Wabeno School referendum not approved by voters

The Wabeno School referendum failed by a count of 521 yes votes versus 555 no votes. This sets the date for another referendum next year.

The school board had a meeting on Wednesday evening, and this is written in the afternoon, so the adjustments made by the board cannot make this paper. However, the board will likely have to dip into savings and cut back on activities at the Wabeno schools.

The failure of the referendum will leave the Wabeno Area School District about \$6-800,000 short on funding.

Goodman-Armstrong Creek PTO smelt fry April 7

Whether snow has melted or not, back once more is the Goodman-Armstrong Creek Parent-Teacher Organization's annual spring smelt feed and fundraiser which occurs Sunday April 7 at Rocque's 8-HI Club just east of Goodman. The all-you-can-eat-smelt and fry from noon to 5 p.m. features the silver fish, cleaned and lightly breaded, homemade (raw) fries, peeled and cut by members and friends, plus baked beans, coleslaw, and desserts.

Takeouts will be available. The prices vary according to age. The basic cost for anyone in their teens on up is \$7. Ages 5-12 will be charged \$4 for a fish or hot dog plate. For those age four and under, a special fish or hot dog meal will be available for \$2. Coffee and other refreshments will be available for purchase.

In addition to the smelt fry, the raffle wheel with Kevin Rocque at the helm will be turning all afternoon. Raffleing off the donated prizes will begin an hour or so after the start time. Last year, people arrived early and stood in line before the event began. PTO member Lynn Stankevich said they tried to accommodate as much as they could, but volunteer help won't be there in time to serve before noon. Early arrivals should expect to wait.

Of the donated items for the raffle wheel, one large prize is a package of meat, either pork or beef, that includes a variety of cuts. Another big item during the afternoon is what normally is a 50-50 drawing. The event calls for a 50-25-25 drawing with half going to the organization and the money going to two winners instead of one. Stankevich said that if anyone has an item or two to donate, they can bring it to the 8-HI Club ahead of time. Otherwise, PTO members will be out collecting and picking up. All the proceeds go to the school and its programs and children's educational opportunities.

2013 County Health Rankings released

The health factors examined in the *County Health Rankings* go well beyond medical care and include our health behaviors, social and economic conditions and the physical environment in which we live. The health outcomes measured include how long people live (mortality) and to what degree they report feeling healthy (morbidity). Rankings are published online at www.countyhealthrankings.com by the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The Rankings allow people to see how their county compares with others in their state and against national benchmarks. It is the only tool of its kind that measures the overall health of counties in all 50 states.

The 2013 County Health Rankings confirm the critical role that factors such as education, jobs, income, environment and access to health care play in how healthy people are and how long they live. The Rankings place Forest County at 68 out of 72 Wisconsin counties in overall health.

When we look at health behaviors, such as smoking, obesity, physical inactivity, drinking, vehicle crashes, teen birth rate, and sexually transmitted infections, Forest County ranks 59th out of 72. The Rankings also indicate that Forest County is at-risk for poor health when it comes to social and economic factors that affect health, such as poverty rates, unemployment, high school graduation rates, and the number of children in single parent households, where it ranked 62nd.

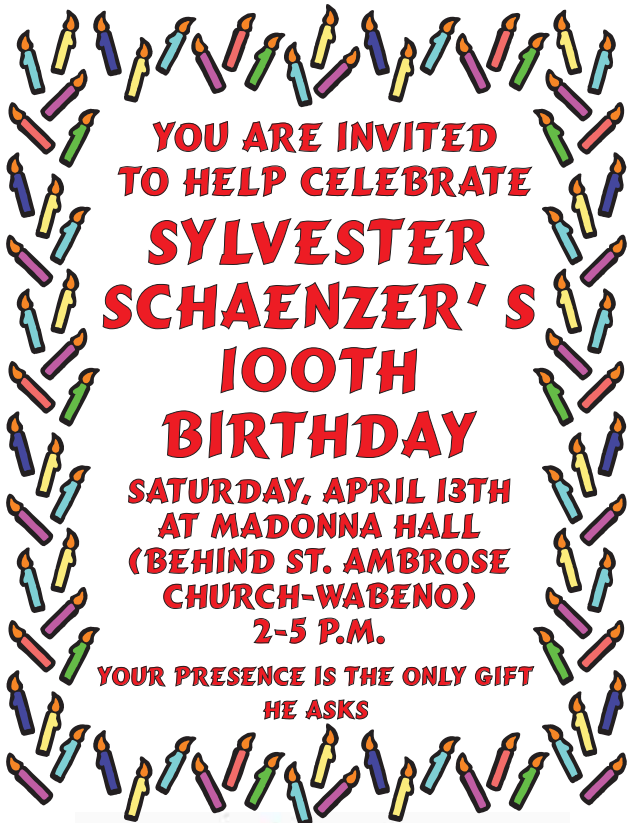

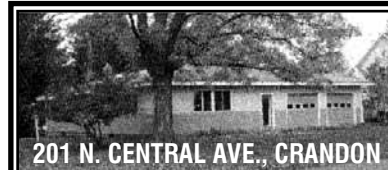

Wisconsin Lifeline

This program can help low-income customers reduce their telephone bills.

Lifeline makes telephone service more affordable for income-eligible households by reducing the basic monthly charge for one telephone line.

How Much Can I Save Per Month? Lifeline will generally reduce the cost of monthly telephone service for eligible households by \$10.00. If the cost of monthly traditional telephone service is more than \$25.00, a credit will be issued so that the monthly charge is no more than \$15 for a basic residential line, 120 local calls, 911 costs and the Federal Subscriber Line Charge (SLC).

Lifeline customers who choose a prepaid wireless service will receive a set number of minutes each month (at no charge) equivalent to the \$10.00 credit on landline services. Additional charges will apply if you have higher usage.

Lifeline Providers: More wireline and wireless providers offer a **Lifeline** service. A list of **Lifeline** Providers can be found on the Public Service Commission website at <http://psc.wi.gov/Lifeline>.

How Do I Apply? First, contact your telephone service provider and ask to apply for **Lifeline** assistance for Wisconsin residents. The service provider will need to verify that you are eligible.

If you are currently receiving benefits from one of the programs listed below, but your **Lifeline** application was denied, contact your case worker of county benefits specialist.

NOTE: If you are getting a **Lifeline** service from one provider, you cannot also get **Lifeline** from another provider. For instance, if you have a **Lifeline** service in your home, you are not eligible to also get a **Lifeline** supported pre-paid wireless service.

Who is Eligible to Participate in Lifeline?

Eligible customers include those that receive benefits from:

- Wisconsin Homestead Tax Credit (Schedule H)
- Wisconsin Works (W2)
- Medical Assistance (MA)
- Badger Care
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Food Stamps
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- TANF
- National School Lunch Program

Residents of tribal lands may also qualify for **Lifeline** and **Link-Up** (assistance with the cost of initially getting telephone service) by participating in a federal tribal assistance program and may be eligible for additional credits. Please contact your Tribal Authority for additional information.

When I quit the Forest County Humane Society (FCHS) less than a year ago, people started dropping kittens off at our place. I guess they knew I love cats and that they would be well cared for - and they are!

In about October, a litter of 6 were dropped off, then a litter of 4 and occasionally 2, 3 or more would appear. I've kept them warm and fed, hoping to do a catch and release program, at my own expense.

Today, March 23rd, was a very sad day! I found "Little Sox", a male cat about 6 months old, dead in the Kitty Lair.

Every morning and evening he greeted me. Rolling over and over, purring as I gave him a friendly head scratch and held him. He was totally adoptable and was scheduled, next month, to be neutered and get his shots.

These are not feral cats, they're "drop offs" and "throw aways". The FCHS is usually over loaded with cats. However, other shelters will take them.

This little cat looked as though he had been poisoned. I've seen it before. I worked with the shelter since it started on short County S.

How sad, the things people do to animals. As though they have no feelings! Do some of you people ever think just maybe your animals could also get into this poison? Or worse yet, a curious child?! Oh yeah! If it's out there, every animal who gets loose, by accident or otherwise, has access.

Don't abandon unwanted animals. Call Animal Rescue Hotline at 1-800-282-8911.

Remember the case a few years back. When some young people pretended to adopt cats from the shelter, not ours, took them to a dump, soaked them with gasoline and set them on fire?! Unforgivable! They should have had the same treatment. But I know that's not possible! One of the vets still has one cat who survived. He has no tail and is badly scared but is still alive and doing well. Do good, you'll be rewarded. Do bad, it comes back to haunt you!

Also, we now have a new program out there. "The Fix Is In" to spay or neuter your pets. At a more than reasonable rate. Call 715-550-7729 or go to www.thefixisin.org to make appointments or for more information.

Thank you and remember, be kind - it pays!

One area where Forest County does have some strength is in the physical environment area, where it ranked 26 out of 72. Good air and water quality are areas where the county scored well, while improvement is needed in access to healthy foods and recreational facilities.

The Rankings give us information we can use to work together to take action, so we can implement programs and policy changes that improve health in Forest County. Forest County has several coalitions and agencies that are addressing the issues noted above.

Forest County CAN's main goals are to increase opportunities for people to exercise and eat healthier. We know that people who live in areas with lots of walking paths and have access to exercise facilities are more likely to be physically active. And, people with access to grocery stores and local farmers' markets are more likely to eat healthier, nutritious foods. Some exciting news this past year is the new Cardinal Walking Path at the Crandon High School and the Fitness Boot Camps by Paul Limon that are happening through out the community.

The Forest County Partnership Coalition will be celebrating their 25th year of serving Forest County youth. They have focused on providing all day prevention conferences for 8th and 11th graders. The students receive information on healthy eating, alcohol and drug awareness and prevention, sexual and reproductive health education and much more. Recently the Coalition is sponsoring cyber bullying presentations at all of the schools.

The Community Coalition of Forest County is another group of community leaders who are focused on improving health. The group has subcommittees looking at improving community norms, decreasing alcohol and drug use, and promoting healthy lifestyles. This group supports Teen Court and Parents Who Host Lose the Most Campaign.

Wisconsin's 'absolute Sobriety Law' means Not A Drop Of Alcohol For Drivers Under Age 21

With the start of the high school prom season and graduation parties soon to follow, the State Patrol and other law enforcement agencies are reminding young motorists and their parents about Wisconsin's Absolute Sobriety Law for drivers under age 21.

The law is quite simple. Absolute sobriety for drivers under age 21 means they may not consume any amount of alcohol—not even a drop—and legally operate a motor vehicle.

Young drivers convicted of violating Wisconsin's Absolute Sobriety Law will have their license suspended for three months. They also will have to pay a \$389.50 citation and will have four demerit points assessed on their license.

"At any age, alcohol even in small amounts may impair the mental and physical skills needed to drive safely, such as decision-making, concentration, coordination and reaction time. However, teens and young people, who often are inexperienced drivers, are especially susceptible to the adverse effects of alcohol on their driving ability," says Wisconsin State Patrol Captain Nicholas R. Wanink of the North Central Region. "Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death for young people in Wisconsin. And as the prom and graduation party season begins, we don't want young drivers or their passengers to suffer serious injuries or tragic deaths because of a disastrous decision, such as getting behind the wheel after drinking."
