Rob MacCachren holds off Adrian Cenni & wins Crandon's \$20K Chairman's Cup Challenge

CRANDON, Wis., (June 17, 2012) Much like a rock concert, the world's top short course off-road stars that jam the loudest on the Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, tour the 900-horsepower PRO 4x4 and PRO 2WD trucks - came out for an encore performance to cap off a day full of action for the 15,000olus fans in attendance at the Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway.

The 19th annual Forest County Potawatomi Chairman's Cup a 12.5-second handicap start race favoring the blistering fast PRO 2 trucks versus the cornerhugging and equally fast PRO 4 trucks featured a stacked field of THIRTEEN trucks on the famous Land Rush starting line at Crandon. Ten laps with no competition caution, it's an all-out blitz for a BIG bag of cash at the finish line!

In the end it would be Ram/Mopar's factory PRO 2 racer Rob MacCachren who would reign victorious surviving a furious charge from PRO 4 racer Adrian Cenni (RealTree Energy), who blew out a rear tire when he left the track with four laps remaining, having been right on MacCachren's tail down the 100 mph Skybox

"It feels great to win the Chairman's Cup." said MacCachren. "Everyone at Jenkins Brothers Racing worked so hard on this truck and it really came to fruition for that race. Our Mopar-powered Ram Truck was absolutely awesome. We were just hooked up today and running strong. I've won the Chairman's Cup now in both a PRO 2 and PRO 4, and that is pretty cool."

Added Cenni, who finished 2nd on just three tires: "I was pushing just as hard as I could."

The battle for the third and final podium spot was

a brotherly affair as Mike and Mark Jenkins of Traxxas fame went lug nut-to-lug nut over the finish line virtually tied depending on where you were sitting. But in the end it'd be Mike that would edge Mark to end a spectacular weekend of racing at Crandon.

"We're proud to be the longest-running Challenge Cup race 19 years and counting," said Jim Crawford, Jr., Vice Chairman of Forest County Potawatomi. "Congratulations to Crandon for another highly successful Brush Run!"

Pavement work & expansion for Crandon/Steve Conway Airport

Governor Scott Walker today announced a \$1,095,738 pavement reconstruction and expansion project at the Crandon/Steve Conway Municipal Airport in Forest County.

Matt Malicki, airport development engineer with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), said the project will include the reconstruction of the airport's primary runway and two taxiways, along with the reconstruction and expansion of its terminal ramp. A new hangar area, including a new hangar taxiway, will also be developed.

Construction is expected to begin in July and should be completed by September 2012. The airport will be closed during construction. Funding Breakdown

CRANDON, Wis., (June 17, 2012) The final day of competition the annual Forest County Brush Run at Crandon International CRANDON, Wis., (June 17, 2012) The final day of competition the annual Forest County Brush Run at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway, round six of the 2012 Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, ran pretty much from sun up to sun down providing a number of surprises and interesting twists to the TORC Series season. But above all it was, as it always is, a spectacular day of racing for the thousands of fans that flock to Crandon's first of two big summer off-road races.

Partially rained out on Saturday, to which the PRO 4x4 and PRO 2 contests will be made up on the Friday prior to Labor Day's World Championships at Crandon, fans attending Sunday's action saw a full day's worth of racing action from both the Midwest Off-Road Racing's Sportsman members, the TORC PRO class drivers and, new to Crandon, the Ultra 4 "King of the Hammers" vehicles.

With a bunch of pent-up aggression thanks to Saturday's rain/mud-oriented postponement of the TORC Series PRO 4 main at Crandon, fans knew Sunday's race would be a banger.

Charging out to the early lead was Red Bull/Ram/Mopar/KMC Wheels' Ricky Johnson, the defending TORC PRO 4 champ.

Johnson led Mike Jenkins (Traxxas/AMSOIL/BFG/Ford) and Crandon legend Johnny Greaves (Monster Energy/Maxxis/Toyota) into the first turn, with Adrian Cenni (RealTree Energy) and Mark Jenkins (Traxxas/AMSOIL/BFG/Ford) in hot pursuit. Curiously, though, Scott Douglas (AMSOIL/Borla Exhaust/BFG) would be nowhere to be found as he mis-time and came down the Land Rush shoot in dead last.

But that would change as Douglas had brought a hyper-fast motor to Crandon and the veteran started picking off drivers left and

With Johnson and Greaves soon separating themselves from the rest of the pack, the two first came together on the corner before the starting line with Greaves getting pushed up into the loam-covered concrete wall as Johnson would not relinquish his lead. About a half lap later Johnson would make a mistake and Greaves would jump all over him, taking the lead from Johnson who went high in the corner heading into the Land Rush start straight and barreling off towards the competition yellow. But a beautiful inside/out drifting power slide in front of the most crowded section of the 15K-plus audience by Johnson would send a warning blow across Greaves bow the other thanks the start to the control of the section of the 15K-plus audience by Johnson would send a warning blow across Greaves bow though the Wisconsin native wouldn't flinch just yet.

Moments later Greaves spun and, in trying to right himself back on course, collected Johnson and the two came to a complete

Johnson, who's truck was at this point at least cosmetically jacked up, would take full advantage of this and regained the lead. "I had two holeshots, spun out and was able to work my way back," said Kincaid, who grew up right here in Crandon Wis. "Our new truck ran great. Scott (Taylor) did a great job. I'm proud to be here and it's good to be back in the winner's circle."

On the start of Sunday's PRO 2 main Steve Barlow (RealTree Energy) and Andy Zipperer (Loctite/Warm Wenches) got together at the worst possible section of the track the top of Turn One at the pinnacle of the Land Rush start. Slamming through the fence Zipperer went airborne and landed in a gully. Barlow's crash, though not as spectacular, rendered his truck just as wrecked at Zipperer's. Fortunately both drivers would walk away, thank equally to TORC's stringent safety rules and the efforts of Crandon's veteran safety crew.

After nearly an hour wait while the Crandon track crew fixed the concrete barrier that was blown out, the green flag dropped

again with Taylor, Chad Hord (BOSS Snowplows/AMSOIL/Nissan) and Kincaid leading the pack. The second-tier of racers would include again with rayin, chart ford cyclos of work provided in the place and last year's TORC PRO 2 champion, Bryce Menzies (Red Bull/Ram/Mopar/KMC Wheels), moving up fast to 5th.

Sunday's second red flag in the PRO 2 race came when Nick Tyree got loose on the Argon Turn, got airborne over some concrete

Chasing CJ Greaves hard was Menzies who ended up breaking in the process and failed to finish Sunday's PRO 2 contest, similar to what happened to defending PRO Lights champ Andrew Caddell on Saturday.

In the closing laps a bit of smoke shot out the end of Miller's truck, though it didn't seem like he was down on power at all. Kincaid would dog Taylor relentlessly and, ultimately, set the Hall of Fame driver up with an inside/outside pass on the finish line turn and bolted to the victory. Taylor would hold on for 2nd and TORC PRO 2 points leader Hord was 3rd, extending his points lead.

De Jong absolutely dominated the contest, racking up leads of 17 seconds and 15 seconds at the competition yellow and finish. with the pass of the day, smacking front wheels with Schwalbe as they crossed the finish line.

"The chance was there, I took it, went wide and it hooked up ... worked," said Zipperer.

Added Schwalbe: "Last corner, picked the inside line and held tight, he (Zipperer) went wide. A lot of times that doesn't work, but

it worked for him. Andy ran a great race."



PRO Lights, Super Buggies & Ultra 4s highlight a rain-shortened TORC Series Crandon Saturday Fans treated to great racing - then the heavens open up - and TORC PRO 2/PRO 4 drivers agree to nostnone to Sunday

CRANDON, Wis., (June 16, 2012) After a morning/afternoon filled with great Midwest Off Road Racing Sportsman class and Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, Super Buggy and PRO Light racing, the annual Forest County Brush Run at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway was again besieged by rain, forcing the PRO 2 and PRO 4 drivers to vote to postpone their race, along with the 19th annual Forest County Potawatomi Chairman's Cup, to Sunday.

Much like 2011 the missed round (round five) for PRO 2s and PRO 4s will be made up the Friday before Crandon's big Labor Day race.

And though they did leave Crandon without getting to see the premier PRO 2 and PRO 4 trucks race, the resilient fans that flock to the world's premier short course off-road raceway, some 15,000 strong, did get to some thrilling TORC Series PRO Light and Super Buggy racing, along with a brand new class at TORC/Crandon the Ultra 4s, famous from the "King of the Hammers" event.

Brad Lovell (AMSOIL/Torchmate/Nissan/BFG) made it two in a row in the PRO Light class, taking the lead early and running 'er through the checkers in a good 'ol Midwest downpour to which the opening laps were run on excellent conditions thanks to the Ultra 4 class and their tall, spinning flotation tires spraying the mud if every direction imaginable.

"I gotta thank all my Ultra 4 buddies for coming out and blowing all the mud off this track, yelled Lovell from the podium!

Pulling the holeshot in the PRO Light opener at Crandon's Brush Run was Matt Cook (Supercross.com). CJ Greaves (Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis) would move into 2nd place with Lovell, who set the Crandon PRO Light lap record in qualifying on Friday, moving up to 3rd. On lap two Josh Hintz, who was also running near the front, spun as did Greaves. This allowed Lovell to move to the lead a position he wouldn't relinquish through the checkers.

"The conditions were terrible and it was tough to race," said CJ Greaves. "But

Brad did a good job for the win."

PRO Light points leader heading into round five at Crandon, Andrew Caddell (Ram/Mopar/Traxxas), left the track on lap four and suffered a flat right front. Caddell would remain out through the competition yellow then hustled into the pits to get a new tire. And while fans anticipated another classic back-to-front run from Caddell, it appeared as if there were other issues with his truck as he struggled to remain in the contest.

With two laps to go Lovell had put 3.5 seconds on CJ Greaves, then upped that to five seconds on the last lap. Local racer Keegan Kincaid (Traxxas/AMSOIL/BFG) would take advantage of his teammate Luke Johnson's spin and put himself in a position to podium (3rd) which he did in a virtual quagmire. CJ Greaves (2nd), Johnson (4th) and

After a 90-minute rain delay, high anticipation for the Ultra 4 class came to a crescendo when 15 high-riding, earth-churning 4x4 buggies came charging down Crandon's legendary front straight in "Land Rush" formation, mud flying everywhere and fans going wild in mass approval.

Vehicles literally Made for Mud were led by the #4446 ride of Gary Ferravanti (Paso Robles, Calif.) through Crandon's big, sweeping 'Talladega-style' left hander. In pursuit of Ferravanti were the No. 5252 of Bill Baird (Sturgis, Ky.) and the 4404 of Nick Nelson (Las Vegas).

With 37" tires (which are considerably smaller than the usual 40-42" tires used at the King of the Hammers event) the Ultra 4s quickly stripped the mud from the track and were racing at pretty good clips with leader Ferravanti's ride being the only one that wasn't completely caked with mud.

The track was muddy, but we had a good time," said Ferravanti. "You just had to

At the competition yellow Ferravanti would hold his lead and run it through to the checkers recording his first-ever Ultra 4 victory. Nelson would battle for 2nd place, leading 3rd place racer Erik Miller (Cumberland, Md.) to the finish.

"There was such a learning curve for us here at Crandon, and the rain and mud just made it that much more tough," said Nelson. "But the four-wheel drive helped and I was just giddy the whole time!"




