The Town of Lincoln Building Committee met last Tuesday, November 29th to discuss the plans of a proposed new town hall and town garage.

The town garage and town hall is in dire need of upgrades. The new site selected is located on Bear Road off of Highway 8. There is a fourteen acre plot on which to work. The committee looked at possible options for the project and also looked where they can cut costs. The plan is to be able to build a town hall and garage without having to raise taxes. They have saved money over the past few years and have about \$500,000 saved for this project. The options are a town hall. The second option is a town hall with a garage.

The Building Committee now has to meet with Kellor Construction to layout a more permanent design. Kellor Construction will also be able to then give a more exact quote on the price of the project. The Building Committee and Kellor Construction can then present the project to the people of the town. The people then have a vote on which option they want or to tell the committee that they do not want any of them. The committee then, with the opinion of the public, can revise their plans. A date has not been set on the presentation to the public. The next committee meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 10th, at the Lincoln Town Hall.

Hunters harvested 226,260 deer during the gun season

MADISON – A call around survey of 600-plus deer registration stations all across Wisconsin completed today shows a preliminary harvest total of 226,260 for the just completed nine-day gun deer hunting season, up 3.6 percent from 2010. At the same time, hunters posted the second all around safest season on record.

The nine-day harvest numbers are preliminary and are expected to change before a final report is published in late winter. The total does not include harvest information from the archery, October antlerless gun deer hunt, muzzleloader, December antlerless deer gun hunt or late archery seasons. Hearings on state health care programs at Nicolet College

A public hearing focused on a state agency's plan to make \$554 million in cuts to the state's health care programs for eligible seniors, children, families and the disabled will be held at Nicolet College in Rhinelander on Thursday, December 8.

State Senator Jim Holperin (D-Eagle River) said the hearing is one in a series being held around the state to solicit comments, answer questions and accept advice regarding the future of Wisconsin's BadgerCare health insurance program.

"Health care for the elderly, disabled and children is the state's 2nd largest program (behind school aid) and there's no question additional efficiencies must be identified for the program to remain viable," Holperin said. "But is the Department of Health Services making the right choices? Are the cuts they've proposed to the federal government the right ones? This is a topic we need to hear more about."

The Rhinelander BadgerCare hearing will be held in the LRC Theater on the Nicolet College campus starting at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 8. The hearing will last 2 hours, or until everyone who wishes to speak has done so.

Remembering Pearl Harbor Day 70 Years Later Historical Events have Significant Meaning Today

It happened early on a Sunday morning in December, 70 years ago. The United States of America had an outpost -- a naval base in the Pacific -- nestled in an idyllic setting called Pearl Harbor, within its island territory of Hawaii.

Suddenly, at about 7:20 a.m. on December 7, 1941, the naval base came under unprovoked attack by airplanes and bombs sent by the Empire of Japan. Casualties suffered included over 2,400 Americans killed and more than 1,000 wounded. Vessels lost or damaged numbered: four U.S. Navy battleships sunk and four damaged; three cruisers damaged or sunk; three destroyers; one minelayer; and hundreds of damaged U.S. aircraft. The USS Arizona exploded, and the USS Oklahoma and the USS Utah were submerged and completely destroyed.

Never before had the United States witnessed such a surprise assault on her territory. President Franklin D. Roosevelt declared the date would "live in infamy."

December 7th of each year is now observed as Pearl Harbor Day. The attack on Pearl Harbor prompted our nation's involvement in World War II nearly three-quarters of a century ago. It was the greatest war of our time. While to some it may seem like an era from the past, we must always remember and learn from our history and from the men and women of our "Greatest Generation."

World War II was the pivotal event of that century, and the men and women who won that war have made a contribution to our country and the world that may never again be equaled. About 16 million Americans served in World War II, with nearly 300,000 of them killed in battle and another 600,000 who would become its casualties. Almost 8,400 Wisconsin service members lost their lives during World War II.

The youngest of the living Pearl Harbor survivors are among the eldest WWII veterans and average 90 years old now. Of the some 32,000 veterans of WWII still living in Wisconsin, a remaining few Pearl Harbor survivors are still with us and able to tell what they witnessed on that fateful day of December 7, 1941.

Firman Balza, 88, of Green Bay, says he was stationed on the USS Maryland at the time. He tells how he went back to his ship from the USS Oklahoma, to change into dress shoes before church. If he had not returned to his ship, he would have been on one of the eight ships on "battleship row" that took a direct hit and went down. Stuart "Bud" Sweeney of Plymouth enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1940 and was stationed at Wheeler Field when the attack hit. His story is that the Air Corps served as a backup to the Naval War in the Pacific. "We were in a peace time Army and picked it up from there," Sweeney said.

George Hutton of Madison is 90 years old. He entered the service on December 7, 1938 in Omaha, Nebraska, and it was exactly three years later that the Pearl Harbor attack took place. He spent 23 years in the U.S. Navy. Hutton attended a reunion in 2010 of Pearl Harbor survivors who were stationed on the USS Nevada on December 7, 1941. Hutton is a WWII veteran who has shared his story in an oral history recorded with the Wisconsin Veterans Museum.

Paralleling the sudden attack from 1941 is an event that took place nearly 60 years afterwards, a recent event that has meaning for all of us. On September 11, 2001, the United States was the target of a surprise series of attacks while not at war. On 9/11, airplanes once again were used as the method of assault, this time aimed for the twin towers of the World Trade Center in New York and the U.S. Pentagon, while a third attempt to attack the White House was halted over Shanksburg, Pennsylvania.

At the end of this month during which we observe Pearl Harbor Day, all U.S. troops who have been involved in the Global War on Terrorism since this fateful day are being

brought out of Iraq. When they return home, it is our mission to ensure they will be reintegrated into our civilian society, with meaningful jobs, housing, education, health care and other treatment.

Our traditions of service and sacrifice as Americans has spanned nearly 250 years, since our nation's beginning. During this current time period in our country's history, there are veterans of the "Greatest Generation" era who have witnessed firsthand the attack on Pearl Harbor and who also remember "9/11" within their lifetime.

These historical events hold significant meaning for all of us as Americans. May we never forget them, by always caring for our heroes who serve our country through each generation.

December marks the eighth anniversary of the enactment of a Wisconsin law that prohibits drivers from having any detectable amount of a controlled substance in their system, such as marijuana or cocaine, while operating a motor vehicle. The law also makes the legal penalties for drugged driving the same as drunken driving.

The Wisconsin State Patrol and other law enforcement agencies are continuing their efforts to combat drugged driving. "Law enforcement officers throughout the state have extensive training and experience in procedures that effectively identify drivers impaired by alcohol. Officers use many of those same procedures to identify drugged drivers," says Wisconsin State Patrol Captain JD Lind of the North Central Region/Wausau Post. "Drivers who exhibit behavior or symptoms indicative of drug use must submit to a blood test that determines the

presence of drugs. Refusing to submit to the blood test means an automatic revocation of the driver's license."

In addition to illegal drugs, the overuse or abuse of medications, especially when combined with alcohol, will often cause impaired driving. State law prohibits drivers from being "under the influence of any drug to a degree which renders him or her incapable of safely driving or under the combined influence of an intoxicant and any other drug to a degree which renders him or her incapable of driving safely."

"Drivers under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or a combination of the two are deadly threats to everyone on the road," says Captain Lind. "That's why officers never take a break even over the holiday season from arresting those who choose to get behind the wheel while impaired."

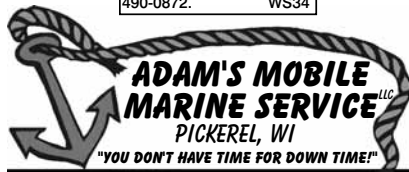

Make Half Your Grains Whole 10 tips to help you eat whole grains

Any food made from wheat, rice, oats, cornmeal, barley, or another cereal grain is a grain product. Bread, pasta, oatmeal, breakfast cereals, tortillas, and grits are examples. Grains are divided into two subgroups, whole grains and refined grains. Whole grains contain the entire grain kernel - the bran, germ, and endosperm. People who eat whole grains as part of a healthy diet have reduced risk of some chronic diseases.

1.) Make Simple Switches: To make half your grains whole grains, substitute a whole-grain product for a refined-grain product. For example, eat 100% whole-wheat bread or bagels instead of white bread or bagels, or brown rice instead of white rice.

2.) Whole Grains Can Be Healthy Snacks: Popcorn, a whole grain, can be a healthy snack. Make it with little or no added salt or butter. Also, try 100% whole-wheat or rye crackers.

3.) Save Some Time: Cook extra bulgur or barely when you have time. Freeze half to heat and serve later as a quick side dish.

4.) Mix it up with whole grains: Use whole grains in mixed dishes, such as barely in vegetable soups or stews and bulgur wheat in casseroles or stir-fries. Try a quinoa salad or pilaf.

5.) Try Whole-Wheat Versions: For a change, try brown rice or whole-wheat pasta. Try brown rice stuffing in baked green peppers or tomatoes, and whole-wheat macaroni in macaroni and cheese.

6.) Bake Up Some Whole-Grain Goodness: Experiment by substituting buckwheat, millet or oat flour for up to half of the flour in pancake, waffle, muffin or other flour-based recipes. They may need a bit more leavening in order to rise.

7.) Be A Good Role Model For Children: Set a good example for children by serving and eating whole grains everyday with meals or as snacks.

8.) Check The Label For Fiber: Use the Nutrition Facts label to check the fiber content of whole-grain foods. Good sources of fiber contain 10% to 19% of the Daily Value; excellent sources contain 20% or more.

9.) Know What To Look For On The Ingredients List: Read the ingredients list and choose products that name a whole-grain ingredient first on the list. Look for "whole wheat", "brown rice", "bulgur", "buckwheat", "oatmeal", "whole-grain cornmeal", "whole oats", "whole rye", or "wild rice".

10.) Be A Smart Shopper: The color of a food is not an indication that it is a whole-grain food. Foods labeled as "multi-grain", "stone-ground", "100% wheat", "cracked wheat", "seven-grain", or "bran" are usually not 100% whole-grain products, and may not contain any whole grain.

December is National Drunk & Drugged Driving Prevention Month

December marks the eighth anniversary of the enactment of a Wisconsin law that prohibits drivers from having any detectable amount of a controlled substance in their system, such as marijuana or cocaine, while operating a motor vehicle. The law also makes the legal penalties for drugged driving the same as drunken driving.

The Wisconsin State Patrol and other law enforcement agencies are continuing their efforts to combat drugged driving. "Law enforcement officers throughout the state have extensive training and experience in procedures that effectively identify drivers impaired by alcohol. Officers use many of those same procedures to identify drugged drivers," says Wisconsin State Patrol Captain JD Lind of the North Central Region/Wausau Post. "Drivers who exhibit behavior or symptoms indicative of drug use must submit to a blood test that determines the presence of drugs. Refusing to submit to the blood test means an automatic revocation of the driver's license."


In addition to illegal drugs, the overuse or abuse of medications, especially when combined with alcohol, will often cause impaired driving. State law prohibits drivers from being "under the influence of any drug to a degree which renders him or her incapable of safely driving or under the combined influence of an intoxicant and any other drug to a degree which renders him or her incapable of driving safely."

"Drivers under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or a combination of the two are deadly threats to everyone on the road," says Captain Lind. "That's why officers never take a break even over the holiday season from arresting those who choose to get behind the wheel while impaired."

**Laona Elementary
No School Dates**

The School Board of the School District of Laona, at their November meeting, approved four additional days during the 2011-2012 school year in which K-6 students will not have school. Those dates are: Tues., Dec. 13; Fri., Feb. 17; Thurs., March 22 and Wed., May 2. These four dates are changes to the initial district calendar.

These four days will be used by the elementary staff to work on the District's "Response to Intervention" plan that must be submitted to DPI by the end of the school year. RTI requires that staff provide alternative instruction to students who are not making adequate yearly progress. This alternative instruction must be provided prior to a student being considered for special education services.

These four dates will also be announced on the District website and reminder notices will be sent home prior to each date.

7-12 high school students will still have school on the above dates. State instructional guidelines allow for this type of scheduling as the yearly required minutes of instruction for elementary students are substantially less than for 7-12 students.

count in 2010 was 218,144 and in 2009 was 201,994.

"Overall participation was good. We had a 3.6 percent increase in deer harvested compared to 2010 and the reports that we've been getting in from the field are that in many parts of the state hunters saw more deer," stated Tom Hauge, wildlife director for the state Department of Natural Resources. "That said, we do know that not everyone got a deer this year, or saw a deer. The herd in parts of the state is still rebounding and that even within counties with higher harvests, deer aren't distributed evenly."

A table of county by county harvest (pdf) broken down by DNR region, with a comparison to the 2010 preliminary harvest is available on the DNR Web site.

The preliminary tally showed hunters harvested 102,837 bucks and 123,423 antlerless. This compared to 2010 preliminary harvest figures of 102,121 bucks and 116,160 antlerless.

"Harvests suggest that deer herds are increasing in some of the units where deer numbers were previously below goal," Hauge said. "We also saw an increase in buck harvest in the CWD zone with the new provision this year allowing hunters to shoot a buck first before having to go to earn-a-buck rules for a second buck in the zone. This was a popular change among hunters I've heard from."

"As far as hunting conditions and deer observations, we will be interested in seeing the data hunters provided on their registration stubs," added Hauge. "We know broadly what weather conditions were like, but data from individual hunters in the field provides a much more personal and localized perspective. We will summarize these findings along with the harvest totals in February."

In February, DNR biologists will use unit-level harvest numbers to develop overwinter population estimates and will propose season structures for 2012 in March.

Deer hunt wrap up

The books have closed on Wisconsin's 160th gun deer hunt but the season's memories and tales will live for years to come. Over the past nine days the DNR Facebook page received dozens of pictures of happy hunters and some pretty impressive deer. Visitors to the page can view the photos share them with you along with a YouTube video that highlights Wisconsin Hunters sharing their stories. People can join the conversation by visiting the DNR on Facebook at Facebook.com/widnr.

Late seasons now open

There are still days to hunt in 2011. The muzzleloader hunt is already underway through December 7 for hunters holding unused gun buck and antlerless deer tags. There is also a statewide antlerless deer hunt December 8-11.

Hunters are reminded that the antlerless deer hunt December 8-11 in regular units is open only to hunters with a valid antlerless deer tag for the unit in which they are hunting. Regular unit antlerless tags are still available for many units at \$12 each. In herd control units, hunters can purchase as many \$2 antlerless tags as they wish.

The Holiday Hunt in CWD zones in south central Wisconsin that starts Dec. 24 and lasts until Jan. 8, 2011. Hunters asked to participate in online Deer Hunter Wildlife Survey

The Deer Hunter Wildlife Survey is still active until the end of all deer seasons and wildlife managers are asking hunters to send in a report of what they saw during the just completed 9-day gun hunt and during any hunting trips they make through the end of all deer hunting seasons. This data helps to provide valuable data biologists can use to help provide an additional human element to the completed deer season.

Third fatality free season on record

"Hunters can be proud of a second consecutive firearm-related, fatality-free year and the third fatality free season on record," said Tim Lawhern, Law Enforcement Administrator. "This is an important milestone and one we hope to see again and again in future seasons."

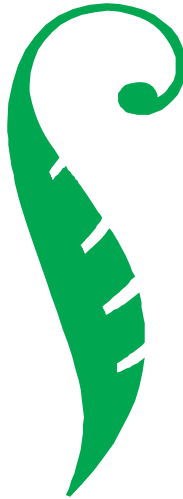
Overall, there were six hunting incidents during the nine-day deer gun season. Lawhern said that for the families of those injured hunters, 2011 didn't feel like a success and that everyone at DNR wishes the injured a speedy recovery. The agency only tracks firearm-related incidents and does not keep track of deaths or injuries due to heart attacks, tree stand falls or other causes.

This would make it the second all-around safest hunt ever in Wisconsin. The lowest number of incidents occurred in 2004 when there were four incidents and two of those were fatal.

Three of the incidents occurred during deer drives. Two of the incidents were self-inflicted injuries. Four incidents involved rifles and two involved shotguns. Two of the incidents involved juvenile shooters. Four of the six shooters in these incidents had completed the Hunter Safety certification course.

"Ultimately, nearly all are linked to a violation of one or more of the four basic rules of firearm safety - treat every firearm as if it is loaded, never point your firearm at a person, never put your finger in the trigger until you are ready to shoot and know what is behind your target," Lawhern said.

The downward trend in hunting incidents speaks highly about the hunter education program, the thousand of volunteer instructors who teach the course and hunters. Hunter education is required for anyone born on or after Jan 1, 1973, and Lawhern encourages "All hunters should take the hunter education certification course"

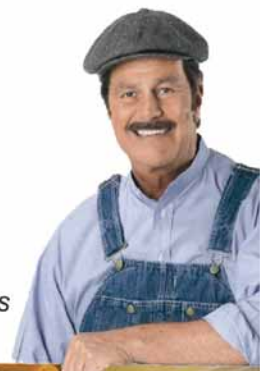
