Ultra4 Rock Racing 4x4s to race at Crandon's Brush Run, June 16-17



CRANDON, Wis. (May 9, 2012) Fans attending next month's (June 16-17) annual Brush Run at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway are in for a big time additional treat as the wild open wheel 'moon buggy'-style vehicles that compete on the Ultra 4 Series, popularized by the annual "King of the Hammers" race, will line up and race the Brush Run both Saturday and Sunday at

Likely thought of as the powerful 600horsepower buggies that crawl up and down ungodly steep rock faces at places like Moab. Utah, the Ultra 4 Series vehicles when unimpeded - can also blast across the desert at speeds in excess of 100 mph. That said, the inaugural 15 vehicle Ultra 4 race at Crandon will take place on the same track the Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, PRO Light, 2WD & 4x4 trucks race earlier in the day with no obstacles put in the way of the Ultra 4 vehicles, which are thought to be able to reach the same speeds as the TORC PRO Light trucks at Crandon (approaching 90 mph).

"We're coming to enjoy Crandon the exact way it is," said Ultra 4 founder Dave Cole. "I've got a bet with Brad Lovell that our fastest guy will beat his PRO Light truck."

"This style of racing is the foundation of our team it is very thrilling to have our Ultra 4 family at Crandon the weekend of the TORC Brush Run," said Lovell. "Ultra 4s are designed to take on any terrain and are truly unlimited four-wheel drives ... anything goes! I don't know exactly what to expect at Crandon from the Ultra 4s, but side bets are developing already. This might be the only charge for a lot of these guys to ever race Crandon, so I know they will be going all out!" Note: Lovell's brother, Roger, will run his No. 232 AMSOIL Torchmate rock racer (Ultra 4) at Crandon so Brad can focus on his No. 44 AMSOIL PRO Light driving duties.

The Ultra 4 vehicles, with their exposed suspension and massive low pressure flotation tires, mark a radical departure from the TORC truck-style racers at Crandon. Likened more to the Super Buggy class, Ultra 4s are considerably more powerful, higher off the ground and something that the Crandon faithful will no doubt

appreciate - tend to roll over onto their tops fairly easily.

"This is something we've never seen before and our fans are really going to get a kick out of it," said Crandon's Cliff Flannery. "And it's pretty neat how it came together so fast. From speaking with Dave at the Indy offroad trade show to having USAC/TORC sign off on it, the Ultra 4s at Crandon are really going to be something!

"Everybody likes to go fast. Now we get to do it for the biggest crowd we've ever raced in front of, at an iconic track," said Cole, adding his first trip to Crandon this week was "Incredible." "All I can think of is that first turn and how 15 guys, side by side at nearly 100 miles per hour in open wheel buggies are going to make it out of there. One thing's for sure is that we're going to put on a heck of a show for the fans at Crandon!

Remembering Mom's clothesline

You have to be a certain age to appreciate clotheslines, but you younger people can read about the "good old days."

- You had to hang the socks by the toe and not the top.
- You hung pants by the bottom cuffs, not the waist.

Beth Van Cleve DeJongh to deliver Crandon's Commencement Address

Beth DeJongh, Pharm.D., BCPS is the daughter of Ken and Lori Van Cleve and is a 2001 graduate from Crandon High School. She completed her pre-pharmacy coursework at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 2005 and was then accepted into the University of Minnesota College of Pharmacy, Duluth. Dr. DeJongh was an active member of several campus organizations as well as professional fraternities/societies. She was nominated and selected by her peers for induction into Phi Lambda Sigma National Pharmacy Student Leadership Society. She was also inducted into Rho Chi Pharmacy Honor Society for her academic achievements, an honor granted to students in the top 20% of the class. Dr. DeJongh graduated from the program with distinction and

received her Doctor of Pharmacy degree in 2009.

After graduation Dr. DeJongh completed two post graduate pharmacy residencies. From 2009-2010 she worked as a behavioral health resident at the University of Minnesota Medical Center, Fairview Riverside in Minneapolis, Minnesota. During that time she completed psychiatric medication consults, participated in patient rounds, lead medication groups on the inpatient psychiatric units, and performed a research project exploring shared decision making through the use of antidepressant decision making aids. Dr. DeJongh became interested in the relationship between depression and heart disease and decided to also pursue a pharmacy residency in cardiology. From 2010-2011 she worked as a cardiology resident at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in West Palm Beach, Florida. She started a metabolic syndrome monitoring clinic for mental health patients taking atypical antipsychotics and was responsible for managing their hypertension, hyperlipidemia, and diabetes medications. She also completed a teaching certificate program through her academia rotation at Palm Beach Atlantic University Gregory School of Pharmacy.

Dr. DeJongh currently resides in Grafton, Wisconsin with her husband and is employed as an Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice at Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy in Mequon. She coordinates and teaches in the pharmacotherapy course series with instructional expertise in psychiatry and cardiology. She recently passed a specialty exam to become a Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist. Her scholarship focuses on atypical antipsychotic induced metabolic syndrome, plasma renin activity guided blood pressure management, and prescription drug abuse in minority patient populations. She also practices as a clinical pharmacy specialist at the Clement J. Zablocki Veterans Affairs Medical Center where she recently started another metabolic syndrome monitoring clinic for mental health patients. Dr. DeJongh continues to serve the profession of pharmacy and her community by being an active committee member for the College of Psychiatric and Neurologic Pharmacists and volunteering weekly at the Ozaukee County Humane Society.

Some of the scenes might not be suitable for very young children. "There's nothing you wouldn't see on network TV," Roller Drama director Nick Lowery comments. "it's actually tamer than most contemporary TV shows aimed at teens. Next year, we're looking at doing something the little ones can enjoy as well."

WHS Drama began making movies last year. The process exposes students to new ideas for employing technology to make art and also offers a more flexible schedule than the fall one-act play competition. 



Eddie Blazonczyk passes

We have had two people bring in newspaper clippings concerning the death of Eddie Blazonczk, and while we have not received a formal obituary, we think that a great many people would like to know of Eddie's demise.

Blazonczyk was 70 years old. He was from Chicago, but in his teen years was sent to live with his aunt and uncle, Fritz and Louise Kurek, in Hiles. Eddie was a Chicago kid thrown into the culture of the Northwoods, but he managed to fit in and make many friends.

To say he was musically gifted is a big understatement. He seemed to be able to master a musical instrument in a very short time. But he didn't just sit in his room and play the accordion, he got into the woodsy stuff too. As memory serves, he borrowed a rifle from Ralph Roberts and went deer hunting. The rifle was a trapdoor Springfield of Spanish American War vintage, and Ralph was amazed when he shot a nice buck with the antique qun.

After graduation, he went into the music field. He had a hit with a tune called the "Masked Man." He was now Eddy Bell, and he made it to American Bandstand. According to an article on Eddie in the Journal-Sentinel, he toured with Buddy Holly and Gene Vincent.

But the rock and roll circuit wasn't where Eddie shined. He knew how to play polkas, and was a big name around his native Chicago. He also played in Hlles, helping raise money for the construction of the Catholic Church. He had a large fan base in Pulaski, where he played a number of times at Pulaski Polka Days and at Milwaukee's Polish Fest.

He won a Grammy in 1987 for his album Another Polka Celebration, and he produced more than 60 Eddie was also named a National Heritage Fellow by the National Endowment for the Arts in 1998.

After he stopped performing in 2002, his son, Eddie Blazonczyk, Jr. stepped into lead his father's band, the Versatones. Eddie Jr., who I heard play on Prairie Home Companion a few years back, broke up the Versatones on New Year's Eve of 2011.

Eddie Blazonczyk died in Palos Heights. Illinois on May 21st at age 70 from multiple organ failure.





Forest County unemployment rate continues decline

New unemployment data just released by the of Wisconsin's Department of Workforce Development (DWD) reveal that Forest County's unemployment rate continues to decline. According to the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) Forest County unemployment was down 13.6 from a year ago; April 2011's rate was 11%. April 2012 is 9.5%. Declines occurred in many Wisconsin counties; unemployment in Forest County is declining faster than neighboring counties such as Vilas, Florence and Oneida but not as quickly as others such as Oconto and Marinette. Major ship and boat building initiatives in those two counties have helped drive unemployment rates downward.

"While it is good to see the positive trend in unemployment, current statistics reveal that there are still 428 people in Forest County seeking employment and we want to match them with a job," stated Forest County Economic Development Partnership's (FCEDP) Executive Director Jim Schuessler. We have several new business launches and existing business expansions in the pipeline with Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC). Those initiatives alone can be our opportunity to achieve the strides being achieved south and east of Forest County.'

"With WEDC's support we have the opportunity to drive county unemployment to historic lows and really get this local economy in high gear," indicated FCEDP's board president Jason Neilitz.

clothes. You had to walk the entire length of each line wiping with a damp cloth.

- 4. You had to hang the clothes in order. The whites went with the whites and you had to hang them first.
- You never hung a shirt by the shoulders. It was hung by the tail.
- $Wash\,day\,was\,on\,Monday!\,\,You\,never\,hung\,clothes\,on\,the\,weekend\,or\,on\,Sunday,\,for\,Heaven's\,sake!$
- Sheets and towels were hung on the outside lines so you could hide your unmentionables on the middle lines. There were perverts and busybodies, you know!
- 8. It didn't matter if it was sub-zero weather, clothes would freeze dry.
- 9. Always gather the clothes pins when taking down dry clothes. Pins left on the lines were "tacky."
- 10. If you were efficient, you would line the clothes up so that each item did not need two clothes pins, but shared one of the clothes pins with the next item of clothing.

 11. Clothes must be taken off the line and folded in clothes baskets before dinner time and were ready to be irone.

12. Ironed? Well that's a whole different subject!

A clothesline was news forecast to neighbors passing by It was also a friendly link, for neighbors always knew If company had stopped on by.
