## Town of Lincoln building project meeting

There was a meeting last Tuesday, January 10th, at the Lincoln Town Hall to discuss the ongoing efforts to replace the outdated and too small facility that now serves the town of Lincoln. Present was the town board and members of the building committee.

Keller Construction was on hand to present changes to plans and options for the plans. They also presented an updated budget, explaining that prices for materials had jumped ten to twenty percent after the beginning of the new year. They also talked of the option of having an attached garage or a separate structure. They explained that there would be insignificant savings with either option.

Keller went on to explain that they had included \$20,000 in the budget for furniture. They also said that to get a natural gas line to Bear Road, the town would have to spend an additional \$9,500.

With these increases in mind, the reps from Keller said the proposed town hall would now cost from \$775,000 to \$850,000. He added that proviso that they like to make estimates a little higher to allow for any contingencies that might come up and that the final price would actually be determined by the bidders for the various facets of the construction project. In addition, the new town garage was estimated at \$475,000 to \$594,000. For this price, no in-floor heat was included nor was there a mezzanine for storage or hoists.

Larry Sommer asked them to prepare an itemized budget, which the Keller people said they would furnish.

There were other discussions on how to save money on paving, how big a parking area was needed and other items.

Recently, the board and building committee has traveled to other recently constructed town buildings, asked questions, considered options and looked at costs compared to the town's needs. The village of Beecher was a recent construction that was looked at, and those making the trip felt that Beecher had got a lot for their money. The Keller people suggested they also look at what Little Suamico had recently constructed and make a comparison. There was agreement around the room that a day trip by whoever is interested should be arranged. With the use of a cell phone, the visit was quickly arranged. The date is on Sunday, January 29th. All who would like to make the trip are welcome to meet at the town hall at 8:00 a.m. on the 29th and travel first to Beecher and then to Little Suamico.

Chair person Lynne Black said that it is her goal to have the best plan, that is the most economical and is accepted by the people of the community.

Then a surprise came to the meeting. Gary Mueller entered with some large rolls of paper and laid another idea on the table. Mueller had put together a plan in conjunction with Urban Construction of Wausau that incorporated the present building into a completely remodeled building complete with additions that would fill the needs of the town.

The new plan was met with some enthusiasm by Chairperson Black as well as some of the building committee and those attending. The proposed cost for this plan was a big saving over the site and construction being discussed on Bear Road, coming in at \$575,000 to \$625,000, depending on how many options are incorporated into the final plan.

There will be another meeting on the Lincoln building project on February 16th at 5:00 p.m.

#### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REDEMPTION OF THE DISTRICT'S GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, DATED JULY 1, 2002:

WHEREAS, the School District of Wabeno Area, Forest, Langlade, Marinette and Oconto Counties, Wisconsin (the "District") has issued its \$2,080,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, dated July 1, 2002 (the "2002 Bonds"); and  
WHEREAS, \$220,000 of the 2016 maturity and the principal balance of the 2017 maturity of the 2002 Bonds are currently callable; and  
WHEREAS, the School Board has determined that it is necessary and desirable to apply funds on hand to call \$220,000 of the 2016 maturity and the principal balance of the 2017 maturity for redemption on March 1, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Wabeno Area, Forest, Langlade, Marinette and Oconto Counties, Wisconsin, that:

Section 1. **Call of the 2002 Bonds.** \$220,000 of the 2016 maturity and the principal balance of the 2017 maturity shall be called for redemption on March 1, 2012, at the price of par plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The District shall provide sufficient funds for such redemption to the fiscal agent for the 2002 Bonds prior to March 1, 2012.

Section 2. **Call Notice to Depository.** The District Clerk, in conjunction with Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated ("Baird"), shall direct Associated Trust Company, National Association, as fiscal agent of the District with respect to the 2002 Bonds (the "Fiscal Agent") to cause timely notice of the call of the 2002 Bonds to be redeemed to be given by providing a notice thereof, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, by registered or certified mail, facsimile transmission, or overnight express delivery to the registered owner of each 2002 Bond to be redeemed at the address shown on the registration books at least thirty days prior to March 1, 2012.

Section 3. **Additional Call Notices.** In addition to the official notice of redemption provided for in Section 2, the District Clerk, in conjunction with Baird, shall cause further notice of the redemption of the 2002 Bonds to be provided to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board through its Electronic Municipal Market Access System. Further notices of redemption shall contain the information set forth in the Notice of Call provided on Exhibit A.

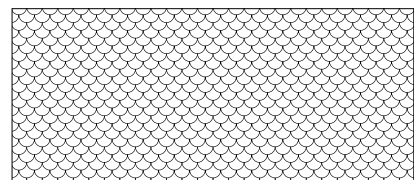

**8 Foods That'll Make You Look Younger**

**1.) Sweet Potatoes:** Beta carotene, which makes these tubers orange, balances your skin's pH, helps combat dryness, and promotes cell turnover, all resulting in smoother skin.

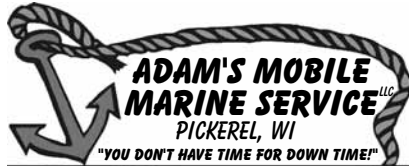
