WD Flooring to expand in Laona

Lt. Governor Kleefisch visits the plant

With some help from a \$750,000 loan through the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation(WEDC), WD Flooring, in Laona, is expanding its product line to engineered flooring. The expansion will add 58 new jobs and support the retention of over 100 jobs at the Laona industrial site, by adding to the lumber market for Nicolet Hardwoods.

Currently, WD Flooring is the largest hardwood flooring manufacturer in the Midwest. The investment by the company, coupled with the loan from WEDC, will widen the markets available to WD Flooring. The engineered flooring is a hardwood covering over a plywood backing that is more stable than pure hardwood flooring, offers more versatile installations, and is less costly.

The manufactured type of flooring does look and feel like hardwood flooring, and, indeed, the face of flooring will be made from locally logged hardwoods. In addition, and a nice touch, is that different styles of the Otter Creek line of flooring are named after some of the pioneer families that came to Laona when the mill was built back in 1898. At a glance, the display held a Stauber line, a Carter and a Sturzl line. There is also a line of European styles and a traditional line of flooring.

WD Flooring currently produces a million square feet of flooring per month. Production should double after the new facility is added to the Laona industrial complex. The new facility should be operational in about 90 days. Lieutenant Governor Rebecca Kleefisch was on hand in the flooring mill for the initial announcement of the WDEC loan. She toured the plant with WD CEO Peter Connor, asked a lot of pertinent questions, and talked to the employees of the mill. She said, "What an honor to be here and help you grow!" She talked of the importance of jobs, especially in northern Wisconsin and in the forest products industry. She also said, "We celebrate you guys and congratulate and thank you for keeping our economy going." Kleefisch said she was proud of our manufacturing and forestry heritage.

Of interest is that hardwood flooring has been produced in Laona for over 110 years. It was also mentioned that Kleefisch was the second Lieutenant Governor to visit the site. The first was W.D. Connor, namesake of the flooring mill and past CEO of the Connor industries. Floors made in Laona from our Great Lakes hardwoods that are of note include the Detroit Art Institute, Weisman Art Museum, the Latvian National Gallery, the Country Music Hall of Fame, the practice facility of the Beijing Olympics, the African Intercontinental Basketball Championship and a Laona-produced floor was installed in the New York Stock Exchange years back.

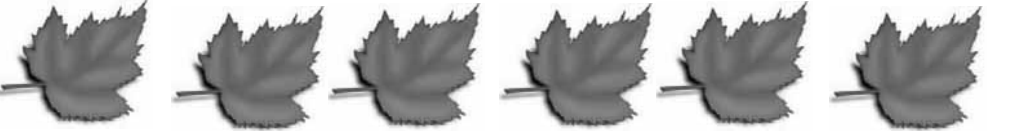
Political signs not legal on road right-of-way says DOT

With a host of national, state and local elections set for this fall, campaign signs are an increasingly common sight. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is reminding candidates, campaign workers and the general public that state law prohibits the placement of any type of sign – including political, commercial or garage sale signs – on highway right-of-way.

“This is not a political issue, this is a matter of public safety,” said Allan Johnson with WisDOT’s Bureau of Highway Maintenance. Improperly-placed signs:

- Distract motorists or obstruct their view, especially at intersections;
- Pose a safety risk to people who enter highway right-of-way to install a sign, and to road maintenance workers who will remove the sign;
- Damage or disable mowers and other equipment, and can potentially injure maintenance workers or others. Signs with wire supports degrade in the weather, leaving only the wire frame that is difficult to see.

State law prohibits the placement of signs within highway right-of-way, except for official traffic signs. This prohibition extends to all numbered state, federal and interstate highways, along with county highways, town roads, municipal streets, alleys, bike and pedestrian paths. In general, highway right-of-way in a rural area extends to beyond shoulders, ditches and any adjoining fence line. In urban areas, right-of-way



Signposts and street name marker posts are always within the right-of-way. Most utility poles are within highway right-of-way and can be used as a rough guide for sign placement. If a sign is placed between a utility pole and a roadway – it is likely in an illegal location. Signs are not allowed within street terrace areas, highway medians or roundabouts. With the landowner’s consent, political signs are permitted on private property without a billboard permit as long as the signs do not exceed 32 square feet and contain no flashing lights or moving parts.

Improperly-located signs are dealt with as part of regular highway maintenance. A sign that poses a traffic safety hazard will be promptly removed. Road maintenance crews are asked to make reasonable attempts to preserve larger, improperly-placed campaign signs and provide campaign offices an opportunity to retrieve them.

“If you see road maintenance workers removing improperly-located signs, remember, they’re simply enforcing state law and keeping roadways as safe as possible for everyone,” Johnson said.


State law (Section 86.19) provides for a fine from \$10 to \$500 for signs that violate the law. Local municipalities may have additional guidelines regulating the placement of signs along county highways or local roads and streets. Persons who illegally place signs may also be liable for any damages caused to equipment or people.

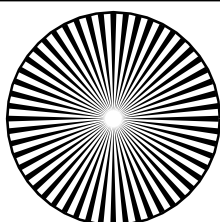

**Youth deer hunt to be held
 October 6-7 statewide**

Youth hunters must be mentored or accompanied by adult

MADISON – A statewide youth deer hunt will be held the weekend of October 6-7 in Wisconsin. The hunt is designed to give youth hunters ages 10-15 an opportunity to hunt deer and gain valuable hunting experience at a time when other hunters are not authorized to hunt deer with a firearm.

Since 2009, hunters ages 10 through 15 have been able to participate in the youth gun deer hunt, which is open to both resident and non-resident youth hunters.

The hunt is open in all deer management units, except state park units and areas where permits are not issued by the Department of Natural Resources. The bag limit is one buck with a gun buck deer carcass tag, plus an additional antlerless deer per antlerless deer carcass tag valid for the DMU or a junior antlerless deer tag, which is valid statewide. Archery deer hunters are required to wear blaze orange clothing whenever any gun deer hunt is open, including during the youth deer hunt.

Youth hunters do not have to have a hunter safety certificate, but are subject to certain restrictions depending on their age.

Youth ages 10 and 11 and youth ages 12 through 15 years who do not possess a hunter education certificate can participate if they are "mentored" by an adult who is within arm's reach at all times during the hunt. Only one firearm, bow or crossbow may be possessed jointly between the mentor and youth who is age 10 or 11, or who has not completed hunter education, if participating in the youth gun deer hunt.

Youth ages 12 through 15 who possess a hunter education certificate can participate if they are accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older. To "accompany" means the adult is within both visual and voice contact of the youth. Adults accompanying youth hunters may not "gun hunt" for deer during the youth hunt, but may possess a bow or gun and hunt for a game species that is open for them to hunt at that time. The adult does not have to be a licensed hunter or a hunter education graduate to accompany one or two youth hunters who are at least 12 years old and have completed a hunter education course.

An adult may not accompany more than two youth hunters during the youth gun deer hunt at any given time.

**DNR statement on decision
 not to dismiss wolf lawsuit**

MADISON -- Department of Natural Resources Spokesman Bill Cosh issued the following statement on Dane County Judge Peter C. Anderson's September 14 decision not to dismiss a lawsuit challenging the use of dogs in the Wisconsin wolf hunting season:

First and foremost it is important for the 1,160 successful wolf license applicants to know that Wisconsin's first modern day wolf season will continue.

The judge's injunction on the use of dogs still stands.

We will continue to work on that issue and try to find a resolution prior to the end of November when the use of dogs for hunting would have been allowed if the injunction had not been issued.

In light of Judge Anderson's decision to not rule in favor of the department's motion to dismiss, we will continue to discuss our options with our legal team and develop a strategy in the coming weeks.

The goal would be to ultimately resolve this issue prior to November 26; the day when the use of dogs for wolf hunting would begin.

Is A Reverse Mortgage for You?

A reverse mortgage is a way of generating monthly income from the equity and value of one's home, without having to sell the home or repay a loan each month. This type of loan is typically available to seniors 62 and older that own and live in their home. A reverse mortgage can pay out income in several ways:

- All at once, in a single lump sum of cash
- As a regular monthly cash advance
- As a "credit-line" account that lets the senior decide when and how much of his or her available cash is paid to him or her

- Or any combination of these payment methods

No matter how the loan is paid out, the loan typically does not have to be paid back until the owner dies, sells the home, or permanently moves out of the home. A move to an assisted living or nursing home will usually trigger repayment of the loan. Additionally, a lender can also require repayment if a borrower fails to pay property taxes, fails to repair the home, or fails to keep the home insured.

Rising Debt, Falling Equity

Reverse mortgages have a different purpose than forward mortgages do. With a forward mortgage, a borrower uses his or her income to repay debt, and this builds up equity in the home. But with a reverse mortgage, the borrower is taking the equity out in cash. So with a reverse mortgage the borrower's debt increases, and the borrower's home equity decreases.

Common Features:

Although there are different types of reverse mortgages, all of them are similar in certain ways. Here are the features that most of them have in common:

Home Ownership: with a reverse mortgage, the senior remains the owner of the home just like when the senior had a forward mortgage. The homeowner is still responsible for paying property taxes and homeowner insurance, and for making property repairs.

Financing Fees: A borrower can use the money from a reverse mortgage to pay the various fees that are charged on the loan. This is called "financing" the loan costs. The costs are added to the loan balance and the borrower pays them back plus interest when the loan is over.

Loan Amounts: The amount of money a senior can borrow depends most on the specific reverse mortgage plan that is selected. It also depends on the kind of cash advances a senior chooses. Some reverse mortgages cost a lot more than others, and this reduces the amount of cash one can get from them. Within each loan program, the cash amounts a borrower can get generally depend on the borrower's age and the home's value:

- The older you are, the more cash you can get
- The more your home is worth, the more cash you can get

Debt Payoff: Reverse mortgages generally must be "first" mortgages. So, if a senior owes any money on his or her property, he or she generally must do one of two things: pay off the old debt before he or she gets the reverse mortgage or pay off the old debt with the money he or she gets from a reverse mortgage.

Debt Limit: The debt a borrower owes on a reverse mortgage equals all the loan advances the borrower receives (including any used to finance loan costs or pay off prior debt), plus all the interest that is added to the loan balance. If that amount is less than a borrower's home is worth when the loan is repaid, then the borrower (or the borrower's estate) keeps whatever amount is left over.

But if the rising loan balance ever grows to equal the value of the borrower's home, then the total debt is limited by the value of the home. A borrower can never owe more than what the borrower's home is worth at the time the loan is repaid. This overall cap on the loan balance is called a non-recourse limit. It means that the lender, when seeking repayment of the loan, does not have legal recourse to anything other than home's value. The lender may not seek repayment from a borrower's income, other assets, or heirs. A home equity conversion mortgage (HECM) is the only reverse mortgage that is federally insured and over 90 percent of reverse mortgages are HECMs. The federal housing administration tells HECM lenders how much they can lend a Home Equity Conversion Mortgage borrower, based on his or her age and home value. Typically the older the borrower and the larger the value of his or her home, the larger the loan amount will be. The HECM program limits a borrower's loan costs and the FHA guarantees that lenders will meet their obligations. Furthermore, HECM loans generally provide the largest loan advances of any available reverse mortgage. The HECM reverse mortgage is also generally less expensive than other private sector reverse mortgages.

In general to be eligible for HECM reverse mortgage, the owner(s) of the home must be 62 or older and live in the home as a principal residence. Additionally, the home must be at least one year old and meet HUD's minimum property standards, but the HECM loan may be used to pay for repairs necessary to qualify. Also the borrower(s) must discuss the program with a counselor

from a HUD approved counseling agency and the home must be a single-family residence in a 1 to 4 unit-dwelling or part of a planned unit development (PUD) or HUD approved condominium. Some manufactured housing is eligible, but cooperatives and most mobile homes are not.

Precious to October, 2010, there was only one type of HECM reverse mortgage available. Now there is also the option of the HECM Saver reverse mortgage. The HECM Saver allows the individual to borrow less than with the HECM Standard but the tradeoff is that the costs associated with the Saver will be less than the Standard. The up-front insurance premium is substantially less than what's charged for a HECM Standard, .01% of the home's value vs. 2%. The HECM Saver may make more sense for borrowers who need a relatively small loan, or if they expect to remain in the home for only a short amount of time. For borrowers who want or need to borrow the most possible, the HECM Standard may be the better option.

Payday Loans: An Expensive Option

"FAST CASH NOW!" "BAD CREDIT, NO PROBLEM!" These enticing slogans are used to lure unsuspecting borrowers into very expensive loans. They are called many different things: payday loans, cash advance loans, check advance loans, post-dated check loans, or deferred deposit loans. Whatever they are called, these loans come at a very high cost.

Payday loans are small-dollar, short-term, unsecured loans that borrowers promise to repay out of their next paycheck or regular income payment. Typically, there is a fixed-dollar fee which represents the finance charge to the borrower. While Wisconsin law does provide some protections for consumers, because these loans are short-term, the annual percentage rate usually ranges from 100% to more than 500%. To illustrate: Say you needed to borrow \$100 for two weeks. You write a check for \$115, which includes a \$15 fee. The check is held for two weeks at which time the lender will either deposit the check or you must pay the full amount by cash or money order. Paying \$15 does not sound like a lot but the cost of this \$100 loan is an annual percentage rate of 391 percent! You could alternatively agree to extend the loan for another two weeks and pay an additional fee and even higher APR.

Payday loans are usually less than \$500 and in Wisconsin, total outstanding loans cannot be more than \$1,500 or 35% of the borrower's gross monthly income, whichever is less. This limit applies in the aggregate. This means that an individual may only borrow a total of \$1,500, which includes principle, interest and fees, from any and all licensed payday lenders in Wisconsin.

Consequences for Failure to Make Payment

If a lender deposits a check and it is returned or debits the borrower's account and there are not sufficient funds, the lender may charge a \$15 fee. The lender may only electronically debit the account or present the check for payment one time. If the borrower fails to make a payment, the lender must offer the borrower the opportunity to repay the outstanding balance of the loan in four (4) equal installments. If this repayment arrangement fails, the lender may attempt to collect on the loan through phone calls, letters or personal visits as long as those contacts are not harassing. They may report the delinquent to a credit reporting agency or assign it to a collection agency. The lender or the collection agency may file a small claims action in court to try to get a judgment against the borrower. The lender cannot take any other action to collect the debt unless they have a judgment. They may not garnish wages or threaten criminal action.

The bottom line: If you must use a payday loan, you should try to limit the amount and make sure you are using the funds only for absolutely necessary expenses. Try to find other sources to pay for outstanding bills. For example, if you need assistance with energy costs, seek out available energy assistance programs or contact your energy company to arrange a payment plan. If you have exhausted your options, borrow only as much as you can afford to pay with your next income payment, and still have enough to make it to the next. Doing this will prevent astronomical fees and the cycle of payday loans that trap so many borrowers.

Time was when a person could start a career in law enforcement with little more than a high school diploma. Those days are no more.

"Law enforcement officers today have to undergo extensive training to work in the field," Nicolet College Criminal Justice Instructor Phil Schmidt told the college's Board of Trustees. "Increasingly, Nicolet is providing this higher level of training right here in the Northwoods."

Schmidt gave the report to the board during the trustee's regular September monthly meeting.

Along with the two-year associate degree in Criminal Justice, which the college has offered for many years, the college now offers numerous other training opportunities and academic credentials, he explained. These include:

- The 520-hour Law Enforcement Academy, which is required by the Wisconsin Department of Justice in order for personnel to be certified to work in law enforcement.
- a one-year technical diploma in Corrections.
- a 160-hour Jail Academy.
- and more than 30 Continuing Education classes for those already working in the field.

"In the past, local agencies had to send people to other parts of the state to get this training," Schmidt said. "That meant they had to pay for travel, lodging and meals, which can get costly, especially for the more in-depth training which is held over a longer length of time. It's a definite cost savings for local agencies to get this training right in the Northwoods."

Nicolet Board Trustee Bob Egan, who formerly chaired the Vilas County Law Enforcement and Emergency Management Committee, said that having this training available locally has resulted in significant savings for Vilas County.

"I know for the Jail Academy alone, we were saving \$2,000 to \$3,000 per student. That can really add up over time," he said.

Nicolet has offered the Jail Academy since 2008 in partnership with the Vilas County Sheriff's Department, which hosts the training at the Vilas County Jail.

The benefits are also more than just monetary. The instructors in just about every Nicolet offering have worked in the Northwoods and know first-hand the unique challenges of the region.

"We need to train people for rural policing," he said. "That's a much different approach than what you will get if you went to, say, Milwaukee, for training."

Schmidt went on to explain to the board that along with teaching the technical skills students need to work in law enforcement, he also strives to instill a sense of community service in the curriculum.

"That's really what law enforcement is all about," said Schmidt, who served with the Oneida County Sheriff's Department for 22 years before joining Nicolet in 2009.

Over those years he's served on numerous hiring committees and he would frequently ask candidates why they wanted to be in law enforcement. A common answer was that they wanted to serve their community. "Then I would follow up and ask for examples of how they have served their communities in the past. More often than not I would get this blank look. They couldn't give any examples. That always made me question their level of commitment," he said.

If Nicolet Criminal Justice graduates are ever asked that question in an interview, they will have no problem giving multiple examples. Every year students in Schmidt's classes volunteer many hundreds of hours to numerous community events, most commonly helping with security and parking.

These events include the Tomahawk Fall Ride, Minocqua's Beef-A-Rama, the Living History Encounter in Eagle River, 4th of July parades, and area Halloween events.

"I'm very proud of the Criminal Justice program and a lot of that has to do with the quality of the graduates that come out of the program," he said.

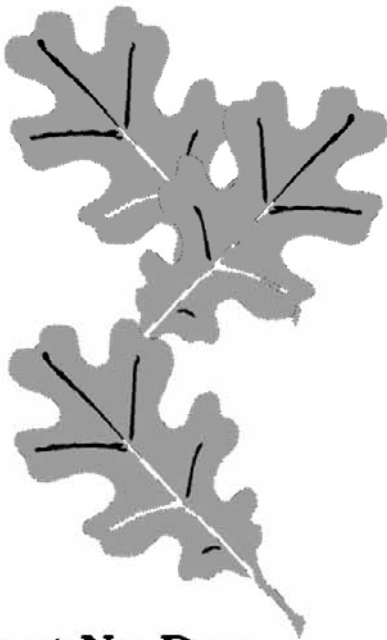
