This fun event is for everyone and is intended to bring the community and the school together.


### Candidate Spotlight

#### **Cortney M. Britten Candidate For Register Of Deeds**

The Democratic Party of Forest County announced that it has nominated Deputy Register of Deeds Cortney M.Britten for the office of Forest County Register of Deeds in the November 6, 2012 Election. Britten has worked in the Register of Deeds Office since April of 2010. She is a resident of Laona and the mother of one child. She is also a member of the Laona Women's Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary.

The untimely death of Forest County Register of Deeds Paul Aschenbrenner has created a rare situation for the November 6th election. With the primary election having already been held in September, the only candidate whose name would appear on the November 6 ballot would be that of Paul Aschenbrenner. However, a state statute addresses that situation and allows the party of the deceased candidate to nominate another candidate in his place. Aschenbrenner was on the ballot as a Democrat and thus the Democratic Party of Forest County has the option to nominate someone else. Shirley Mills, Vice Chair of the Forest County Democratic Party, announced that the party has filed the necessary paperwork to make Cortney M.Britten, the present Deputy Register of Deeds, the candidate for the position.

#### Wabeno Selected For Community Design and Landscape Project

**Capstone Project through UW-Madison Presents Opportunity** for Future


The University of Wisconsin-Madison's Department of Landscape Architecture has selected the Town of Wabeno for a 2012-13 Capstone project. The Department has a long history of community and regional service with a program that includes faculty supervised participatory design and planning projects. The project was first suggested by UW-Extension's Steve Nelson and the grant application was written by Forest County Economic Development Partnership (FCEDP).

"With a very small investment to cover out of pocket expenses, we have the opportunity to bring our community together on a design plan to take advantage of our newly-acquired lands and the many great things we already offer including excellent local businesses, museum, library and soon-to-be replaced band shell," proclaimed Wabeno Town Chairman Butch Piontek.

Wabeno has several great fishing and recreational venues within the town including a class "A" trout stream and lakes such as Range Line and Trump. Fireman's Park and recreational facilities are also a plus. The proximity to the Casino and the potential synergy is an advantage.

Capstone student Emily Groh met with town officials last weekend and it is likely that the steering committee will grow. "Either communities plan for their future or they are not likely to provide the services desired by citizens," stated Wabeno Supervisor Dennis Kopecky. "We are looking forward to helping pilot our future in a positive way," added Wabeno Town Supervisor Paul Ehlinger.

development and employment opportunities across the nation in manufacturing and health care.

Nicolet will use the money to purchase advanced manufacturing training equipment and hire an instructor to teach students how to use the equipment and an advisor to keep them on track academically and guide them through the job search process.

In July, Nicolet was awarded a \$750,000 state grant from the Wisconsin Covenant Foundation to build on the recently-created Industrial Maintenance Fundamentals Certificate and provide tuition assistance to students. The goal now is to develop a sequence of college credentials that ladder from the certificate to a oneyear technical diploma and ultimately a two-year manufacturing maintenance associate degree.

Classes for the certificate start Oct. 15. "The classes are almost full but there are a few seats left for anyone interested in starting the program," said Brigitte Parsons, dean of Trade and Industry at Nicolet. She noted that the next round of classes will begin at the start of Spring Semester, Wednesday, Jan. 23.

A recent wage survey by the Grow North Regional Economic Development Corporation found that manufacturing maintenance jobs in the Northwoods today pay an average of about \$35,000 a year.

In both grant applications, strong support from area manufacturers was instrumental in making a successful bid, Parsons explained. Private sector support for the federal grant application came from the Grow North **Economic Development Corporation.** 

"None of this would have been possible without the hard work and commitment from Grow North and its manufacturing members," she said, noting that many helped Nicolet develop the curriculum so that the skills taught in the labs and classrooms are an exact match to those needed in the workplace.

Recent state studies have found that "middleskill" occupations, or those positions that require more than a high school diploma but less than a four-year college degree, represent 50 percent of Wisconsin's workforce needs, with advanced manufacturing occupations among the fastest growing. Meanwhile, only 39 percent of Wisconsin residents between the ages of 25 and 64 meet these education criteria.

### Potential for deer crashes high again this fall

Each fall, body shops and automotive repair businesses are in great demand as the deer crash season peaks. October and November are the mating season for deer, which makes them more active especially at dusk and dawn when they move back and forth between their bedding and feeding areas. As they roam, deer often will dart unexpectedly into the path of vehicles, and drivers likely will confront the panicky "deer in the headlights" predicament.

To avoid a collision, drivers must be attentive and cautious at all times, Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) officials advise.

Last year, Wisconsin law enforcement agencies reported a total of 18,176 deer vs. motor vehicle crashes. Dane County had the most motor vehicle vs. deer crashes reported in 2011 with 846. Shawano County had the second most with 762 followed by Waukesha County with 714. In Shawano and Green Lake counties, more than half of all reported crashes in 2011 involved deer. Deer are the third most commonly struck object in Wisconsin traffic crashes (behind collisions with another vehicle or a fixed object).

"To avoid deer crashes, drivers must slow down when they see deer in the area. If you see one deer, there are probably more nearby that could dash in front of your vehicle," says State Patrol Maj. Sandra Huxtable, director of the Bureau of Transportation Safety. "If you can't avoid a deer, it's safer to hit the brakes and hit the deer than to swerve suddenly and try to miss it. If you swerve, you risk losing control of your vehicle and rolling over or hitting another car or a fixed object, like a tree."


Motorcyclists must be especially careful because collisions with deer can be fatal to motorcycle drivers and passengers. Motorcycles were involved in four of the five fatal deer versus motor vehicle crashes in 2011, according to Major Huxtable.

The WisDOT Bureau of Transportation Safety offers the following advice to prevent deer crashes:

• Be on the lookout for deer, eliminate distractions while driving, and slow down in early morning and evening hours—the most active time for deer.

· Always wear your safety belt—there are fewer and less severe injuries in vehicle-deer crashes when safety belts are worn. CONT ON PAGE 19



If you see a deer by the side of the road, slow down and blow your horn with one long blast to frighten the deer away.

- · When you see one deer, look for another one—deer seldom
- If you see a deer looming in your headlights, don't expect the deer to move away-headlights can confuse a deer and cause the animal to freeze.
- · Brake firmly when you notice a deer in or near your path.
- · Do not swerve-it can confuse the deer as to where to run-and cause you to lose control and hit a tree or another
- o The one exception to the "don't swerve" advice applies to motorcyclists. On a motorcycle, you should slow down, brake firmly and then swerve if necessary to avoid hitting the deer. If you must swerve, always try to stay within your lane to avoid hitting other objects.
- · If you hit a deer, get your vehicle off the road if possible, and then call a law enforcement agency. Walking on a highway is dangerous, so stay in your vehicle if you can.
- · Don't try to move the animal if it is still alive. The injured deer could hurt you.



#### Medicare Part D Open Enrollment

The annual Medicare part D open enrollment period for 2012 is October 15 through December 7. This is the time that Medicare beneficiaries who are enrolled in Part D prescription drug plans have the opportunity to review their plan to determine if it is still the best one for them. Because insurance companies can change their premiums, deductibles and co-pays, switching to a different plan often results in extra money in your pocket!

If you have had changes in your medications this past year it seems obvious that looking into a different plan is a good idea. But even if you have not had medication changes, sometimes the different pricing structure an insurance company imposes will mean that the costs for your same drugs will increase next year. Likewise, a different company may now offer better coverage for those same medications. Some people have saved hundreds of dollars in a year by switching to a different Part D plan.

Insurance companies can also change their formularies (the list of medications that they cover) or change the way they cover your medication. In some cases, you will need to get prior authorization before your medication is covered. Sometimes, insurance companies will make you try an alternative drug before they pay for the one you and your doctor have chosen. This is called step therapy. Another restriction to watch out for is quantity limits, where you are limited to a certain number of pills each month. These are other reasons it is important to carefully review your Part D plan each year.

People on Senior Care, Wisconsin's state drug plan, are not affected by this open enrollment period. They only need to renew their enrollment every 12 months. A renewal notice will be sent in the mail to the beneficiary. If you are on Senior Care and have had medication changes, you might want to check on the cost of a Part D plan to see if Senior Care is still the best option for you.

Another avenue to saving money on prescription drugs next year is the Extra Help program. Extra Help reduces your drug costs by decreasing premiums, deductibles and co-pays for medications based on your income and asset levels. If you are married and your income is less than \$1,891 per month with assets below \$26,120 or single with an income less than \$1,396 per month and assets below \$13,070 you may qualify for Extra Help. Remember that your home and car are not counted as assets. Call your Elder Benefits Specialist for more information.

Take the time to review your insurance options and also check to see if you might qualify for Extra Help. You just might end up with extra money in 2013!





#### WPS Proposes to Eliminate 2013 Electric Rate Increase and Reduce Gas Rates

Green Bay, WI - Wisconsin Public Service, a subsidiary of Integrys Energy Group (NYSE: TEG), today filed a request with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) to modify its filing for retail electric and natural gas rates for 2013. This request, if approved, will result in no electric rate increase and a small natural gas rate decrease for 2013.

"Current economic forecasts are improved over those used in the initial filing," said David Kyto, WPS Rate Case Director. "In addition, because of lower fuel costs, we have a refund to pass along to customers. We propose to use that refund to offset increased costs. If the Commission agrees, there will be no electric rate increase for 2013."

Kyto noted that the filing continues a trend in which WPS retail electric rates have been stable for several years - with an average increase of less than one (1) percent per year for six years, including 2013. During that time, WPS had several notable accomplishments, including bringing Weston 4 into service, completing the 100-megawatt Crane Creek Wind Farm, and increasing the amounts it spends for transmission projects and to promote energy efficiency. Retail gas rates have actually decreased.






