Forest County Board Report

The first item I would like to report on, because it is property tax payment time, is your county portion of your tax bill. This year the county tax rate is \$4.42 per thousand dollars of valuation. This rate is lower than most of our neighboring counties and counties our size throughout the state. Our county only has 16% to 17% of its land base on the tax rolls. The U.S. Forest Service owns 53% of Forest County, and add to that the state lands, county lands and tribal lands and we end up with 16% to 17% of our county that is taxable. This makes it extremely hard to run the county on such a small taxable land base.

To accomplish holding the line on our tax rate, the Finance Committee sent out a letter to each department head requesting a 5% cut in their proposed 2012 budget. Most of the department heads complied with the request, and the finance committee, consisting of Paul Millan, Ron Henkel, Jimmy Landru and Erhard Huettl, then met with various department heads and found adjustments to make enabling us to get the budget down to the \$4.42 rate per thousand.

The biggest effect on our budget was the loss of revenue from state prisoners being held in our jail. This loss of revenue will be about \$200,000 per year. The state has already taken all of their prisoners out of the neighboring county jails and is housing them in their own facilities. Due to the efforts of Senator Holperin, Representative Mursau, Chairman Huettl, and Sheriff Dennee, we were successful in retaining prisoners here for a longer time. If the state does have excess prisoners to house, Forest County would be high on the list for getting them because of our low tax base and need for revenue. I have made our state and federal representatives well aware of our needs, and they understand it well.

We have also had an average the past few years in the Social Service Department budget. This is caused by the placement of juveniles in secure detention facilities such as Lincoln Hills. These are costs that the county board does not control. When a judge orders a juvenile to these facilities, the county is responsible for the cost. This has been costing the county approximately \$200,000 per year more than we have had budgeted.

We all know that the price of fuel, heat, patrol vehicles and everything else that the county needs to purchase does nothing but increase every year. With the rate freeze imposed by state law that counties have had to live with for years, it's going to be hard in future years to survive without drastic changes. Many counties are talking about sharing services, eliminating positions, and many counties have resorted to layoffs, something we do not care to do.

It was united effort by the county board, department heads, elected officials and employees to come up with our final budget for Forest County. We can all be proud of the budget that was passed for 2012 with the levied amount of \$5,069,150.

Another big concern of our Forest County Board members is the lack of timber being harvested in our Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF). We need a sensible cut on our national forests yearly, and this has not been accomplished for many years. The fact is, I haven't seen a sale in my area harvested in many years. This in turn does not give proper and stable employment to our loggers and mills in Forest County. It even has a huge negative effect on the pulp mills in Wisconsin that need a constant flow of wood sent to their facilities. Many of these mills are closing their doors. The Forest County Board feels it is high time the U.S. Forest Service quits listening to the environmentalists and gets back to the business of logging our national forests.

In an attempt to get the U.S. Forest Service to manage the CNNF properly, the Forest County Board passed a resolution on August 16, 2011, requesting the CNNF be managed at the annual sale quantity level as identified in the Forest Plan as well as manage the backlog of timber that has not been managed or harvested since the implementation of the Forest Plan in 2004.

The resolution also requests a written response from the Forest Service Chief and the CNNF Forest Supervisor within sixty days explaining why these lands are not being managed in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Plan. Sixty days have long passed, and still no letter has been received.

On December 13, 2011, another letter was sent to the CNNF Forest Supervisor and the Regional Forester, once again explaining our extreme disappointment in not

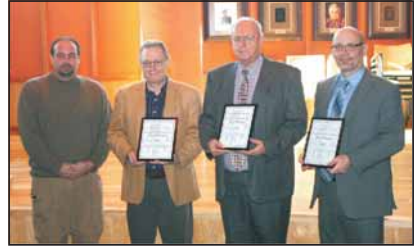
The growing Christmas tree

Potawatomi Hold 2nd Annual Grant Awards Ceremony

\$235,000 awarded to local school districts

(Crandon, WI) - The Forest County Potawatomi Community held their second annual Grant Awards Ceremony today, announcing the school districts of Crandon, Laona and Wabeno as recipients this year. The grants total \$235,000 and are part of the tribe's Intergovernmental Grant Program, established as part of their 2003 gaming agreement with the state.

"The Forest County Potawatomi Community is proud to contribute to our local school districts and pleased that Indian gaming allows us to do so," said Forest County Potawatomi Vice Chairman James A. Crawford. "Our Tribe is committed to our community, particularly the education of our area youth."

Crandon and Wabeno School Districts will use their grant money to assist with Virtual Desktop Infrastructure (VDI) implementation. The VDI system allows students to access their school desktop and files from any computer inside or outside of the home. Additionally, students are able to access all of the software resources offered by the school district.

"In this time of dwindling school resources, it is great to have a partnership with the Forest County Potawatomi so that we can provide cutting edge technology opportunities to our students," said Jim Asher, Superintendent of Crandon School District. "Without their generous giving, this project would have not been possible. The School District of Crandon is fortunate to have the Forest County Potawatomi as a partner."

"VDI has improved the educational experience for both our students and our staff and we are thankful to the Forest County Potawatomi Community for making VDI a reality," added Rick Huisman of the Wabeno School District.

The Laona School District will use the grant money toward the funding of their four-year old kindergarten program. Over 290 children have taken part in Laona's four-year old kindergarten since it began 18 years ago. This is the seventh year the Potawatomi have contributed funding toward the program.

"The School District of Laona is extremely grateful to the Forest County Potawatomi Community for their continued funding of our 4K program," said Dr. David Bardo, Laona Superintendent. "Our District would be unable to sustain the 4K program without their generous support."

The Forest County Potawatomi Community is the largest employer in Forest County, providing jobs for more than 900 area residents through its government operations, casino and hotel business, health and wellness center, and additional business investments. 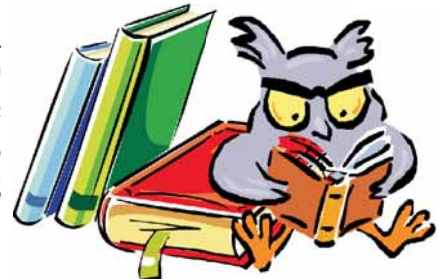

Don't Know Much About Bookworms

Bookworm, common name for any insect that feeds on the paper or binding of books. The name is most frequently given to the larvae of certain beetles, although any insect that normally feeds on starchy material or wood may eat paper. The beetle larvae are about 0.25 to 0.50 cm (about 0.1 to 0.2 in) in length.

Insects other than beetles, such as cockroaches and the tiny larvae of certain moths, have also been known to destroy books. One family of tiny, soft-bodied, wingless insects in particular are known as booklice and do considerable damage when they feed on book bindings or on biological specimens found in museums.

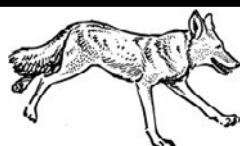
There are several different theories as to the origin of the history of poker, but it is most likely that the game of poker was formed from several different games. Some historians believe that the history of poker derives from Chinese dominoes and was first played in China around 900 A.D. Others believe that poker descends from the French "poque" which closely resembles a 17th century 25 card Persian game called "asnas" and that the game was taught by Persian sailors to the French settlers in New Orleans. The game then made its way from New Orleans by steamboat up the Mississippi river and all the way by wagon and train to the west side of America. The first written words on the history of poker comes from Jonathan H. Green in his chronicles from 1834. He wrote about a very popular game amongst gamblers on the Mississippi riverboats called the "cheating game". The deck contained only 20 cards and was played by a maximum of 4 players.

even receiving a response to our letter. The latest letter was sent to all our representatives in the state and federal government.

Governor Walker responded and pledged his support and a letter from U.S. Senator Ron Johnson included a request he made to Douglas Randall, Director of Forest Service, Washington D.C., to oversee an investigation into the lack of action on Forest County's request and to keep his office apprized as to the status of this matter. Our neighboring county board chairmen are also expressing their concerns to me and are passing resolutions stating their concerns over the management of the CNNE.

To date, we still haven't received a response from the Forest Service. I mentioned the need for a reply to our district ranger and his reply was, "They are working on it."

The Forest County Board is not going to give up on seeing our national forest managed as it has been in the past. We have a County Forestry Department that would be glad to take over the management of these forests to see our area prosper again and keep our loggers and mills working full-time.

With Protein Foods, Variety is Key

Protein foods include both animal (meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs) and plant (beans, peas, soy products, nuts and seeds) sources. We all need protein - but most Americans eat enough, and some eat more than they need. How much is enough? Most people, ages 9 and older, should eat 5 to 7 ounces of protein foods each day.

1.) Vary Your Protein Food Choices - Eat a variety of foods from the Protein Foods Group each week. Experiment with main dishes made with beans or peas, nuts, soy and seafood.

2.) Choose Seafood Twice a Week - Eat seafood in place of meat or poultry twice a week. Select a variety of seafood, include some that are higher in oils and low in mercury, such as salmon, trout, and herring.

3.) Make Meat and Poultry Lean or Low Fat - Choose lean or low-fat cuts of meat like round or sirloin and ground beef that is at least 90% lean. Trim or drain fat from meat and remove poultry skin.

4.) Have an Egg - One egg a day, on average, doesn't increase risk for heart disease, so make eggs part of your weekly choices. Only the egg yolk contains cholesterol and saturated fat, so have as many egg whites as you want.

5.) Eat Plant Protein Foods More Often - Try beans and peas (kidney, pinto, black or white beans; split peas, chickpeas, hummus), soy products (tofu, tempeh, veggie burgers), nuts and seeds. They are naturally low in saturated fat and high in fiber.

6.) Nuts and Seeds - Choose unsalted nuts or seeds as a snack, on salads, or in main dishes to replace meat or poultry. Nuts and seeds are a concentrated source or calories, so eat small portions to keep calories in check.

7.) Keep it Tasty and Healthy - Try grilling, broiling, roasting or baking - they don't add extra fat. Some lean meats need slow, moist cooking to be tender - try a slow cooker for them. Avoid breading meat or poultry, which adds calories.

8.) Make a Healthy Sandwich - Choose turkey, roast beef, canned tuna or salmon, or peanut butter for sandwiches. Many deli meats, such as regular bologna or salami, are high in fat and sodium - make them occasional treats only.

9.) Think Small When it Comes to Meat Portions - Get the flavor you crave but in a smaller portion. Make or order a smaller burger or a "petite" size steak.

10.) Check the Sodium - Check the Nutrition Facts label to limit sodium. Salt is added to many canned foods - including beans and meats. Many processed meats - such as ham, sausage, and hot dogs - are high in sodium. Some fresh chicken, turkey and pork are brined in a salt solution for flavor and tenderness.

Burglar found guilty in Forest County Court

Forest County Sheriff John Dennee and Forest County District Attorney Charles Somono report that a jury trial was conducted for defendant Shawn Bierhals, age 39, from Oconto, Wisconsin, on January 11, 12, and 13. The trial stemmed from a complaint filed June 23, 2011 in the Roberts Lake area. Bierhals was charged with two counts of burglary to a dwelling, party to a crime, felony; two counts of theft of movable property with a value of \$2,500 to \$5,000 party to a crime, felony; three counts of misdemeanor theft, party to a crime; and contributing to the delinquency of a child, felony.

Bierhals was found guilty of all eight charges and was remanded to the Forest County Jail until sentencing on April 5, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. Bierhals's conviction carries a maximum sentence of 40 years and three months.
