Crandon gets some BIG new jumps!



Things just got a bit more interesting for the upcoming short course World Championships at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway. Veteran track builder Cliff Flannery had the dozer out this week, putting the blade to the rich northern Wisconsin clay loam and crafting several new jumps into the legendary Crandon track all under the watchful eye of TORC's Menzies Race Team and defending PRO 2WD champ Bryce Menzies (Red Bull/Ram/Mopar/KMC Wheels).

"We're still tweaking the jumps a bit from the way I first envisioned them, but the Menzies Team has been here to give their input and I think we'll come away with some pretty neat features that the fans and drivers will enjoy," said Flannery.

The most noticeable feature will be the new Skybox Jump sending racers 100-150 feet through the air down the 80-90 mph straight-away right in front of Crandon's VIP seating section on the east side of the track. According to Flannery the drop-off tabletop-style jump was requested in the past by TORC PRO 4x4 drivers Johnny Greaves (Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis) and Ricky Johnson (Red Bull/Ram/Mopar/KMC Wheels) as a way to ratchet up the excitement even more on the fastest portion of Crandon's track.

"You're pretty much wide open there, flying all the way down to flat," said Menzies, the test driver for Crandon on the new Skybox Jump. "It's going to be pretty insane when you get three trucks side-by-side hitting it at speed. But it all adds to the show for the fans and will play a huge role racing." Menzies went on to say that drivers are going to have to finish their turns sooner on the top of the hill leading into the Skybox Jump. "You're normally still sliding (sideways) in the area where the new take-off is for the Skybox Jump. And if you do that now it could be disastrous."

Added Flannery on the Skybox Jump: This is going to prove to be interesting. Spectators will be counting the blocks (the eight-foot long blue concrete blocks that line that portion of the track) to see how far the trucks are flying."

Also new for Crandon's Labor Day Weekend is the redesign of the finish line jump below the Red Bull arch. The tabletop area of the jump has been extended back to the north some 100 feet, which means the trucks will be landing in the area where they used to take off from giving spectators on the hill and in the grandstands a better view of the airtime. Busy on the dozer, Flannery also put a new jump in the area by the timing stand, while also removing the pond in the center of the track and replacing it with a rock wall.

Brass takes Jake Mullins **Memorial Race**



It was an emotional night for Argonne's Todd Brass Saturday at Three Lakes TNT Speedway. Brass took home over \$950 in cash and prizes as the winner of the third annual Jake Mullins Memorial WISSOTA AMSOIL Dirt Track Series Street Stock special, but the significance of the victory meant so much more.

Brass was close friends with Mullins, also of Argonne, a well-liked racer at TNT Speedway who died in a passenger automobile accident in August 2010. "I almost starting crying,"Brass said of his emotions after taking the checkered flag in the 25-lap feature. "I wanted to win it for Jake and his family. If (Jake's brother) Jeff (Mullins) couldn't win it, I wanted to. Our families are so close, you know. I miss the little guy, as we all do."

The victory was even more poignant for Brass, who had his own brush with death earlier this year, surviving an passenger auto accident in Sugar Camp that led to an extended hospital stay.

Brass was the class of the field, in just his second start at TNT Speedway since the accident, leading the final 20 laps. He passed Jordan Kurtti of Bruce Crossing, Mich. on lap six and opened up a full straightaway lead on Tigerton's Gary Kasperek and Sugar Camp's Ben Pitlik by the time the race's second and final caution flag flew on lap 19. Brass felt the heat over the final six-lap dash, but slowly edged away from Kasperek and Pitlik, who finished second and third. "I knew Kasperek was there. I knew Pitlik was there. I just ran my own line,"Brass said.

After doing donuts on the front stretch, Brass got out of his car and climbed on top of it, to the delight of the packed house. But Brass was more reflective than jubilant after the race. He recalled how often he thought about Mullins while lying in the hospital bed earlier this year. "A lot actually, because that could have been me too," he said. "I was very fortunate, to be out here three months after crushing three vertebrae. You know, it's very emotional."

Watch for blue-green algae before jumping in the water

Public health officials are reminding families and pet owners to watch for blue-green algae in area lakes this summer. Blue - green algae are not new to our area, but with the warmer temperatures this year is being seen much earlier than usual. "It's great to have fun in Wisconsin waters, but swimming in or swallowing water with high levels of blue-green algae can make you sick," said Jill Krueger, Forest County Health Officer. "People and pets should avoid drinking or swimming in bodies of water with high levels of blue-green algae." "You should also avoid high speed boating through the waters because high speeds cause water spray which could be inhaled or cause eye irritation."

Blue-green algae may bloom in lakes, rivers and ponds, and some blue-green algae produce toxins. Exposure to these algae can cause illness in people and has caused death in animals. Individuals can protect themselves, their family, and their pets by avoiding contact with water containing visible amounts of bluegreen algae. Algal blooms can form a thick, foul-smelling scum on the water's surface that can look like paint or pea soup. Algal blooms range in color from green and fluorescent blue to brown. Most adults will avoid entering water with an algae bloom, but kids and pets can be hard to keep out of the water no matter how it looks or smells.

Many water-loving dogs will swim and drink from water regardless of smell or appearance. It is important to remember that dogs exposed to algae should be rinsed off following contact with waters experiencing a bloom. Dogs often lick their fur after swimming and rinsing pets helps decrease the chance of ingesting algal materials. Seek immediate veterinary care if your pet develops any signs of illness after swimming in a lake, river or pond.

If you come in contact with a blue-green algae bloom, you may experience eye, throat, nose or skin irritation and gastrointestinal problems, such as vomiting or diarrhea. Symptoms typically appear a few hours after exposure, but occasionally people feel ill several days after exposure. Contact a physician if you experience muscle cramps, respiratory difficulties, nausea or vomiting following swimming in a lake or river. "It's a good idea to wash with clean water after playing or swimming in any lake or river, and, as always, to wash hands before eating," Krueger said.

Headache Relief Naturally

Most headaches involve abnormal nerve activity within your brain. Common triggers are stress, alcohol, lack of sleep and a variety of foods and environmental factors.

Fortunately, we have several mind-body therapies and self-care techniques that can often help calm the affected nerves so you have less pain. Research suggests these methods may be helpful for migraine, tension-type and chronic headaches.

field and would not request a prepaid card payment.

If customers have been approached in this manner, WPS requests that customers inform the Customer Call Center at 1-800-450-7260. In addition, the customer should report the activity to the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection at 1-800-422-7128.

So far, it seems the fraud is being perpetrated in the Green Bay area and primarily trying to take advantage of the Hispanic community. That does not mean, however, that the parties trying to prey on unsuspecting customers will not branch out to other customers and other locations. 

Get Your Garden Ready For Winter

If you get your garden ready for winter properly, it will make a big difference next spring. Instead of playing catch-up and fixing winter's damage, you'll be ready to enjoy your garden when the first spring bulbs come up.

Leaf cleanup is one of the key jobs of late fall. Protect young trees with guards: Put plastic or wire mesh (hardware cloth) tree guards around the slender trunks of any new trees and shrubs to protect them from gnawers such as rabbits and mice, and make sure the tree guards go high enough, over the snow line.

Continue to water trees, especially evergreens, until the ground freezes. Evergreens need a good store of moisture going into winter because they don't lose their leaves, which means they continue to transpire (give off water vapor) through the cold months. More information on winter care for your trees and shrubs.

Use your yard's leaves: Consider shredding fall leaves and using them as winter mulch on flower beds. You can also add shredded leaves to the compost pile. In a season or so, they'll make the best treat your garden soil can have. You can use a chipper shredder, if you have one, or just run your lawn mower over the leaves. Read more about easier ways to clean up fall leaves.

Clean up fallen leaves from your lawn each week instead of leaving the job until all the leaves have fallen. In fall, lawn grass still needs sunlight as it is creating sugars to store in its root system for good growth next spring. Leaving the leaves on top of the lawn can smother the grass and weaken it. However, there is an easier way than raking to deal with leaves on your lawn: just chop them up with your mower, and leave them on the grass to break down. You will probably have to run over them a couple of times. Research at Michigan State University has found that turf grass benefits from chopped up leaves left on the lawn instead of being raked off.

Control lawn weeds: If you spray your lawn to control broadleaf weeds, the month of October is the most effective time for this job.

Apply lawn fertilizer. A lawn fertilizer application made in the late fall encourages increases winter hardiness and promotes quick greening in spring. For more information on this, see low maintenance lawn care.

Cut the lawn one final time: After you are finished, why not get your mower serviced and its blade sharpened now so it will be ready for spring?

Weeding: Do one last weeding and discard any weeds that have seeds on them in the garbage instead of the compost. You don't want those pesky seeds sprouting in your garden later.





96 percent of public water systems met health standards for drinking water.

MADISON -- Ninety-six percent of Wisconsin's public water systems served drinking water that met all health-based standards in 2011, a year also notable for a doubling in the amount of financial help provided to upgrade infrastructure and for small systems to address nitrate standards violations.

"Once again water utilities, water associations, laboratory staff, state staff and others did an exemplary job of providing water that meets safe drinking water standards," says Jill Jonas, who leads the Department of Natural Resources drinking water and groundwater program. "We're also happy to report that during these tough economic times we were able to provide more financial aid to communities to help them address contaminant problems and build capacity for the future."

Ninety-six percent, or 10,951 of 11,439 systems, served drinking water that met all health standards, the same proportion as last year and above the federal goal of 95 percent.

Also of note in 2011, 18 communities received a total of \$36.5 million in financial aid from DNR, most of which was low interest loans. Such loans can provide a cost savings of up 30 percent to communities, enabling them to address challenges more quickly and cheaply, she says. That compares to the \$18 million provided to 14 communities in 2010.

These and other details summarizing Wisconsin's public water systems' performance as a whole between Jan. 1, 2011 and Dec. 31, 2011 were submitted to EPA earlier this month in the "2011 Annual Drinking Water Report [PDF]."

Wisconsin has more public water systems than any other state except Michigan, ranging from utilities serving the state's largest communities, to churches, restaurants and taverns. About 4.9 million of Wisconsin's 5.6 million residents get their drinking water from community public water systems while the rest tap private wells, according to the report.

Of the 4 percent of Wisconsin public water systems reporting at least one violation of health-based standards, their elevated contaminant levels did not mean that people who drank the water got sick.

The second most common violation was elevated levels of nitrate, a pollutant largely resulting from fertilizer application to crops, and the third was elevated levels of arsenic, a naturally occurring contaminant. Forty water systems had water samples in which nitrate levels exceeded the standards in 2011 and 18 systems had arsenic violations.

As radium violations were addressed by dozens of communities, DNR staff were able to spend more time in 2011 working to address nitrate problems. DNR staff have been working with day cares, schools and factories - so-

called nontransient noncommunity systems -- to reduce nitrate levels in the wake of a new evaluation of the risk the contaminant poses, Boushon says.

Federal standards set the permissible level of nitrate in drinking water to 10 mg/l, but transient noncommunity public water supply systems -- those which serve at least 25 people at least 60 days of the year -- can operate with levels of up to 20 mg/l if the state agrees. Transient noncommunity systems do not serve the same people water every day - unlike community water systems that provide drinking water to homes for daily use -- so the exposure to contaminants would be

Concerned that federal nitrate standards were not protective enough of the general population, however, DNR asked the state Department of Health Services to review the scientific evidence. Nitrate levels that exceed the federal standard for drinking water have long been regarded as an acute risk for infants and pregnant women because the contaminant interferes with the oxygencarrying capacity of blood and can cause infants who drink water or formula with high nitrate levels to get seriously ill and die. Some scientific studies have found evidence suggesting that women who drink nitratecontaminated water during pregnancy are more likely to have babies with birth defects.

State health officials concluded in 2009 that long-term exposure of a year or more to nitrates in drinking water could have adverse health effects even in adults. So DNR has notified nontransient noncommunity water systems that they must reduce nitrate levels in water to below 10 mg/L. About half of the systems that had violations now comply with the standards through taking actions including drilling new wells or installing water treatment equipment. DNR staff are working with the remainder to correct the problem.



Results available from survey on turkey management plan revision

MADISON — Results from a recent survey on turkey management in Wisconsin show strong support of current practices, with 80 percent of respondents indicating they believe the current seven turkey management zones provide good hunting opportunity, and over three-quarters of respondents favoring the six separate time periods of the spring hunting season.

"While there's a lot of information yet to comb through, our initial summary provides unique insight into how hunters view various aspects of Wisconsin's turkey season framework," said Krista McGinley, assistant upland wildlife ecologist for the Department of Natural Resources.

The survey showed strong approval of the current permit drawing process for the spring season, but also suggested that it might be time to make some changes to the fall permit drawing process.

"Over half of the survey takers indicated that they'd support the elimination of the fall permit drawing in favor of over-the-counter permit sales," McGinley said. "We greatly appreciate the time folks took to participate in the public input process. Thanks to this input, we'll be able to develop a plan that continues to reflect the desires and concerns of our state's hunters."

Following their successful reintroduction to Wisconsin in the 1970s, wild turkeys have expanded their range so that they now occupy all counties in the state, and spring and fall turkey hunting have become very popular outdoor activities.

DNR biologists believe the current Wisconsin Wild Turkey Management Plan, written in 1996, is in need of revision in order to remain pertinent to contemporary issues related to turkey management in the state. A critical part of the revision process includes soliciting, gathering, and analyzing input from the public regarding challenges and opportunities in turkey management and hunting in Wisconsin.

During late April and early May of 2012, 11 public input sessions were held around the state, during which attendees were presented with background information and asked to complete a survey that addressed important issues related to the future direction of turkey management. The survey was also available online through the end of May. Information from this survey will help all of the partners involved in managing our state's turkey flock in developing a plan that protects the turkey resource, but also optimizes recreational opportunities for outdoor enthusiasts.

"There's no question that the DNR and the Wisconsin Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation have done a masterful job restoring wild turkeys back to Wisconsin," says Cory Catlin, president of the federation's Wisconsin chapter. "This was particularly evident a couple of years ago when our state led the nation in spring harvest. Now that we've seen those numbers level off a bit, it's time to move forward with management changes that improve habitat, hunting opportunities, and the overall health of our sport." 




