Upcoming Panfish Meeting in Crivitz

CRIVITZ, Wis. – A meeting scheduled for Monday, March 18, 2013 at the Crivitz High School auditorium will give anglers and others the opportunity to share their expectations for fishing for panfish in Wisconsin. It's one of more than two dozen meetings being held across the state.

"We want to hear from the public about what they want from their panfishing experience to help guide us in developing a statewide plan for managing panfish populations," says Joanna Griffin, the Department of Natural Resources fisheries specialist coordinating the effort.

The public meetings mark the opening phases of statewide outreach efforts by Department of Natural Resources' fisheries management to better connect with anglers in Wisconsin. These first meetings will focus on inland lake and river panfish management although other local fishery concerns, such as the panfish creek survey conducted last summer, may be covered at the meetings, she says.

Ruffed Grouse Society Banquet



On Saturday evening, March 23rd, the Nicolet/Wild Rivers Chapter of the Ruffed Grouse Society will be holding its 22nd annual fund raising banquet at the Crandon Community Center. Doors open at 5:15 PM. Tickets for the banquet are \$45 for individuals and include a membership and dinner. Tickets for a member and a spouse are \$60 and tickets for children are \$10 each. Funds generated at this banquet will be used to improve habitat for ruffed grouse and woodcock in Northeastern Wisconsin.

Banquet Chairman Craig Williams says, "We invite folks to join us at this year's banquet and help support ongoing projects in the area. Funds from this year's banquet are targeted for developing a new ruffed grouse management area south of Crandon in Forest County and support for a new hunter walking trail system in Oconto County."

Since its inception, the Ruffed Grouse Society has provided over 3.5 million dollars for 600 projects in 28 states, encompassing more than a half a million acres. In Wisconsin alone, local chapters like the Nicolet/Wild Rivers Chapter have generated over \$850,000 used to improve approximately 150,000 acres of wildlife habitat on over 100 projects, including 16 project sites in the Florence, Forest and Oconto County area.



Attendees at the meetings will be asked to fill out a short questionnaire to help DNR understand their concerns, issues and priorities for panfish. The questionnaire and background materials presented at the meeting can also be found on our website at http://dnr.wi.gov, keyword "panfish plan".

DNR has long had management plans in place for game fish species such as walleye, bass, musky and northern pike, and biologists and some anglers believe such attention is necessary for panfish.

"We know there have been proposals from the Conservation Congress in recent years and again this year to reduce the daily 25 fish limit on panfish on select lakes. Their concerns, along with our data analyses and modeling efforts, lead us to believe we need to take the next step and develop a management plan."

As a category, panfish are by far the most common fish caught by anglers in Wisconsin although anglers report walleye as their favorite target. Wisconsin anglers reported catching 88 million fish in the 2006-2007 license year, of which 57.7 million were panfish, according to a statewide mail survey done that year. About 25.7 million of those panfish were kept.

"We hope the feedback we receive from anglers can help us understand whether to stay the course, or if they want changes in their panfishing experience that could require us to do something different, depending on the particular water body and its capabilities."

Ghost Girls, especially Cassie, are smitten with flirtatious Luke, and their jealousy toward Elysia only increases as Luke falls ever more deeply in love with her. Things take a turn toward the dark side when a demon named Brimstone tries to tempt Cassie into doing away with the Breather girl in order to take her place. To counter Brimstone's evil actions the late Flower Child, Sunshine, has been dispatched to Earth as a "Heavenly Functionary." Sunshine and Jessie must strive to prevent Cassie from doing the unthinkable.

"This is the theatrical equivalent of a 'date movie'" says director Nick Lowery. "It's the kind of show that unapologetically attempts to both tickle your funny bone and tug at your heartstrings. The show feels a bit like a pop musical version of Touched by an Angelor for children of the 1980's like Cassie, let's say 'Highway to Heaven with, like, totally tubular tunes."

The play features songs from several eras. Sunshine shares 1960's songs from The Fifth Dimension. The Byrds and Etta James. A very recognizable 1970's disco anthem inspires the girls, both living and dead. Cassie's 1980's roots are reflected with songs by Adam Ant, Oingo Boingo, Billy Joel and an iconic Bonnie Tyler power ballad. 

2 lbs lean ground beef

1 can (16 oz.) refried beans 12 oz. uncooked lasagna noodles

1 jar (16 oz.) mild salsa 2 cups (8 oz.) shredded Monterey Jack cheese 1 envelope taco seasoning 1 can (8 oz.) tomato sauce

1.) Cook lasagna noodles in a large pot of boiling water for 5 minutes. Drain the water off the noodles.

2.) Cook ground beef in a large skillet until the meat is no longer pink. Add the refried beans, tomato sauce and taco seasoning to the cooked meat.

3.) Spray a 13x9" baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.

4.) Place 1/3 of cooked noodles in the baking dish. Cover with 1/3 of the meat mixture. Sprinkle with 1/3 of the cheese. Repeat the layers twice, using the rest of the noodles, meat and cheese.

5.) Pour the salsa over the top of the lasagna. Cover with aluminum foil. Bake in a 350° oven for 1 hour.

6.) Serve with chopped tomatoes, onions, olives and salsa.

Variations:

- · Use corn tortillas instead of lasagna noodles in this recipe.
- Try ground turkey instead of ground beef.
- · Use canned pinto or black beans instead of refried beans. Drain water off the canned beans before using.



Mursau on State Budget: Good Start, Room for Improvement

Madison ... Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) heard Governor Scott Walker's budget address on Wednesday night. Mursau both approved of and had concerns with different components of Walker's budget proposal. The governor made good on his promise to continue reforming the way government operates, while only partially recognizing problems and funding solutions for rural Wisconsin.

'Governor Walker made great strides in his proposal to increase funding for worker education, mental health treatment, domestic violence, and military veteran assistance programs," Mursau said. "However, his education reform and funding looks like a first-draft that needs help from the public and legislators alike."

The legislature's Joint Finance Committee (JFC) will hold hearings around Wisconsin, including Green Bay, in April. Following the public hearings, JFC will amend the budget bill in May and send it to the Assembly and Senate for final passage in June.

"This proposal is missing a decent increase in busing funds, federal timber income for school districts in the national forest, and local control for school choice vouchers," Mursau said. "It's still early, though, and I'll work hard with area citizens, Governor Walker and other legislators to improve education funding for northern Wisconsin."

Time to check if boat registration decals are still valid

MADISON - Time to check boat decals to make sure they're still valid and if they expire March 31, to use one of several convenient ways to renew them, including the one-stop solution of vehicle registration agents, state boat registration officials say.

There are 290 vehicle registration agents in the state, most of them with longer hours and open on more weekends than the Department of Natural Resources customer service center. Boat owners can renew a registration or get a duplicate and walk out with their decal that same day.

"Now is the time to check your decals to make sure they are still valid and if they're expiring, to renew them before the ice goes out so you're ready for the boating fun ahead," says Susan Cook, operations section chief in the DNR Bureau of Customer and Outreach Services.

DNR has sent out 263,000 boat renewal notifications and has emailed 40,000 boat owners with a reminder in the last few weeks. Boat registrations are on a three year cycle; registrations renewed in 2013 will be good until March 31, 2016.

There are several convenient ways to renew, including since 2010 the option of using the vehicle registration agents. Agents include hotels, chambers of commerce, marine supply stores, and the like.

Cook says that boat owners can also renew registration online or by mail. More information on these options and a link to DNR's online licensing center can be found on the DNR website, dnr.wi.gov, by searching keywords "boat registration."







The Bureau of Parks and Recreation will mail you an identification card to be presented each time you visit a state park, forest or recreation area. The park, forest or recreation area will then issue a courtesy pass for the day. When using state trails requiring a trail pass, carry the identification card with you.



Nicolet College to expand Welding lab to meet demand

With local demand for skilled welders at an alltime high, Nicolet College is expanding its Welding lab to accept more students and graduate more welders to meet the workforce needs of area employers.

This spring the lab will grow from 17 workstations to 23, said Nicolet College President Elizabeth Burmaster.

This expansion, recently approved by both the Nicolet College Board of Trustees and the Wisconsin Technical College System Board, is just one in a growing list of recent activities to accommodate more students. Last year the program doubled in size by adding more classes and this year a third section of classes was added to train even more skilled workers.

The college also recently started offering an accelerated sequence of classes that give students the option to graduate in as little as seven months compared to taking the same classes over a full year.

"Area employers have told us they still need more welders so adding more workstations and offering an accelerated sequence of classes were the next best ways for us to meet that demand," said Burmaster, adding that students currently in the Welding program will help construct the new stations.

Nicolet was also recently able to upgrade its welding equipment and hire an additional instructor and academic advisor, thanks to two recent grants totaling \$1.2 million from the state and federal governments.

Along with physical upgrades, the college also revamped curriculum with significant input from area employers.

"We wanted to make sure that the skills taught in our labs and classrooms were an exact fit with what is needed in the workplace," Burmaster said. "By bringing in employers, we were able to hear first-hand about the skill sets they need. We then took this information and updated our curriculum to match those needs."

The curriculum now places a greater emphasis on soft skills such as communication, teamwork, and customer relations.

"Employers told us that these soft skills are vital to a productive and efficient work environment so we included more instruction in these areas as well," Burmaster added.

Ruffed Grouse Society announces 2013 Wisconsin Drummer Fund Projects

Record 15 Projects Approved For Funding

Coraopolis, PA The Ruffed Grouse Society (RGS) has selected 15 projects to receive over \$58,000 during 2013 through its Wisconsin Drummer Fund program. The projects are designed to benefit habitat for ruffed grouse, American woodcock and other wildlife species that rely upon young forests for survival.

Partners receiving RGS funding for projects in Wisconsin in 2013 include county forestry departments in Douglas, Florence, Marathon, Oconto, Washburn, Wood, and Vilas Counties, and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Other partners providing support for these projects include the American Bird Conservancy and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

According to John Eichinger, RGS President and CEO, "2013 is a record year for the Wisconsin Drummer Fund with the most funds being distributed to the highest number of projects that RGS has ever supported in Wisconsin. Our ability to fund these important projects is highly dependent on the dedicated efforts of the volunteer members of our local RGS Chapters in Wisconsin."

The Wisconsin Drummer Fund was initiated in 2010 and is the direct result of funds being raised specifically at Wisconsin RGS chapter fund raising events and through direct member donations. Since its inception, nearly \$157,000 has been made available through the Wisconsin Drummer Fund to support 40 Wisconsin grouse and woodcock projects.
