Larry the Logroller is probably the most famous logger in the Northwoods. Larry logged the Forest County area in the golden years of logging. Legend has it that Larry would haul the trees out to the road when the horses got tired. After many hard days in the woods and new technology coming into the logging industry, Larry thought the time was right to retire and live the good life.

Larry was always fond of Wabeno. He made a new career of greeting tourists to town and keeping an eye on the Phoenix log hauler. Life was grand for the old lumberjack until noon on Thursday, January 3, 2013. Then, Larry was involved in a logging accident.

The old trees to the south of Larry needed to be removed. They were right behind the Phoenix and across from power lines, and because of this the trees had to be felled just right. Well, the winds were blowing a little too hard, and a tree fell on Larry. Larry hit the ground and sustained some serious, but non-life threatening injuries. He is at the doctors office recovering at this time. He is in good spirits and excited to be back at his post by the spring of the year. We're not sure if he is covered by worker's comp, but it is apparent that logging is a dangerous job, even in retirement.

Crandon Library News

Nancy Ann Storybook Dolls on Display

During the month of January the library has a very charming and irresistible collection of Nancy Ann Storybook Dolls on display from the collection of Natalie Kamenick of Crandon. The display contains approximately 28 dolls. Natalie's mother would occasionally purchase a "Nancy Ann" for Natalie from a department store and she received her first around the age of five or six years of age.

The story of the Nancy Ann Storybook Dolls makes this collection even more unique. In 1936, Nancy Ann Abbott started her doll-making venture with \$125 working from her apartment 16-18 hours per day. Individual artists painted the facial features, therefore, giving each doll its own special look. By 1942, the company claimed a million dollars in sales and was producing the largest doll volume in the nation. The dolls were named after nursery rhymes and jingles and were dressed with costume materials that were available at the time. An original wrist tag identified the dolls by names such as "Silks o Satin" and "Princess Rosanie." The dolls have mohair wigs of brown, light blonde, honey blonde, lemon yellow, auburn and black. During the war years, ribbons were used to fasten the costumes rather than metal closures and potteries made bisque products for Navy hospitals along with the dolls. The government considered the dolls necessary for morale and demand for the dolls was high.

In the 1950's Nancy Ann Storybook dolls reached a top production of 12,000 dolls per day. Nancy Ann Abbott, who had become known as "The Doll Lady" passed away in 1964. Anyone who has ever loved a doll will delight in this collection.

Thanks you Natalie for sharing this beloved collection with our community.

Two Florence men arrested in Laona Pharmacy burglary

Forest County Sheriff John Dennee reports that arrests have been made in the December 12th Burglary of the Laona Pharmacy in the Town of Laona. Several bottles of narcotics were stolen when a masked individual entered the pharmacy by breaking through a wall between the pharmacy and the Laona Clinic. Sheriff Dennee states that investigators from Forest County and Florence County worked hand in hand and executed several search warrants on Florence County Residences over the last weekend.

Those search warrants resulted in evidence being located and the arrests of two Florence County males. This case is still under investigation and more arrests may be forthcoming. No further information will be released at this time due to continual investigation.

The two individuals arrested are: Charles E. Hetzer, age 27 and Sheldon L. Burkart, age 26, and both are from Florence.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF THE APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET TO EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT FOR THREE YEARS FOR NON-RECURRING PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the School Board of the School District of Wabeno Area, Forest, Langlade, Marinette and Oconto Counties, Wisconsin (the "District"), has heretofore duly adopted a resolution entitled: "Resolution Authorizing the School District Budget to Exceed Revenue Limit for Three Years for Non-Recurring Purposes" (the "Revenue Limit Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the School Board deems it to be desirable and in the best interest of the District to direct the District Clerk to submit the question approved in the Revenue Limit Resolution to the electors for approval or rejection at the regularly scheduled election to be held on April 2, 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the District as follows:

Section 1. Referendum Election Date. The District Clerk is hereby directed to call a referendum election to be held in the District at the regularly scheduled election to be held on April 2, 2013 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the proposition of whether the Revenue Limit Resolution shall be approved.

Section 2. Notice to Electors. The District Clerk is directed to give notice by:

- (a) causing a Notice of Election in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A to be published in the Pioneer Express and Oconto County Beacon in the issues published immediately prior to the fourth Tuesday before the referendum election.
- (b) causing a Notice of Referendum (which includes the facsimile of the sample ballot) in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B to be published in the Pioneer Express and Oconto County Beacon in the issues published immediately preceding the referendum election. This Notice shall also be posted in each polling place on election day.

If any of the municipalities within the District use an electronic voting system employing a ballot label and ballot card, the Notice of Referendum set forth in Exhibit B shall also include a true, actual-size copy of the ballot label and ballot card in the form in which they will appear on election day.

Section 3. Polling Places and Hours. The District electors must vote at the referendum election at the times and polling places at which they cast their ballots in regularly scheduled elections.

Section 4. Referendum Election Officials. The election officials appointed in each of the municipalities within the District shall conduct the election.

Section 5. Official Referendum Ballot Form. The ballot to be used at the referendum election shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Sections 5.64(2) and 7.08(1)(a), Wisconsin Statutes. The ballot shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C.

The District Clerk shall cause to be printed sufficient ballots for use at said referendum election, both as actual ballots in those polling places which do not use voting machines and as absentee ballots where voting machines are used and as specimen ballots (the latter to be of a different and easily identifiable color from the actual ballot). The form of the ballot shall be filed with the official responsible for providing the ballots for the election, and the District Clerk shall file a copy of the ballot with the clerk of each county having territory within the District, as soon as possible after the date hereof but in no event later than 70 days prior to the election, as provided in Section 8.37, Wisconsin Statutes. If the District prepares the ballots, they should be delivered to the municipal clerks running the election at least 25 days prior to the election, to allow the municipal clerks to comply with their obligation to provide absentee ballots under Section 7.15, Wisconsin Statutes.

The municipal clerks of the municipalities within the District shall receive applications for absentee ballots and initial the same when issued to qualified absentee voters.

Section 6. Canvass. The returns of the referendum election shall be canvassed by the Board of Canvassers of each municipality within the District. Each Board of Canvassers shall certify the returns of the referendum election to the District Clerk. The District Clerk and two other reputable citizens appointed by the District Clerk prior to the date of the referendum election shall act as the District's Board of Canvassers for this referendum election. This Board of Canvassers shall meet in open session no later than 9:00 a.m. on the Tuesday after the election to determine the result of the referendum election. The canvass shall be open to the public and the District Clerk is directed to give due notice of said meeting.

Section 7. DPI Notice. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 121.91(3), Wisconsin Statutes, the District Clerk shall notify the Department of Public Instruction of the date of the referendum election and shall provide the Department with a copy of the Revenue Limit Resolution within 10 days after the adoption of the Revenue Limit Resolution and shall further notify the Department of the results of the referendum within 10 days following the election using the method prescribed by the Department.

Adopted and recorded January 2, 2013.

The motion carried.

There was a motion by Dawn Jakubiec seconded by Bill Connors, Jr. to schedule a Two Cents Event on February 6, 2013 from 6-7 p.m. to share information and answer questions about the upcoming referendum. The Regular Board Meeting will then begin at 7 p.m. that night. The motion carried.

A discussion was held regarding the use of cell phones/electronic devices at the Jr/Sr High School. There was a motion by Rob Seeber seconded by Patricia A. Manthey to approve the revision of the Jr/Sr High School Handbook to allow cell phones/electronic devices during lunch at the discretion of the building administrator. The motion carried.

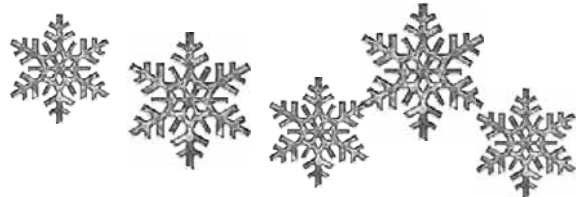

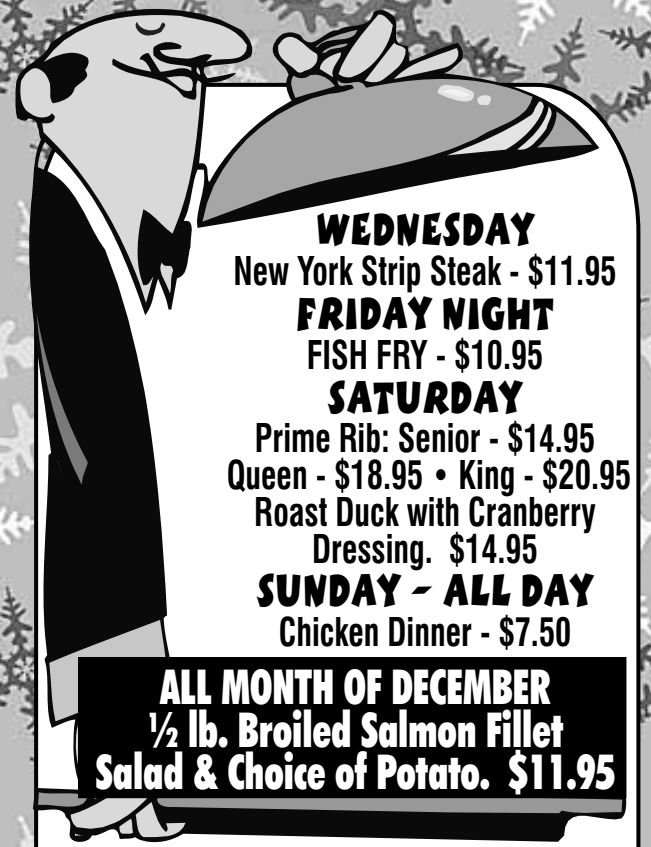

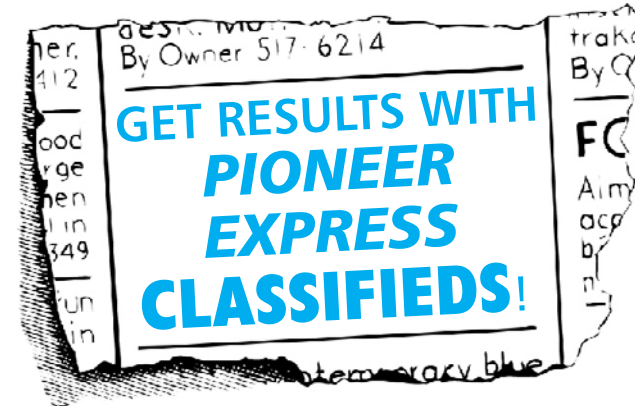

The library was able to select from over 700 titles offered by the Foundation, all representing award winning and well-reviewed works for children. Wabeno was especially able to augment the science and math collections which were seriously out of date, and urgently needed updating and replacement.

"Even though we were aware of the list from which to chose, when the books arrived, we were overwhelmed by the sheer beauty as well as quality of the collection we received," commented library director Carol Lee Saffioti-Hughes.

Several other generous donors working with the Libri Foundation add to the amount and types of books added to the collection: Bill Strawbridge and Meg Wallhaven, Hal Berenson and Laura Ackerman. Their names, as well as the Friends of the Wabeno Library, are acknowledged in the lovely bookplates placed inside each book as it is catalogued. The Berenson and Ackerman donations specifically are intended to allow the library to acquire designated titles in math and science. Their generosity came at a particularly well-timed point, as the library celebrated the landing of the Nasa spacecraft "Curiosity" on Mars.

Other works included stories about Mark Twain and Martin Luther King, the history of the White House from a child's point of view, and the story of the Statue of Liberty.

We received a grand total of 78 books through the generosity of the foundation, with a value of over \$1400.

The current personal protective equipment that the department owns is an average of fifteen years old with some dating back to 1980. Much of the gear is badly worn and is considered dangerous by today's standards. Included are new turnout coats and pants, helmets, gloves, and protective hoods. The grant award yields a great benefit to the fire fighters by keeping them safe and enabling them to provide improved fire protection in our community.

Only about ten percent of those departments that apply receive awards so Crandon is in good company for this round of grants.
