Two Cents Event held in Wabeno

The School District of Wabeno held another two cents informative meeting on the upcoming vote for an operating referendum. The vote will be held on April 2, 2013.

Kim Odekirk gave a slide show presentation to the public and the school board. The first order of business was to explain why a referendum was needed. Mrs. Odekirk explained that prior to 1993, a school district would have to determine what they needed to spend for the year and levied for the dollar amount needed. From 1993 to the present, revenue limits were put in place and the district would have to adjust expenditures accordingly.

The system in place that regulates revenue sharing is not a favorable one for a declining enrollment. The smaller the enrollment gets, the less revenue the district gets. Wabeno School District is one of the biggest in the area. Some districts have cut non-manditory programs and staff to save cost, other districts have consolidated.

Wisconsin Statewide Point-in-time Count 2013

Homeless Count Results In Forest, Langlade, Oneida And Vilas Counties

The semi-annual Point-in-Time (PIT) count of sheltered and unsheltered populations was held from sunset on January 30, 2013 until sunrise on January 31, 2013. Locally, teams in Antigo, Crandon, Eagle River, Minocqua and Rhinelander were out on the streets in the early morning hours of January 31, 2013 looking for unsheltered people for the PIT count. It was reported that three people were unsheltered that night, two in Antigo and one in Rhinelander. The total sheltered results of the PIT are as follows: Emergency Shelter: six households (six adults and 14 children) and 19 single households (all adults); Transitional Housing: 15 households (17 adults and 26 children).



Raising the Bar through PRIDE at Crandon Elementary

The second quarter Cardinal PRIDE goal of Crandon Elementary was for each classroom to reach at least a 96% attendance rate. Congratulations to Mrs. Keller and Mrs. Marvin's classes which had a 96.34% and 96.51% attendance rate, respectively. Students in these classes enjoyed a tailgate party. Students are well on our way to meeting the third quarter attendance goal of 93%, based on last year's attendance rate (91.5%). Elementary students will also continue to fill their 100's chart and work toward an acknowledgement for the entire school.

The middle school and high school also set goals to decrease the number of tardies during the second quarter. The classes engaged in competition to see which class could have the lowest tardy rate. Congratulations to the juniors for winning the high school competition with a second quarter tardy rate of .079%. The high school PRIDE semester goal was to increase attendance to 92%. Unfortunately the goal was not achieved; however, the attendance did improve from 90.3% last year to 91.56% this year. Congratulations to the sixth grade class for winning the middle school competition with a tardy rate of .55%. The middle school PRIDE semester goal was to increase attendance to 94%. Unfortunately the goal was not achieved; however, the attendance did improve from 92.7% last year to 92.98% this year.

The third quarter goal in the MS/HS is to be the class with the highest overall grade point average (GPA). The semester goal is to reduce tardies by 25% compared to first semester. Coming to school makes a difference!





Planning ahead, such as packing lunches and snacks, is one of the best ways to satisfy appetite and nutritional needs on a busy schedule.

The following are Tips to Eat Right, Your Way, Every Day from the Academy of Nutrition and

- On-the-Job. Busy work days and business travel can lead to on-the-fly meals. For desktop dining, keep singleserve packages of crackers, fruit, peanut butter, lowsodium soup or canned tuna in your desk.
- Always on the go? Tuck portable, nonperishable foods in a purse, briefcase or backpack for a meal on the run. Try granola bars, peanut butter and crackers, fresh fruit, trail mix or single-serve packages of whole-grain cereal or crackers.

Wisconsin Public Service Reports More Instances of Utility Scam

Callers threaten disconnection if payment not made quickly

Green Bay, WI- Scammers posing as utility company employees have been contacting small businesses and residential energy customers of Wisconsin Public Service (WPS) sporadically in a scam that gained widespread notoriety last year as victims surfaced across the country.

Here's the scam: Someone calls customers requesting money for "delinquent accounts," advising that utility payments had not been received. Customers were told that their power would be disconnected immediately, but they were given an hour or two to make payment to avoid the disconnection. A major red flag in this scam is that customers were told to purchase prepaid debit cards and then call back to make payment. Another version is the customer is told to assemble the cash for pickup. WPS will never provide these instructions for making payment on your account.

Threats of immediate disconnection are a sign that customers might have been contacted by a scammer. To confirm suspicions, customers should follow these tips and report the behavior:

Calmly write down any information the caller provides to you. Take note of the call date and time, caller ID, a description of the caller and any details revealed to you by the caller. DO NOT provide any private information or banking information.

Contact your utility to verify this was a legitimate call. If not, call the police to report the scam. Customers who may have been "scammed" in this fashion should contact the police. For More Information, Contact: Media Hotline: 800-977-2250.



Others have had no other option but to ask for an operating referendum. Laona, Phelps, White Lake and Florence have already passed an operating referendum. These are all schools in the same conference.

Wabeno School District has already taken action to delay a referendum. They had applied for and received grants such as, SAGE, Impact Aid, Microsoft Settlement, Teacher Mentoring, Teen Institute and also Forest County Potawatomi Grants. The district has also saved by cutting costs. They have received help from volunteers, community organizations, reduced staff, condensed bus routes, cut days on activity bus schedule, changed employee benefits and use energy saving practices. Mrs. Odekirk also explained that the district has utilized the fund balance, but that if you deplete the fund balance too much, the district will not be self sufficient and would depend on borrowing.

If the operating referendum passes, it will mean that for every \$1,000.00 of equalized value, the mill rate will raise from \$6.17 this year to \$6.73 next year or if your home is valued at \$50,000.00, your taxes will increase \$28.00, \$54.00 increase for a home valued at \$100,000 and \$84.00 if your home is valued at \$150,000. The school board maintains that they want to keep the mill rate as low as possible for the taxpayers.

If the operating referendum does not pass, the district will try again, they will also cut the non-manditory classes and staff will be cut causing bigger classes. The meeting ended with Mrs. Odekirk expressing to the crowd that no matter what happens, the Wabeno School District will strive to be the best learning environment for the students, teachers and staff.



From the Humane Society:

Since its founding in 1996 the Forest County Humane Society has provided a facility where the abused, abandoned, neglected and injured animals of Forest County are medically treated and can live until they are adopted to a "furr-ever" home". For sixteen of the last seventeen years the county government has provided zero support to the shelter. Some county board members have even expressed the opinion that "if we don't support the shelter then we are not responsible for the shelter". This opinion is rampant through the county government although they continue to use the capabilities of the Humane Society.

The annual budget of the Humane Society for 2012 was in excess of \$92,000. The greatest expense associated with the Humane Society was veterinary bills, which were in excess of \$20,000 for FY 2012. These bills were necessary in order to provide medical care for injured animals when ownership is not known or accepted. We have received some minor donations from individuals and small townships but they do not offset the large costs associated with operating a Humane Society. The largest townships and most financially secure in the county will not provide any form of financial support to the Humane Society.

Residents of Forest County may have heard that in past years the shelter had several thousand dollars in surplus funds, which would have been true. However since 2005 the surplus has been depleted at a rate of \$17000-\$20000 per year. We now have enough funds to operate for approximately 4-5 months thanks to donations from the Mole Lake Tribal government and the City of Crandon. After these funds are depleted our shelter will be forced to close and Forest County will be the only county in Wisconsin without a Humane Society. I have already brought this to the attention of the Forest County board. After nearly six months of negotiations with county officials over support for the shelter we have accomplished nothing.

The county government continues to state that the enforcement of WI Animal laws is the responsibility of the township governments and not the county government. It is for this reason and the desire to ensure survival of the Humane Society that we are being forced to change our protocol.

Effective 03-01-2013 the Forest County Humane Society became a Pay for Service organization. Any township that signs a Pay for Service contract with the Forest County Humane Society will receive the services outlined in that contract. Any township that refuses or neglects to sign the contract will no longer be able to utilize the services of the Humane Society. Those townships not utilizing the services of the Humane Society will have to care for the abandoned, abused and mistreated animals in their own township in accordance with WI State law. This will include the need for housing and veterinary care for the abandoned, neglected and injured animals in their townships. The Humane Society will no longer provide care or accept animals coming from townships of Forest County that refuse to participate in this Fee for Service program.

If you should have questions regarding your township responsibilities in enforcement of WI animal control laws then I suggest that you contact the Forest County board or your township supervisor. The Humane Society can no longer provide free services to the residents of Forest County if we want to survive. The Humane Society will notify the public identifying those townships that will receive our services and those that will not. Hopefully the Humane Society will be able to provide support to your township with your help.

This year, Northern Wisconsin Initiative to Stop Homelessness (N*WISH) Continuum of Care partnered with St. Augustine's Episcopal Church for the PIT Count to raise awareness of homelessness and provide community resources to people who attended The Table for dinner that evening. The Table is a free community meal offered all

community members on the last two days of each month at St. Augustine's Episcopal Church in Rhinelander. The Table was well attended despite the winter storm that was in full force that evening.

The PIT count is a state-wide effort to find out how many people are experiencing homelessness during a designated one-night period. 

GED students encouraged to finish tests this year

New tests coming in 2014

Anyone working on their GED is strongly encouraged to finish the five-test sequence by the end of 2013 or face the prospect of starting over next year.

"The national organization that administers the GED program will implement a series of new tests in 2014 that will be required to earn this academic credential that's equivalent to a high school diploma," said Jim Begotka, director of Learner Success at Nicolet College. "We want to make sure that anyone who has started their GED knows about these changes so they can finish their GED by the end of the year. This is the only way students will get credit for work they've already completed."

He added that Nicolet offers free GED preparation classes throughout the Northwoods to help students better prepare and successfully complete the GED tests. These classes, offered through the college's Academic Success department, are held on the Nicolet Campus just south of Rhinelander, in the Curran Building in downtown Rhinelander, and in numerous other communities including Minocqua, Eagle River, Tomahawk, Lac du Flambeau, Crandon, Carter and Mole Lake.

"Earning a GED is important in many different ways," Begotka said. "It opens the door to college, better and higher paying jobs, and the personal sense of accomplishment that comes from earning this valuable academic credential."

Annually, more than 200 students earn their GED or HSED through Nicolet College's Academic Success program.

He also said individuals need to beware of the scams related to GEDs. "The Wisconsin technical colleges are the only institutions that can offer official GED testing," he noted.

Nicolet College offers the GED test on paper and now also in computer-based formats. If an individual does not meet the minimum required score, students can retake the test for free. This only applies to the computer-based testing option.

The white letters are larger than the old lettering and the blue background is more reflective than the old yellow background, making the new signs easier to read both day and night. The new signs are also fully compliant with federal standards, assuring their use for many years to come. I also helped with the inspecting and rating of our roads to meet state requirements, and wrote a grant application that was successful in getting just under \$18,000 extra dollars for our road maintenance program.

I took on the power company due to the many outages in our area during high winds. I complained to the state, then sat down with power company officials to discuss causes, options, and people's changing expectations. I was very pleased to read in the newspaper last fall that WPS has now embarked on a multi-year system modernization and reliability project in our area. They will address 200 to 300 miles of electric distribution lines in northeast Wisconsin each year for five years beginning in 2014.

I have not only inspected the roads in Townsend, but our buildings, dams, parks, and other facilities as well. When we needed a new roof on our public works garage last year, I asked that the project be let to competitive bid, rather than only obtaining one quote. That move saved the taxpayers of Townsend close to \$6,000 on that project.

My civil engineering education and experience has helped with the maintenance and construction of our roads, bridges, buildings, and dams. My supervisory and managerial experience has helped as we balanced our budget, kept taxes down and tried to balance our purchases and programs between our various departments. We've hired new employees and purchased new equipment to improve our service. All while keeping taxes down.

I have attended not only every Townsend Town Board meeting during my term, but also every six town meeting, every county informational meeting, and every regional and district meeting of the Wisconsin Town's Association. I have also attended training sessions and promoted training for our town employees. That employee training has already enhanced the way our employees perform their daily tasks.





Secrets To An Even Easier Slimdown

Women who trade processed fare for nutrient-dense whole foods can lose up to 7 pounds a week! This way of eating will also give you a greater sense of vitality, says Pamela Peeke, M.D. Better still, it can cut the risk of major health concerns like diabetes, heart disease, cancer and more.

But while the results will be well worth the effort, successful slimmers report that adjusting to this plan can be difficult, as the urge to eat hyper-palatable foods can be intense in the beginning. The biggest problem, they say, is that stress and cravings can cause you to reach for the sugary, fatty foods that will pull your brain back into a weight-gain cycle. To prevent this, Dr. Peeke recommends several strategies that will strengthen your resolve in the moment, while building the prefrontal cortex and rebalancing dopamine levels for longterm success.

Obstacle: Stress

We've all been there: A chaotic day has us feeling exhausted and on edge, and suddenly - without even really making a conscious decision to do so - we find ourselves pulling up to the drive-through window or standing at the kitchen counter dishing out a bowl of Ben & Jerry's and feeling as if that food is the only thing that can pull us out of our funk. According to Dr. Peeke, finding a way to deal with life's stresses without resorting to a destructive habit, like overloading on calories, is the key to breaking free from any addiction. And as researchers have discovered, a few mind-body strategies can trigger the same brain response as that ice cream or cheeseburger - without the health-harming downsides. The best part: The feel-good fix kicks in instantly.

Correct Your Inner Voice

A new study in the Journal of Consumer Research points to an amazingly effective and surprisingly easy - way to outsmart cravings when a jam-packed schedule or uncomfortable situation has you reaching for a mouthful of comfort. Researchers at the University of Houston in Texas found that when women were trying to resist tempting foods, 80 percent who said "I don't eat that" were successful, compared with only 10 percent of those who said "I can't eat that". According to study author Vanessa Patrick, Ph.D., the words "I can't" subconsciously signal the brain that you're bypassing something desirable, while the words "I don't" increase self-awareness and convey a decisive, empowering choice (and putting yourself in that powerful position further strengthens the prefrontal cortex, making it easier to say no each time temptation strikes.)

Obstacle: Cravings

One of the reasons some people find that breaking free from a food addiction can be trickier than quitting cigarettes, or even drugs, is that most people are addicted to one of the three combinations of flavors: sweet-fat, fat-starchy or savory-salty-starchy. "With drugs, you have one substance that triggers one kind of 'pure' brain response, but with flavor combinations, you're being hit with a variety of layered rewards, such as smooth, sweet, salty and crunchy," Dr. Peeke explains. "These elicit more complex biochemical brain changes that can make them much more difficult to break away from.

It doesn't help that we have such easy access to goodies that will satisfy those cravings - food manufacturers and restaurant chains make sure the items they sell contain the flavor combos that keep us coming back for more. And while you won't feel as drawn to these foods after three to four weeks on Dr. Peeke's plan, you may need a little help dealing with any intense cravings that strike in the meantime.


