### City of Crandon partners with Eagle Waste and Recycling Inc.

Eagle Waste & Recycling Inc. in partnership with the City of Crandon are excited to provide a new program for collection of trash and recycling. The changes will improve aesthetics within the city, save money and promote and improve recycling collection and participation. The new number of items that you are allowed to recycle has increased. A summary of the changes to your trash and recycling collection include:

- Each customer will receive a 64 gallon cart on wheels, black lid, for storage and collection of trash. This container will be picked up every week. Please note that all waste must fit into this container. If you need a larger container for trash, you are able to upgrade to a 96 gallon cart for a fee of two a month by contacting us at 715-477-
- · Each customer will receive a 96 gallon cart on wheels, green lid, for storage and collection of single stream recyclables, glass, plastic, tin, aluminum, paper and cardboard all mixed together in one container. All material is to be clean and placed loose within the container, no plastic bags. The 96 gallon recycling cart will be picked up every other week on the same day as your trash. Most residents will find the cart large enough to hold two or more weeks of recyclables. If you determine you need an additional cart for recycling, one will be provided at no charge.
- · Your collection schedule will continue on as usual with pickup on Wednesday until the week of March 4th. Therefore, place both your trash and recycling out on February 20th and 27th. During the week of March 4th your collection day will change to Monday and recyclables will be picked up every other week. On March 4th we will be picking up Trash only. On March 11th we will be collecting both trash and recycling. Recycling will continue to be picked up every other week thereafter.
- Please place your trash and recyclables out by the curb by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection.
- Please place your cart in the location it was delivered. The cart is picked up with an arm that extends out of the truck. Therefore, the driver does not need to get out of the truck to pick up your trash or recyclables.
- · Please be sure that the cart is at least three feet from other carts, telephone poles, vehicles or anything else that would interfere with the automated arm.
- Please note that Eagle Waste collects trash and recycling on all holidays with the exception of Christmas.

### Rosemarie Rogers pleads guilty Sentence rendered

On Friday February 15, 2013 Rosemarie Rogers entered a Guilty plea to the Class G felony of Theft (greater than \$10,000). The second count, misdemeanor bail jumping was dismissed and read-in. Ms. Rogers was placed on probation for a period of 5 years (which is the maximum allowed by law for this particular offense) is required to serve 90 days of conditional jail as part of her probation, must pay the victim \$13,000.00 for the funds stolen, must pay the state victim-witness surcharge of \$1300.00 (all must be paid during probation). The defendant is required to file state and federal returns on or before April 1, of each year with the entirety of the returns being forfeited towards restitution until it is paid in full. The defendant is also required to perform 250 hours of community service while on probation which must start within 60 days of her conviction, must write an apology letter to the victim, must work full-time, is to have no contact with the victim and will be given credit for 30 days she already served if she is revoked on probation as she sat 30 days prior to being bonded out of jail.

The amount originally owed was much greater, approximately \$24,000, but we were able to recover some funds which mitigated the final restitution amount.

### Report on the meeting of the **Forest County Board**

The full Forest County Board met last Tuesday, February 19th at 7:00 p.m. in the board room.

The meeting was opened by Jim Schuessler, representing the Forest County Economic Development Partnership. Schuessler gave plenty of good news about some the job creation that has taken place in the county, and outlined some of the goals of FCEDP. Discussed was the building of an ORV park in the county in the 10,000 acre range, getting rail service back into the county, signage in the county, and an effort to get an increase in available timber, especially from the national forest lands.



# Vet's Corner

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13, 2013 - Defense Secretary Leon E. Panetta has approved a new medal designed to recognize service members directly affecting combat operations who may not even be on the same continent as the action.

The Distinguished Warfare Medal recognizes the changing face of warfare. In the past, few, if any, service members not actually in a combat zone directly affected combat operations.

These new capabilities have given American service members the ability to engage the enemy and change the course of battle, even from afar, Panetta said at a Pentagon news conference today.

"I've always felt -- having seen the great work that they do, day in and day out -- that those who performed in an outstanding manner should be recognized. Unfortunately, medals that they otherwise might be eligible for simply did not recognize that kind of contribution."

Now, the Defense Department does.

"The medal provides distinct, department-wide recognition for the extraordinary achievements that directly impact on combat operations, but that do not involve acts of valor or physical risk that combat entails," Panetta said.

Technological advancements have dramatically changed how the American military conducts and supports warfighters. Unmanned aerial vehicles, unmanned underwater vehicles, missile defense technology and cyber capabilities all affect combat operations while the operators may not be anywhere near the combat zone. The new medal recognizes the contributions of these service members.

It will not be awarded for acts of battlefield valor, officials said. It will be awarded in the name of the secretary of defense to members of the military whose extraordinary achievements directly impacted combat operations, and cannot be used as an end-of-tour award.

"This new medal recognizes the changing character of warfare and those who make extraordinary contributions to it," said Army Gen. Martin E. Dempsey, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. "The criteria for this highly selective and reflect high standards."

The most immediate example is the work of an unmanned aerial vehicle operator who could be operating a system over Afghanistan while based at Creech Air Force Base, Nev. The unmanned aerial vehicle would directly affect operations on the ground. Another example is that of a soldier at Fort Meade, Md., who detects and thwarts a cyberattack on a DOD computer system.

The medal could be used to recognize both these exceptional acts, officials said.

In the order of precedence, the Distinguished Warfare Medal will be below the Distinguished Flying Cross, and will be limited to achievements that are truly extraordinary. "The member's actions must have resulted in an accomplishment so exceptional and outstanding as to clearly set the individual apart from comrades or from other persons in similar situations," a DOD official said.

The military department secretary must approve each award, and it may not be presented for valorous actions. "This limitation was specifically included to keep the Distinguished Warfare Medal from detracting from existing valor decorations, such as the Medal of Honor, Service Crosses and Silver Star Medal," the official said.

Award criteria will be incorporated into the next revision of DOD Manual 1348.33-V3, Manual of Military Decorations and Awards, Volume 3.

### **VRAP Deadline Looms**

According to the VA, over 94,000 veterans have applied for VRAP education benefits. To date the VA has approved over 77,000 Certificates of Eligibility. However, just over 27,000 of those eligible veterans have begun using their benefit. The VA is encouraging veterans to finish the process and get enrolled in eligible education programs as soon as possible. A VA official recently stated, "We do not want any of the 99,000 slots to go unused. The program is only two years long. By law we can only accept applications until September 30, 2013, and the last payment can be made through March 31, 2014." VRAP participants that do not enroll in school by March of this year will not be able to receive a full 12 months of training. VRAP participants are being warned that they must apply and begin using their benefits as soon as feasible, or, notify the VA to cancel their Certificate of Eligibility to make room for other veterans to use the benefit. **VRAP GI Bill Factsheet** 

The Veterans Retraining Assistance Program (VRAP) GI Bill offers up to 12 months of Montgomery GI Bill

benefits for older unemployed veterans. Unemployed veterans between the age of 35 and 60 may apply for education benefits worth as much as \$17,600 (\$1473 a month). This new GI Bill program was created as a part of the VOW to Hire Heroes Act of 2011.

To be eligible for the VRAP GI Bill you must:

Be at least 35 but no more than 60 years old.

Be unemployed (as determined by DoL).

Not have a dishonorable discharge.

Not be eligible for any other VA education benefit program. Not be drawing VA compensation due to unemployability. Not be enrolled in a federal or state job training program.

Here's what you should know about the new VRAP before you apply:

This benefit can only be used to earn an Associate Degree, Non-College Degree, or a Certificate, and train the you for a high demand occupation

According to the VA, the program should begin processing VRAP benefits on July 1, 2012.

This new benefit will be limited to 45K vets in FY2012 and 54K from October 1, 2013 through March 31,

Once you have completed the VRAP education program, the Dept. of Labor will provide employment assistance

### **IMPACT OF THE REFERENDUM IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WABENO AREA**

The School District of Wabeno Area will have an operating referendum on the ballot April 2, 2013. The School District works hard to provide an excellent education and well-maintained facilities for our students. Evidence of this quality education is confirmed by the high marks the district received on the State School Report Cards which indicate that the district is meeting and exceeding expectations.

At the same time, the School District is cognizant of the impact of educational costs on its taxpayers. The School Board and Administration are committed to keeping the mill rate as low as possible. The proposed referendum will increase the mill rate from the current 6.17 to 6.73. For a home valued at \$50,000, the proposed referendum would increase the school tax by approximately \$28. For a home valued at \$100,000, the proposed referendum would increase the school tax by approximately \$56.

A number of things were decided and not decided. The board voted to buy a new fully equipped tandem plow truck fully equipped with dump box, wing, plow, undercarriage and salting apparatus at the cost of about \$190,000. There was little discussion, and it was obvious that all present was aware of the Highway Department's need for a new truck to replace a worn out truck.

There were a number of items that were routine, but the discussion over the problems facing the Forest County Humane Society, mainly funding, was lengthy.

The funding currently in place was brought to the attention of the board members, and it appears that money from the sale of dog licenses that come from the various towns and the city is sent to the county, where 25 cents is sent to the state, and a \$1,000 fund is maintained to cover animal damages, then the remainder is sent back to the communities. It appears that this money should be sent to the Humane Society by the communities. But, taking into consideration that hardly anybody buys a dog license, this is not a significant amount of money. The sum is about \$800 or a slightly more yearly.

This brought up the question of why people don't buy a dog license, and one board member wasn't aware that they were offered anymore, and he was joined in this by others in the room who didn't know they were supposed to be purchased by dog owners. This, in turn, brought up the subject of how dog owners could be induced to buy a dog license. Sheriff Dennee was present and asked if it the Sheriff's Department could enforce the ordnance. He replied that his people had their hands full of work now, and that combing the county looking for unregistered dogs took time that the Sheriff's Department didn't have. The idea of having a Humane Officer position was brought up, which brought up a discussion of how this could be funded.

As the old saying goes, "When all was said and done, more was said than done." However, it is a complex problem, and it will not be solved with one meeting, but there was a better understanding by the board members of what the Humane Society is facing. Certainly, we need an organization in place to take care of the numerous dogs and cats that are not cared for in Forest County. It can also be said that the Society needs to come up with some better internal funding, but the county also has a responsibility.

While nothing was settled, the problem was brought to the attention of the board members, and hopefully, there will be some problem solving done to correct this deficiency.

Another item of interest was approving by the board of State Highway 55 as a State Scenic Byway.


