A little History of my years as County Board Chair

I became a County Supervisor in 1968. In 1975 I was serving as Vice Chair when our County Board Chair Glen Garlock, a good friend of mine, died of a heart attack. I ran for Chairman of the Forest County Board and won the position that I have held ever since. When I became Chairman the tax rate was \$5.24 per thousand valuation, this year our rate is \$4.44 per thousand.

During these thirty-seven (37) years I have had the privilege of working with some of the finest County Board Members on earth.

During the 1980's with the prospects of possible mining coming to Forest County a State of Wisconsin Mining Impact Board was appointed by the Governor. I was appointed as one of the members of the Impact Board along with others including State Department Heads. While I was on the Impact Board I convinced them that Forest County needed an increase in the size of our Courthouse to accommodate any influx of people to our county. At the time our Social Services and Health Department offices were very inadequate in size and our County Board Room was where the Soil and Water and Forestry Offices are now located. The room was small and narrow, approximately 12' by 30', hardly adequate for the County Board much less any spectators. I was successful on my second attempt to get \$300,000 toward the Courthouse Addition, a huge amount at that time.

Years later the County got involved in the Contract for a short line operation on the railroad which is now our Nicolet Trail. At the time the operator was not making money because with cheap fuel the pulp industry was trucking instead of using the rail. The operator aimed the law suit at the County thinking we had the deepest pockets and we were ordered to pay \$540,000. I then went to Madison and presented our case to the Governor showing that it was the states duty to pay the \$540,000 settlement because the state was involved in the contract.

Lottery Credit Week May 14th - 18th

The Forest County Treasurer's office is dedicating the week of May 14 to help all Real Property Owners who were eligible, receive the lottery credit on their 2011 tax bill. If the property owner did not receive the credit, and meets the eligibility requirements the Treasurer's office will help you complete the paperwork and file the forms with the Department of Revenue to receive the late lottery credit and ensure that the credit is applied to their 2012 tax bill.

To qualify for the lottery and gaming credit, an owner must be a Wisconsin resident, the owner of the dwelling, and use the dwelling as their primary residence as of the certification date (January 1, 2011). If temporarily absent, typically for a period no longer than 6 months (hospital, vacation, incarcerated, etc), it is the home to which the owner returns. Principal dwelling means any dwelling used by the owner of the dwelling as his/her primary residence. A property owner may claim only one primary residence. The lottery and gaming credit cannot be claimed on business property, rental units, vacant land, garages, or other property that is not the primary residence of the owner. [sec. 79.10 (1) (dm), (9) (bm), Wis. Stats.]

To verify if you received the lottery credit please visit the Forest County Website www.co.forest.wi.gov and click on Land Records Data. If you did not receive the credit and you qualify to receive it contact the Treasurer's office at 715-478-2412 and Treasurer's office will assist you in completing the necessary paperwork to receive the credit for this year and on next year's tax bill. The lottery credit can only be obtained by having a signed application on file.

Forest County Families Unplug! Screen Free Week Turns Attention to Physical Activity

Kids who spend less time in front of TV and computer screens in the early years tend to do better in school, have a healthier diet, be more physically active and are better able to engage in schoolwork in later elementary school.

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends no screen time for children under two and less than two hours per day for older children, yet the average 8-18-year-old spends upwards of seven hours per day in front of a TV or computer, according to a Kaiser Family Foundation study.

Parents and other adults can set a good example by limiting their own screen time and helping kids unplug. To address screen time overload for children of all ages, adults can:

- ** Set screen time limits that are age appropriate
- ** Suggest other developmentally appropriate activities for young children
- ** Set a good example by limiting their own screen time
- ** Embrace play and physical activity as a way to build relationships between children and adults

Permanent prescription drug drop-off at F.C. Sheriff's Dept.

On April 28, 2012, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration will coordinate the 4th National Pharmaceutical Take Back Initiative. The idea is to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from the nation's medicine cabinets.

This is a one-day effort nationally, but in Forest County, the Sheriff's Department has placed a drop box in the lobby of the Sheriff's Department for public use. Your drop-off of an unwanted prescription drug is available 24 hours a day at your Sheriff's Department.

This time, liquids will be accepted, but the liquid must be in original packaging or it will not be accepted.

FCP Health & Wellness Offers Weekend Walk-In Clinic

On May 5, residents of Forest County, Wisconsin, and the surrounding area, will gain access to expanded medical coverage.

In collaboration with Aspirus Clinics, The Forest County Potawatomi Health & Wellness Center will open a weekend walk-in clinic for non-emergency medical care. It is the only weekend walk-in clinic offered in the Crandon area. The clinic is open to the public on Saturdays from 8 a.m. 4 p.m., and plans to expand its hours to include Sundays this summer.

"We're excited to make people's lives in our community a little easier," said Linda Helmick, FCP Health & Wellness Administrator. "Our main goals are to provide access to care for people who need it without having to travel a long distance to receive that care, and to help people avoid having to spend money on unnecessary medical expenses at an emergency room."

Aspirus has several walk-in clinics throughout the region and brings its expertise in this arena to the Health and Wellness Center. Providers at the clinic are physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants who are contracted from Aspirus and are supported by nursing, radiology, lab, and records/reception staff from Health and Wellness. Medications are available on a limited basis.

"The weekend clinic is a complement to care received regularly Monday through Friday from your primary care physician," Helmick said. She also said that the weekend clinic's purpose is to provide weekend convenience for minor illnesses and injuries. Its purpose is not emergency medicine (chest pain, trauma, etc.) or regular office visits for physicals or stable chronic conditions.

The weekend clinic treats basic ailments, of a non-emergency nature, such as, but not limited to: allergies, bladder infections, colds, cough, flu, cuts, scrapes, bruises, minor injuries, ear infections, fever, insect bites, minor burns and rashes, pink eye, sinus infections, sore throat, sprains, stomachache, upper respiratory infections, and other minor illnesses.

Most insurance is accepted, including Medicare and Medical Assistance, insurance offered through the Aspirus Network, and most third-party payers, but it's important to check with your insurance company first.

The weekend walk-in clinic at the Forest County Potawatomi Health & Wellness Center is located three miles east of Crandon, off of Hwy. 8, on 8201 Mish ko swen Drive. The phone number is (715) 478-4300, and website is www.FCPotawatomi.com.

Nicolet Building Trades students show off new home May 5
Project sought for next year

The public is invited to an Open House Saturday, May 5, to view the latest home constructed by students in Nicolet College's Building Trades program. The event will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the home located at 5617 Riverview Dr. on the shore of Boom Lake in Rhinelander.

"I was very impressed with the overall craftsmanship the students displayed as they were building the home," said Jeff Labs, Nicolet Building Trades and Architectural Technology instructor. "They did a great job and should be proud of the quality of the construction they put into the home."

Last September students started construction on an existing foundation of an older home that had been demolished and removed from the site. Because of zoning laws and the fact that the foundation is only about 50-feet from water's edge, they had to construct the new home on the existing footprint. "This meant they had to be sensitive to the environment around the home, especially on the property that was lakeside, so as not to have a negative impact on the shoreline environment," Labs explained. "It was a great experience for them to build a home in such a manner."

The two-bedroom, 1,920-square-foot home includes a deck that the students built around a tree that has been sculpted by a local artist.

Anyone interested in a career in the building trades is also encouraged to stop by the Open House to learn more about the one-year Building Trades program offered at Nicolet. Brigitte Parsons, dean of Trade and Industry at Nicolet, said students are seeing "significant opportunities" for jobs this year as the home construction business in the Northwoods is picking up. She said she's heard from many contractors who are now scheduling work a year or more in advance.

Nicolet's Building Trades program is also currently accepting applications for a home construction project for the 2012-13 academic year. Anyone attending the Open House will have a chance to pick up an application and talk to Labs about the criteria for next year's project. Anyone interested in an application but is unable to attend the Open House can email Labs at jlabs@nicoletcollege.edu.

The home is located to the northwest of Hodag Park across Boom Lake. To get there, take Hwy. W north out of Rhinelander past the Rhinelander County Club, turn left (west) on River Rd., left of Trails End Road, and left again onto Riverview Drive. Signs will also be posted directing people to the Open House.

So, the people spoke on the issue. That presented a test for Chairwoman Black to demonstrate whether she would abide by the wishes of the Citizens or, on the contrary, to seek a way to avoid them. Now, since the Town Meeting, and armed with opinion of the Town Lawyer that she was not bound by the Citizen's resolution (with which I don't disagree), she has driven the Building Committee ahead by scheduling three successive meetings to proceed with planning. But, she also had the option, as Chairwoman, to voluntarily set the process aside and let things settle down. That she chose not to do that is a strong indication of her continuing willfulness and determination to keep personal control of the process, regardless of the expressed will of her Electors. But, now her Electors have that knowledge. And, knowledge is power. So, that is actually a positive result.

5. One issue of importance to the Citizens was Chairwoman Black's reliance on a determination by the Building Committee that any building to be built would be built on Bear Road, rather than on the present building site. She had referred to that decision as unchangeable except by motion for reconsideration by the Committee. Of course, prior to the Town Meeting, it was clear that any motion to reconsider the site, if brought, would not survive the Chairwoman's majority on the Committee. But, at the first Building Committee following the Town Meeting, and with no motion to reconsider the site issue, the Chairwoman announced that she wanted to clarify the Committee's position on the Site. And, that the present site is "still on the table". Well, okay. We don't know whether the Committee somehow changed it's mind or whether the Chairwoman changed her mind on what the Committee had previously decided. But, there clearly is a change in the direction of hearing the Public on the issue. And, that's positive.

6. The Citizens passed three other resolutions. We have seen no reaction from the Board to these, nor has the Chairwoman made the effort to publish the reaction of the Town Lawyer to these resolutions. So, the length of time that we are to be kept in the dark about these will, in and of itself, be interesting. But, one of those, a motion rescinding a grant of Village Powers to the Town Board, was probably not well thought out in that it primarily affects the town zoning authority. It was your writer who suggested and authored the resolution. On further consideration, it appears that the action of passing that resolution, at least to the extent that effective zoning control is interrupted, is of potentially negative impact, and should be reversed. I take responsibility for the error and will advocate for its reversal.

7. Finally, the Town Meeting produced another positive result. That is, that Board Member, Larry Sommer, has started to write to the Public in local media. Communication is necessary to reestablish the trust of the Citizens in its Government. And, communication on issues of this importance to the Community between the Citizens and their representatives should be a dialogue. It should be two-way! We very much welcome the fact that at least one Board Member is going to participate. That he sees fit to do so is very, very positive.

There are other results of the Town Meeting that come to mind. But, what is extremely important is the extent to which you Citizens have weighed in on how your Town Government makes decisions that affect you and the quality of life here in the Town. You are due our thanks for getting involved, because that is very positive, too.

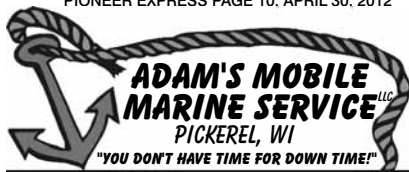

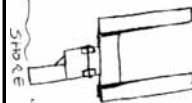

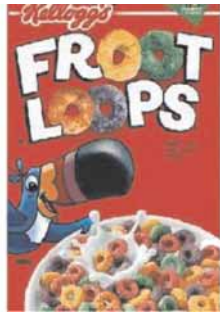

Pension Contributions Save Taxpayers \$6.8 Million Annually

Madison -State Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) announced Monday that the new pension contributions required by school district employees are saving nearly \$7 million for school districts within the 36th Assembly District as well as taxpayers supporting them. The new law went into effect last year and requires employees contribute at least 5.8% of their salary to their retirement pension.

"These annual savings are just the beginning," Mursau said. "Government across Wisconsin is increasing productivity and meeting high priority citizen services with the same or fewer taxes than would have otherwise been required."

To: Town of Lincoln Voters and Taxpayers

Dear Editor,

The Town Meeting Success or Failure?

How should we, as the People of the Town of Lincoln, measure our success or failure in influencing the course of our government through our efforts at the Town Meeting of April 10th? Let's look at what we know of the results:

1. We all had the strong feeling that the Town Board and Building Committee were, for at least a year, acting as though they were in charge of a rich city in need of a great city hall. We, who felt that a large government building would be a bad thing for our little Town, were in disbelief that our representatives and their appointees could be so completely deaf to the voices of the Citizens and so oblivious to their concerns. The Town Meeting afforded an opportunity for the people to directly express their thoughts to those people in such a manner that all doubt was eradicated as to whether their representatives received their message. The resulting, but undeniable, clarity is a distinctly positive result.
2. It was necessary, because of the seeming indifference of our Elected Officials to the feelings of the Electorate, to deliver our communications to them in a brutally frank manner. Doing so caused injured pride and hurt feelings. We all felt that effect, on leaving, and none of us took satisfaction from it. So that was a negative, but necessary, collateral effect of our delivering our thoughts.
3. A presentation by Mike Hobbs, which enlightened so many of us as to issues other than a town building, was apparently given some weight by the Board. This was evidenced by the very rapid and obvious response by the Town Government in the remediation of certain work deficiencies by the road maintenance crews. So, that is an apparent positive result.
4. Mike Hobbs also made a motion, overwhelmingly supported by vote of the Citizens, to cease all spending and planning relative to proposed town buildings, for one year.

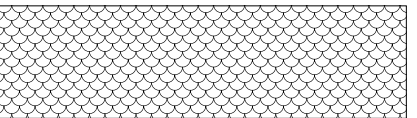



No person may appear before the Board of Review, testify to the Board by telephone or contest the amount of assessment unless, at least 48 hours before the first meeting of the Board or at least 48 hours before the objection is heard if the objection is allowed because the person has been granted a waiver of the 48 hour notice of an intent to file a written objection by appearing before the Board during the first two hours of the meeting and showing good cause for failure to meet the 48 hour notice requirement and files a written objection, that the person provided to the clerk of the Board of Review notice as to whether the person will ask for removal of any Board members and, if so, which member will be removed and the person's reasonable estimate of the length of time that the hearing will take.

When appearing before the Board of Review, the person shall specify, in writing, the person's estimate of the value of the land and of the improvements that are the subject of the person's objection and specify the information that the person used to arrive at the estimate.

No person may appear before the Board of Review, testify to the Board or by telephone or object to a valuation; if that valuation was made by the assessor or the objector using the income method of a valuation; unless the person supplies the Assessor all information about income and expenses, as specified in the Assessor manual under Sec. 73.03(2a) of WI Statutes, that the Assessor requests. The Town of Wabeno has an ordinance for the confidentiality of information about income and expenses that is provided to the Assessor under this paragraph which provides exceptions for persons using information in the discharge of duties imposed by law or the duties of their office or by order of the court. The information that is provided under this paragraph, unless a court determined that it is inaccurate, is not subject to the right of inspection and copying under Sec. 19.35(1) of WI Statutes.

Governor Tommy Thompson flew up to Forest County and attended our County Board meeting and presented us with a check for \$540,000.

As the Casinos were developed and the law enforcement costs increased on the reservations I traveled to Madison and met with the Governor, State Finance Committee and our representatives and others to attempt getting a yearly payment from the State of Wisconsin Casino Revenue Account for our county to help us cover the mounting costs. I was successful in getting a \$300,000 yearly amount attached to the State Budget Bill and we have received it yearly since. I am presently working with our legislators and Governor Walker in getting this amount increased to at least \$500,000. Hopefully this can be accomplished this term as the State Deficit improves.

I also bargained \$100,000 payments from the Crandon Mining Company per year for several years before they gave up the project. The payments were made on the new Highway Maintenance Center.

I have also been very successful in receiving many smaller Grants, these all help hold down the tax burden to our Forest County tax payers.

In the past year I have called all the Northern Counties together to organize the new North Woods Rail Commission which hopefully can retain the last rail service to Forest County. I feel rail is very essential to our Logging Industry and any other County Growth.

I have been involved in the MRA Park proposal for Forest County. Hopefully we will see this become a reality whether an add on to our existing brush run facility or other options. We are having a feasibility study at the present time as to how it would or could be developed in Forest County. This could be a bonanza to our Forest County businesses if it is developed here. Working together with the two Tribes, The City of Crandon, the Chamber of Commerce, the Forest County Partnership Committee and the Forest County Board there is no limit as to what we can accomplish to make Forest County a better place to live.

Besides the Courthouse addition, we have also built a new Law Enforcement Center and a new Highway Maintenance Center during my years on the board. I have always been very conservative and at the same time very progressive in my

recommendations on the three building projects that we accomplished through the years. We made these projects a reality without hardly any tax rate increase. The County Board made decisions at low cost and low interest rate times, getting the bids during slow winter building times. The various building committees during these times are to be complimented on their many decisions to have the fine facilities we have today.

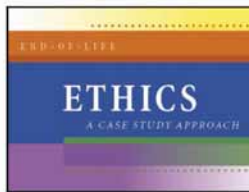
During my many years as County Board Chair I can only say I am extremely pleased with the progress we have made. We have a County tax rate that is lower than any comparable County in Wisconsin. We had to do this with only approximately 17% of our land base on the tax roll. I still serve on state and district boards that I can help guide assistance toward our County.
