Please don't pick up hitchhikers this summer, and I'm not talking about the ones your mom warned you to never stop for along highways. These hitchhikers are found on boats and trailers and in live wells and the bucket where you may keep the day's catch.

These hitchhikers -- aquatic invasive species (AIS) -- are non-native plants and animals that can harm our treasured Wisconsin waters and recreation and which are primarily spread when we are boating or fishing.

But by being alert and taking a few easy steps, you can curb the spread, and we can help in a host of ways.

Have you encountered AIS like Eurasian water-

Debate at Crandon's City Hall over two veteran's issues

There are two issues in front of Crandon's City Council that concern local veteran's groups, and the meeting last Wednesday, July 3rd, of the council often became heated.

One issue is the lease on the old Crandon Library building that has been leased to the Northwoods Veteran's Center for ten years, and serves as a veteran's museum. The lease is up, and the Public Property Committee voted to renew the lease for another five years at the rate of \$70 per year. This, of course, doesn't mean that the rest of the city council will vote to renew.

Alois Bocek, Commander of the Patsy Shay Veteran's of Foreign Wars Post made a comment. His contention was that the VFW asks for and receives very little from the City of Crandon, and resents the financial aid given to other vet's groups.

Ron Eveland had the floor, and he indicated that the museum has a purpose. He said that the building is filled with donated items and that there are people who come in all day long. The public likes it said Eveland, and he argued for a five-year continuation of the lease.

Diane Fenske Joyner, President of the Veteran's Memorial Association, took the floor and said she was speaking as an individual veteran, and not for the association. She said the Memorial Association has one fundraiser per year, and she questioned the low cost of leasing the museum, and aired out some grievances between some of the veteran's organizations.

Mayor Jaeger stepped into this discussion and said that he was against a five-year lease. He said that this wasn't fair to the city taxpayers, and he had received more calls against the lease than for it. His idea was to offer a

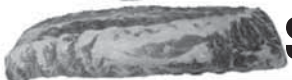

Brad: "For several years I have found old rail beds throughout Oconto County, and in 2003 I began my personal quest in finding out what these railroads were all about. With information from historical resources and fellow historians, I have explored and evaluated the conditions of what were once logging railroads. My personal recordings of my findings are kept in field journals. I found that not only Oconto County but also Langlade, Forest, and Vilas Counties have many reminders of these logging railroads that I have been walking on since 2003."

"We believe our museum provides the perfect setting to introduce Brad and his amazing work," says Marsh. "The oldest of its kind still sitting where it was built, the Holt & Balcom Camp was a depot camp and thus built to last longer than most. It was opened in 1881 and operated until 1927. It defies the passage of time only because it was restored to its former glory by the McCaslin Lions from 1975-83 and once again from 2007 to 2013 by the Friends of the Logging Camp, a subgroup of the Oconto County Historical Society."

If you have never visited the camp before, or if you have and want to see its new look, you will want to come early that day. Tours will be offered beginning at noon. A donation of \$5/adults and \$2/children under 12, is requested. All donations are used for maintenance of the Museum.

Manufacturing classes start Aug. 26 at Nicolet College;

Free tuition available to qualifying students

Workers with strong manufacturing skills are in high demand in the Northwoods today and that is expected to grow into the future as the economy continues to improve, according to the dean of Trade and Industry at Nicolet College.

"These are good paying jobs that pay a family-supporting wage," said Brigitte Parsons. "I would encourage anyone interested in entering these fields to look at the training programs Nicolet has available."

Fall Semester classes start August 26.

Parsons also noted that Nicolet has received a grant to support the college's Manufacturing training efforts and a portion of those funds have been set aside to help qualifying students pay for tuition.

Average starting wages in manufacturing in this area range from \$14 to \$24 an hour, depending on the level of training, and typically increase steadily with on-the-job experience, she added.

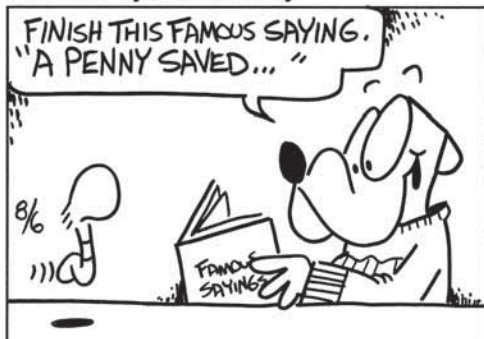

one-year lease, and if a commercial buyer for the property was found in that year, the building would be sold. If there is no other buyer, another year's lease could be signed. He said he would veto the motion passed by the council to give a five-year lease. (On Wednesday morning, Mayor Jaeger used his veto power on the five-year lease motion.)

The other contentious business was an offer made by American Legion Post 94 to purchase the metal building on Madison Street, next to the new Legion post, for \$30,000. This wouldn't be that contentious an issue, except that the council was told that as the Legion owned the property on the north side of their new headquarters, if they couldn't purchase the metal building, they would build out the north side of their building, effectively closing the service alley that exists now. With an extension of the building, numerous main street businesses would have a difficult time receiving deliveries to their back doors. If the metal building would be sold, Jim Gunderson, Post Commander, said that the 51 feet in question would be given to the city.

City Attorney Lindsay Erickson asked if the city had another place for their storage should the metal building be sold. There was a pause, then Councilman Berg said that a good portion of the material in the metal building could be stored in the city garage, at least for awhile.

The alley has been a public thoroughfare for the entire history of the business district as far as current memories go, and Erickson said that the city may already own the use of it by adverse possession. She also pointed out that a survey should be done to determine exactly where the land in question lays.

Gunderson reiterated that if the city doesn't make the deal with the Legion post, they will extend the building to have a place to store their equipment.

Tricia Novak was granted the floor. She is the owner of three buildings that would be adversely affected should the building be extended. Tricia's Treasures receives deliveries through their back door, as does Tricia's Bistro, and she currently bought the building next to the Legion post, and is currently remodeling. In addition, Jim and Peg Houle's 2nd Chance Antiques would have deliveries affected, as would Bruce Walentowski's Flowers From the Heart. Any traffic, especially trucks, would have to either back in or back out, and that includes any postal trucks delivering or picking up from the post office.

Novak made an impassioned plea for the alley to remain open and said she is for veterans, had many family members who served in the armed forces, but didn't think this offer to buy or plans to extend the post building were anything but disastrous for existing businesses. In addition, she pointed out that people lived in apartments over some of the buildings, and closing down a portion of the alley would make it very difficult for the tenants.

Jim Houle spoke next, and he touched on the museum as well as closing the alley behind his store. He said that he had offered to buy the old library for \$50,000 before the museum was established and the city was paid \$60 a year for a lease. Closing the alley, according to Houle would cripple numerous businesses, and he was definitely against it. He pointed out that the land in question actually has city street drains installed, has always been an alley and should remain so. He said that through the years, he and his wife had invested \$1.2 million dollars in downtown real estate, and he had never asked the city for any favors.

Mayor Jaeger said there should be a legal survey, and the city attorney pointed out that there would be a building permit involved as well, and cutting off emergency services to the back of these buildings could make a permit hard to get.

At the end of the meeting, it was obvious that many of the numerous veteran's organizations do not get along, and there seems to be cross-purposes in their many endeavors. If I may be permitted to editorialize, these groups should have a summit meeting, so to speak, and work out their differences and various goals and responsibilities.

As for closing off the service alley behind the businesses on Lake Avenue, it is a bad idea (A little more editorializing). Small towns across the nation have to work hard to maintain their business districts, and most have not been as successful as Crandon. For those of us who own property on Lake Avenue, and the Pioneer Express is one of those who count on the back of the store as well as the front.

All of us appreciate the service rendered by veterans to our nation, but it is apparent to property owners and neighbors to the post, that the Legion's threats to close off the alley to gain access to the metal building are not the right approach. There are enough challenges to business owners without making it difficult to service the business from a busy front door. It may be that the city can sell the building to the Legion, or another buyer should one arise, but it should be for enough money to erect another storage facility on city property in another location. Cool and intelligent heads should prevail.

milfoil, zebra mussels or rusty crayfish in your favorite lake? Do you have questions on AIS "no transport" laws aimed at boaters and anglers? Are you aware of the numerous prevention, monitoring and control efforts taking place in Wisconsin?

Ever wonder who those folks with the blue shirts are out at the boat landing? Do you know local group/governments can apply for AIS grants through our DNR AIS Grants Program?

Or are you interested in joining the hundreds of volunteers working to monitor and prevent the spread of AIS?

Preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species takes effort from everyone who enjoys our state's waterways. Our surveys show that more than 90 percent of boaters know what they need to do to prevent the spread of AIS. We continue to educate boaters about AIS and we have also started to enforce the AIS laws in Wisconsin.

Please go to the DNR searchable website and type in "invasive species" for more on how we can all help keep Wisconsin lakes and fish healthy. The best place to start is by removing organic material from boats, trailers, and live wells.

Drain water from live wells, bilges and pumps. Put your catch on ice instead of in a bucket full of water.

To minimize the spread of these invasive species the law requires water to be drained from our live wells and bilges even if they contain your day's catch. To help preserve your Friday fish fry the DNR has been handing out thousands of ice packs to place onto the fish to preserve until filleting.

The outside and inside of the boat, trailer, live wells, bilges, and pumps should be disinfected

Wisconsin made significant progress in 2012 in efforts to prevent, contain, and control the damage done by AIS, capitalizing on increased federal funding and growing involvement by counties and volunteers.

With your help, we can continue to keep AIS in check. About 200 lakes were monitored this year as part of a five-year process to paint a more accurate picture of where aquatic invasive species are found across the state, and how fast they're spreading, and to evaluate the effectiveness of outreach and education efforts.

The number of counties actively partnering with the state to prevent and control the spread of aquatic invasive species is growing. Over the July 4 holiday, for instance, a record 53 counties will have volunteers and paid staff at boat launches to provide free boat inspections, hand out limited supplies of towels and ice pack, and help raise awareness of steps to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Efforts to engage new partners in geographic areas where there were gaps in the past are paying off. We continue to partner with nearly 200 bait shops to help spread the word and this year, high school students from Siren will help raise awareness at boat launches in Burnett County over the July 4 holiday.

These partnerships helped spread the AIS prevention message to even more water users in 2012 with nearly 110,000 boats inspected and 233,000 people contacted.

The results are encouraging.. 70 percent of lakes with public access were free of Eurasian water-milfoil, despite that invader being here in Wisconsin for more than 50 years. And 82 percent of suitable lakes with public access are still clear of zebra mussels, present inland for more than 20 years.

Rapid response efforts have been successful at eliminating new infestations of species like hydrilla, red swamp crayfish, yellow floating heart, Vietnamese water celery, water chestnut, grass carp and several other invasive species in Wisconsin.

Research has led to new techniques that are providing alternative for the control of aquatic invasive species, early season treatment of Eurasian water-milfoil, innovative techniques to control rainbow smelt, development of products that have the potential to control zebra mussels, or deter Asian carp from moving upstream are all showing signs of success.

Other highlights include, Eurasian Water Milfoil found in 642 water bodies in the state (2012 data), Zebra mussels found in 149 water bodies in the state (2012 data). Over 180 AIS in Great Lakes, but no new invasive aquatic species are known to have been introduced through ballast water since changes in ballast water management regulations were implemented in 2006. Over 110,000 boats inspected for AIS in 2012. Over 232,000 boaters surveyed at launches in 2012. \$ 3.6 million in grants were awarded to local communities for aquatic invasive species prevention and control in 2012, bringing to \$20 million the grant money awarded to local communities since 2003 for aquatic invasive species prevention and control.

\$200,000 was awarded to local communities for Clean Boats Clean Waters grant program following expedited process developed in 2013.
