Influenza Update from the Forest County Health Department

Influenza "the flu" is at a high level in the Northern Region and in WI. Hospitalizations due to influenza are almost four times higher than this time last year. The Flu Vaccine is a good match for the strain of flu that is currently circulating. There are many other viruses circulating as well so you can still become ill even if you get the flu vaccine. The flu vaccine can prevent complications like hospitalizations, pneumonia and worsening of other conditions like diabetes and asthma or congestive heart failure.

The flu and the common cold have similar symptoms. It can be difficult to tell the difference between them. In general, the flu is worse than the common cold. Symptoms such as fever, body aches, tiredness, and cough are more common and intense with the flu. People with colds are more likely to have a runny or stuffy nose. If you have questions you should contact your health care provider.

You should seek medical attention immediately if you experience any of the following: difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, purple or blue discoloration of the lips, pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen, sudden dizziness, confusion, severe or persistent vomiting, seizures.

You can treat flu symptoms with and without medication. Over-the-counter medications may relieve some flu symptoms but will not make you less contagious. Your health care provider may prescribe antiviral medications to make your illness milder and prevent serious complications. Your health care provider may prescribe antibiotics if your flu has progressed to a bacterial infection.

There are steps you can take in your daily life to help protect you from getting the flu.

** All people age 6 months and older should get the flu vaccine.

A representative from the University of Wisconsin System will also be on hand, either in person or on video, to talk about transfer opportunities.

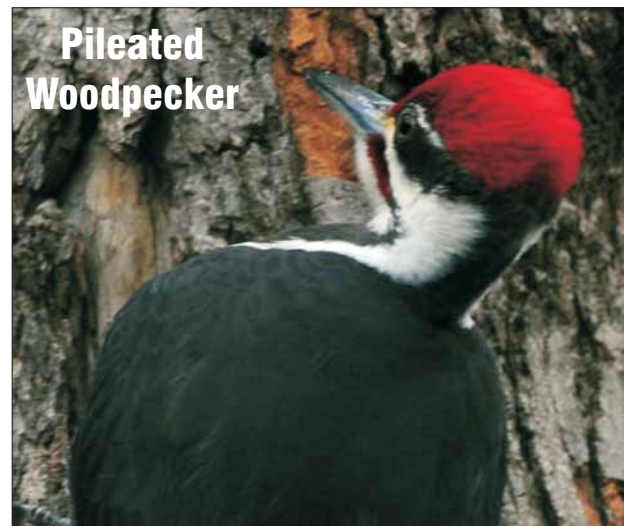

A message from Forest County District Attorney Charles Simono

The past week has brought forth many questions and concerns stemming from the threatening video posted on Facebook and YouTube last weekend. The video utilized the Crandon School whereby one student was simulating the shooting of other students. The questions being presented surround what will be happening to the juveniles involved and is the school safe for our children.

On Sunday January 6, I was contacted by the Forest County Sheriff's Department and advised of the video. Shortly after the communication I assisted in the drafting of a search warrant and the Forest County Sheriff's Department acted swiftly and professionally in their approach to securing all individuals involved and searching their homes.

The good news is that the video, crafted with extremely poor taste and no concern for the affect on the public, was quickly proven to not be of any viable threat or plan. The video did not use any weapons and none were located at any location searched. The video creators used software applications to replicate the audio and visual effects of gun fire and further violence. Needless to say, it was a relief to all that such a horrible act was not being planned.

The collaboration between the Forest County Sheriff's Department and Superintendent James Asher allowed for the swift response to assure that the public, and especially the children of the Crandon Schools were safe and they are indeed safe.

However, the individuals involved must still be held accountable for their actions. Due to the fact that they are juveniles, the law requires that their identities and juvenile prosecutions remain confidential. The juveniles, in addition to any punitive measures to be taken by the school system, will be held accountable through the juvenile court system.

Idle No More movement comes to Mole Lake

While you may not hear about it on our daily news cycle, Canada is undergoing a social revolution by the many native tribes who inhabit the land to our north. The ongoing protest movement is rooted in Canadian legislation that tribal members think will erode environmental protections, especially bill C-45.

According to sources on the web, there are protests in public places, and the movement has spread across Canada and into Alaska. One of the figures in this protest is Attawapiskat Chief Theresa Spence, who has been on a hunger strike since December 11, 2012. She is residing in a tipi on a hill overlooking the capitol in Ottawa, and is pledged to exist on about 400 calories a day until the Prime Minister will meet with her. She is living on broths and lemon juice and other fluids. Her efforts have brought attention to indigenous peoples and others in Canada.

Flash mobs that turn into round dances that brought awareness to shopping malls and highways, and a flash mob erupted in Mall of America in Minneapolis.

This is called the "Idle No More" movement in Canada, and the movement has brought a solidarity response from Native Americans in the U.S.

There was a march and get-together in Mole Lake to show support for Theresa Spence last Thursday evening. At least 40 people gathered in front of the lodge and walked to the youth center, where there was a drum, singing and a round dance. Some inspirational talks were given by Fred Ackley, Ken VanZile, Franny VanZile and chair Chris McGeshick. After the dance and speaking, a delicious meal was served.

Marisa VanZile was the spark plug for this event. Marisa is a student at Northern Michigan University in Marquette, Michigan and the daughter of Ken Vanzile. Marisa is an activist for all human rights and a clean environment, and seems dedicated to her mission. Marisa is anxious to get youth involved in human issues, like the environment.

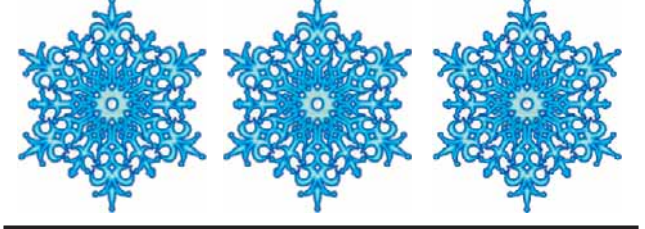

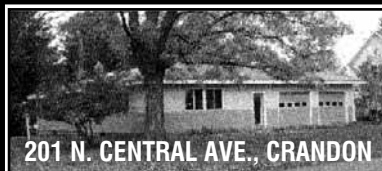

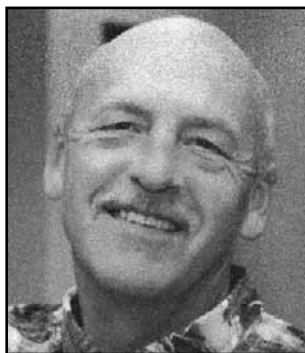

"I'm pleased to be able to continue my leadership on environmental issues in the State Assembly," Mursau said. "The improvements we made to natural resource management last session need to continue."

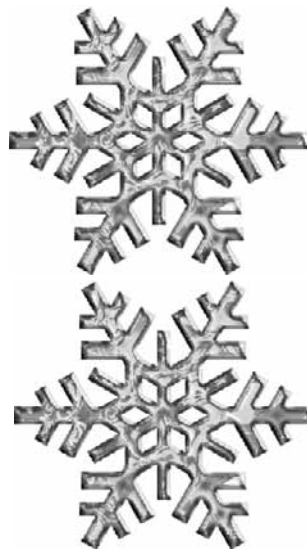
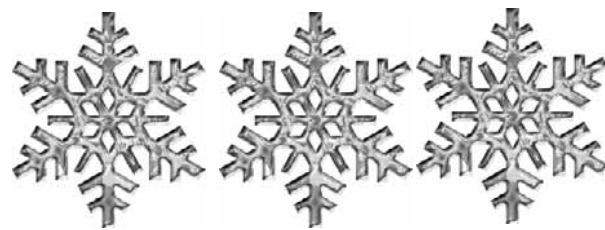

Getting Ski-Ready

Snow means time to pull out the skis! But before you hit the slopes, get ski-ready with these pre-conditioning tips (get your health care provider's okay first):

Loosen up: Do stretching workouts that keep you limber. Before you hit the slopes, warm up your muscles with 5 to 10 minutes of exercise and then stretch. Don't forget to stretch after skiing too.

Improve your balance. Use a balance board or exercise ball for balance training. Or try one-legged squats or standing on one foot with eyes closed.

Increase your speed and endurance. Raise your heart rate for 40 to 60 minutes a day - try walking, running or biking.

Strengthen your entire body:

Core training - any functional exercise that requires you to maintain your own center of gravity over your own base of support is a core exercise. Try a Pilates workout. Use proper form to prevent back injuries.

Legs - try squats, lunges, stairs, walking hills for thighs and walk, jog, bike or swim for strong calves.

Arms and shoulders - your pole plant technique can make or break your run through bumps or short turns. Include your triceps and back muscles.

Note: If you're new to skiing or haven't hit the slopes in a while, take more time to do these exercises.
