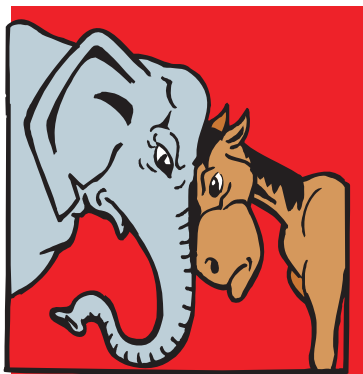

Election day has come and gone. Some have won and some have lost, but the democratic process has struggled on!

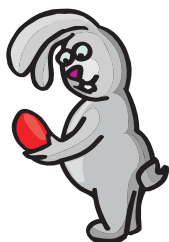
Forest County Board Chairman Erhard Huettl has retained his spot on the Forest County Board, but many of the positions for the board were unopposed.

Three words that could save your life during Tornado Season

(MADISON) – May 22, 2011... one of the deadliest tornados in U.S. history strikes Joplin, Missouri directly killing 161 people and injuring over 1,000. The massive EF-5 with winds over 200 mph hit the city of more than 50,000. That's about the same size as Janesville. Despite the tornado warnings why were there so many deaths? A National Weather Service study on the Joplin tornado reveals important lessons learned:

A majority of residents did not immediately seek shelter when tornado warnings were issued.

People needed between two and nine warnings to take action and seek shelter. For example, if they heard

Spring Game Hearings to be held on Monday, April 9th

For nearly 80 years the Conservation Congress has been reaching out to the citizens of the state, asking people to join the conversation and share ideas on a variety of resource management topics.

The tradition continues Monday, April 9. There will be 72 public hearings, one in each Wisconsin county, starting at 7:00 p.m. If you attend, you'll have the chance to elect delegates to represent your county on the Conservation Congress and you can weigh in on DNR wildlife and fisheries and Conservation Congress advisory questions and citizen resolutions.

New this year, the Conservation Congress will hold a town hall meeting at the end of the night to gather ideas from attendees on how to simplify regulations and how to eliminate participation barriers to activities like fishing and hunting.

This is a Wisconsin-born, unique opportunity to weigh in on natural resources issues that may affect you. It's incredibly important for you to be part of the process.

DNR questions gauge your support - or lack thereof -- on issues ranging from fishing and hunting questions.

This year, wildlife advisory questions seek feedback on permanent adoption of a two-period bobcat hunting and trapping season with permit applicants being required to select either the early or the late season; updating licensing requirements for hunting guides; and, expanding open water hunting opportunities for waterfowl.

Fishing questions this year ask your opinion on allowing year-round fishing seasons in areas we are comfortable it is unnecessary to protect certain fish populations; having a single, statewide musky season opener date; and eliminating some fish refuges if DNR finds that fish populations can be adequately protected by other regulations such as season, bag, or size limits in the same area.

Wisconsin is a fantastic place to hunt and fish. Help us make it even better. Join the conversation at this year's annual hearings. Share your ideas on how we can continue to work together to protect natural resources while making fishing, hunting, and trapping more fun for more people.

The Forest County hearing will be at the Crandon High auditorium. Langlade County's hearing will be at the high school in the Volm auditorium, the Oconto County hearing will be in the Suring High School cafeteria, and Oneida County will meet at the Nicolet College LRC Theater in Rhinelander.

Scam aimed at senior citizens hitting the area

A scam is hitting area senior citizens and has prompted Sheriff Dennee to issue a warning.

Seniors have been receiving phone calls from someone posing as their grandson, saying that he has been arrested in another country and needs money sent via Western Union so he can be released from jail. Some victims have sent money, but most have investigated further by calling other family members, etc. only to find the aforementioned grandson to be safe and sound in the United States.

Sheriff Dennee states there are ways grandparents can avoid this scam and others by looking for a few red flags.

First, automatically be suspicious of anyone asking for money. Also, be extra cautious if the money is requested through a wire transfer or credit card. Be sure to verify identities and whereabouts with other family members. Last, but not least, if you are unsure of any suspicious call, contact law enforcement and they will assist you.

Open Letter Request for Representation

Gentlemen,

This group is comprised of people of the Town of Lincoln who share the common concern that Town Chairman Lynne Black has been leading our Town Government to decisions that will result in needless additional tax burden on our Citizens. A recent and specific example is the issuance of the Building Committee, with Supervisor Sommer absent, of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the sale, to the Town, of design and construction management services for a Community Center/Office Building.

We believe that the bundling of these services into one contract ensures that no local contractor can be expected to compete for the contract. Our builders simply build. They are not in the business of construction management. In addition, there is no need for construction management for the small building contemplated by the Building Committee. And, based on estimates previously provided to the Town by Keller, Inc, the apparent favored contractor, the cost of the combined services will likely amount to about \$130,000.00! Whereas, the reasonable cost for design alone, by engineers or architects foreclosed from bidding, would be very unlikely to exceed \$10,000.00. The difference amounts to \$200 to \$300 per town voter.

Now, we know that you are about to entertain a presentation by Keller, Inc. (and, perhaps, no others) in response to the RFP. But, we also know that the RFP that was approved by the Committee was provided it by Chairman Black, who had, in turn, just received it from Keller, Inc. Is it any wonder that the process seems to us to be suspect? Is there a value in keeping the faith of the electorate?? We think so.

Supervisor Sommer is to arrive here, tomorrow, after long absence. His taking an active role in these matters will be very welcome. We also believe that Supervisor Wilson is a very considered individual. So, there is reason for hope. We think that there is an opportunity for the two of you to control this process at the Town Board level. All that would be required is for one of you to make a motion to withdraw the Request for Proposal and for the other to second it. We are asking that you consider doing that for the people of the Town and advising us, before the Town Meeting on April 10, of your decisions to take action. We appreciate your consideration.

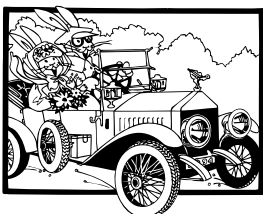

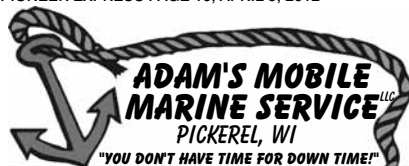
That means you are about 25 per cent more likely to be shot and killed in the US capital, which has some of the strictest gun control laws in the U.S., than you are in Iraq".

While the announcement outlines additional avenues for service members to pursue benefits, it does not expand the benefits provided under the Expanded Homeowners Assistance Program (HAP), established under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, or change the eligibility requirements of the HAP. The deadline for SRTS application submissions is May 4, 2012. Applications and guidelines are available online at <http://www.dot.wisconsin.gov/localgov/aid/saferoutes.htm>. Approved projects will be announced in August 2012. Since 2007, WisDOT has awarded \$13.4 million for 130 projects around the state.

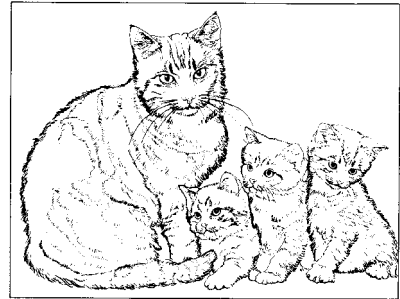


Crandon Fire Department awarded Grant

Members of the Crandon Fire Department will have some new tools at their disposal after recently receiving a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. The funds were awarded through the Forest Fire Protection (FFP) grant program which focuses on providing financial assistance to local fire departments so that they can procure the specialized tools and equipment necessary to combat wildland fires without adding financial burden to their respective townships.

The grant award of \$1,209.11 will be put toward the purchase of a new chainsaw, personal protective equipment, and radio upgrades. The FFP program is a matching funds grant, so Crandon Fire Department will be able to purchase just over \$2,400 worth of equipment while spending only about \$1,200 out of their local budget. With this new equipment, Crandon Fire Department will be able to continue to provide a high level of service while maintaining the safety of its members during our upcoming and future wildland fire seasons.

Local fire departments across Wisconsin play a vital role in preventing and suppressing wildland fires alongside the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and federal agencies. These partnerships are put to use each year to protect lives, property and natural resources during Wisconsin's 1,600 annual wildland fires.

the sirens going off they would look in the sky, then go to a TV to get information and then call a friend, etc.

The time it took between those warnings and seeking shelter cost lives.

What can you do? ReadyWisconsin (part of the team at Wisconsin Emergency Management) urges everyone to Listen, Act and Live!

Listen: When severe weather is possible (Thunderstorm or Tornado Watch issued) pick a credible source of information and keep in touch with that source until the danger has past. One of the best tools is a NOAA Weather Radio (also know as an Emergency Weather Radio).

Act: When you hear a tornado warning (tornado seen by spotters or detected on radar) seek the best shelter you can find immediately. Don't waste time checking multiple sources of information. You may have only seconds to find a safe place.

Live: Your chances of survival multiply. Hopefully the storm will pass with no damage. But don't risk your life on a hope.

For more information visit our website: <http://readywisconsin.wi.gov>. You'll find great information on how to protect you and your family from tornadoes and other severe weather threats.

Did you know that...
--Wisconsin averages 23 tornadoes annually.
--In 2011, 38 tornadoes in Wisconsin were confirmed by the National Weather Service, the fourth highest number on record. The earliest outbreak occurred on April 10th. On August 19th, a man was killed when a tornado with winds of 105 mph struck Marinette County. Five others were injured in 2011.
--In 2010, 46 tornadoes in Wisconsin were confirmed by the National Weather Services, the second greatest yearly number on record. Fortunately, no one was killed but 22 were injured and the tornadoes caused nearly \$30 million in property damage.
--The peak tornado season in Wisconsin is April to August, but tornadoes can occur any time of year, like the January 7, 2008 storms near Kenosha.

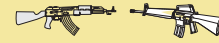

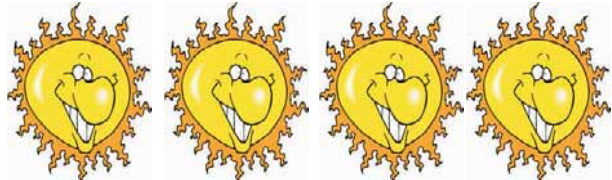

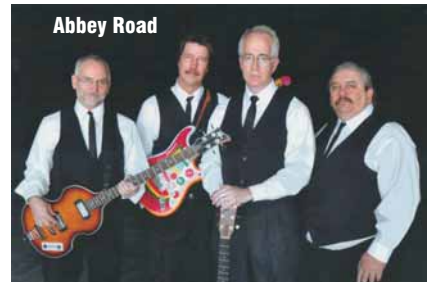
