Sylvester Schaenzer to hit the century mark on April 12



Wabeno's Sylvester Schaenzer will turn 100 years-of-age on April 12th. He will be honored for his longevity and his contributions to the community at an Open House at Madonna Hall, behind St. Ambrose Catholic Church, in Wabeno, on Saturday April 13th from 2:00 until 5:00 p.m. Your presence is the only gift he requests.

Sylvester is a true Forest County and Wabeno native. He was born on the family farm on County H in 1913. His father, Joseph Schaenzer, was from Kewaskum, and he clerked in a store there. After a bout of Typhus, he became overweight and wanted a more active life. Joseph Schaenzer chose a very active lifestyle, as he bought cutover land from the C&NW Railroad and began stumping and picking rocks to make a farm. Sylvester was born on that farm.

When asked of his first memory, he thinks it is when he was outside and couldn't get in the house. He thinks he was age two. He said he put up a fuss and tipped a slop bucket of dishwater on himself, so when someone came to let him in, they put him right back outside!

He worked on the farm after graduation from Wabeno High School in 1931. Sylvester said he graduated 4th in a class of 42 students. He stayed on the farm and eventually took over the farm.

Sylvester was one of the farm kids who took the UW-Madison short Agriculture Course. The course was a two-year program. He graduated from the UW course in 1937. He showed me his diploma and the composite picture of his classmates from across the state.

Sylvester eventually dropped the farming and took up logging. His first job was on County H, where he bought 80 acres of timber and logged it off, selling the logs and bolts to Connor Lumber & Land Co.

Alice Neider consented to be his bride, and they were married for 52 years. Alice passed about five years ago. She was 94. The Schaenzers had one son, George, who is a Doctor in Duluth. They have one granddaughter, of whom Sylvester is very proud. Ann is a student at the University of Minnesota at St. Cloud. Sylvester pointed out that Ann is 80 years and one month younger than him.







Sylvester was an active guy. He was town treasurer for Wabeno for 32 years, and took the job over from his father who held it for 30 years. He helped start the Rescue Squad in Wabeno and is one of the original EMTs, taking over 200 calls when he was an active member. Alice and Sylvester also traveled in their spare time, visiting all of the states except Hawaii and Rhode Island.

Besides logging, he planted trees for the Forest Service, was sexton for the cemetery, a Boy Scout leader, and did income taxes for about ten years. He is a faithful member of St. Ambrose and goes to church weekly with

Sylvester said it gets a little lonely, but he likes to watch birds in his feeder. While I was there, a flock of wild turkeys visited his yard. He reads and plays Skip-bo. He said his son, George, calls every day and tries to visit once a month. He enjoys going to events and festivities and likes to go out to eat. He also likes to take daily walks and enjoys visitors. He lives at his home on Folkman St.

He said that when he and Alice married, they both said they wanted to live until they were eighty yearsold. They both exceeded their expectations.

INFORMATION TO ELECTORS

Upon entering the polling place, an elector shall state his or her name and address before being permitted to vote. If an elector is not registered to vote, an elector may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence if the elector presents proof of identification in a form specified by law unless the elector is exempted from this requirement, and, if the document presented does not constitute proof of residence, the elector provides proof of residence. Where ballots are distributed to electors, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the elector shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot except that an elector who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the elector's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the elector of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

On referenda questions, where paper ballots are used, the elector shall make a cross (X) in the square at the right of "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall make a cross (X) in the square at the right of "no" if opposed to the

On referenda questions, where optical scan voting systems are used, the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question

On referenda questions, where touch screen voting systems are used, the elector shall depress the button next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall depress the button next to "no" if opposed to the question. The vote should not be cast in any other manner. If the elector spoils a paper or optical scan ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one elector. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the elector shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place. The elector may spoil a touch screen ballot at the voting station, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one elector. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the elector in casting his or her vote may be taken into the booth and

copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked. After casting his or her vote, the elector shall leave the voting booth, properly deposit the ballot and promptly leave the polling place.

After an official paper ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspectors' initials on the outside do show. The elector shall then deposit his folded ballot in the proper ballot box, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit.

After an official ontical scan ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. The elector shall then insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the elector shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit.

After an official touch screen ballot is marked, the elector shall leave the polling place promptly.

An elector may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the elector declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the elector's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the elector.

For the past several years, in response to revenue limits and declining enrollment, the School District of Wabeno Area has reduced its operating budget. Essentially, over a million dollars has already been cut out of the school budget. These cuts and changes have included: condensing bus routes, reducing activity buses, reducing the after-school homework program, eliminating driver's education, changing employee benefits, and reducing staff (special education teacher, technology education her, business education teacher, librarian, social studies teacher, guidance counselor, secretary, summer custodial staff, study hall aides, kitchen staff, bus driver).

If the referendum does not pass on April 2, 2013, the district would try again. However, considerations for more cuts and reductions will need to be made. Areas that would be considered for cuts would be extracurricular activities and sports, school lunch program, instructional aides, teachers (increasing class sizes in both buildings and eliminating some electives such as Music. Art. Technology Education, Family and Consumer Education), and administrators. These additional cuts could cause more families to consider open-enrolling out of our district, which would push our enrollment into further decline.

Many school districts around the state have utilized operating referendums for several years. The School District of Wabeno Area has delayed the need for the referendum as long as possible. In order to continue to maintain the current programs and opportunities for our students, the referendum is necessary. The school district needs and appreciates the support from our families, businesses and communities.
