Bottoms Up bar in Wabeno loses license for 90 days

At a town meeting last Tuesday evening, Tom Pari, proprietor of Bottoms Up lost his liquor license for a period of 90 days.

The Wabeno tavern has been the site of alleged illegal drug sales in recent times, and there have been two other meetings on this subject. At the previous meeting, the board went into closed session to discuss and look over the evidence. On Tuesday, they rendered their decision.

Over the objections of business owner Dale Adams, the board decided to close the bar for 90 days starting on March 8th and extending to June 5th.

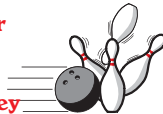
Pari has been cited for being open after hours, selling to underage drinkers, and there are eight charges pending on Randi Pari for illegal drug sales on the premises to undercover drug officers.

The board had the option to revoke the liquor license completely, which would have resulted in complete closure of the property to have a license for a period of 12 months. The board felt this was a fair way to allow the property owner to find another operator for the bar.



An Apple A Day...

Want to keep a lid on your calories? Fruit beats fruit juice, even if the juice has added fiber. Once a week for five weeks, researchers gave 58 adults one of four pre-loads 15 minutes before lunch: peeled apple segments, applesauce, ordinary apple juice, or apple juice with 5 grams of added fiber (pectin). That's how much fiber the apple and applesauce supplied naturally. Serving sizes were adjusted so that all four pre-loads had the same number of calories (125). After the apple segments, the participants ate 15 percent (roughly 190) fewer calories at lunch than they did with no pre-load. The applesauce shaved 100 calories off lunch, but the juices trimmed none. The volunteers felt more full after the apple than after the applesauce, and more full after the applesauce than after juice with or without fiber. Always pick fresh fruit over juice. Try snacking on fresh fruit before meals to see if it curbs your appetite.

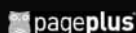

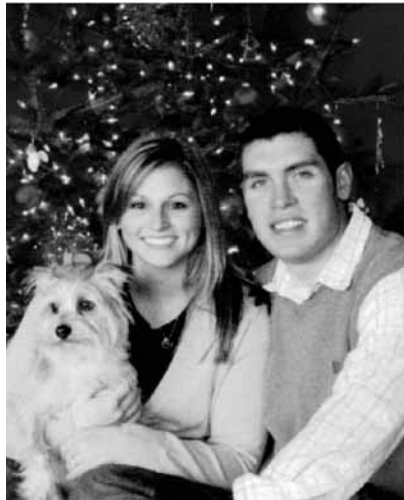

Your Town of Lincoln readers have received a questionnaire to be forwarded to the Lincoln Town Board indicating a preference of site location for a new town hall and garage. We've listed our pros and cons of both sites under consideration:

PRESENT TOWN HALL SITE on HWY W

- PROs**
- Familiar, established location for Town of Lincoln headquarters
 - Safe public access from a low speed area of roadway and right turn lane off Hwy. 8
 - Excellent visual exposure for an attractive new building from both Hwy. W and from Hwy. 8 westbound
 - Active enough area to deter vandalism
 - Property is already in tax-exempt status as a municipal building
 - Complies with Town of Lincoln comprehensive plan
 - Electric service is established
 - Natural gas service is available to property with potential long-term utility savings
 - Water well is present
- CONs**
- The 2.3 acre site size may limit parking if a mega-facility is built
 - Removal of old buildings might add slightly to construction costs

BEAR ROAD SITE (southwest corner of Hwy 8 and Bear Road)

- PROs**
- Larger building and parking site after clearing
- CONs**
- Hillside intersection access from Hwy 8, is a high-speed, moderately busy road with no turn lane
 - Fair visual exposure at best, and only from Hwy. 8 if cleared to the highway
 - Remote location might attract vandalism
 - Removes several acres of taxable land from the Town's tax roles
 - Is out of compliance with the Town's comprehensive plan, which sets aside Hwy 8 frontage east to Bear Road for future commercial development
 - No electric or water are presently on property
 - No natural gas service to the property
 - Potentially leaves the present structure on Hwy W as an eyesore with limited use

The Town's consultant has indicated that a proposed structure would fit on either property, but the town's building committee has directed the consultant to proceed with bidding documents for the Bear Road site. We're not convinced this is the best choice. Hopefully, each Lincoln voter will add any other considerations to the lists and make a responsible choice on the questionnaire.
