After the committee resumed open session, they took questions from the attendants. The first question was, "What will we be voting on Saturday, money? Money will be voted on along with where to build, what to build and even if to build. The committee has to have approval from the electors to go forward with the building project. They cannot sign a contract with anybody without permission. This means that they also cannot get a hard figure of the project, just a ballpark figure.

The question of so many closed session meetings came into question. The committee responded that because of multiple bids for the project and state statue 19.85 allows them to be in closed session. They also stated that this will probably be the last closed session that they will have to be in.



5 Ideas for Strawberries

Each recipe requires 1 pound of hulled strawberries

1.) Strawberries & Cream Smoothie: In blender, puree strawberries, 1 cup frozen peach slices,

1/4 cup low-fat vanilla frozen yogurt, 1/4 cup skim milk and 2 tbsp. honey until smooth. Serves 2.

2.) Minted Fruit Salad: In 2-qt. saucepan, combine 1 bunch fresh mint leaves, 1/2 cup water and 1/4 cup sugar. Heat to boiling on high. Remove from heat. Cool completely; strain and discard mint. In large bowl, combing cooled syrup with strawberries, quartered, 3 kiwis, peeled and sliced, and 1 cup cantaloupe chunks. Refrigerate at least 30 minutes or up to 8 hours. Serves 4.

3.) Berry Nice Pork Chops: Preheat grill on medium-high. Season 4 (3/4-in. thick) boneless pork loin chops with 1/4 tsp. salt. Spray 10 inch skillet with nonstick cooking spray. Add 1 small onion, thinly sliced, 1/2 tsp. fresh thyme, chopped and 1/4 tsp. salt. Cook on medium for 5 to 8 minutes or until tender, stirring. Add 2 Tbsp. cider vinegar and 3 Tbsp. water. Cook 1 minute. Remove from heat. Stir in strawberries, sliced and 1/8 tsp. pepper. Grill pork 6 to 8 minutes, until meat thermometer registers 145 degrees F., turning over once. Serve with berry sauce. Serves 4.

4.) Strawberry Sauce: In 3 gt. saucepan, stir strawberries, sliced; 1/2 cup water; 1/4 cup light corn syrup; 1/4 cup sugar and pinch salt. Heat to boiling on high, stirring. Reduce heat to simmer 2 minutes or until strawberries are soft. Puree in blender until smooth. With spatula, push puree through fine-mesh strainer set over medium bowl. Stir in 2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice. Serve with pancakes, waffles, or pound cake. Makes 2 1/2 cups.

5.) Red, White & Green Salad: In large bowl, combine strawberries, sliced; 2 Tbsp. balsamic vinegar; and 1/4 tsp. each salt and pepper. Let stand 10 minutes, stirring often. Add 5 oz. baby-greens-and-herbs mix and 3 cups coarsely shredded cooked chicken; toss to combine. Divide among 4 plates. Top with 4 oz. herbed goat cheese, crumbled. Serves 4.

To: Town of Lincoln Voters and Taxpayers -Special Town Meeting Coming Up.

Your Town Chairwoman has scheduled a meeting of the Electors for next Saturday morning for the purpose of gaining from you the authority to spend your public funds. She and the Building Committee cannot spend your money on a building without your approval. So, your presence and your vote are critically important in protecting your interest in reduced town tax burden.

We hear that you will be told, when you get there, what you will be authorizing or denying. We understand that you will see drawings of a couple of different building options (with or without garages) and be given a 30-minute presentation by members of the Building Committee as to what they want to do. Then, you will be asked to select one of the two building plans and one of two building sites. Then, and most importantly, you will be asked to GRANT TO THE BOARD OR BUILDING COMMITTEE THE POWER TO SPEND YOUR FUNDS in some, as yet, UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT.

There is much more to say, than can be contained in this letter, but we want to share several basic perceptions with you:

There has never been performed a basic analysis of the Town's needs for public facilities. That should have been the first step, still should be done and should be done with adequate input solicited from you, the Public, through all means available, including the media. That step is not adequately addressed by the posting of a bland notice of a public meeting.

You will hear the Board and Building Committee proclaim that grand buildings can be constructed without the need for tax increases. This is partly true only because the over taxation has been the practice of this Board for some time. Accrual of building funds, through taxation, has been going on for years. But the current Board has dramatically expanded the pace of accrual through tax increases. This has already produced a higher tax burden on you than was necessary. Additionally, the current Board has been diverting funds from the town's operating budget, including town highway funds, to build a building. This diversion could only continue at the expense of our local road system. Nothing we might do as a community will be free. To imply otherwise is governmental

3. The process engaged in by our Town has been wrought with controversy from the beginning. That is largely by reason of an early determination by unanimous vote of the Building Committee, to support the Chairman's dream of building a very much larger and more expensive facility than was appropriate for our Town. The degree of pressure on the Board has, fortunately, resulted in a much more reasonably sized facility being now recommended. That is progress, but at a steep price. That is because the Board and Committee have chosen to perform their public service activities in a relatively clandestine fashion, operating largely in closed meetings and denying Public access to relevant public information. That kind of degradation in quality of government is too high a price for citizens to pay for the correction of the Chairwoman's dream.

On April 10th, we had our annual Town Meeting. Many citizens attended. A very wise man proposed a resolution that we suspend, for one year, this entire process relative to a new town hall. The electors passed his resolution by an overwhelming vote. In response to her electorate, however, Chairwoman Black engaged the Town's lawyer to obtain the advice that she was not legally bound to honor the resolution. And, she chose not to do so. No one claimed that your existing facility would fail to serve anytime soon. So, what reason to flaunt power to the Voters? What reason to drive forward in the face of public resistance? Is it the existence of too much of your tax money laying in her control? Does this sound to you like good or wise leadership?

We believe that, for these and other reasons, the voters of the Town of Lincoln should appear at the Special Town Meeting next Saturday morning at 8:30 to vote down any expenditure for a new building at this time. Then, as a community, we should take an active interest in assessing our building needs, engage in community thought and dialogue on the matter and arrive at some agreed and reasonable solutions. Please join us to vote against any capital expenditure.





The committee also stated that they have roughly \$678,000 in the building fund. They will present two options for consideration to build. The first option is a town hall with a garage. The ballpark figure is \$600,000 dollars with a ten percent contingency that would equate to \$660,000 dollars. The second option is a building without a garage. The dollar amount is \$435,000 with a ten percent contingency to total \$478,000.

The drawing of the proposed building is below. This is not a final drawing, but the general format of what will be presented on Saturday June 9th.

Town of Lincoln Proposed Town Hall and Garage

THE TIME HAS FINALLY ARRIVED! The Town of Lincoln Building Committee has completed our preliminary investigation of proposed building plans and budgets. The Building Committee has done their due diligence over the past 17 months and taken the time to investigate many avenues.

The fown has scheduled a SPECIAL MEETING OF THE ELECTORS for June 9th, 2012 at the Crandon High School Auditorium, beginning at 8:30 a.m. A large plan will be available at the entrance for inspection, and a smaller plan is presented below. At 9:00 a.m. there will be a short presentation by committee members and then a question and answer session will commence. Voting will be at approximately 9:30 a.m. or after all questions have been addressed. The Building Committee is confident that the proposed project can be built without raising taxes or borrowing any money. The money for the intended building project has been previously budgeted and set aside to cover the anticipated costs of this development, therefore not causing an increase in taxes. Consequently, because of this highly anticipated need and insight of the Town Board to budget these costs over the past several years, the money for "FUTURE" outlay has also already been established, so again, there will be no need to increase taxes. But, your VOTE is very important, as two (2) building outlooks will be presented alrow with the location.

options will be presented, along with site location. So, please plan on attending.

Below, please find the proposed Town of Lincoln Town Hall and Garage preliminary plan as prepared by the town's Building Committee. Much time and thought has gone into this proposal. We feel that the ideas and concerns of our community have been taken into consideration. This plan, at approximately 7,100 S.F. compares to 5,400 S.F. that the town now has in its two current buildings. The new plan includes a meeting room for about 20 people for town board meetings. This would mean that the community center for about 100 people would not have to be heated for board meetings, saving the town money throughout the winter months.. The small community center could be used on

voting days, larger board meetings, such as the annual meetings and this area could also be rented out for small social events. The town hall will also include an open area that could be used for conducting town business and could accommodate 1-3 desks if necessary. The plan also includes: one office, men's and lady's rest rooms which would be handicap accessible, a warming room to allow for food, a fire-safe vault for storing of town records, mechanical room, HVAC and storage for table and chairs.

The garage will accommodate all of the town's equipment. In addition, a large area above the storage room to the HVAC room (approximately 12'x60') will have a deck for possible storage. Three (3) large 16'x14' insulated garage doors will allow safe in-and-out access for equipment.


All Town of Lincoln residents are welcome to attend, but by state statute, only eligible voters will be able to vote. Voters must be in attendance to register and vote, as absentee ballots are not available for this type of voting.

After many hours of consultation with contractors, the Building Committee is confident that the preliminary budget figures indicate that the entire project to build a town hall inclusive with the garage can be built for \$660,000 (\$600,000 plus \$60,000 for contigencies). The town hall, without the garage, is expected to cost \$478,000 (\$435,000 plus \$43,000 for contingencies).

Two building sites options will also be considered; the current 2.5 acre location on Highway W or the 14 acre site on Bear Road. All options will be explained in detail at the meeting.

We hope for a large turnout and a favorable, positive result, one which will be acceptable and meet the town's needs, now and in the future.


Look for more information to come about guest professional story teller Tracy Chipman, who will delight and engage the audience with her global collection of *Dreamtime Tales* on July 5th.
