Town of Lincoln special meeting of electors

The proposed town hall for the Town of Lincoln building committee is one step closer to completing the project after the special meeting of the electors this past Saturday, June 9.

The meeting was held at the Crandon High School Auditorium. The building committee had a drawing of a similar plan that they would build set up by the entrance for everyone to see. The meeting started at 8:30 a.m. The town's people were given time to get a closer look at the design. The design would be similar to what would be built, but because of legalities, it can not be exactly the same. The drawing also showed what the town currently had for a town hall and garage.

The committee then gave a presentation. The presentation was broken down into three parts. Larry Sommer gave a presentation on the new design. Larry explained that the new building is only 1400 square feet, or 22 percent, bigger than the current building. This plan would fit easily on the current site, Highway W or on the Bear Road site. Larry also stated that the open area on the drawing would be where the town conducts everyday business, there is a meeting room that holds up to 25 people, the community center holds up to 100 which will be used for bigger town meetings, elections and other gatherings. The garage would be an up to date garage with three stalls. The garage would also have a second story loft for storage. The heating would be broken into three parts, the open area, meeting room and records are would be heated together. The community center would be heated by itself and the garage would be heated separately. This setup would allow a section that is not in use to be heated at a lower temperature than the areas that are in use saving the town money.

Wayne Daul discussed the benefits of building the garage and building all at the same time. He explained that to build the town hall and then later build a garage, that the redundancy would be lost. This means that the cost of the project would increase. Wayne also stated that this is the best time to build. Professionals in the building business have told the board that prices are the lowest right now. This would help the project come in under budget.

Town of Lincoln Village powers meeting

The Town of Lincoln had another special meeting of the electors on June 12 at 6 p.m. at the Lincoln Town Hall. This meeting was a result of a motion made at the annual town meeting this past April. The agenda was to discuss the recinding of the village powers. Village powers allows for the board to act upon a matter that would affect public health, safety and welfare.

The citizens at the meeting decided that they were wrong in asking for the motion to recind the village powers and simply adjourned. This means that the Town of Lincoln will keep their village powers.

School Accountability Report Cards Are Coming

(Wisconsin Association of School Boards)

Wisconsin is moving through the process of getting a No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) waiver from the U.S. Department of Education, with final approval expected sometime later this summer. Many may not be aware, however, that as part of its waiver application, Wisconsin has pledged to implement a new statewide accountability system that will include report cards to be issued for the first time this fall grading each public school.

For reading and math, these report cards will be calculated using the new WKCE proficiency cut scores, based on proficiency levels linked to the state-by-state National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), the only nationally administered continuing representative assessment of what U.S. students know and can do in these subjects.

These new cut scores will reflect significantly higher proficiency benchmarks than were applied in the past and will result in changes to the percentages of students in each performance category. Test results will likely show a significant, one-time decline in the number of students considered to be "proficient" or "advanced" on the WKCE.

Counties Rally For Rail Service

Across northern Wisconsin, freight rail service has been in a steady decline over the past decade. In 2001, the Canadian National Railway (CN) took over much of the track in northern Wisconsin and the upper peninsula of Michigan when it purchased the Wisconsin Central Limited. Today, many feel CN is not providing the local freight service needed to develop business in their communities.

When CN acquired Wisconsin Central it made commitments to provide local freight service at Wisconsin Central levels; however, since then local rail service has deteriorated significantly. The number of trains available to many area industries per week has been reduced, and whole segments of track from Cameron to Prentice and from Rhinelander to Goodman have been taken out of service. Communities like Crandon and Ladysmith have been left with no rail service at all.

Recently a representative of CN notified a Forest County Governmental official of their intention to pull the tracks if there was no intention to mine in the county. "Forest County already has a good base of businesses that are candidates for a company that is willing to provide acceptable rail service" stated Forest County Economic Development Partnership executive director Jim Schuessler. "Existing industry coupled with planned expansions and new business launches provide a great opportunity for a rail line that will provide an satisfactory level of service. It is unacceptable for a railroad to try to force one potential revenue stream while ignoring the many other potential opportunities for rail business. If the United States Forest Service ever gets back to harvesting at the level within their timber plan there are not enough trucks within hundreds of miles to handle the back-log."

Turkey & bobcat applications now available

Applications for the 2012 fall and 2013 spring Wisconsin turkey hunting season are now available and can be purchased at any of the 1,350 locations that sell Department of Natural Resources licenses or over the Internet through the DNR Online License Center.

The fall turkey application deadline is August 1, and the 2013 spring turkey application deadline is December 10.

Beginning this year, there will no longer be a paper applications process. Turkey application information will be collected at the sales locations or online. The new electronic application process will make it is easier for hunters to view and/or change application choices if necessary. Changes can be completed through the on-line License Center, or through the DNR Call Center at 1-888-936-7463. Changes can be made right up to the deadline, with the last submission superseding all previous applications.

People who purchase a Conservation Patron license prior to July 4 will receive special instructions on how to submit their turkey applications in if they did not provide this information at the time of purchase. As in the past, Conservation Patron holders can go online at any time from now until the deadline and submit their applications for free.

Up to four people can apply as a group application. Each person in the group will need to submit the exact same choices and provide the same group leader Customer ID number. Hunters should be aware that during the drawing, the entire group will receive the preference associated to the customer in their group with the least preference points. This means that if one of the group members has zero preference points, the entire group will go into the pool of applicants at the level of zero points. Landowner preference cannot be applied to group applications.

Customers who wish to claim landowner preference will be able to do so when they apply for their turkey application. To qualify, the landowner must own at least 50 contiguous acres of land and apply for the zone where the land is located. Customers who claim landowner preference when purchasing their application at an agent location will be required to provide the last four digits of their social security number as a form of electronic signature verifying that they understand and comply with the landowner preference requirements.

The bobcat application is also now available for purchase. The bobcat drawing application fee is \$6. The deadline for the bobcat application is August 1. This application can also be purchase via the Online License Center or at any DNR agent location.

Citizen Lake Monitoring Network Workshop

A free CLMN workshop, hosted by Oneida County Land and Water Department and the University of Wisconsin Extension, and sponsored by the Wisconsin Lakes Partnership, is being planned for June 13th at Kemp Natural Resource Station inside the Boathouse classroom in Woodruff. The workshop will run from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and will provide participants an opportunity to become involved in lake monitoring. Refreshments will be provided.

The workshop will have speakers from multiple resource agencies. Participants will be taught how to identify aquatic invasive species, learn techniques on how to measure and document water quality, and be able to get their hands wet with an on the water training and shoreline monitoring segment. Participants will be able to witness Eurasian Water Milfoil, Curly Leaf Pondweed, Purple Loosestrife and Yellow Iris. A CLMN kit (contains all the tools needed to perform lake monitoring) will be provided at no cost (only one kit per lake group please).

Please bring appropriate clothing to wade/walk the shoreline and for the on the water training segment (life jackets will be provided).

Sunlight For Good Health?

The sun helps us make vitamin D, the sunshine vitamin, which is essential for healthy teeth and bones, heart health and better immunity. Recent studies show vitamin D may help reduce risk for certain cancers.

Very little sun exposure is needed to stimulate production of vitamin D: 10-15 minutes twice a week to the face, arms, legs or back without sun screen is usually enough. Infants and sun-sensitive folks, however, need to stay out of direct sunlight.

After your sun time is up, apply a sun screen with an SPF of 15 or more to prevent sun damage. Accumulation of sun exposure over years can accelerate visible skin aging and lead to skin cancer.

The best source of vitamin D is food: milk, soy milk, orange juice, and some ready-to-eat cereals. Vitamin D supplements are an option to discuss with your provider.

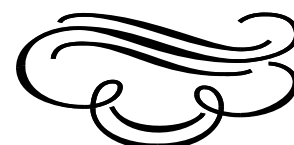

Public meetings on wolf harvest

DNR press release

The public will have the opportunity at four upcoming meetings to provide input on the draft concepts to be included in a wolf hunting and trapping season rule that will be going to the state Natural Resources Board on July 17 in Stevens Point as an emergency rule.

The Wisconsin Legislature passed a bill calling for a wolf hunting and trapping season that the governor signed on April 2. The Department of Natural Resources has been directed to implement a wolf hunting and trapping season this fall. To do so, an emergency rule and harvest quotas and permit levels must be adopted by the Natural Resources Board.

The Natural Resources Board approved the rule scope statement [pdf] on May 23.

The public meetings will include a review of the history of wolf recovery and management in Wisconsin and will focus on major rule components such as harvest management zones, as well as potential wolf harvest

quotas and hunting and trapping permit levels. Public comments and questions are welcome.

These meetings will start with an open house for visiting with DNR staff at 6 p.m. Staff presentations will begin at 7 p.m. with time for questions and comments to follow. The meetings are being held at:

In response, a number of northern counties have joined together to form the Northwoods Rail Transit Commission. To date, the Commission is made up of Forest, Florence, Lincoln, Marinette, Oneida, Price, Rusk and Vilas counties. Forest County Supervisors Jimmy Landreu, Jr. and Mike Albrecht are members of the Commission. More northern Wisconsin counties are interested in signing on. "We have received interest from Ashland and Langlade counties, and we also anticipate adding counties from the U.P. of Michigan," stated Darryl Landeau, planner for the North Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission who provides administrative support for the newly formed rail group.

The Northwoods Rail Transit Commission has been organized to negotiate on behalf of its counties, cooperate with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and take other actions designed to improve local rail service for the communities of northern Wisconsin.

Wendy Gehlhoff, recently elected to chair the Commission, believes the group must keep pressure on CN at the state and federal level to live up to the promises they made when the lines were purchased. "We will work with area businesses and CN to build and maintain rail service. Our goal is to obtain market data to share with CN to encourage improved rail service either by them or, if necessary, through a short-line company interested in operating the tracks."

Landeau noted that freight rail service is crucial to some area businesses and could also be key in attracting new businesses to the area. "By working together we can ensure that the Northwoods will continue to have the rail service that is critical for industry and jobs."

Mike Wilson gave the third part of the presentation. His presentation was on the sites, County Highway W and Bear Road. The County Highway W site needs some work. The site needs to be perked. The existing well and septic might be too close to each other. If that is the case, new septic and well need to be put in. The committee has been told that the site will probably perk.

The Bear Road site would need timber removed, gas and electric put in, septic, well and the site needs to be perked. The cost for the preparation for the bear site is more, but there is more land on the site.

Before the vote, concerns were made by the citizens. The first concern was what will be done with the site that will not be used. The committee said that they would investigate all routes but were not able to give a definite answer on the subject. Another concern was where the town will conduct business if the site on Highway W was selected. The plot is big enough for the building to be built and the existing building would remain in use until the project is complete. The third concern is what would happen to the fund that is in the bank, how is it invested and what is the interest on the fund. The answer was that when the building project is approved by the electors, the project would not be allowed to surpass \$660,000 dollars. There is around \$678,000 in the fund. The taxes would not be raised and the fund would closed. Currently, the money is in a cd and it collects about \$550.00 in interest a month.

The vote had three parts. The first part would be to vote on the garage and town hall not to exceed \$660,000. If that did not pass, the citizens could vote on just a town hall not to exceed \$478,000 and the final vote would be the site. If the first vote of the town hall and garage passed, the second vote would not take place. The result of the vote was 89 yes to 71 no and the site was 126 to 25 for County Highway W over Bear Road.

TO THE EDITOR:

In response to Dave Meier's letter published June 11, I offer the perspective of one who served on the building committee of the Town of Nashville for the design and construction of its new community center.

The fact that Lincoln's proposed building costs have been budgeted and funds set aside over the past several years has been a de facto approval of the project because the town's budget has to be disclosed and approved every year. To raise go-no-go questions now seems a little bit sleepy.

Your town's governance has shown fiscal discipline and leadership. Nashville's capital structure for its new community center included two government grants and a long-term, low-interest loan. Lincoln needs only to write a check.

It doesn't take a time-based and cost-based analysis or a town consensus to figure out needs for public services. Think emergency shelter, elections, vaccinations, senior activities, civic group meetings, fire department training, housing for town offices and records, housing for all emergency and highway maintenance vehicles and a vehicle maintenance shop.

You might want to add things like a lending library, a computer for public use, and memorabilia displays. It is also a great opportunity to bring structures and systems up to code.

The "very wise man" who proposed that the entire process be suspended for one year needs to consider the risk of project cost escalation as the economy improves.

Give your town governance credit for saving before they spend, for having spending choices, and for holding a vision of public service. What you should be talking about is how to allocate the money in the future that was previously budgeted for the building fund.

A Town Meeting was held last Saturday, at which 160 voters turned out. They authorized the expenditure for a new town hall of \$600,000.00, together with a possible additional expenditure of \$60,000.00 to meet unforeseen contingencies. The vote was 89 (56%) in favor and 71 (44%) opposed.

The \$600,000.00 approved by the town's voters is more than a million dollars less than the projected cost of the plan approved by unanimous vote of the Building Committee, some months ago. In addition, it was settled that new structure would be built on the site of the existing Town Hall. Thus the Town might recapture some of the investment that it has made in the alternative site on Bear Rd.

Intern to Work with Wisconsin Wins Program

Zachary Meyer, a student at UW-Madison, is joining the Wisconsin Wins project and visiting tobacco license holders to find out which businesses are complying with the law and which ones may need to provide their employees with more training regarding tobacco sales. Zachary will be working in six counties: Oneida, Forest, Lincoln, Florence, Vilas, and Price.

WI Wins was launched in the spring of 2002 as part of a comprehensive approach to preventing youth access to tobacco. With the help of local retailers, illegal sale rates in Oneida County have dropped from 38% in 2001 to 5.1% in 2011. According to Meyer, "Wisconsin Wins is an excellent program. I am excited to work with the area's youth in a way that will benefit them now and in the future."

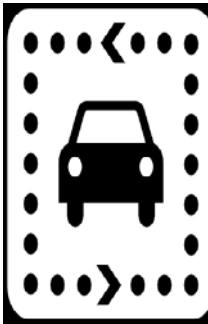
The CDC estimates that adult male smokers lose an average of 13.2 years of life and female smokers lose 14.5 years of life as direct result of smoking. Yet, every day in the United States 3,600 young people between the ages of 12 and 17 years initiate cigarette smoking. When clerks make a difference to decrease youth access to tobacco products, Wisconsin wins.

Meyer will begin his senior year at UW-Madison in the fall where he is majoring in Kinesiology-Exercise and Movement Science. He plans on attending physician assistant school after graduation, as well as being involved in a rural public health department.

Prometheus Grant Money in Action

Congratulations to the winners of the Prometheus Grant for the 2011-2012 school year. The goal of the Prometheus Grant, provided by Jason and Erica Neillitz, is to provide an incentive for excellence promoted through rewarding innovative and creative thinking in the classroom. Among the recipients were: Tressa Votis, High School Social Studies, Tracy Cassidy, Middle School Science and Tanya Schallock, 2nd Grade. Each recipient was awarded \$500 to fund a project based educational opportunity for students in the classroom.

Using Prometheus funds, students in Mrs. Votis's Social Problems classes participated in the Wisconsin Stock Market Simulation (SMS) 10-week state competition for the fall 2011 semester. Overall, a total of 1,176 teams participated in the simulation. The simulation helps students understand how the financial markets work without using real money. Each team was given \$100,000 hypothetical dollars to invest in stocks, bonds and mutual funds. In addition, students also managed an individual portfolio. Congratulations to Jassie Retzlaff who made almost \$50,000 in profit for which he was awarded a \$50 gas card. The top performing team consisted of: Catelyn Miller, Willie Sekel, Jasee Flannery and Taylor Schallock (captain). At certain points of the game, this team was placed as high as 5th in the state, however investing in risky foreign companies only netted them a total profit slightly higher than \$4,000 for the 10-week period.

Mrs. Cassidy's seventh grade science students worked toward personal goals in the areas of physical fitness, coordination, and nutrition. Goals included improving personal time in running a mile, improving balance, improving hand-eye coordination, and increasing ability to run longer distances. Students collected data to analyze whether their chosen procedures for achieving their goals were effective. Prometheus funds were used to purchase equipment that helped collect blood pressure data and exercising heart rate data. In addition, students collected resting heart rate data and recorded upper body strength in terms of the number of push ups they could complete. It is hoped that through their study of the human body's systems, these students will continue on a path of improved physical health.

Students in Mrs. Schallock's second grade class participated in science experiments that led to a better understanding of the earth's weather and water cycle. They worked in small groups to make clouds, rain, and tornadoes. They performed experiments to demonstrate evaporation, condensation, and precipitation. The students made a water cycle model and used it to explain this process. In addition, they collected data about the weather and temperature, analyzed it and then drew conclusions. They also discovered how unstable air can cause thunderstorms.

Students within the district enjoyed the projects that were made possible through the Prometheus Grant. Hands on learning opportunities are very beneficial for students as they tend to be highly motivated and actively engaged in the learning process.

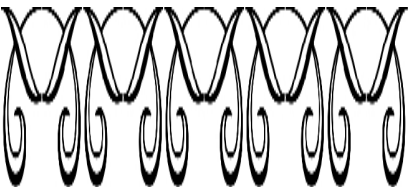

Boat inspectors to be at Lake Lucerne and Lake Metonga

Effort aims to prevent spread of aquatic invasive species

CRANDON Volunteers and citizens from the Lake Lucerne Advancement Association and Lake Metonga Association will be educating boaters and conducting free courtesy boat checks from June 29th to July 1st at Lake Lucerne and Lake Metonga to assure the boaters do not accidentally spread Eurasian water-milfoil, zebra mussels, and other aquatic invasive species.

The inspectors will be stationed at landing sites to help boaters understand Wisconsin's invasive species laws and what they must do before leaving the landing.

"Wisconsin is home to 15, 081 lakes and is a great place for fishing and boating. By following simple steps, we can preserve the quality of our lakes for future generations to enjoy," says (AIS coordinator John Preuss.)

Invasive species can crowd out native species, disrupt lake ecosystems, lower property values, and interfere with boating, fishing and other recreational opportunities. The main way that invasive species and fish diseases such as viral hemorrhagic septicemia (VHS) spread to new waters is aboard boating and fishing equipment and live fish or water moved from one waterbody to another.

The citizens, who have been trained through Wisconsin's Clean Boats, Clean Waters program, will demonstrate the required prevention steps boaters must take and will talk about Wisconsin invasive species and VHS laws.

Boaters, anglers, and others enjoying Wisconsin waters are required to:
INSPECT boats, trailers, and equipment.
REMOVE all attached aquatic plants and animals.
DRAIN all water from boats, vehicles, and equipment.
NEVER MOVE plants or live fish away from a waterbody. *
*Limited exceptions apply. Visit www.dnr.wi.gov and search for "bait laws."

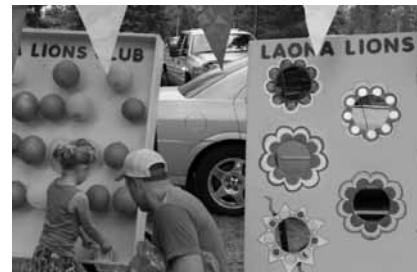
