Wabeno Memorial Day Presentation

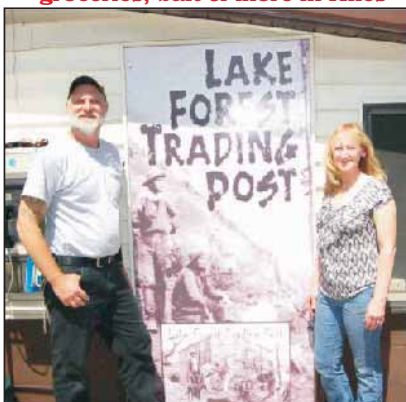

The band shell was the idea of Mrs. George Reddick, who in 1940, proposed the construction of the band shell to Louis Mallow, Sr. Mallow drew out a plan on the inside of a candy box and the idea grew.

Mothers of the band students started a fund-raising campaign, and with bake sales, auctions, raffles and donations gathered enough money to start the building.

Carpenter Albert Schuster headed up the project. With purchased and donated material and much volunteer labor, the band shell was built.

The band shell is a monument to those who worked so hard to give it to the community of Wabeno, including those who worked hard in recent years to restore one of the town's historic structures.

To be sure, another band shell will rise on the foundations of the old one, and once again there may have to be fund raising and volunteer labor, but Wabeno always does what it sets out to do, so watch for the next landmark!

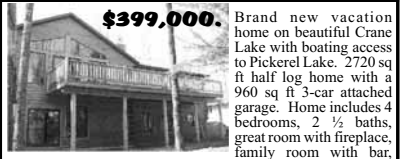

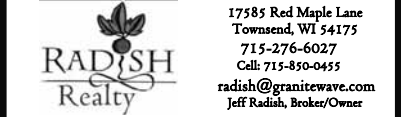

Mursau: Survey Responses Wanted by May 31

Madison – Assembly Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) is urging residents of the 36th Assembly District to return surveys by May 31st. Mursau mailed the survey to residents in April. Residents who need a new copy can request one from Mursau at: Rep.Mursau@legis.wi.gov or (888) 534-0036.

"Things in Wisconsin are turning around, but our hard work is far from over," Mursau said. "I need your help to plan out what we need to do next to make sure Wisconsin remains a great place to live, work and recreate."

Mursau's survey depends, like all surveys, on a large sample of the population. In order to reduce the margin of error, responses are needed from as many people across the legislative district as possible.

"Inaccurate survey results do no good," Mursau said. "I need an accurate response to continue being a voice for the people of northeast Wisconsin down in Madison."

Town of Lincoln Zoning

To the Editor:

Quite a bit happening in new regulations for property owners in Forest County and the town of Lincoln .

The State of Wisconsin has passed NR 170 that addresses repairs of existing nonconforming cottages and boat houses on and near water ways. Forest County zoning will be having a public hearing to discuss the 20% coverage of improvements resulting in non-permeable surfaces of existing lots. And the Town of Lincoln has updated their zoning ordinance that is headed to the Forest County Board of Supervisors for approval.

It is the Town of Lincoln Zoning Ordinance that may have the largest impact of restrictions and changes to local property owners. The town board has reviewed the changes and voted to implement regulations that are more restrictive than the State and County. Their reasoning is on page 22 . (Given high levels of existing development on some water bodies, increasing pressure for development, it is necessary that classes of water bodies meet certain standards more restrictive than the minimum standards required by state law in order to fully achieve the purposes of this ordinance.)

One example is the non permeable lot coverage that is spelled out in the new town ordinance of 15% , this may require a home owner to get a variance for the paving of a driveway or side walk if the improvement exceeds the 15 % non permeable lot coverage. There are many other restrictions in the ordinance pertaining to existing non conforming structures, new lots, and conditional use of your property. If interested copies of the new town of Lincoln ordinance are available digitally from the county clerk or zoning.

Don't get ticked

As many of you may already know the ticks are out and about. It's likely that at some point this summer you will encounter these creepy crawling critters. There are two kinds of ticks in Wisconsin. Both are tiny and flat. One is the wood tick, and one the deer tick. The deer tick or black legged tick may sometimes carry Lyme disease. Lyme disease can be identified by a ring-shaped "bulls eye" rash, fever, or flu-like symptoms and tiredness. However, according to the CDC (Centers for Disease Control) a deer tick or black legged tick needs to be attached for at least 24 hours before it can transmit Lyme disease. Symptoms usually occur within a month of being bit.

Call your doctor if you experience: A rash, fever, stiff neck, muscle aches, joint pain and inflammation, swollen lymph nodes, flu-like symptoms or light sensitivity to the eyes or skin.

Call 911 if you experience: a severe headache, difficulty breathing, paralysis, chest pain or heart palpitations.

DO:

- Use a tweezers try to grasp them as close to the skin's surface as possible.
- Pull upward, do not twist, or jerk the tick because this can cause mouth parts to remain in the skin.
- Clean the bite area and hands with rubbing alcohol, iodine scrub, or soap and water

DONT:

- Paint the tick with nail polish
- Use petroleum jelly
- Use heat to make the tick detach from your skin

The best medicine is prevention. To help prevent tick bites wear long sleeves, long pants and high socks with your socks tucked in. Use an insect repellent on exposed skin. DEET formulations as high as 50% can be used on adults and children 2 months of age and older. Always apply repellent over the top of sunscreen, and wash off before going to bed. The most important step is to INSPECT! Do yourself and others a favor and do a "tick check" before going to bed, and help others in your family who may need help!

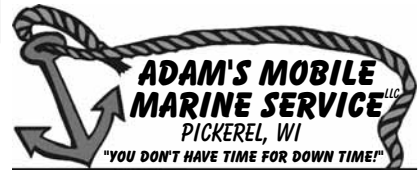

New Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator Appointed for Lincoln, Langlade, and Forest Counties

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) has been and continues to be a concern in the state of Wisconsin. Harmful species include Eurasian Water Milfoil, Curly Leaf Pondweed, Purple Loosestrife, Rusty Crayfish and the fish disease Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS). All of these species have the potential to choke lakes out, hinder recreational opportunities, lower property values and they can spread rapidly. With summer rapidly approaching, the potential for AIS spread comes with it. Many individuals and groups including lake associations, volunteer workers, and state, federal, and county employees put in countless hours stopping the spread of AIS.

Lincoln County Land Information and Conservation Department received funding for a three year AIS education program from a successful grant application through the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Aquatic Invasive Species Control Grant Program. Lincoln County partnered with Lumberjack Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Council to hire an AIS project coordinator to assist the county Land Conservation Departments in Lincoln, Langlade and Forest counties.

John Preuss, a native of Elroy, Wisconsin was recently hired to fill the vacancy of Lumberjack Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator. Preuss will seek input and will work with federal, state, and local government agencies, lake associations, volunteer groups and the general public on halting the spread of AIS. The goals of the Tri County Aquatic Invasives project include creating a multi county network of people interested in coordinating and implementing AIS prevention and control efforts; plans to monitor and prevent new AIS infestations and minimize the spread of established populations; public awareness and education programs related to AIS issue; and AIS action plan protocols for lake organizations.

Preuss grew up on a small dairy farm in Central Wisconsin and while on the farm developed a deep appreciation and respect for our natural world. Preuss grew up hunting and fishing and spent a large amount of time enjoying the state's water resources. During the past four years Preuss worked as a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Deputy Warden in the Water Guard Program in Northern Wisconsin. His counties of responsibilities included Lincoln, Langlade, Forest, Oneida, Vilas, Iron, Florence and Price Counties. His responsibilities included preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species through enforcement, education, and community collaboration. While in the position Preuss worked closely with area lake associations, fishing

2012 Fishing Season is Upon Us and With it Comes Responsibilities

With the warmer weather and the feel of Spring upon us many of us are getting the itch to start fishing and boating. With fishing and boating comes the risk of spreading aquatic invasive species (AIS). These species can spread rapidly by hitching a ride on somebody's boat or watercraft and include Eurasian Water Milfoil and Zebra Mussels. These species can choke out lakes and make recreating difficult if not impossible. As our fishing line first hits the water or the boat motor starts, our responsibilities begin. It is up to all of us to do our part to prevent the spread of AIS. There are several laws in place to prevent the spread of these nasty invaders.

Wisconsin laws have been in place since September 2009 to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. While fishing and boating remember to follow these Wisconsin laws to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Remove all aquatic plants, animals and mud from boats, trailers, and equipment before leaving the boat landing. Drain all water from your boat, motor, bilge, transom wells, and livewells before leaving the boat landing. Do not move live fish away from a boat landing. A live fish is a fish still in water. Drain water from all containers containing your fish including pails, coolers, livewells, and bait buckets. Frozen water bottles or ice can be used in place of water to keep fish fresh.

Minnnows also have the potential to spread aquatic invasive species. Minnows cannot be used from a state other than Wisconsin. When purchasing minnows in Wisconsin it must be from a licensed Wisconsin bait dealer. Unused minnows may be transported away alive from a waterbody and used again on the same waterbody or on a different waterbody if no lake or river water or other fish was added to their container. If lake or river water or fish were added to the container the minnows can be taken home BUT only used again on the same waterbody.

If trapping minnows special regulations apply. Minnow harvesting is closed on VHS affected waters and they include Lake Michigan (including Green Bay), Lake Superior, the Mississippi River, Lake Winnebago, Fox River from Lake Winnebago to Green Bay, and all connecting waters upstream to the first barrier impassible to fish. On other waters minnows may be harvested for personal use but may not be transported away alive from the water.

These laws can also be found in the 2012-2013 Wisconsin fishing regulations on pages 17 and 18.

Political signs along right of way are illegal, potentially dangerous, and will be removed

With a major election set for June 5, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is reminding citizens that state law prohibits the placement of any type of sign – including political, commercial or garage sale signs – on state highway right of way.

"We certainly don't want to discourage anyone from participating in elections, but signs within highway right of way are a public safety concern," said Deb Brucaya with WisDOT's Bureau of Highway Maintenance. "Improperly placed campaign signs can distract motorists or obstruct their view, especially at intersections. And when people enter an intersection or highway right of way to install a sign, they're putting their own safety at risk, as well as risking the safety of the road crew worker who will remove the sign."

Other than official traffic signs, state law prohibits the placement of signs within state highway right of way. The State Highway System includes all numbered state, federal and interstate highways. In general, state highway right of way in rural areas extends to beyond shoulders, ditches and any adjoining fence line. In urban areas along the state highway system, signs are prohibited from the roadway area to at least one foot past the sidewalk.

Signposts, street name marker posts and most utility poles are all within highway right of way. Signs are not allowed within highway medians or roundabouts. With the landowner's consent, political signs are permitted on private property without a billboard permit as long as the signs do not exceed 32 square feet and contain no flashing lights or moving parts.

Improperly located signs are dealt with as part of regular highway maintenance. A sign that poses a traffic safety hazard will be promptly removed. Road crews are asked to make reasonable attempts to preserve campaign signs that are taken down and to provide campaign offices an opportunity to claim the signs.

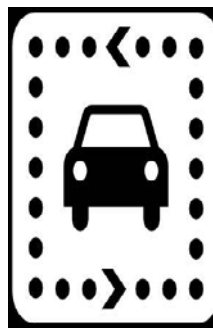
"Remember, if you see road maintenance workers removing illegal signs, they're simply following our directions to enforce state law and help keep our roadways as safe as possible for all travelers," Brucaya said.

State law (Section 86.19) provides for a fine from \$10 to \$100 for signs that violate state law. Local municipalities may have additional guidelines regulating the placement of political signs along county highways or local roads and streets.

Results of Two-Year Bear Lake Study of Water Quality Released

Results of a two-year study of Bear Lake were revealed to 35 to 40 people on Saturday, April 29th at the Blackwell Town Hall. The study was conducted by the Center for Watershed Science and Education at the University of Wisconsin Stevens Point. The Town of Blackwell, with support from the U.S. Forest Service, the Association for Bear Lake and Environs (ABLE), the Aquatic Invasive Species Program of Forest County, and Bear Lake Shores Association, applied for a Department of Natural Resources Lake Management Grant to look into reasons for some algae issues the lake had been facing for several years and how the problem could possibly be managed. Center Director Nancy Turyk presented data and other information about the lake and watershed, outlined various parts of the study, and presented data gleaned from the rigorous sampling of the lake, Shabadock Creek, and Bear Creek. Some of the observations and results include:

-- Bear Lake is a drainage lake, meaning most of its water comes from the watershed which drains into the lake. In Bear Lake's case, the watershed is very large, over 4,000 acres, and Bear Lake is only 68 acres in size. The large watershed includes numerous wetlands, which store water throughout the year and maintain adequate Bear Lake water levels. On the other hand, the watershed collects a lot of phosphorous, which contributes to algae growth.

-- Over 121,000 pounds of phosphorous enter Bear Lake annually, and most of that goes out Bear Creek. Surface water runoff contributes a little over half (53%) of the phosphorous delivered into Bear Lake, while just under half the load is from Shabadock Creek. About two percent is from groundwater, which feeds Bear Lake at numerous spots around the lake, and contains phosphorous as well. Overall, much of the phosphorous delivered to Bear Lake is naturally occurring and little is man-made.

-- Bear Lake's phosphorous levels border on high naturally, according to DNR standards, so any additional phosphorous input results in an overload, causing algae. A lake's native vegetation, if healthy, is usually adequate enough to store and use algae in its growth cycle, and therefore allow little to be used for algae growth. Bear Lake has relatively little vegetation due to its rocky, sandy nature, and therefore is at a disadvantage. Added to that is the fact that phosphorous is naturally occurring in the soils, and the task to stay algae free becomes difficult.

-- One of the biggest problems cited in the study as a possible cause of algae production is the presence of rusty crayfish, an aquatic invasive species (AIS) introduced to the lake several decades ago. Rusty crayfish are very aggressive against native crayfish and various fish species, and their eating habits create water quality problems, in addition to aesthetic ones. While native crayfish eat green algae on the aquatic plant, rusty crayfish cut off the plant to eat the algae, creating the dual problem of reducing the number of plants which can take up excess phosphorous and leaving the plants to decay, creating even more nutrient problems. Neither species eats blue-green algae, the main cause of deteriorated water quality.

Controlling rusty crayfish populations, however, was identified as a main focus in the battle to improved water quality on Bear Lake. This and other suggested methods will be addressed in a multi-year plan being prepared by the project team to pro-actively promote activities to manage and reduce phosphorous in Bear Lake. In the meantime, half dozen teams of landowners will continue efforts to trap and reduce the rusty crayfish population. The document is expected to be completed by July 2012.

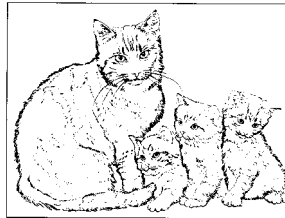

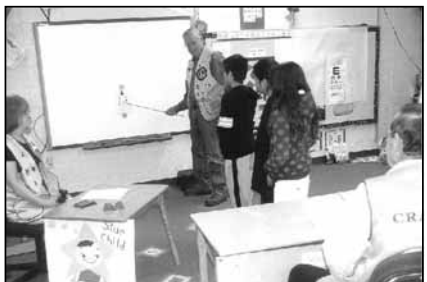

Salt and Sodium

10 Tips to help you cut back!

It's clear that Americans have a taste for salt, but salt plays a role in high blood pressure. Everyone, including kids, should reduce their sodium intake to less than 2,300 milligrams of sodium a day (about 1 teaspoon of salt). Adults age 51 and older, African Americans of any age, and individuals with high blood pressure, diabetes or chronic kidney disease should further reduce their sodium intake to 1,500 mg a day.

1.) **Think Fresh:** Most of the sodium Americans eat is found in processed foods. Eat highly processed foods less often in smaller portions - especially cheesy foods, such as pizza, cured meats, such as bacon, sausage, hot dogs, and deli/luhcheon meats, and ready-to-eat foods like canned chili, ravioli, and soups. Fresh foods are generally lower in sodium.

2.) **Enjoy home-prepared foods:** Cook more often at home - where you are in control of what's in your food. Preparing your own foods allows you to limit the amount of salt in them.

3.) **Fill up on veggies and fruits - they are naturally low in sodium:** Eat plenty of vegetables and fruits - fresh or frozen. Eat a vegetable or fruit at every meal.

4.) **Choose dairy and protein foods that are lower in sodium:** Choose more fat-free or low-fat milk and yogurt in place of cheese, which is higher in sodium. Choose fresh beef, pork, poultry and seafood, rather than those with salt added. Deli or luncheon meats, sausages, and canned products like corned beef are higher in sodium. Choose unsalted nuts and seeds.

5.) **Adjust your taste buds:** Cut back on salt little by little - and pay attention to the natural tastes of various foods. Your taste for salt will lessen over time.

6.) **Skip the salt:** Skip adding salt when cooking. Keep salt off the kitchen counter and the dinner table. Use spices, herbs, garlic, vinegar, or lemon juice to season foods or use no-salt seasoning mixes. Try black or red pepper, basil, curry, ginger or rosemary.

7.) **Read the label:** Read the Nutrition Facts label and the ingredients statement to find packaged and canned foods lower in sodium. Look for foods labeled "low sodium", "reduced sodium" or "no salt added".

8.) **Ask for low-sodium foods when you eat out:** Restaurants may prepare lower sodium foods at your

request and will serve sauces and salad dressings on the side so you can use less.

9.) **Pay attention to condiments:** Foods like soy sauce, ketchup, pickles, olives, salad dressing, and seasoning packets are high in sodium. Choose low-sodium soy sauce and ketchup. Have a carrot or celery stick instead of olives or pickles. Use only a sprinkling of flavoring packets instead of the entire packet.

10.) **Boost your potassium intake:** Choose foods with potassium, which may help to lower your blood pressure. Potassium is found in vegetables and fruits, such as potatoes, beet greens, tomato juice and sauce, sweet potatoes, beans (white, lima, kidney), and bananas. Other sources of potassium include yogurt, clams, halibut, orange juice and milk.
