Rob MacCachren's historic run 200 off-road race win on Sunday

Crandon International Off-Road Raceway draws one of the largest crowds ever to witness a short course off-road race!

CRANDON, Wis. (Sept. 2, 2012) – Sunday! Sunday! Sunday! Crandon International Off-Road Raceway! What a great day of Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, racing in Wisconsin's northwoods, action-packed from start to finish in front of the season's biggest crowd – estimated at 40,000-plus on the weekend - at the world's premier short course off-road track, aka the "Big House!"

Forty-three years they've been racing short course off-road at Crandon. And in those 43 years nary a weekend has been just as thrilling as was the legions of Crandon faithful were privileged to witness today at Crandon, topped off by a historic run in the PRO 2WD class.

PRO 2WD Yee-hah! Rob MacCachren (Mopar/Ram/Traxxas/BFG) finally did it – recorded his historic 200th career win racing off-road. And what a better place to do that than the world's epicenter of short course off-road ... the Big House @ Crandon!

"It's been ten races since we last won ... and I was getting kind of worried there," said MacCachren. "But this is especially great to have done it here at Crandon. I first raced here in 1989 and fell in love with this place. Thank you, guys!"

MacCachren was on a mission from the beginning. Battling Chad Hord (BOSS Snowplows/AMSOIL/Nissan) for the holeshot, MacCachren took the early lead – only to get the dreaded Malachi Crunch from Hord and CJ Greaves (Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis), sending MacCachren shooting through the infield and kicking up a pile of dust the size of Kansas.

When the dust settled CJ Greaves had muscled into the lead, albeit a short-lived one as Hord came busting back in the No. 9 truck – bringing the Crandon faithful to their feet as he roared down the famous Land Rush start straight and first turn into the lead. Hord would hold that lead through the competition yellow, followed by Greaves. MacCachren would put up the top lap in pursuit of those two, earning him the Oakley Bomb Award, and putting the No. 21 Ram into 3rd place when TORC's Ram Runner pace truck hit the track.

On the restart defending TORC PRO 2 series champ Bryce Menzies (Red Bull/Mopar/Ram/KMC Wheels), who'd run up from the rear of the pack after an early race mishap, moved up to the lead pack past Steve Barlow (Real Tree Energy). The 4th fastest guy early in the race, local Wisconsinite Jeff Kincaid (Traxxas/AMSOIL/BFG), broke his front end and had to retire.

With just a few laps remaining MacCachren got past CJ Greaves on the Oakley Timepiece Turn and set his

"Blood donors give a life-saving gift that benefits hospital patients on a daily basis," explained Jan Hadsell of the Community Blood Center. "Every day, hospital patients throughout Northern Wisconsin receive blood transfusions. These transfusions are available through the generosity of volunteer blood donors."

Advance donation appointments are highly recommended, and may be made by calling the Community Blood Center at (800)280-4102 ext 1, or visiting www.save3lives.org. Walk-in donors are welcome, but scheduling an appointment keeps the total time required for a donation to less than an hour.

Blood donors must be at least 17 years old (16 with parental permission), weigh at least 110 pounds, be in general good health, and bring a photo ID. Donors are encouraged to eat a regular meal and drink plenty of fluids prior to donating.

Crandon Police Dept. makes arrest for felony theft

The City of Crandon Police Department, through Chief Dan Packard, has arrested Rosemarie Rogers (d.o.b. 08/11/1958) for the theft of monies in excess of \$27,000.00. The thefts are alleged to have occurred against an elderly couple after Ms. Rogers had gained their trust to manage their finances.

Rosemarie Rogers has been charged with one count of Felony Theft for taking in excess of \$10,000.00 which is a class "G" felony which is punishable by a fine up to \$25,000.00 and imprisonment up to ten years. The Forest County District Attorney, Charles Simono, has indicated his intent to file additional charges against Ms. Rogers after all of the extensive investigative materials have been fully reviewed.

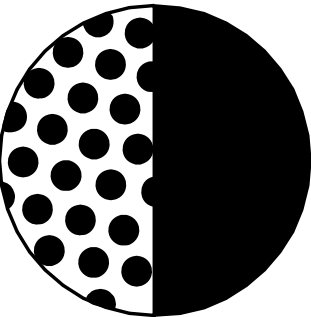

Cheri Wilson received a certificate of appreciation from Forest County Economic Development Partnership for the initial funding to start a revolving loan fund in Forest County.

Forest County in what was likely the first of several contributions to the Forest County Economic Development Partnership (FCEDP) Revolving Loan Fund; CoVantage Credit Union announced a \$25,000 investment to the fund to help establish a Revolving Loan Fund in Forest County. The fund will operate as a micro-loan fund designed to encourage the creation and retention of permanent jobs. The Fund will also encourage new private investment into Forest County in the form of fixed asset investment, perpetuate a positive and proactive business climate, maintain a diverse mix of employment opportunities and minimize seasonal employment effects.

"CoVantage is deeply committed to the future success of businesses and citizens in Forest County and we are proud to make this investment to support those efforts. Our ability to make this level of commitment can be attributed to a grant we obtained last fall when our credit union was designated as a Community Development Financial Institution," stated CoVantage Assistant Vice-President Cheri Wilson.

"We have seen the tremendous impact that local loan funds have made in neighboring counties and look forward to developing the local structure to work with local lenders and help opportunities advance," said FCEDP executive director Jim Schuessler.

Florence County has had tremendous success with their \$500,000 dollar fund; Oconto and Marinette Counties have several funds that have been involved in launching new business. The Brown County Micro Loan Program helped 14 businesses start or grow in its first year and is poised to do more.

FCEDP executive board member Bucky Dailey declared "The establishment of a fund is another step toward FCEDP's mission which is 'To foster an economic environment that promotes an increased tax base, an improved standard of living and quality of life for all the people of Forest County', and we look forward to investing this fund in ways to achieve that ideal."

What's So Great About Winter Squash?

Winter squash are excellent sources of vitamin A, beta-carotene, potassium, vitamin C and fiber. They also contain niacin, folate and iron. Winter squash are low in calories, fat free and cholesterol free.

Each type varies in texture, aroma and flavor. Winter squash can be prepared with sweet or savory flavors. It goes well with meats, fruits, and other vegetables.

Selecting and storing winter squash:

Winter squash is harvested when fully mature in September and October. It is widely available until late winter.

Look for:

- A hard, tough rind with the stem attached.
- Squash that is heavy for its size (meaning a thick wall and plenty of edible flesh).

Avoid:

• Squash with cuts, punctures, sunken spots, or moldy spots on the rind. These are signs of decay. A tender rind means that the squash is not ripe. Unripe squash lacks flavor.

Storage:

Winter squash can keep for up to three months if stored in a cool dry place. Squash stores best with part of the stem still attached to help retain its moisture.

- Once cut open, store squash wrapped in plastic in the refrigerator for 4 to 5 days.
- Cooked squash can be stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 4 to 5 days.
- Frozen cooked squash can be stored for up to a year.

sights on Hord, eventually passing the U.P. native in the same place he set up – and got past – Greaves.

There'd be no stopping MacCachren as he scorched up the northern Wisconsin dirt, putting time on both Hord (2nd) and Greaves (3rd) for the win in front of the massive Sunday crowd at the Big House. NASCAR racer Robby Gordon (Menard's) would put in a solid effort for 4th place and Menzies would hold on for 5th, battling hard late in the contest with privateer Keith Steele (NKS Carpet Care/Spazzie/Ringer).

Noteworthy: "This is, by far, the biggest crowd I've ever seen here," said Nissan's Ron Stukenberg. "I don't know where you'd put all those people that filled up the (Nissan) grandstands if you hadn't built them!"

Johnson had actually topped Greaves' best lap with a 1:22.10, and was gaining on Greaves when the 2010 champ's wheel let loose and flew off into the Wisconsin northwoods.

In 2nd place was Cenni, last year's big winner at Crandon. Cenni drove a near flawless race and ended up battling some mechanical gremlins of his own in rushing to the finish to hold off a hard-charging Scott Douglas (AMSOIL/Borla Exhaust/BFG). "It was a great, clean race," said Cenni. "Had a bit of a fire and a flat rear tire, but we'll put it back together for the Cup race later this afternoon." Rounding out the podium was Douglas, who's made all but one PRO 4 podium this year through 12 rounds of racing. Douglas and Johnson had a pretty good battle going, until Douglas said he (Johnson) "Hit the nitrous button" and was gone. "I couldn't even make a race out of it," said Douglas.

Noteworthy: NBC will broadcast TORC's weekend at Crandon at 1:30 p.m. (EST) on Dec. 29th in a two-hour special on short course off-road racing at the Big House!

Casey Currie (Monster Energy/Nissan/General Tire) made it a clean sweep of the TORC PRO Light races this weekend at Crandon, creating an interesting ripple in the tight points chase between Andrew Caddell (Ram/Mopar/Traxxas/BFG) and Brad Lovell (AMSOIL/Nissan/Torchmate/BFG). As it stands Lovell leaves Crandon with a three-point lead over Caddell with one weekend of racing remaining in Lancaster, Calif., Sept. 29 & 30.

Battling for the holeshot, Lovell and Caddell left a small crease of a line open for Currie – which he gladly filled and took off with the lead early in the contest, a lead he'd never relinquish. "I'll put on a show or lose!," shouted the energized Currie to the Crandon faithful, some 18,000 strong at Crandon on Sunday alone. "It's the crowd, I swear! If I'm gonna win I say win big at the Big House!"

In hot pursuit of Currie, Lovell and Caddell early on were Keegan Kincaid (Traxxas/AMSOIL/BFG) and TORC PRO Light rookie, Nick Baumgartner (Loctite/Warn), the pro snowboarder-turned-off-road racer from nearby Iron River, Mich. But no sooner could you say "north, south, east, west" Kincaid suffered a massive rollover and was out of the

contest.

Things tightened up in the front and at the competition yellow the field was able to catch back up to Currie. Things were pretty tame on the restart, up to the infield right hander by the scoring tower when Matt Cook (Supercross.com) put his ride on its lid. USAC/TORC safety crews in the big Ram Power Wagon series safety trucks were right on the spot to flip Cook back over and he continued on in the race, albeit limping quite a bit.

plague 2012 Traxxas TORC Series PRO Buggy champion the rest of the contest.

At the competition yellow Frana and DeJong jockeyed for 2nd place with DeJong, engine-a-misfiring, limping over the finish in 2nd at the halfway point. But that's as good as things would get for the champ.

Two laps into the second half of the race Hawley and Zipperer would get past Frana while Klaus extended his lead to three seconds over DeJong. On the last lap, with DeJong now in their rearview mirrors, Zipperer would bust past Hawley on the high speed Skybox Jump and into 2nd place. Then in a bit of poetic justice, Hawley got past Zipperer on the final turn - something Zipperer did to win a race earlier this year - and just nicked Zipperer at the checkers.

"This is only the second time I've raced here in the last five years," admitted Hawley. "We had a good 4th place finish here yesterday and finished up the weekend with a podium today. Lot of good friends here to it was a great weekend at Crandon for us."

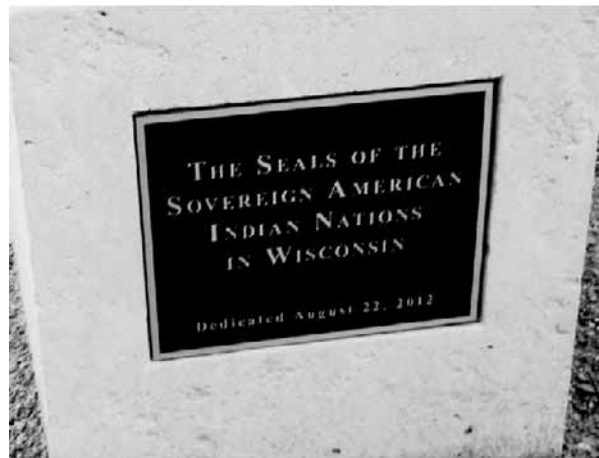
Adeline was born in Black River Falls, WI. She "hit the ground running" and has been busy ever since. She has always

Wisconsin Indian Tribes honored at UW-Madison campus

Delegates from Wisconsin's tribal nations gathered in celebration on August 22nd of the newly constructed \$47 million DEJOPE student resident hall on Lake Mendota, on the campus of the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

This magnificent structure is a state-of-the art dormitory, with the newest technology and superb amenities which came actually from the students themselves when asked during a past survey as to what would be an ideal place to live. This shall be the blue print for the future of student campus residence halls. This structure sits upon a site looking out across the magnificent Lake Mendota on a site long recognized as HO-CHUNK Nation ancestral lands

Dejope means four waters. "DE" means water (lake) and jope means "four" from the Ho Chunk language. The HO CHUNK Thundercloud singers offered a series of thrilling songs along with drumming to commemorate this historic event.


In addition, an outside permanent camp fire gathering area constructed of concrete and stone, in a circular fashion, overlooking Lake Mendota now has permanent plaques honoring and remembering each one of Wisconsin's Native American communities. This setting will be used as an educational site for students of history as well as all students in recognition of Wisconsin's original peoples who thrived on this very spot going back to at least 12,000 years.

This is the very first time in Wisconsin history whereby a University has set aside a special place in honor and recognition of Wisconsin's Indian Tribes. Approximately 100 people attended the special tour of the resident hall and were treated to an evening of foods representing Asian, Italian, Mexican and various styles of American, which will be made available to all students campus wide

Fall migration takes wing as experts keep an eye out for drought impacts

MADISON – The avian parade continues with hummingbirds, warblers and vireos the next species to begin their migration south, providing Wisconsin birders some great viewing opportunities and experts more insight into how the early spring and drought has affected Wisconsin's winged travelers.

"The next three weeks will be the peak of fall migration for land birds that migrate to central and south America," says Andy Paulios, a Department of Natural Resources biologist. "We're past peak for orioles, but birders should expect to see good numbers of hummingbirds, warblers, vireos, thrushes and other migrants in their local migration hotspots or even in their backyard if they have good natural cover."

Paulios says that birders should also watch the skies over the next few days as they could expect to see migrating common nighthawks and chimney swifts in the evening.

What exactly will turn up and when on the landscape and at birdfeeders, however, is uncharted territory given the warm, early spring, record heat and the drought experienced in much of the state, says Kim Grveles, an avian biologist with DNR's Endangered Resources Bureau.

"It's hard to know exactly what we'll see with migrations this fall," Grveles says. "Warm weather definitely brought the short-distance (overwinter in southern U.S.) migrants up north earlier than usual and some long-distance migrants as well. But they do not seem to be leaving for wintering grounds sooner."

Paulios suspects that migration through drought-stricken areas of Wisconsin will be more stressful this year. "My guess is that there will be less food for insect eaters in dry years as many insects have moisture-dependent abundances...but birds are very adaptable and may be able to move or adjust along their routes."

"Homeowners can always help by providing a water source and by providing native trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants that produce lots of bugs and fruit for birds to eat and shelter during migration," he says.

Gveles says that the hummingbirds she's seen in the Madison area are struggling to find food because the blossoms just aren't there because of the drought. "So the feeders become really important," she says. "There is less seed available because of things not flowering due to the drought for gold finches and even for migratory birds that depend on seeds, like towhees, finches and grosbeaks."

"Flyover land" a vital stopover in fall and birding mecca

Every spring and fall, tens of millions of migrating birds sweep through Wisconsin and other Great Lakes states and stop at a variety of sites on their way to breeding grounds as far north as Greenland and the Arctic Ocean and wintering grounds as far south as Argentina's Tierra del Fuego. These stopover sites provide birds with critical food and shelter en route, a function described in "Respite for Migratory Birds," in the August 2011 Wisconsin Natural Resources magazine.

They also provide bird watchers a unique opportunity.

"The beauty of migration is you don't have to go to the world's best birding place to see these beautiful birds," Paulios says. "On some days, these things will be in your backyard. So explore your local parks and natural areas."


Paulios says the general rule of thumb for finding fall migrants is to look for shrubby, woody edges with morning sun. These places tend to have the right mix of fruit and bugs, especially if they get morning sun. Native bushes and trees with fruit like black cherry trees, viburnum or dogwoods are a draw for many bird species.

Baltimore orioles have already peaked, and it's past peak for shorebirds as well but they are still around. Late September and early October, the sparrows and ducks will be stopping over, he says.

Paulios advises checking sites like Wisconsin ebird (exit DNR) to see what species are showing up where. Also, birders can check their local areas for sites listed on the Great Wisconsin Birding and Nature Trail (exit DNR).

Nationally and in Wisconsin, birdwatching is big and growing. Earlier this month, federal officials released national results of their recreation survey (exit DNR) and showed that 46.7 million Americans 16 and older watched birds in 2011; 33 million adults fished and 13.7 million hunted in 2011.


State statistics from the survey are to be released later, but the most recently available state statistics (which date to 2006) rank Wisconsin in the top three states in percentage of birdwatchers: 41 percent of adults 16 and older reported watching or photographing birds.
