- Use a small amount of sharp or aged cheese, like cheddar or parmesan, to get plenty of taste without a lot of fat or calories.

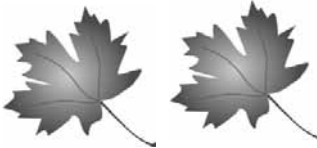

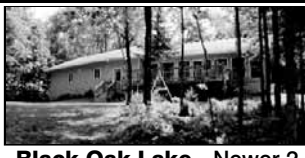

Allergies: Your 2013 Forecast

Sorry, allergy sufferers: Experts are confirming that the 2013 allergy season is going to start sooner, and last longer, in most parts of the country.

The season is expected to occur about two weeks earlier in many parts of the US, and will likely endure for about an extra month—right through October. Why? Because of heavy precipitation levels this past winter, along with the rapid surge of warmer weather that's followed, says allergy specialist Clifford Massett, MD, clinical assistant professor of medicine at the New York University School of Medicine and Langone Medical Center.

And then there's climate change: Higher-than-normal carbon dioxide emissions are fueling pollen production, experts suspect, causing plants to produce three to five times more pollen than usual. "Not only is the pollen more prolific," Dr. Bassett says, "but it seems to be more powerful, supercharged." Combine that with a heavy dose of precipitation over the winter, and you've got the ingredients for a majorly unpleasant allergy season.

If you're hoping to skate through the season relatively unscathed, consider these recommendations from Dr. Bassett on diagnosing and managing those sniffly, sneezy symptoms:

Get a diagnosis. To determine whether you've got seasonal allergies, and how severe they are, start by visiting allergyandasthma.org to take a free screening test. But before starting any type of treatment, get your allergies confirmed by your doctor—otherwise, you may end up treating the wrong condition.

Treat early. If you use nasal antihistamines, steroids, oral antihistamines, or eye drops for seasonal allergies, don't wait until your symptoms are unbearable to start treatment. "If you see an allergist and get tested, the doctor can quickly individualize treatment" Dr. Bassett notes.

Be in the know. Make a habit of checking allergen levels in your area. Go to the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma & Immunology's National Allergy Bureau for up-to-date pollen counts—you can even sign up for email alerts or download a smartphone app that tracks pollen counts.

Accessorize appropriately. Wear oversized sunglasses to block airborne pollens, and opt for a wide-brimmed hat to keep pollen and other allergens from landing in your hair or eyes.

Look for diet triggers. As many as one-third of seasonal allergy sufferers experience unpleasant reactions from certain foods as a result of their condition. For instance, oral allergy syndrome (tingling of the mouth or itchy throat) may set in after eating fresh fruits, carrots, celery, almonds, or hazelnuts. If you experience these symptoms, avoid the trigger foods during allergy season.

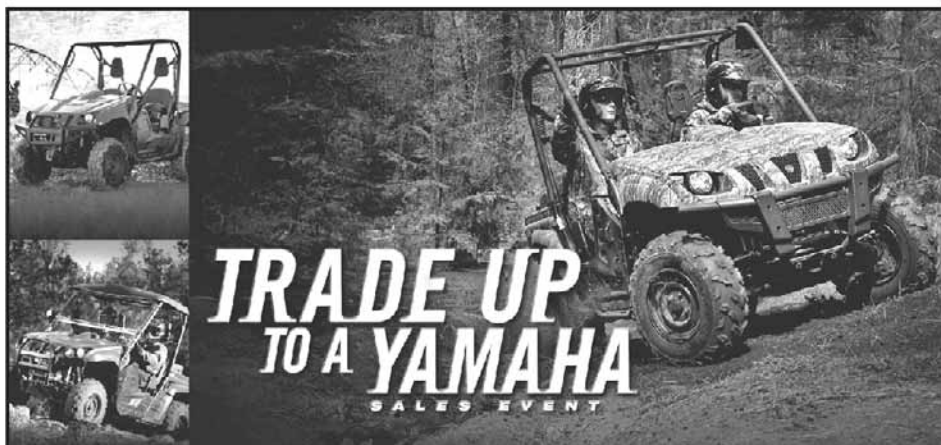

School District Of Wabeno Area Puts Question Of Paid School Meals To The Electors

On Wednesday, May 29, 2013 at 6:00PM, the School District of Wabeno Area will be holding a Special Meeting. The sole purpose of the meeting is to have the electors of the school district vote on the question of the school meal service for students.

The School District of Wabeno Area is one of the few school districts in the state that provides free breakfast and free lunch to all students. With the operating referendum not passing on the April ballot, the School Board is looking for more ways to tighten the budget. Providing free school meals to all students currently costs the district approximately \$160,000.

Each year at the Annual Meeting of the school district, the electors have voted in favor of free school meals for all students. However, due to the outcome of the referendum, the School Board believes it is necessary to ask for a vote specifically on this question before the Annual Meeting takes place in October.

Any U.S. citizen age 18 or older who has resided in the district for 10 days prior to the meeting will be eligible to vote. A paper ballot will be used for the vote at the meeting on May 29, 2013. The question will be posed as follows:

Shall the School District of Wabeno Area, Forest, Langlade, Marinette and Oconto Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to require families to pay for breakfast and lunch according to their eligibility for paid, reduced, or free meals?

If the electors vote "NO" on this question, the school district will continue to provide free meals to all students. If the electors vote "YES" on this question, families will have to pay for school meals according to their income eligibility, beginning with the 2013-2014 school year. Eligibility is determined by the Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application that families turn in at the beginning of each school year. The prices for school meals for students are estimated to be set at the following rates:

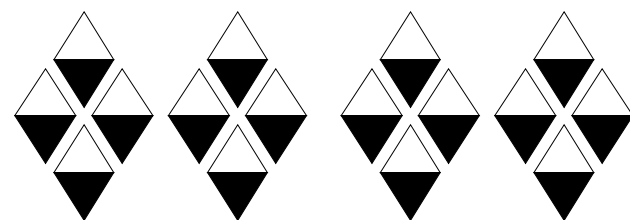

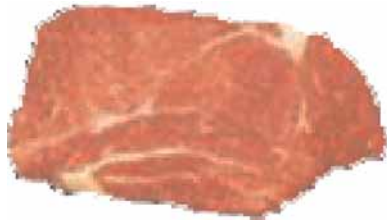

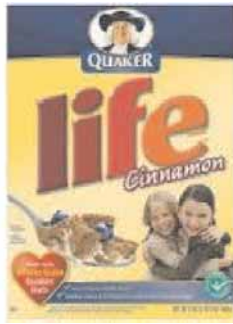

Installing automatic door operators will also provide convenience for the elderly, children and people carrying heavy loads or pushing strollers.

This project was coordinated by the Wisconsin Valley Library Service, a regional library system, with Library Services and Technology Act funds awarded to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction by the Federal Institute of Museum and Library Services.

New Local History database

Crandon Public Library's website located at www.crandonpl.org has a new database that will be of interest to those researching Crandon's earliest residents. The database is an online index to a recently discovered census that was taken in 1909 shortly before the City officially incorporated. The census, enumerated by Mr. Clyde Warnick, Town Clerk for the Town of Crandon, reported that on January 18th, 1909 there were 1,981 persons living within the proposed City limits. The following day, on January 19, 1909, an election was held and 286 votes were cast in favor of creating the City of Crandon and 138 votes were cast against the creation. The election results allowed for the official creation of the City of Crandon.

The database, which consists of a name index to the census, and the census images themselves are available on the library's website. A special thanks to library volunteer Jan Bellucci for the time spent indexing this document.

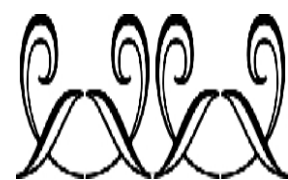

USDA Seeks Applications for Grants to Provide Technical Assistance to Rural Businesses

WASHINGTON, May 14, 2013 – Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that USDA is seeking applications from organizations that will provide technical assistance to rural businesses. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) remains focused on carrying out its mission, despite a time of significant budget uncertainty. Today's announcement is one part of the Department's efforts to strengthen the rural economy.

"These grants will help businesses get access to planning, mentoring and other services that can help ensure their success," Vilsack said. "This assistance will provide development and managerial services that often are not readily available to businesses in rural areas." Funding will be provided through USDA Rural Development's Rural Business Opportunity Grant (RBOG) program. Up to \$2.6 million is available through this notice. The maximum grant is \$100,000.

Grants may be used for feasibility studies, strategic planning, leadership training and other types of business development activities. Eligible applicants include public bodies, non-profit corporations, institutions of higher education, Indian tribes and rural cooperatives.

USDA Rural Development is further interested in RBOG applications to support a new Obama administration initiative called Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership (IMCP). This initiative is intended to stimulate an environment for developing manufacturing jobs. RBOG applicants, for example, could seek grants to help rural communities develop long-term strategic plans for their manufacturing sectors or to provide training to entrepreneurs who want to create manufacturing businesses in rural areas. Applicants who receive RBOG funding complementing the IMCP initiative may later be eligible for much larger grants directly through the initiative.

Some of the funding available under this RBOG notice will be made available for projects benefitting federally recognized Indian tribes and projects benefitting Rural Economic Area Partnerships. The remaining funds are open for national competition.

The RBOG program and other USDA business and cooperate development programs have had a significant impact on rural communities. In 2012 alone, they helped almost 10,000 rural small business owners or farmers improve their enterprises. Business and cooperative program funding created or saved an estimated 53,000 rural jobs in 2012.

In fall 2011, USDA Rural Development awarded a \$90,000 Rural Business Opportunity Grant to the Southwestern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission to conduct a tri-state prospectus to identify agricultural strengths, regional opportunities, and recommend a unified network of processing, storage, and distribution facilities across Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois. The Prospectus has been released is available at <http://swwrpc.org/wordpress/project-produce/>. USDA's RBOG funds are also helping support the City of Marshfield with targeted, long term economic development and planning through professional board development, website creation, and improved community communication.

Spring has Arrived, I Think! Be aware of invasives

I thought the winter would never end and I am sure I am not alone in that thought! Much of the snow and ice has melted and the lakes are finally opened up! This all means one thing. The boating and fishing season is finally upon us! Many of you are getting boats and docks back in the lakes for the year. Just remember that aquatic invasive species are still lurking in the water. Species such as zebra mussels, Eurasian water milfoil, curly leaf pondweed, rusty crayfish and many others can still cause permanent damage to our lakes. Many lakes in Wisconsin are still free of invasive species and are worth protecting. You may be thinking what can I do to help prevent the spread of these destructive creatures? Just follow these important rules below when fishing or boating!

Remove all aquatic plants, animals and mud from boats, trailers, and equipment before leaving the boat landing. Drain all water from your boat, motor, bilge, transom wells, and livewells before leaving the boat landing. Do not move live fish away from a boat landing. A live fish is a fish still in water. Drain water from all containers containing your fish including pails, coolers, livewells, and bait buckets. Frozen water bottles or ice can be used in place of water to keep fish fresh.

Minnnows also have the potential to spread aquatic invasive species. Minnows cannot be used from a state other than Wisconsin. When purchasing minnows in Wisconsin it must be from a licensed Wisconsin bait dealer. Unused minnows may be transported away alive from a waterbody and used again on the same waterbody or on a different waterbody if no lake or river water or other fish was added to their container. If lake or river water or fish were added to the container the minnows can be taken home BUT only used again on the same waterbody.

If trapping minnows special regulations apply. Minnow harvesting is closed on VHS affected waters and they include Lake Michigan (including Green Bay), Lake Superior, the Mississippi River, Lake Winnebago, Fox River from Lake Winnebago to Green Bay, and all connecting waters upstream to the first barrier impassible to fish. On other waters minnows may be harvested for

personal use but may not be transported away alive from the water.

These laws can also be found in the 2013-2014 Wisconsin fishing regulations on pages 17 and 18.

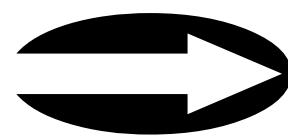

CBCW Training and Drawdown Information Meeting

On Saturday, May 18, 2013 the Oconto County Land Conservation Division hosted a Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW) training meeting and a discussion of the 2012 drawdown of Reservoir Pond and the Townsend Flowage. The workshop was held at the Townsend Town Hall and was attended by 39 people from Northern Oconto County lakes.

The training was conducted by the Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator, Amanda Strick. Bob Skalitzky from Oconto County was on the agenda first to discuss the 2012 drawdown which generated considerable discussion. Amanda Strick then discussed the current aquatic invasive species in the county and what can be done to prevent their spread. Through the CBCW program, volunteers are trained to conduct boater education interviews at local boat launches. Volunteers show boaters how and where aquatic invasive species (AIS) are most likely to hitch a ride on their watercraft and be transferred to other water bodies.
