Hometown Trolley is off and running

I doubt that anybody would have envisioned what a trolley business could do when Double K turned out there first trolley back in 1978, but these classy means of transport are quite popular worldwide.

Starting in Illinois, the company made about six of these eye-catching vehicles a year. The numbers are different these days. Moving to Crandon in 1992, production jumped to about 12 a year.

Changing the name to Hometown Trolley in 2000, the production jumped to about 30 to 36 a year. With the move to the larger and more efficient quarters, the output is 50 per year, and they are both trying to keep up with orders and to look for more dealers and orders for their trolleys. According to the owners, Joey and Kristina Dunow, they will be able to push a completed trolley out the door every 12 days!

By moving into and remodeling the building formerly occupied by Rhinelander Door, they have made a much more efficient operation that will move trolleys under construction to different bays that are set up to do separate functions. With a room full of cataloged supplies, it is easy to track materials and easy for workers to get what they need right away and not look around the work area for what is needed, and Kevin Bocek is there to find it fast.

According to Kristina and Joey, the future of the trolleys could well be electric. As reported before, Hometown Trolley received an order from Alpena, Michigan for an all electric trolley. They are also looking at building trolleys that will run on compressed natural gas or LP gas. The current electric trolley order has been in the construction phase since January, and is still being worked on. What is learned from this electric trolley will make succeeding orders easier and faster to build.

There are currently 20 people working at Hometown Trolley, and if orders increase, and we are sure they will, even more workers will make their living in the trolley business.

The business is a good fit for Crandon's industrial park, and we congratulate Hometown Trolley on their success.



Clean Boats, Clean Waters (cbcw) Workshop Offered

A free CBCW workshop, hosted by the Oneida County Land and Water Department and the University of Wisconsin-Extension, is planned for Tuesday, May 21, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. The workshop will be held in the Board Room of the Minocqua Community Center, 415 Menominee St. The Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW) program provides an opportunity to learn how and why educational awareness is critical in preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS).

The workshop will have speakers from multiple resource agencies. Participants will receive information on AIS along with species identification, instructions on how to organize an effective volunteer watercraft inspection program and practice with conducting boater interviews. A CBCW water inspection handbook and kit, containing all the tools an inspector needs will be available at the workshop. Seating is limited so register soon.



On display this month in the David Brezovar Memorial display case we have the collection, 'A Little Bit of England from Crandon resident, Bess Aho. The case includes Torquay pottery, Chintz china, and David Winter sculpture models. The Torquay pottery began in the South Devon area of England as early as 1867 and the mottos on the pottery were introduced in the late 19th century as the art was taken up by the other Torquay potteries. The Torquay is most famous for the verses, proverbs, and quotations that decorate it, which is achieved by scratching the letters through a slip to expose the red clay underneath. Looking closely you may see how beautiful each letter shows through and how the thought of each motto is expressed.

The Chintz is a generic name for English china with an allover floral design. It is colorful, bright, cheery, and reminiscent of chintz dress fabric. Chintz china was produced in England in the first half of the 20th century it stands out among other styles of china. A spot of tea in one of these charming green or blue tea cup and saucers sets would be most inviting.

The David Winter handmade, sculptured models are a treasury of buildings that have architectural and historical roots deep in the heart of the cities and countryside of every province in Canada. These models come from the picturesque fishing villages of the east coast to the majestic west coast Rocky Mountains. They reflect the design of churches, commercial buildings, farms, private homes, and historic fortifications of Canada. They are made from milled natural stone which, having been processed according to a secret technique, are petrified again. 




