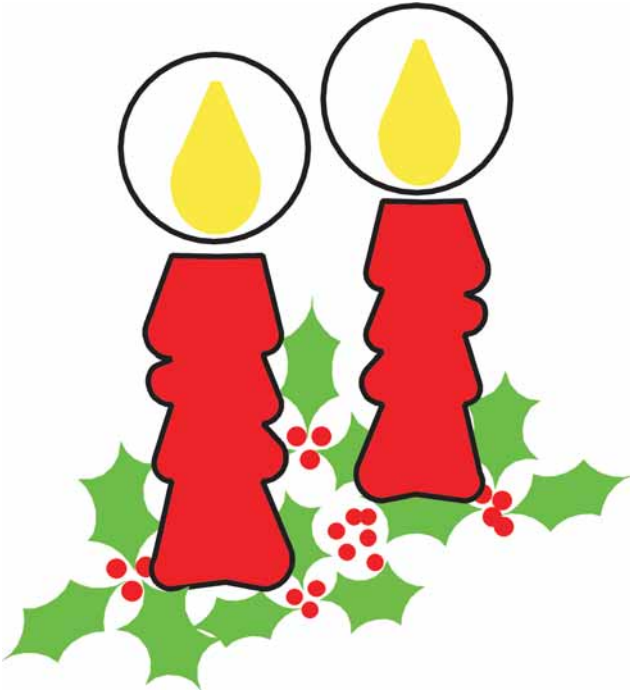

Northern Lake Service awarded large EPA contract

Northern Lake Service, Inc. (NLS) has been selected as one of only four laboratories to assist the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) with sample analyses for the third Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR3). The aggregate contract value is estimated at over \$8.5 million. The UCMR3 program is mandated as part of the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) and affects all public water systems who serve more than 10,000 people. This contract involves the analyses of drinking water samples collected from 800 randomly selected small systems. During the previous cycle of this program, NLS was also involved in a similar lab support contract with US EPA for the analysis of thousands of samples, received from all 50 states and several US territories.

Government funds available for housing in rural communities

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development still has loans available to rural communities in Wisconsin with affordable monthly payments.

Direct Single Family Housing loans are also available with no down payment for lower income households. These are for a period of 33-38 years. The current interest rate is 3.125 percent, and in some cases may be subsidized down to one percent.

USDA Rural Development also offers Home Repair Loans and Grants. Funds can be used to repair or replace furnaces, electrical, foundations, siding, roofing, windows, plumbing, wells, septic systems, and other health and safety hazards as well as improving and modernizing a home. These loans are at one percent interest for a maximum term of 20 years. The loan amount depends on the ability to make a monthly payment based on required income guidelines.

Ministry Health Care asks the public to get flu vaccination

To mark National Influenza Vaccination Week, Ministry Health Care is reminding the public about the importance of receiving the influenza vaccination. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone over the age of six months receives the vaccination each year.

"With the start of the flu season upon us, it is vitally important that everyone who is able to get the flu vaccine takes the time to receive it," said Dr. Stewart Watson, president of Ministry Medical Group. "We know that the best way to stop the spread of the influenza virus is by vaccinating as many people as possible."

Ministry Health Care puts such a high importance on vaccinations that physicians, employees and volunteers working at a Ministry facility are required to receive the influenza vaccine. Since the beginning of December, those who could not or chose not to receive the vaccine are asked to wear a mask when in contact with patients, visitors and co-workers. All employees with flu symptoms will be asked to stay home while symptoms persist.

According to the CDC, symptoms of the flu include: Fever* or feeling feverish/chills, Cough, Sore throat, Runny or stuffy nose, Muscle or body aches, Headaches, Fatigue (tiredness), Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

* It's important to note that not everyone with flu will have a fever.

Complications of the flu include bacterial pneumonia, ear infections, sinus infections, dehydration, and can cause chronic medical conditions, such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes to get worse.

Vet's Corner

Respiratory Cancers and Agent Orange

Veterans who develop respiratory cancer (lung, bronchus, larynx, or trachea) and were exposed to Agent Orange or other herbicides during military service do not have to prove a connection between their disease and military service to be eligible to receive VA disability compensation.

About respiratory cancers

Respiratory cancers are cancers of the lung, larynx, trachea, and bronchus.

Symptoms vary, depending on the location of the cancer:

- § Lung cancer—a new cough or cough that doesn't go away, coughing up blood, shortness of breath, chest pain, hoarseness
- § Cancer of the trachea—dry cough, hoarseness, breathlessness, difficulty swallowing
- § Cancer of the larynx (at the top of the trachea)—hoarseness, voice changes, sore throat or earache, feeling of a lump in the throat
- § Cancer of the bronchus—cough, chest pain, coughing blood

Guard against lung cancer

Number one rule: Don't smoke and avoid second-hand smoke. VA can help you every step of the way to quit smoking.

VA benefits for respiratory cancers

Veterans with respiratory cancers (lung, bronchus, larynx, or trachea) who were exposed to Agent Orange or other herbicides during military service may be eligible for disability compensation and health care.

Veterans who served in Vietnam, the Korean demilitarized zone or another area where Agent Orange was sprayed may be eligible for an Agent Orange Registry health exam, a free, comprehensive examination.

Surviving spouses, dependent children and dependent parents of Veterans who were exposed to herbicides during military service and died as the result of respiratory cancers may be eligible for survivors' benefits.

Research on respiratory cancers and herbicides used in Vietnam

The Institute of Medicine (IOM) of the National Academy of Sciences concluded in its 1994 report "Veterans and Agent Orange: Health Effects of Herbicides Used in Vietnam" and in future updates that there is limited/suggestive evidence of an association between exposure to herbicides (2,4-D; 2,4,5-T and its contaminant TCDD; cacodylic acid; and picloram) and respiratory cancers.

In updates to this report, IOM noted that associations linking development of respiratory cancers and exposure to dioxin were found consistently only when herbicide exposures appeared to be high and prolonged.

Sugar Shocker

Arsenic used to be the favored poison in mystery novels. Now it's showing up in organic and all natural snack bars that are sweetened with organic brown-rice syrup. That's the report from a team of Dartmouth scientists, who found that numerous brands of these bars contained more arsenic than the government allows in drinking water. The toxin, which exists in the soil, gets stored in the outer layer of the rice grain; you may be getting it not only from bars and other packaged items sweetened with organic brown-rice syrup, but also from rice in other forms, like cereals and crackers, and from the grain itself (especially if it's brown). While the amount in your snack or dinner won't make you keel over like a character in those old mysteries, long-term arsenic exposure has been linked to several types of cancer and to other health problems. If you're worried, you can limit your arsenic intake by:

- Eating a variety of grains
- Switching to bars with different sweeteners
- Cutting back on goodies that list any added sweetener near the top of the ingredient list.

Your body doesn't care whether those calories are coming from organic brown-rice syrup, sugar, or fruit-juice concentrate, but you'll probably care when you're trying to shimmy into your favorite jeans.

Diet for a longer life. Enjoying a Mediterranean-style menu, which includes plenty of vegetables and fruit, along with whole grains, fish, olive oil, nuts, legumes, and seeds, may be the key to living two to three extra years.

That's what Swedish researchers concluded after a 40-year study that looked at more than a thousand older adults.

Penny wise, pound wise. Just how much of a health payoff would a penny-per-ounce tax on sugar-sweetened beverages deliver? In a study from the Columbia University Mailman School of Public Health and the University of California, San Francisco, researchers estimated that the so-called "soda tax" would prevent nearly:

- 100,000 cases of heart disease
- 8,000 strokes
- 26,000 premature deaths

Still, other research has suggested the tax might just lead people to turn to other caloric beverages. If it passes, what will you do? In a poll of our Facebook fans, we were cheered to see that while 34% would keep sipping the sweet stuff, 60% would switch to no-cost water - and probably have the improved health and happier scale moments to show for it.



may be used to pay for officers' overtime and to purchase new equipment for improved safety belt enforcement. Because of stringent law enforcement and effective education, safety belt use now is at all-time high in Wisconsin. However, the state's safety belt use rate of approximately 80 percent lags behind the national average of 86 percent. "Our safety belt enforcement goal is not to write more tickets, but to save lives and prevent serious injuries," says Chief Packard. "We hope that people will voluntarily buckle up every time they drive or ride in a vehicle so we can reduce the number of preventable traffic deaths to zero in Wisconsin. But if voluntary compliance fails, we're fully prepared to take the appropriate enforcement action. All too often at a crash scene, our officers see critically injured adults and children taken to a hospital—or even more tragically—dead bodies taken to the morgue because they were not buckled up. Consistent safety belt use is the single-most effective protection against being ejected from a vehicle or thrown around violently inside it during a crash. That's why we're so serious about safety belt enforcement."
