tree a bit longer than you'll need (6-12"), so you'll have room to make a fresh cut on the bottom just before bringing it into the warm house. Don't cut it too much in advance as it will begin to seal up.

** Get your tree into its stand as soon as possible.

** As the tree warms and thaws it will take up water; it will need a lot more when its new, so check the reservoir frequently in the beginning. Even though it has been cut, your tree is still "alive" and the needles will take on water. As the days go on, the cells in the cut end react to the wound and seal up and less water will be used, and the tree will begin to die.



Expenses You Shouldn't Cut

Some 'savings' are financial disasters in the making, but others really do put money back in your pocket. And when money is short, it's crucial to know where you can safely skimp.

In this economy, almost everyone has trimmed the household budget. But you don't need to overdo it with the scissors. Certain cuts might save you \$25 or \$50 today but cost you thousands later.

1.) Your Car - Cuts That Cost You: Skip your regular oil change and you save \$25 to \$30. But those savings could be temporary when aging oil damages your engine.

Worst-case scenario: You'll need a new engine, which could cost \$5,000.

"Old oil turns to sludge, and you have restricted oil movement through the engine," says Jeff Ammons, the owner of Howard Motor in Williamsburg, VA. "Dirty oil is bad for an engine."

There is an added benefit of a regular oil change. While getting it changed, your mechanic will check all the fluid levels in your car, helping ensure your safety on the road, Ammons says.

Worst-case scenario: You could be in a wreck, creating huge mechanical and medical costs.

"A lot of accidents are caused by not enough air pressure," Ammons says.

Paying extra attention to your tires has other benefits as well. Rotating tires helps them last longer, delaying the day you have to spend hundreds of dollars on replacements. The right pressure also improves gas mileage, Ammons says.

Cuts That Count:

Improved spark plugs and computerized fuel injection mean you can lengthen the time between tuneups, Ammons says. Savings: \$250 to \$500.

"If the car is running well, leave it alone and do the other things that have to be done," he says. "Usually I end up talking customers out of a tuneup because I find something else a little more important."

If your car engine starts running rough or vibrating, bring it in for a tuneup, Ammons says.

2.) Your Medicine Cabinet - Cuts That Cost You:

When you consider the cost of medications, you may be tempted to skip doses of your medicines for lowering blood pressure or cholesterol and double the life of that prescription. Unlike some illnesses or conditions, high blood pressure and high cholesterol don't normally produce daily symptoms. But you may shorten your own life.

"You do see people skipping doses," says Sophia De Monte, a pharmacist with Costco in Melville, N.Y. "Instead of taking a medication every day, people might take it every other day just to make it last a little bit longer. With high blood pressure or high cholesterol, you don't feel the changes in your body."

It's true that you're potentially saving half the cost of the medication, but it could cost you down the line.

Worst-case scenario: A life-changing or life ending heart attack or stroke.

"You're putting your health at risk," De Monte warns.

Cuts that count:

That being said, you can save on prescription and over-the-counter medication by thinking about your medications before you go to the pharmacy.

Start at home. Your health insurance company likely releases a list of medications and how much your co-pay will be. Bring that guide to your doctor to refer to when writing a prescription, De Monte recommends.

"There may be a similar medication you can tolerate at a lower co-pay," she says.

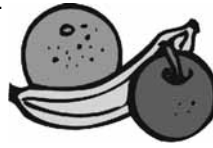

Dear Editor,

November is American Diabetes Month and the American Diabetes Association is encouraging people to take action and raise their hand to Stop Diabetes. Nearly 26 million children and adults in the United States have diabetes and another 79 million Americans have pre-diabetes and are at risk for developing type 2 diabetes. Recent estimates project that as many as 1 in 3 American adults will have diabetes in 2050 unless we take steps to Stop Diabetes.

Diabetes is a serious disease. If isn't managed, it can damage many parts of the body, leading to heart attacks, stroke, amputation, blindness, kidney failure and nerve damage. Diabetes complications can be prevented or delayed by properly managing blood glucose, blood pressure and cholesterol levels. Eating healthy, being physically active and quitting smoking can also help lower the risk of diabetes complications.

In Forest County there are an estimated 1,240 people (13.4%) who have diagnosed and undiagnosed diabetes. In Wisconsin it is estimated that nearly 129,000 adults have diabetes and do not know it. Symptoms can be so mild that you might not even notice them; some people might have symptoms but don't suspect diabetes. Symptoms include: increased thirst, fatigue, weight loss, blurred vision, increased hunger, increased urination, sores that don't heal. 

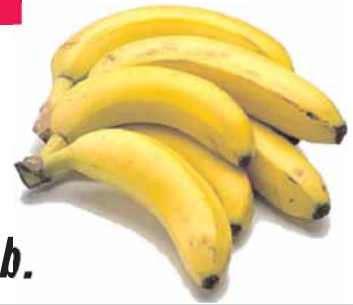

Hunters register 112,581 deer opening weekend

MADISON - More than 600,000 hunters were on their stands Saturday morning eagerly waiting the opening moment of the 2011 gun deer season. By the end of the weekend, a preliminary call-in tally showed hunters registered 112,581 deer over the two day period.
"As I listened to deer hunters over the opening weekend, there is a lot of excitement about the changes implemented this year; particularly the fact that hunters are no longer required to harvest an antlerless deer before harvesting their first buck in the CWD zone," said DNR Executive Assistant Scott Gunderson. "As we all expected, this change is extremely popular amongst hunters which is important as the DNR wants the hunting public to 'buy-in' to our herd management structure."
"It is also important to remember that harvesting antlerless deer remains an important part of deer management in Wisconsin," said Gunderson. "I would encourage hunters to keep this in mind as they hunt the remaining days of the traditional season and when they return to the woods during the December statewide antlerless hunt and the Holiday Hunt in the CWD management zone."

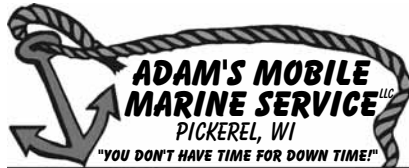

Veterans Who Took Mefloquine (Lariam) in Somalia, Iraq, Afghanistan May Suffer from Long-Term Side-Effects.

All vets who served in Somalia, Iraq, and Afghanistan issued the weekly anti malaria drug Mefloquine (Lariam) to prevent malaria who are still having side effects from the drug, contact your local VA environmental health coordinator.

Service members exposed to mefloquine may complain of long-term symptoms of dysequilibrium, vertigo, sleep disturbance, and persistent changes in personality or mood. These may overlap with symptoms already caused by PTSD.

Veterans may be eligible for VA disability compensation benefits and health care benefits for health problems associated with mefloquine use during military service.

For those not familiar with this area, it is best to start on Porcupine Hill. Take a compass reading due south, and walk for about 45 minutes. Walk a little longer if you are a slow walker and shorten the time if you're fast on your feet. Then head southeast until you hit Otter Creek. Cross the creek where the bottom is solid. At this point, it is a good idea to have chest-high waders, or at least a life jacket. Follow the stream for about a quarter-mile, then head due west. You will have to cross the stream again, which shouldn't be a problem, as you either have waders or are soaking wet. In either case, another stream crossing won't hurt you a bit.

This is the tricky part. If you are on course, you should notice a big spruce stump on the edge of an alder swamp. Larry Roberts cut this tree in the late sixties, or maybe it was Hock Baumgartner. It doesn't matter really, and this issue can be debated later. The stump is there never-the-less. Turn south through the alder swamp. If there are woodcock droppings in the alders, you are probably in the right swamp. If there is snow on the ground, you will have to follow your instincts and your ability to follow directions.

After leaving the swamp, turn due west again, crossing over two hogbacks. The second hogback has a crooked hemlock on the crest, so you can't go wrong in this spot. Then head due south for 300 long steps. You can put the North Star at your back for guidance, which shouldn't be a problem, because by now it will be dark, the sun having gone down about two hours ago. The only catch is if it is a cloudy night. Then you're screwed.

You can thank Jason for sharing his favorite deer stand when you see him.

Muzzleloader season underway after regular deer season

December antlerless season also ahead
 MADISON – The close of the nine-day gun deer hunt also signals the opening of the 10-day, muzzleloader deer hunt that runs from Nov. 28 through December 7. The muzzleloader hunt is statewide with the exception of most state parks. There is also an ongoing deer hunting season through December 7 in designated metropolitan, or metro, units due to higher deer populations near some urban areas. Check the current deer hunting regulations for details.

Following the muzzleloader hunt is a four-day antlerless deer hunt running December 8 through 11 statewide except in state parks and in Menominee County. All hunters are reminded that blaze orange clothing requirements are in place whenever any gun deer season is open.

License sales officials say there are unit-specific antlerless deer tags still available for some regular units. Permits are \$5 for 10 and 11 year olds, \$12 for residents and \$20 for the nonresidents. Antlerless deer tags for herd control units and earn-a-buck units are available for \$2 each.

Visit the deer hunting pages of the DNR Web site for details on license requirements, permit availability, bag limits and harvest rules. For additional questions call the toll free 1-888-WDNR-INFO (888-936-7463) line for answers. The line is staffed 7a.m. to 10 p.m. 7-days per week

Hunters register 112,581 deer opening weekend

MADISON – More than 600,000 hunters were on their stands Saturday morning eagerly waiting the opening moment of the 2011 gun deer season. By the end of the weekend, a preliminary call-in tally showed hunters registered 112,581 deer over the two day period.

"As I listened to deer hunters over the opening weekend, there is a lot of excitement about the changes implemented this year; particularly the fact that hunters are no longer required to harvest an antlerless deer before harvesting their first buck in the CWD zone," said DNR Executive Assistant Scott Gunderson. "As we all expected, this change is extremely popular amongst hunters which is important as the DNR wants the hunting public to 'buy-in' to our herd management structure."

"It is also important to remember that harvesting antlerless deer remains an important part of deer management in Wisconsin," said Gunderson. "I would encourage hunters to keep this in mind as they hunt the remaining days of the traditional season and when they return to the woods during the December statewide antlerless hunt and the Holiday Hunt in the CWD management zone."
