First floor for Infinity Wood Floors

The picture above was taken in a new gymnasium at Brown Deer, Wisconsin. What is important is that it is the first floor sold by Infinity Wood Floors and was milled at the Infinity plant in Crandon's industrial park. It is a 20,000 square foot floor constructed by the best grade maple flooring available.

Pat Tallier, President of the new company located in the former Lipco Gift building, started building the new installation on October 1st. He is proud of the fact that the first day of operation, starting with a bare floor, took place on January 10, 2013. The Lipco building, says Pat, was perfect for what he planned to do. The 25,000 square foot structure gives them the room to store finished product and raw lumber. The flooring will be used in homes, for sports floors, industrial applications and commercial buildings.

To date, Infinity is employing 27 people, and according to Pat, he will need six more employees in the next three weeks. The operation not only brings more employment to Forest County, but also adds jobs in other fields. Novak Trucking Service will be delivering finished product, logs bought from McCaslin Logging have been hauled to Forest Sawmill in Wabeno to be sawed into lumber, and Mike Lemerande hauls the lumber to Kretz Lumber, in Antigo, to be kiln dried.

Infinity is a welcome addition to Crandon's industrial park and to the employment opportunities in Forest County. Tallier says it is a group effort with many people working long hours to make this business start and run in a short time period. We wish them a long run!

Double K, Crandon's trolley company, is now Hometown Trolley. While the new name is a change in the business, the big change is their move to the former woodworking building in the Crandon industrial park.

The company has been doing business out of the old structure in the park for about 20 years, and they have long since outgrown that facility. When you run out of room, you also run out of efficiency of operation.

The new facility has had major renovations already, with numerous garage doors added that will open into a bay where a new trolley will be built, and the building has been expanded in length. Currently, they are waiting for the dirt to thaw in the expansion so the Flannery crew can pour concrete.

According to Kristina Pence-Dunow, at Hometown Trolley, their orders for the unique trolleys has increased dramatically, and they will soon be building all electric trolleys. A \$2.6 million order from Alpena, Michigan to build electric trolleys will be their first order of this new product that will give off zero emissions. Going green is one of the goals of the company, and this is a great start.

Our local trolley company, up here in the frozen north of Wisconsin, has provided their unique mode of transportation to customers all over the U.S., Canada, Puerto Rico and have sold five trolleys in the Aruba area. With the new manufacturing facility, they expect to build three to four trolleys a month.




Wabeno Lions donate to Wabeno Elementary

Brain Food

For years we've known that Mediterranean diet largely fruits, vegetables, whole grains, legumes and nuts is good for the heart. People in countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea are among the healthiest. They eat small quantities of dairy and limit red meat. They like fish and poultry.

Even better news is a recent study in the Archives of Neurology showing that those eating a more Mediterranean diet were also less likely to have small vessel damage (small strokes) in the brain. Large strokes often cause major disability, but small strokes can still lead to falls and memory loss.

Bottom line: Eating more fruits and vegetables and reducing animal fat is good for your heart and your brain.




