songs.







Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest Opinion Editorial from Forest Supervisor Paul Strong

"Reflecting on 80 Years of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest"

Rhinelander, Wis., April 18, 2013 By Paul Strong, CNNF Forest Supervisor- In 2013 the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) is celebrating its 80th anniversary of establishment in Wisconsin and the beginning of its conservation through wise use and restoration. The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) is also celebrating its 80 year anniversary, and the history of these two government programs is inextricably linked.

Together, the Forest Service and the CCC's replanted cutover and burned over lands, repaired soil erosion damage, built roads and trails, and constructed fire towers, campgrounds, picnic areas, and accesses to lakes and rivers. The CCC "boys" and the early employees of the Forest Service got the ball rolling during the first 10 years. For the last 70 years, Forest Service employees, partners, and communities have kept it going.

As we view the heavily forested landscape of northern Wisconsin today, it is hard to imagine what the communities and undeveloped lands looked and felt like then. Recovery from the Great Depression was starting, but unemployment was high and demand for forest products had plummeted. Many businesses which had thrived during the brief period of cut and run logging were gone. Lands on which ill-fated agricultural attempts had been made were being abandoned. A series of drought years had left forests and logging slash dry. Hundreds of thousands of acres of land were burning annually. Communities were struggling to survive.

Under the provisions of the Weeks Act and Clarke-McNary Act, on the lands which were purchased to become the national forest, work began on the restoration of soils, waters, and forests to protect watersheds and make forest lands productive for timber. Eighty years of restoration and wise use has resulted in lands much better poised to provide goods and services and to remain resilient in the face of uncertain future conditions.

The Forest Service has always been an agency which uses a "partnership model" to get its work done. The CCC was our first significant partner. Since then, under authorities provided us by Congress, we leverage the annual appropriations which fund our agency to accomplish more work and to provide greater value to the citizens of America whose forests these are.

In 2012, numerous partners provided nearly \$1.5 million of additional capacity to the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest through volunteer work, in-kind services, and cash. Some of the partners include federally recognized tribes, the State of Wisconsin, colleges and universities, local governments, and non-profit organizations like the Ruffed Grouse Society and Trout Unlimited. Additionally, the CNNF partners with entities which coordinate efforts across larger geographies and multiple owners. For example, we are part of Cooperative Weed Management Area Councils and work with recreation groups like the Chequamegon Area Mountain Bike Association and the Wisconsin ATV association on trail development and maintenance.

There is a need to expand and accelerate important conservation work on the CNNF and we are constantly exploring new partnership opportunities and other legal ways to stretch the appropriated funds we receive. One of the most promising ways is through "stewardship contracting" which allows us to enter agreements or contracts with entities which will trade the completion of on-the-ground conservation work for the value of timber sales we offer.

Timber sales help us meet some of the conservation goals in our comprehensive land management plan and the service work helps meet other Our knowledge and use of this Wabeno, four daughters: Kathryn (Bob) Lind of authority is growing. We are pleased to have recently been Minneapolis, MN, Rhea (Dick) Teteak of Madison, WI, Susan approved to move forward on a Stewardship project in (Tom) Zwickel of Chippewa Falls, WI, and Lisa (Roy) Myles Bayfield County which engaged local government officials and interested citizens in designing projects that will improve key roads, soil erosion, and streams in exchange for timber that can be sold to meet other healthy forest conservation goals.

As the Forest Supervisor on the CNNF, I have the privilege of working with and representing the CNNF employees who pour their hearts and souls into the important work of making sure these lands and resources are used wisely and are sustainable into the future. These are high integrity individuals who follow the regulations and policies which govern our business, but who also are constantly striving to find more efficient and creative ways to accomplish our work. They live in the many towns and villages in the 11 counties where national forest lands are located. Their children attend schools in these areas. Nutrition Bars a Healthy Snack?

Originally created for competitive athletes, nutrition bars are now heavily marketed as healthy food alternatives. You'll find dozens of varieties claiming some effect, such as high-energy, high-protein, low-carb, mealreplacement and brain boosting.

Many bars offer convenience when you're on the run, tied to work or stuck on a plane. But frequently relying on them to the exclusion of healthier whole foods may not be smart. Plus, bars are relatively expensive and some brands are no more healthful than a candy bar, advises the American Dietetic Association.

As an occasional snack, some bars are a better nutritional value than chips or cookies. Check the labels, especially if you're counting calories. The best bars have 10-15 grams of protein, such as soy; 35% of the RDA's for vitamins and minerals; 3-5 grams of fiber; and 5 grams or less of fat per 230 calories. Tip: Have some real food along with your bar - a piece of fruit or carrot sticks.

Sunlight for good health?

The sun helps us make vitamin D, the sunshine vitamin, which is essential for healthy teeth and bones, heart health and better immunity. Recent studies show vitamin D may help reduce risk for certain cancers.

Very little sun exposure is needed to stimulate production of vitamin D: 10-15 minutes twice a week to the face, arms, legs or back without sunscreen is usually enough. Infants and sun-sensitive folks, however, need to stay out of direct sunlight.

After your sun time is up, apply a sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or more to prevent sun damage. Accumulation of sun exposure over years can accelerate visible skin aging and lead to skin cancer.

The best source of vitamin D is food: milk, soymilk, orange juice, and some ready-to-eat cereals. Vitamin D supplements are an option to discuss with your





The **Bobcat Meeting**

Last Thursday evening, about twenty hunters with an interest in hunting bobcats, met with John Olson, who is charged with managing furbearing animals by his employer, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Olson says his job is to provide maximum hunting opportunities while protecting the resource.

The meeting in the CHS auditorium was attended by interested people, mostly from Crandon, Laona, Gleason and Tomahawk. The meeting was facilitated by State Senator Tom Tiffany. The reason for the meeting is that bobcat hunters feel there are more bobcats than the number that is reflected by DNR quotas on bobcat hunting. The limit per hunter is one bobcat to a hunter who has waited for his turn, and the season runs from October 15th until June 31st.

Olson started with a slide show that outlined the science used by the DNR to determine populations and subsequently the quotas. Olson said that the bobcat is an animal that is long-lived and has low rates of reproduction and a low natural mortality rate. The harvest area for the bobcat is roughly the northern one-third of the state, and the animal is potentially vulnerable to over-harvest. He said that the population goal for the management area is 2,500 animals, give or take 500.

Olson said that managing bobcat populations can be difficult, as detection of animals and counting is quite difficult. A winter track count is used, and two transits per county are run ten miles apart. The transits are run in aspen and balsam habitat, and the transits are also on lightly traveled roads.

Work is also done on bobcat carcasses to determine the age and sex of the harvested animals. A canine tooth is pulled and used to determine age. If a female carcass is examined, placental scars left by fetal attachment are checked to determine how many pregnancies and the size of litters. This, along with track surveys, provide the data used to estimate populations.

The pre-season of 2012 showed a population of only 1,700 animals, which lead to lower quotas for hunters. All carcasses are checked, and in recent times, more males have been harvested. This leads to the question of whether hunters and trappers are trying for larger males or is there is a decrease in juveniles.

The goal of the DNR is to take about 12% of the estimated population, but in recent vears, it appears that about 15% has been harvested. This leads to smaller quotas with about fifteen applications per permit in 2010.

Olson said that there was a hunter success rate of ten percent until the year 2,000. But, that rate has climbed to 50% now. The science says to decrease quotas.

Like those in attendance, Olson says he too has seen a lot of bobcat sign, but the DNR has to harvest by scientific methods.

There were a number of suggestions and arguments offered. One is to increase the size of the bobcat hunting territory to the south in Wisconsin, and another suggestion is to have a reciprocity with Michigan on our northern border.

While the numbers of cats seem to be increasing in the central part of the state, Olson says we have to act conservatively. He pointed out that the anti-hunting and trapping gang almost stopped bobcat hunting completely, but a court case was won because there was sufficient scientific data to convince a judge that bobcat populations would remain stable with hunting and trapping in place. Without sufficient data on bobcat numbers to the south of us, animal rights activists could win in court, causing a waste of money and time.

Discussion from the floor was in disagreement with bobcat stats compiled the DNR. They cited the time they spent in the woods and the proliferation of cat tracks wherever they hunt coyotes. They were also critical of the amount of miles used in the track surveys, and thought there should be more miles of scouting for tracks. It was a lively and civil discussion, with Olson often agreeing with the audience.

Olson suggested another method of determining bobcat numbers that hunters and trappers could participate in, and that was the use of trail-cams to count bobcats. A member of the audience agreed, and said, "Let's get moving."

Olson says that most biologists think there are bobcats out in the woods, here and in the central part of the state, but what is lacking is research.

USDA Proposes Simplified Application Process for Renewable Energy Funding

WASHINGTON, April 15, 2013 -The U.S. Department of Agriculture has proposed a series of changes to make it easier for agricultural producers and rural small businesses to apply for renewable energy and energy efficiency funding. USDA remains focused on carrying out its mission, despite a time of significant budget uncertainty. Today's announcement is one part of the Department's efforts to strengthen the rural economy.

These changes are intended to help agricultural producers and rural small businesses throughout America," Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack said. "They will streamline and simplify the application process and give businesses more time to do what they do best: innovate, create jobs and serve their rural communities."

The proposed changes would affect applications for loans and grants through USDA Rural Development's Rural Energy for America Program (REAP). They would:

- · Reduce paperwork, especially for projects under \$80,000;
- · Implement a more objective and uniform system to score applications;
- · Authorize funding for refurbished and retrofitted renewable energy systems;
- · Reduce certain reporting requirements;
- Establish a quarterly application period for applicants seeking only guaranteed loans. This change is intended to make the program more appealing to lenders and to ensure that funds are available year-round.

REAP is one of USDA's most popular renewable energy and energy efficiency programs. From the passage of the 2008 Farm Bill through the end of Fiscal Year 2012, REAP funded more than 6,800 renewable energy and energy efficiency projects, feasibility studies, energy audits and renewable energy development assistance

In 2012, for example, USDA Rural Development provided ARC Technology of Whitewater, Kan., a \$9,945 REAP grant to assist with installing a 12.2 kilowatt solar array. As a direct result of the USDA grant, the company expects to save approximately \$1,300 per year on its electric bill and see a return on its investment in only two years.

Additionally, Sheriff Dennee has instructed his deputies to spend more time, as allowed, in and around Forest County schools, not only to familiarize themselves with the design and general layout of each school, but also to show a law enforcement presence at the schools

The Sheriff's Special Emergency Response Team has also recently participated in an active shooter scenario training held at the Rhinelander High School. This training, which involved several different area law enforcement agencies, also served as an opportunity for those agencies to share information, ideas and response tactics.

Sheriff Dennee stated that he is working to organize and implement a similar training in all Forest County schools during the upcoming summer months to reinforce the strategies required to quickly and effectively respond in the event of a school shooting. By working closely with educators to share pertinent information on this very sensitive, but all-to-real subject, the ultimate goal is for local law enforcement to work mutually, efficiently, and spontaneously with school officials as a well-organized team, should the unimaginable ever happen here.

- Any type of suspension 3.
- Receiving a grade/s of "D" or "F" at all grade 4. check times. Grade checks will be done every three weeks.
- Truancy issues 5.

Students earn the privilege to gain Honor Status! If status is lost, it can be regained at the beginning of the next quarter. Attendance and behavior standards must be met to maintain Honor Status!

National Forest to Delay Opening of Campgrounds and Recreational Trails

Recreational trails across the CNNF will also be opening later than usual. All trails will be closed due to the snow pack and wet conditions until approximately May 17. Trails on the Lakewood-Laona District will open on May 10 if conditions allow.

Conditions for both campgrounds and trails will be assessed on a regular basis. If there are changes allowing for earlier openings we will notify the public right

"We ask for the public's understanding with this delay. During a normal spring we get all the campgrounds open in time for the opening of fishing season, unfortunately Mother Nature is just not going along with that plan this year. We know this can make it hard for visitors to plan ahead and we will keep people up to date on changing conditions." said Forest Supervisor, Paul Strong.
