Nothing I have ever done could come close to warranting this kind of support.

One hundred days in the hospital gives a person time to think. For the last 40 years, I've complained about the only job that I ever wanted to do. I've been married to the only girl that I've ever truly loved and I couldn't have hand picked better children or been blessed with three better grandsons. By the grace of God, I accumulated the best employees ever possible; ones who made me look like a businessman. I also accumulated thousands of wonderful friends. And on top of all of that, I was given this great benefit, which was possible because of the thousands of dollars worth of donations.

Lincoln said, "Do as much good as you can, as often as you can, and to as many people as you can." It's not done for any reward, but they always seem to show up instantaneously.

I've kind of tried to live my life like Lincoln said. (Occasionally things backfired.)

I wish I could thank each and every one of you individually for the cards, the prayers, and the well wishes, but that's impossible.

At this writing, I'm in the Wausau hospital. I don't know what this week is going to bring. But I can truly tell you, these have been the thoughts that have kept me going.

By the way, I sat by myself all afternoon on the day of the benefit. I cried like a baby, but have never been so happy.

The commencement speaker at Saturday ceremonies will be Wisconsin Technical College President Morna Foy. As president, Foy oversees operations of the 16-college state system.





Dear Editor,

This letter is in response to the recent "Bad Press" that has been established by the Forest County Humane Society in regards to the "Municipalities not supporting the Forest County Humane Society Shelter."

I must first state, that my family has a dog that is part of the family, and we would not wish anyone to lose their best friend, but at some point we need to look at reality when it comes to the cost of maintaining a shelter.

I truly believe that there needs to be some clarity in the issue from the town and taxpayer perspective.

In March, the Humane Society sent out service contracts to each town, which included a fee of \$10.03 per person, and these contracts requested payment for services prior to April 1st or services would be cut off. Total budget requested from all towns in Forest County was \$92,000 that equaled the total operating expense of the shelter. This equates to \$10.03 per capita population. This would equal over \$12,000 per year for the Town of Laona. This issue resulted in a special meeting of the Forest County Chapter of the Wisconsin Town's Association.

The first line of questions from the towns present at the meeting pertained to actual cost of running the Humane Society as compared to the money collected through fund raising. As per answers from Mr. Al Thompson, the shelter has a total budget of \$92,000, of which there is approximately \$70,000 brought in from donations and services. In essence, this leaves a shortfall of \$22,000 per year. If the shelter had asked the towns for the difference of \$22,000 divided by 9,200 people, the fees requested would have been \$2.39 per capita population. This would equal a little over \$3,000 per year for the Town of Laona.

As a town chairman, the first question in my mind at this point was: "Why would any organization ask for an amount that is five times more than the actual shortfall?"

Other issues that were discussed at the WTA meeting that were not in your article are: The shelter has no way of tracking where the dogs in the shelter come from. One of the main topics of discussion was the fact that there are quite a few towns in the county that have never sent a dog to the shelter or that annually send less than five dogs to the shelter each year. In our estimate from Laona, according to our law enforcement officer, we, as a town government, send approximately three dogs per year to the shelter. If you look at either of the cost scenarios above, the cost to the town of Laona ranges from \$1,000-\$4,000 per dog per year. Is this realistic? Maybe the cost should be spread proportionately to the number of dogs that come from the town?

I would also like to clarify some facts that were misconstrued by Mr. Thompson from the meeting. The attorney from the WTA clarified the state law for the towns as follows:

- 1. The state law states: "Towns may take dogs into custody." The attorney also made it clear that the towns are not required by law to take in cats, and the attorney also made it clear that it would be in the town's best interest to take stray dogs into custody in the name of human safety. At no point was there a statement that a town must care for animals running at large.
- The attorney also made it clear that the town's responsibility was to hold dogs in custody for no less than seven days and post notice of the description of the dog in custody for that time. The town's responsibility for the dogs in custody was normal care, including shelter, feed and water. At no point is the town responsible by law for veterinary services for animals held, and at no point is the town responsible by law to take in animals that need veterinary services. After the seven days, the town has the right to euthanize the animal as un-owned or unwanted.

I do respect that the Forest County Humane Society does an excellent job in caring for all types of animals, including dogs, cats, rabbits, and even occasionally snakes. I do respect that the shelter has a no-kill policy. I do respect that there are many donations and volunteers who assist the shelter.

Although Mr. Thompson maintains the attitude that municipalities do not support the shelter, the town of Laona annually donated \$500 to the shelter. This equaled over \$100 per dog brought to the shelter. At the annual meeting of the town of Laona, the electors in the town chose not to retain the town resolution to provide this support because of recent actions of the Humane Society.

In light of the bad press that has resulted to the municipalities from the Forest County Humane Society, I feel that I must go on the offensive and ask the people of Forest County the following questions:

1. The state law gives authority to towns and counties to take dogs running at large into custody to protect the safety of citizens. If there are no contracts in place between the towns or Forest County and the Forest County Humane Society, how does the shelter even have the authority to take animals into custody and hold them? If your dog has been taken into custody by the Forest County Humane Society, was it done legally? Continued upper right....

- 2. By state law, a town or county can appoint a dog catcher to take custody of dogs or law enforcement can take dogs into custody. Most animals brought to the shelter are brought by people who pick up the animals. What gives people at random the right to take animals into custody if it is not approved by state law or other government authority? If someone took your animal to the Forest County Humane Society, did they have the right to do so?
- 3. How much money shall we pay to keep animals in a shelter until an adoptive home can be found? If your town pays a donation to the shelter, is it approved by the electors at the annual town meeting? If not, is it legal for the town board to make a donation?
- 4. How long shall animals be held in a shelter without a true home?
- How much money shall we pay to give animals veterinary care, regardless of if an owner can be found?
- 6. What services are you willing to give up from your town to pay for services provided by the animal shelter?

As a taxpayer and responsible dog owner, I cannot justify paying expenses to cover the cost of irresponsible animal owners.

At the annual town meeting, in the town of Laona, the following was discussed:

According to law, the town of Laona will take custody of all dogs running at large by the Laona Police Department. If the dog taken into custody is properly tagged and licensed, the Laona Police Department will return the dog to its owner. If the dog taken into custody is not licensed, the town of Laona will provide for a dog pound to retain the dog. If tagged but not licensed, the owner will be notified and fined for lack of licensing. If the dog is tagged and licensed, but found running at large multiple times, the owner will be fined for dogs running at large. Dogs without tags or license will be impounded. We will post the description of the animals in custody at our public places and provide water, food and shelter for ten days. At the point that the ten days expires, we will either allow someone from our town to adopt the animal or the Humane Society can take over custody of the dog in question to follow their process at their own costs. If custody of the dog cannot be transferred to either an individual, a shelter, or a humane society, the town of Laona will proceed with humane euthanization of the dog in question as allowed by law.

Although it may come across as cruel by some, the intentions of the policy will be to protect the safety of the public while insuring that people take responsibility for their animals or provide for the ownership of the animal to be transferred to another or the animal will be put to rest and not face the world without a home.

The town of Laona is currently working to find groups or shelters that can economically address our problem. We have found that a shelter in Iron River, Michigan may be an option with a total cost of less than \$100 per dog, and we have had local people interested in being designated as the Laona "dog catcher" to take dogs into custody for the period required by law.

By actions of the electors in the town of Laona at the annual town meeting, the town of Laona will no longer support the Forest County Humane Society through donation. This will result in cost efficiency for the town of Laona and will allow our town to maintain all current services.

By the way Mr. Thompson, you can save the Forest County Humane Society some money and quit sending contracts and letters requesting that the town of Laona sign and return your Small Animal Collection contract. We will address our issues as required by state law!



The Lake Metonga Association (the Association) proposes to chemically treat approximately 60 acres of Lake Metonga to control excessive growth of the exotic invasive aquatic plant, Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM).

Clean Lakes, Inc. will conduct an application of the aquatic herbicides DMA 4 IVM (liquid 2-4, D), Renovate Max G (granular triclopyr+granular 2, 4-D) and Reward (liquid diquat) to infestations of EWM. It is anticipated that the treatment will occur sometime in May, 2013 and will proceed only after the Association obtains a permit for the treatment from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

The water use restrictions for aquatic herbicides are as follows: There are no swimming or fishing restrictions. Do not use water from treated areas for irrigation purposes for 21 days after treatment, or until an approved assay indicates the 2,4-D concentration is 100 pph or less and triclopyr concentration is 1.0 pph or less.

The Association will hold a public informational meeting on the proposed treatments if five or more individuals, organizations, special units of government, or local units of government request one in writing. The person or entity requesting the meeting shall state a specific agenda of topics including problems and alternatives to be discussed. Broadband internet survey

Lottery Credit Week

May 13 - 17

The Forest County Treasurer's office in conjunction with the Wisconsin County Treasurer's Association is dedicating the week of May 13-17 to verify that all eligible Real Property Owners received the lottery credit on their 2012 tax bills. The exact amount is based upon the school district in which your home is located.

To qualify for the lottery and gaming credit, an owner must be a Wisconsin resident, the owner of the dwelling and use the dwelling as their primary residence as of the certification date (January 1, 2012). If temporarily absent, typically for a period no longer than 6 months (hospital, vacation, incarcerated, etc), it is the home to which the owner returns. Principal dwelling means any dwelling used by the owner of the dwelling as his/her primary residence. A property owner may claim only one primary residence. [sec.79.10 (1) (dm), (9) (bm), Wis. Stats.].

The lottery credit can only be obtained by having a signed application on file. Please contact the county Treasurer's office for any questions at 715-478-2412. If you are an eligible property owner who did not receive the credit, the Treasurer's office will help you complete the paperwork and file the forms with the Department of Revenue to claim the late lottery credit and ensure that the credit is applied to your 2013 tax bill.

If you were not a resident of your property on January 1, 2012 but were as of January 1, 2013 you may qualify for the credit on your 2013 tax bill. You should complete the 2013 application to receive that credit.



Nicolet upgrades workforce training to boost economic development

The economic recession of 2008 and 2009 caused a seismic shift in the American landscape. Perseverance, adaptation and resilience were all key to make it through the economic downturn.

"It was a time of dramatic change that happened relatively quickly," said Nicolet College President Elizabeth Burmaster. "With everything that was happening in the economy, we knew at Nicolet that we were going to have to change how we approached workforce skills training as well."

As the recession deepened, enrollment at Nicolet surged to record levels as the unemployed sought job training for new careers and employers realized existing employees needed higher skill sets for companies to be efficient and profitable.

"More was being expected of employees and we had to adapt to that in the type of workforce training we provided," said Sandy Bishop, director of Workforce Development at Nicolet. "Technical skills have always been important and always will be. But along with solid technical skills we were seeing more demand for employees with what some call soft skills. Knowing how to effectively work as a team, solving problems independently and quickly, communicating effectively, resolving conflict, and adapting to change are all skills that many businesses require in their employees."

Nicolet adapted by placing greater emphasis on these skills in classroom curriculum not only in credit classes but also the whole compliment of short-term, noncredit workforce development workshops that Bishop oversees

"Employers have raised the bar on what they expect from their workforce," Bishop explained. "In many ways, it's like instilling the mindset that every employee is personally responsible for the success of the business. Everyone has to work together responsibly and effectively in order to be successful."

Bishop stressed that teaching the latest technical skills is still at the core of what is taught in classes and workshops and adding this extra level of soft skills was largely driven by what the college was hearing from area employers.

"Nicolet puts a strong emphasis on working in close partnership with area employers and this change is a great example of the effectiveness of these relationships and how the college can adapt to changing needs," she said.

The numbers indicate that employers like the training Nicolet offers. Last year 105 Northwoods employers contracted with the college to provide workforce development training, sending nearly 3,000 registrants to dozens of different workshops, classes, and certification

Entrepreneurship and Business Development

Another recession-driven growth area for Nicolet has been in the areas of helping entrepreneurs launch businesses and assisting existing new and small businesses in growing their operations.

"These two areas are key to lifting the Northwoods out of recession and growing the local economy," said Michelle Madl-Soehren, Nicolet Business Development coordinator. "Many of the new jobs that are being created are coming from small business."

To help fuel this growth, Madl-Soehren and others at Nicolet have developed a series of laddered workshops that offer increasing levels of instruction and advice for entrepreneurs looking to start a business and those looking to grow an existing business.

In the past year Madl-Soehren has held 15 Explore Starting a Business workshops throughout the Northwoods to introduce students to the idea of business ownership.

"Starting and building a successful business is a step by step process and all the pieces have to be in place in order for any business to do well," she explained. "In these workshops we identify the critical components and then work with individuals to help them bring all the pieces together."

The workshops – which are offered for free – have been held throughout the Northwoods in many different communities including Tomahawk, Minocqua, Eagle River, Crandon, Lac du Flambeau, and Rhinelander. More than 50 people have attended these workshops.

As a follow-up for those wanting more detailed business development information, Nicolet recently launched the new 10-session E-Seed Innovative Entrepreneurship Training Program.

"Instruction covers practical, real-world management and planning tools that include all of the basics of starting a business," she said.

Specific topics include determining if business ownership is right for each individual, feasibility testing, business concept development, creating a business plan, bookkeeping and accounting systems, and legal issues facing business owners. Expert guest speakers also share their insights on running a successful business. Today, 10 students are enrolled in the E-Seed series currently offered by Nicolet at the Vilas County Business Incubator in Eagle River.

National Forest Safety Alert

Rhinelander, WI: April 29, 2013 Over the last three years the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF), in cooperation with interagency enforcement agencies, has eradicated numerous marijuana grows that were cultivated by large Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTO). These grow sites were located on the Nicolet land base (2010/2012) and the Chequamegon land base (2011); all were first reported by hunters and fishermen.

The illegal activity of growing and harvesting marijuana on public lands is expected to continue. The safety of the public and employees is the top priority for the U.S Forest Service. The Chequamegon- Nicolet National Forest and other public lands are being used for these illegal operations as they are often vast, uninhabited acres the growers find have the right conditions for their illegal operations.

Typically planting occurs in the spring and the plants are harvested in late summer. Even with the late snow melt in much of Northern Wisconsin activity may already be occurring with these illegal grows.

These DTO marijuana growers are dangerous and are known to carry firearms! The CNNF asks that visitors be aware of their surroundings and know what to do to remain safe. Although it is unlikely you will come across one of these sites knowing how to recognize them is vital. Indicators of illegal marijuana grow sites include:

Isolated tents in the forest where no other

recreational activity is present

Garden tools, bags of fertilizer, and large amounts of garbage

Signs of cultivation/soil disturbances (many holes) in unlikely areas 1 to 2 acre (or smaller) cleared areas with stumps

up to approximately 3 feet tall If you encounter a site, or unusual circumstances you

should take these actions immediately: Leave the area as quickly and quietly as possible

Do your best to know your location by use of landmarks or waypoints

Notify local law enforcement authorities, if on National Forest you can also notify the local Ranger District Office.

Authorities will continue to work together to decrease this unlawful and damaging activity. Your assistance is important to help stop marijuana growing in your National



Smart Pet Solutions

Revive a worn catnip toy

Your kitty has dragged her beloved catnip-stuffed mouse around the house all month, and now its intoxicating aroma has faded to almost nothing. To refresh the plaything's scent, immerse it in a bowl of hot water for a few minutes, then let it air-dry. The steamy soak will help re-circulate the herbal oils, resulting in a like-new toy - at no cost to you!

Eliminate litter-box odor

Even though you change the litter regularly, your cat's box is still stinky. The fix: Make an odor "filter" with activated charcoal (available at pet-supply and hardware stores). Simply wrap 5 Tbs. of charcoal in three layers of cheesecloth, tie with twine and bury the bundle in the litter. Activated charcoal is super porous and absorbent, so it will soak up smells. And as long as it's buried, the bundle won't bother or harm your cat.

Lift a pet stain from carpet

Oh no! Your little buddy had an accident on the livingroom carpet. To the rescue: shaving cream. Simply squirt a white-foam formula (not menthol or gel-based) onto the affected area and let sit for 15 minutes, then use a towel dampened with hot water to rub the spot. The foam's concentrated alcohols will break down the bonds between the stain and the carpet fibers, leaving your rug looking and smelling - like new. (Note: Test on an inconspicuous area first for colorfastness.)

Flea-proof your pooch

A simple way to ward off itchy bites: Add neem oil (available at health-food stores) to your dog's shampoo bottle. (Use 1 Tbs. of the oil per 8 oz. of shampoo.) Neem oil contains a plant compound that's proven to kill 93 percent of fleas within 24 hours, and one wash will repel the pests for up to 19 days. Plus, the oil's natural antifungal and antibacterial properties will help speed healing and soothe irritation if a flea does bite.

No more hair balls!

If it seems like your cat is trying to cough up a hair ball, ease her discomfort by adding 1/2 tsp. of olive oil to her food once a day for three days. When ingested the oil acts as a lubricant that allows hair balls to easily pass through the digestive tract. And to prevent future hair balls, continue to add 1/8 tsp. of oil to her food daily. (Cut back on treats to compensate for the extra calories.)
